UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACTS,
1920 TO 1930.

References to the High Court of Justice under Section 10 (1) (proviso ii) of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920.

Pursuant to paragraph 6 of the Unemployment Insurance (Determination of Questions) Regulations, 1920, the Minister of Labour hereby gives notice of her intention to refer to the High Court for decision the following questions that have arisen for her decision under Section 10 of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920, namely, whether the employment of persons in the following circumstances is or is not employment within the meaning of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920:—

Employment by a local authority as—

- (1) a tramway depot cleaner;
- (2) A lavatory attendant at a tramway depot;
- (3) a waitress in refreshment rooms in a public park;
- (4) a waitress in a cafe;
- (5) a waiter in a restaurant.

Under the Rules of the Supreme Court, Order L.V.B. Rule 28, any person who claims to be interested in or affected by the decisions to be given in the above mentioned cases may apply to the Judge for leave to intervene.

The cases have been set down in the High Court, and will be heard in the near future.

In the event of any person desiring to intervene, all the necessary information and documents can be obtained by applying to the Solicitor to the Minister of Labour, 6, Richmond Terrace, Whitehall, S.W. 1.
