

The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts, of women of 18 and young persons of 16 years of age and over in the Ticket Printing Department at the works of Messrs. H. Hunt and Company, 2A, Daybrook Street, Sherwood, Nottingham, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be em-

ployed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks, and that suitable accommodation for clothing put off during working hours, mess-room accommodation and washing facilities shall be provided, and that arrangements shall be made for the effective and regular supervision of each shift by a responsible person.
