The following Statute made by the University of Oxford, on the 17th day of December, 1930, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

#### UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON WEDNESDAY, 17TH DECEMBER, 1930.

Whereas it is expedient to amend § 18 of Titulus XIX of the Statutes of the University of Oxford concerning College Contributions for University purposes, Now the Said University, in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it, enacts, subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council, as

1. In Statt. Tit. XIX. § 18 (Statuta, ed. 1930 p. 334), in the proviso to item (iv) of clause 2 the words "after five years from the coming into operation of this sub-sectio and after every subsequent period of five years" shall be struck out, and the words "from time

to time" shall be inserted between "may" and "propose".

2. Ibid., item (xi) of clause 3 shall be struck out and the following item shall be substituted:—

"(xi) In each year of every period of three calendar years after the first day of January, 1931

(a) the average annual expenditure during the three years immediately preceding the commencement of each such period on repairs in connexion with the estates of the College or 45 per cent. of the average of the gross rents of lands and houses let at rack rent (other than houses in Oxford used for College purposes) during the same three years, which ever is the less;

(b) the average annual expenditure during the three years immediately preceding the commencement of each such period on repairs in connexion with the buildings and premises of the College or with houses in Oxford used for College purposes."

3. Ibid., item (xii) of clause 3 shall be struck out and the following item shall be substituted:—

"(xii) In respect of expenditure on works, whether external or internal:

(1) When the expenditure is met by a loan, any payments which the College

makes by way of interest, and in repayment of principal, or to a sinking fund for the liquidation of any loan;

(2) When the expenditure is met out of revenue, the first £1,000 or any less amount

so expended in any one year; Provided that in the case of any loan contracted before the first day of January, 1927, the deduction shall be reckoned in accordance with the provisions of the University Statutes in force at the time when the loan was contracted."

- 4. Ibid., item (c) of clause 5 shall be struck out and the following item shall be substituted:-
  - "(c) In respect of the income accruing from the trusts described in item (xiii) (a) of clause 3 of this sub-sectio a payment bearing the same proportion to the whole amount payable by the College under items (a) and (b) of this clause as the said income bears to the net revenue of the College."
- 5. The Statute as hereby amended shall determine the contributions of Colleges payable in the year 1931 and thereafter.

#### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 6th February, 1931, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £30,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 9th February, 1931, to Saturday, the 14th February, 1931, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.
- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be
- 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
- 8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

# MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 2, Sub-section (4) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade give notice that in pursuance of an application received by them for the making of an Order in Council to require imported adhesive insulating tape for electrical purposes to bear an indication of origin, they have made a reference to the Standing Committee appointed by them under the Act in respect thereof.

Attention is called to the fact that, while, under the provisions of the above Act, the Committee must in every case referred to them consider whether the goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of sale or exposure for sale, they may also at their discretion consider and report upon the question whether such goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of importation.

Cessation of landing in Great Britain of Animals from the Port of Newry, Northern Ireland.

The Animals (Landing from Ireland, Channel Islands and Isle of Man) Order of 1923, shall be read and have effect as if the Port of Newry was excluded from the list set out in the First Schedule to that Order of Ports in Ireland from which Animals may be brought to Landing Places in Great Britain.

And whereas in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Section 22 the Corporation are about to provide and equip trolley vehicles along the route of the tramway hereinafter described, authorised by the Derby Corporation Act, 1901; that is to say:-
