DRIFT NETS MENDING TRADE BOARD
(GREAT BRITAIN).

VARIATION OF MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR
FEMALE WORKERS.

The Drift Nets Mending Trade Board
(Great Britain) have issued a Notice E. (10)
dated 19th January, 1931, setting out a varia-
tion in the Minimum Rates of Wages for
Female Workers, confirmed by Order of the
Minister of Labour, the effect of the variation
being to postpone to the 27th July, 1931, the
operation of increased Minimum Rates of
Wages the Minimum Rates which operated for
a period of twelve months from 27th January,
1930, being continued in operation for a
further period of six months as from 27th
January, 1931.
