PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance and other lawful means His Majesty the King has jurisdiction within the dominions of the Republic of China:

And whereas by a Convention dated the 1st July, 1898, the territory of Wei-hai-wei was leased by His late Majesty the Emperor of China to Her late Majesty Queen Victoria:

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 24th day of July, 1901, the said territory of Wei-hai-wei was removed from the operation of the Orders in Council relating to the exercise of His Majesty's jurisdiction in China, and special provision was made for the administration of the territory of Wei-hai-wei in the said Order and in the succeeding Orders set out in the Schedule hereto:

And whereas it was provided by Article 2 of the China Order in Council 1925 that the said Order should not apply within the territory leased by China under the Convention of July 1st, 1898, so long as the lease of the said territory remained in effect:

And whereas by a Convention signed the 18th day of April, 1930, it was agreed that the 65-33683

said territory of Wei-hai-wei should be restored to the control of the National Government of the Republic of China and in pursuance of such Convention the said territory was duly restored on the 1st day of October, 1930:

And whereas it is expedient to restore the operation in the said territory of Wei-hai-wei of the Orders in Council relating to the exercise of His Majesty's jurisdiction in China and to make provision for the exercise of such jurisdiction therein in the same manner as in other parts of China:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, 1890 and 1913 (53 & 54 Vict. c. 37, and 3 & 4 Geo. V. c. 16), or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

- 1. The limits of this Order are the territory of Wei-hai-wei, including the island of Liu Kung, all the islands in the Bay of Wei-hai-wei, and the belt of land 10 English miles wide along the entire coastline of the Bay of Wei-hai-wei, together with the territorial waters of the said islands and coast.
- 2.—(1) The Orders enumerated in Part I of the Schedule to this Order are hereby repealed.
- (2) The Orders enumerated in Part II of the Schedule to this Order shall cease to have effect within the limits of this Order.

Provided however that the provisions of this Article shall not operate so as to:

- (a) Affect the past operation of the Orders specified, or any of them or any appointment made, or any right, title, obligation, or liability acquired, accrued, or incurred, or the validity or invalidity of anything done or suffered under any of those Orders, before the making of this Order; or
- (b) Interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding, action, or enquiry, criminal or civil, in respect of any breach of, or offence committed against, or forfeiture incurred, or liability accrued under or in consequence of any provision of those Orders; or affect any penalty or punishment incurred in respect of any such breach, offence, forfeiture, or liability.
- 3. On the coming into force of this Order, the China Order in Council, 1925, and any Orders amending that Order, shall apply and shall be deemed to have applied and to have had full force and effect within the limits of this Order as from the 1st day of October, 1930, and all acts done within the limits of this Order between the 1st day of October, 1930, aforesaid and the coming into force of this Order, under the authority of the China Order in Council, 1925, and any Orders amending that Order, shall in all respects be fully as valid and effective as if this Order had come into force on the 1st October, 1930.
- 4. This Order shall be exhibited in the public office of the Supreme Court at Shanghai and at the office of H.M. Consulate at Wei-hai-wei, and shall come into force on the day of exhibition.
- 5. This Order may be cited as the Wei-hai-wei Order in Council, 1930.

And the Right Honourable Arthur Henderson, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein.

NATIONAL DEBT AND LOCAL LOANS ACT, 1887 (50 AND 51 VICT. C. 16).

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury give notice that pursuant to Section 13 (5) of the National Debt and Local Loans Act, 1887, They have directed the creation of £4,429,100 Local Loans Three per cent. Stock, which Stock has been issued to the National Debt Commissioners.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 30th January, 1931, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £30,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from

Monday, the 2nd February, 1931, to Saturday, the 7th February, 1931, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
- 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
