

Wressle Farm in the parish of Broughton in the rural district of Glanford Brigg comprising an area of 105 acres or thereabouts, together with the buildings erected thereon;

(2) To authorise the Council to construct works for taking or intercepting water from the said Wressle Farm;

(3) To empower the Council, with the consent of the Minister of Health, by agreement to purchase take on lease acquire and hold such further lands as they may require from time to time for the purposes of their water undertaking;

(4) To enable the Council to exercise the powers of a local authority under Section 54 of the Public Health Act, 1875, for the carrying of water mains through across or under any road street etc. and through or under any lands within or without their district, which, for this purpose, shall be deemed to include any area within the water limits of the Council;

(5) To empower the Council, with the consent of the Minister to borrow money for any of the foregoing purposes;

(6) For the several purposes of the Application or for purposes connected with, incidental to, or consequent on those purposes to make any such alteration or amendment of the said Local Acts, or of any other Local Act or of any Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts or of the Public Health Act, 1875, and in force in the said district as may be necessary or desirable:

And whereas it is proposed that a Provisional Order should be issued in compliance with the said Application:

And whereas the Council have made application to the Minister of Health for his sanction to the borrowing of the sum of £6,075 for the purchase of Wressle Farm, stamp duty and costs:

Butler, Esq., A.M.Inst.C.E., one of the Inspectors of the Ministry of Health will attend at the Council Offices, Scunthorpe, on Wednesday, the eleventh day of February, 1931, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to hold a Local Inquiry into the subject-matter of the said Applications and the proposed Provisional Order.

For the purposes of the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1928, and all Orders and Licences made or granted and issued thereunder, and any Local Act relating to the supply of electricity, the Electricity Commissioners approve

of the construction and pattern of the meter (hereinafter described) for the measurement of electrical energy when supplied on the constant pressure, two wire, single phase alternating current system and known as the Bergmann Type V.N.E. Single Phase Watthour Meter, rated size 5 amperes, 110 volts, at a frequency of 50 cycles per second.

Provided that the meter be constructed as described in the specification and drawings deposited at the National Physical Laboratory, Teddington, Middlesex, dated and numbered 28th October, 1930, and No. 130, and be in accordance with the pattern meters Nos. 1761170 and 1761171, deposited at the National Physical Laboratory on the 22nd March, 1930, by or on behalf of Bergmann Electric Company Limited, 82, Victoria Street, London, S.W. 1, and sealed by the National Physical Laboratory at the instance of the Electricity Commissioners.

The Electricity Commissioners further approve of the means provided for fixing meters of this description, and for connecting them with the service lines as described in the specification and drawings above referred to.

#### ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 27TH JANUARY, 1931.)

#### FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1931 (No. 3).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

##### *Contraction of Sussex Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.*

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1931 shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area described in the Schedule to that Order.

##### *Commencement.*

2. This Order shall come into operation on the second day of February, nineteen hundred and thirty-one.

##### *Short Title.*

3. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1931 (No. 3).
