By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

WHEREAS on 30th July, 1927, the Secretary-General of the League of Nations communicated to His Majesty's Government certified copies of draft Conventions concerning (i) Sickness Insurance for Workers in Industry and Commerce and Domestic Servants, and (ii) Sickness Insurance for Agricultural Workers which had been adopted by the International Labour Conference at Geneva on 15th June, 1927:

And whereas it is provided in Article 405 of the Treaty of Versailles that in the case of a draft Convention so communicated each Member of the International Labour Organisation shall, if such draft Convention obtains the consent of the authority or authorities within whose competence the matter lies, communicate the formal ratification thereof to the Secretary-General of the League of Nations:

And whereas the said draft Conventions have in respect of Great Britain and Northern Ireland obtained the consent of the authority or authorities within whose competence the matter lies and such action as is necessary to make the provisions of the said draft Conventions effective therein has been taken: Now, therefore, the Lords of the Council are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said draft Conventions be confirmed and approved.

And it is further ordered that formal communication thereof be made to the Secretary-General of the League of Nations.
