WHEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the Air Navigation Act, 1920, His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the Air Navigation (Consolidation) Order, 1923, and the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1925, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1927, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 3) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 4) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1929, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 3) Order, 1929, and the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1930, amending the first-mentioned Order:

And whereas it is expedient that the first-mentioned Order as so amended (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") should be further amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas the provisions of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The following amendments shall be made in Schedule V to the principal Order:—

(a) In paragraph 1, after the words "in respect of the capacity in which he is so acting" there shall be inserted the words "and in respect of the class or type of aircraft in which he is so acting";

(b) After paragraph 7, the following paragraph shall be inserted—

"7A. A member of the operative crew of a passenger or goods flying machine of any type, who is manœuvring the machine under the direct supervision of the pilot thereof, shall be deemed to be the holder of a licence in respect of the capacity in which he is so acting, if he holds a pilot's licence, granted or rendered valid under the provisions of this Order, to fly passenger or goods flying machines of that or some other type.

In this paragraph the expression "passenger or goods flying machine" means a flying machine carrying passengers or goods for hire or reward or being flown for any industrial purpose";

(c) In paragraph 9, after the word "authority" there shall be inserted the

words "in any part of His Majesty's dominions outside Great Britain and Northern Ireland or";

(d) Paragraph 10 shall be omitted.

2. The following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraph 7 of Schedule VI to the principal Order:—

"7. The fee chargeable for the validation of a pilot's, navigator's or engineer's licence under paragraph 9 of Schedule V to this Order shall be 5s."

3. This Order may be cited as the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1930.

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Schedule VIII to the principal Order shall be amended by omitting paragraph 4 thereof and by substituting for paragraph 11 thereof the following paragraph—

"11.—(1) An aircraft shall not start on a voyage to a place outside Great Britain and Northern Ireland from any place therein other than a Customs aerodrome.

(2) An aircraft shall not, in the course of such a voyage as aforesaid, land at any place in Great Britain and Northern Ireland other than a Customs aerodrome specified in the application for clearance as hereinafter provided, unless compelled so to do owing to accident, stress of weather or unavoidable cause.

(3) An aircraft shall not leave any Customs aerodrome from which it is about to start on such a voyage or at which it has landed in the course of such a voyage, unless the pilot of the aircraft has obtained clearance and authority for the aircraft to proceed from that aerodrome.

(4) The pilot of every aircraft starting on such a voyage shall deliver to the proper officer of Customs and Excise at the Customs aerodrome from which the aircraft is about to start the journey log-book belonging to the aircraft and also the following documents in duplicate, namely—

(a) an application for clearance in the form prescribed by the Commissioners, specifying the Customs aerodromes (if any) at which it is intended that the aircraft shall land in the course of the voyage; and

(b) a manifest and declaration in the form prescribed by the Commissioners declaring what goods and stores (if any) are on board the aircraft;

and the said documents, when signed by the said officer, shall be the clearance and authority for the aircraft to proceed from that aerodrome.

(5) If an aircraft in the course of such a voyage lands at a Customs aerodrome, the pilot of the aircraft shall, before the aircraft leaves that aerodrome, deliver to the proper officer of Customs and Excise at that aerodrome—

(a) the journey log-book belonging to the aircraft;

(b) the clearance and authority for the aircraft to proceed from the Customs aerodrome which the aircraft last left; and

(c) a manifest and declaration in duplicate in the form prescribed by the Commissioners declaring what goods and stores (if any) have been loaded on board the aircraft at the aerodrome at which it has so landed;

and the said manifest and declaration when signed by the said officer, together with the said clearance and authority when countersigned by the said officer, shall be the clearance and authority for the aircraft to proceed from the aerodrome at which it has so landed.

(6) A pilot shall truly state in every manifest, declaration and application for clearance, which is delivered by him in accordance with this paragraph to the proper officer of Customs and Excise, the particulars required by the forms respectively prescribed by the Commissioners."

2. This Order may be cited as the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 3) Order, 1930.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF MALE TELEGRAPHIST IN LONDON IN THE DEPARTMENT OF THE POSTMASTER-GENERAL.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 15 and 18. If an Examination begins in one or the first six months of any year, candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st day of April in that year. If an Examination begins in one of the last six months of any year, candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of October in that year. A candidate who attained the age of 15 on the governing date would be admitted to the examination, but a candidate who attained the age of 18 on that date would not be admitted.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such a candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalisation or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

4. At each Examination the number of candidates to be selected will be such as the Postmaster-General may from time to time fix.

5. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz. :—

1. English.
2. History.
3. Geography.
4. Arithmetic.

Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners in Handwriting and in the Examination as a whole.

6. The Examination is open only to candidates actually resident in the London district; and no candidate will be eligible for appointment unless he can satisfy the Postmaster-General that he possesses the required local residential qualification. It will be within the authority of the Postmaster-General to decline to employ a candidate successful in the Examination if he is not satisfied on enquiry that the candidate complies with this requirement.

7. Candidates must be at least 5 feet in height, and no officer will be retained in the Service who does not attain the height of 5 feet 4 inches before completing his nineteenth year.

8. In view of the difficulty which left-handed operators are likely to experience in the use of instruments designed for right-handed operators, candidates who are markedly left-handed are ineligible for appointment.

9. (i) Persons actually serving in the Army, Navy, or Air Force are ineligible to compete. (ii) Persons holding situations in the Civil Service, Probationary Engineer Cadets in the Navy, and Apprentices in His Majesty's Dockyards must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination, before the commencement of the competition.

10. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

11. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

12. A fee of 10s. will be required from every candidate attending an Examination.

RHYMNEY VALLEY SEWERAGE BOARD.

ABERTILLERY AND DISTRICT WATER BOARD.

(2) To amend section 55 of the Act of 1910 by altering the basis on which the rates for supply of water for domestic purposes are levied from "annual value" to "net annual value"; and increasing the maximum rate for a supply of water for domestic purposes to fifteen per centum per annum on the net annual value of the premises supplied with a minimum charge of twenty shillings per annum;

(3) To authorise the Minister of Health, on the application of the Board or of twenty consumers of water, to vary the rates and charges for supply of water;

(4) To repeal section 2 of the Act of 1926 which empowers the Board to make an additional charge in respect of every water closet beyond the first;

(9) To extend the power of the Board to inspect premises so as to enable any duly authorised officer at any reasonable times between the fourth hours of four o'clock in the afternoon and one hour after sunset to enter any house or premises supplied with water in order to examine if there be any waste or misuse of such water;
