In three Portions.

Eighteen Hackney Carriages:

In the centre of roadway, commencing at a point fifteen feet West of the Western end of Refuge at the junction of Kensington Park Road, and extending Westward as far as necessary for four carriages. Front of vehicles toward the East.

Provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriage-way, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriage-way.
