WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 7th day of February, 1931 (C.W. 853/31), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas there is at present a surplus of Lieutenant-Commanders and Lieutenants of certain seniorities:

“And whereas we consider it desirable that steps should be taken to reduce the numbers of those Officers on the Active List to those estimated to be necessary:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by

Your Order in Council, to sanction the following proposal:—

“Lieutenant - Commanders, R.N., of seniorities 1923 to 1931 and Lieutenants, R.N., of seniority 1923, to be given the option, at our discretion, of retiring on or after the 1st April, 1931, with retired pay on the following scale:—

“£165 a year with an addition of £7 10s. a year for each of the first six complete years of service, and an addition of £12 10s. a year for each complete year of service subsequent thereto, in the ranks of Lieutenant and Lieutenant-Commander—in reckoning ‘service’, time on unemployed pay or half pay to count as for retired pay generally.

“The rates of retired pay hereby authorised to be regarded as standard rates comparable with those authorised in Schedule V, Section IX, of Your Order in Council bearing date 22nd day of January, 1920, and the actual rates payable from time to time to be determined in the same manner and reviewed in the light of changes in the cost of living at the same dates as retired pay authorised by that Order.

“Officers serving abroad who are allowed to retire under this scheme to be granted full pay up to the date of arrival in England, provided they return by a direct route without delay, but not to be eligible for any extension of full pay in respect of foreign service leave.

"Nothing in this Order shall preclude us from withholding either in whole or in part these special terms in any particular case, or from retiring any officer during the currency of this scheme under any other regulations which may be applicable to his case.

"Lieutenant-Commanders on the Supplementary List and Lieutenant-Commanders and Lieutenants promoted from Commissioned Warrant rank or Warrant rank not to be eligible for retirement under these special terms.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence to this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the Copyright Act 1911 (1 and 2 Geo. 5, c. 46) authority is conferred upon His Majesty to extend by Order in Council the protection of the said Act to certain classes of foreign works within any part of His Majesty's dominions, other than self-governing dominions, to which the said Act extends:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the Rulers of the Federated Malay States have made, or have undertaken to make, such provisions as it appears to His Majesty expedient to require for the protection of works entitled to copyright under the provisions of Part I of the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority conferred upon Him by the Copyright Act 1911, is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. The copyright Act 1911, including the provisions as to existing works, shall subject to the provisions of the said Act and of this Order apply

(a) to works first published in the Federated Malay States, in like manner as if they had been first published within the parts of His Majesty's dominions to which the said Act extends;

(b) to literary, dramatic, musical and artistic works the authors whereof were at the time of the making of the work subjects of the Rulers of the Federated Malay States, in like manner as if the authors had been British subjects;

(c) in respect of residence in the Federated Malay States, in like manner as if such residence had been residence in the parts of His Majesty's dominions to which the said Act extends.

2. Where any musical work to which this Order applies has been published before the date of this Order but no contrivances by means of which the work may be mechanically performed have before the said date been lawfully made or placed on sale within the parts of His Majesty's dominions to which this Order applies, copyright in the work shall include all rights conferred by the said Act with respect to the making of records, perforated rolls and other contrivances by means of which the work may be mechanically performed.

3. In the application to works to which this Order applies of Sections 1 (2) (d) and 19 of the Copyright Act 1911 the date of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the Act and for the passing of the Act in Sections 19 (7) and 19 (8) wherever those expressions occur.

4. Where any person has, before the date of this Order, taken any action whereby he has incurred any expenditure or liability in connection with the reproduction or performance of any work in a manner which at the time was lawful, or for the purpose of or with a view to the reproduction or performance of a work at a time when such reproduction or performance would, but for the making of this Order, have been lawful, nothing in this Order shall diminish or prejudice any rights or interest arising from or in connection with such action which are subsisting and valuable at the said date unless the person who, by virtue of this Order, becomes entitled to restrain such reproduction or performance agrees to pay such compensation as failing agreement may be determined in accordance with the provisions of the Copyright Act 1911.

5. This Order shall apply to all parts of His Majesty's dominions, including any territories under His Majesty's protection, to which the Copyright Act 1911 extends, except to the self-governing dominions and to Southern Rhodesia.

6. This Order shall be construed as if it formed part of the Copyright Act, 1911.

7. This Order may be cited as the Copyright (Federated Malay States) Order, 1931.

"We, the Right Reverend Leonard Hedley by Divine permission Lord Bishop of Sheffield,

do in pursuance of the twenty-sixth section of an Act of Parliament of the First and Second years of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Cap. 106, hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:—

"1. There is in the County of York and Diocese of Sheffield the Vicarage of Thurnscoe the Parish whereof contains according to the last census a population of 4,988 people.

"The nett annual value of the Benefice of Thurnscoe is £553.

"The Patronage of the said Vicarage is vested in William Charles de Meuron Earl Fitzwilliam and the Reverend Henry George Wheeler is the present Vicar thereof.

"2. There is also in the said County and Diocese the Vicarage of Clayton with Frickley the Parish whereof contains according to the last census a population of 290 people.

"The nett annual value of the Benefice of Clayton with Frickley is £350.

"The Patronage of the said Vicarage is vested in John Ralph Patientius Warde-Aldam and the Reverend Charles Thomas Belcher Wilkinson is the present Vicar thereof.

"3. There is also in the said County and Diocese the Vicarage of St. George Doncaster the Parish whereof contains according to the last census a population of 5,638 people.

"The nett annual value of the Benefice of St. George Doncaster is £700.

"The Patronage of the said Vicarage is vested in the Lord Bishop of Sheffield and the Reverend Canon Richard Brook is the present Vicar thereof.

"4. There is also in the said County and Diocese the Vicarage of Arksey the Parish whereof contains according to the last census a population of 709 people.

"The nett annual value of the Vicarage of Arksey is £300.

"The Patronage of the said Vicarage is vested in George Gavin Burn and the Reverend John Pierce Price is the present Vicar thereof.

"5. There is also in the said County and Diocese the Vicarage of Kirk Sandall the Parish whereof contains according to the last census a population of 497 people.

"The nett annual value of the Benefice of Kirk Sandall is £550.

"The Patronage of the said Vicarage is vested in the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain and the Reverend George Cecil Francis Soden is the present Vicar thereof.

"6. There is also in the said County and Diocese the Vicarage of Barnby Dun the Parish whereof contains according to the last census a population of 852 people.

"The nett annual value of the Benefice of Barnby Dun is £234.

"The Patronage of the said Vicarage is vested in the Reverend Thomas Killam Killam and the Reverend Canon Thomas Forster Rolfe is the present Vicar thereof.

"7. It appears to us under the provisions of the said Act of the First and Second Vict., Cap. 106, and the Act of the Second and Third years of the same reign, Cap. 49, the following alterations of the contents and boundaries of the above mentioned Parishes may advantageously be made, such alterations being in our opinion desirable owing to the fact that portions of the Parishes hereinafter more par-

ticularly referred to are in each case nearer to the Parish Church of the Parish to which it is proposed to annex the same than to the Parish Church of the Parish to which they now belong and that such alterations will be for the convenience of the inhabitants of such portions.

"8. The separation of that part of the Parish of Thurnscoe which is coloured pink on the plan Number 1 attached hereto from that Parish and the annexation of the same to the Parish of Clayton with Frickley adjoining.

"9. The separation of that part of the Parish of St. George Doncaster which is coloured red on the plan Number 2 attached hereto from that Parish and the annexation of the same to the adjoining Parish of Arksey.

"10. The separation of that part of the Parish of Barnby Dun which is coloured blue on the plan Number 3 attached hereto from that Parish and the annexation of the same to the adjoining Parish of Kirk Sandall.

"11. The separation of those parts of the Parish of St. George Doncaster which are edged round with blue on the said plan Number 3 and are known as Long Sandall from that Parish and the annexation of the same to the Parish of Kirk Sandall.

"12. Pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the said first mentioned Act of Parliament we the said Lord Bishop of Sheffield have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the portions of Parishes above referred to and the mode in which it appears to us the alterations may be best effected and how the changes consequent thereon in respect of the Ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe dues and payments and in respect of the Patronage and the rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties concerned and we do hereby submit the same to your Grace together with the Consents in writing of the said Patrons and Incumbents and in case you shall, on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied therewith we request that your Grace will be pleased to certify the same with the consents aforesaid by your report to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME

"1. It is proposed to separate that part of the Parish of Thurnscoe which is coloured pink on the plan Number 1 attached hereto and to annex the same for Ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining Parish of Clayton with Frickley.

"2. It is also proposed to separate that part of the Parish of St. George Doncaster which is coloured red on the plan Number 2 attached hereto from that Parish and to annex the same for Ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining Parish of Arksey.

"3. It is also proposed to separate that part of the Parish of Barnby Dun which is coloured blue on the plan Number 3 attached hereto from that Parish and to annex the same to the adjoining Parish of Kirk Sandall.

"4. It is also proposed to separate those parts of the Parish of St. George Doncaster which are edged round with blue on the said

plan Number 3 and are known as Long Sandall from that Parish and to annex the same to the Parish of Kirk Sandall.

"5. That the Incumbent of the Parish to which such portion of Parishes as aforesaid shall be respectively annexed under the provisions of this Scheme shall have the exclusive charge of Souls within the limits of such portions.

"6. That the fees for Marriages, Churchings and Burials and other Ecclesiastical dues, offerings and emoluments received from the said portions so transferred shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the Benefice to which such portions shall be respectively annexed.

"7. That no alterations shall be made as to the Patronage or the endowment of any of the Benefices affected by this Scheme.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power

enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Authorisation of Landing of Sheep for
Exceptional Purposes.*

1. The landing of the sheep described in the First Schedule hereto, which are intended for exceptional purposes, is hereby allowed subject to the provisions of Part II (Quarantine) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and Part VI (Animals intended to be landed at an Imported Animals Quarantine Station) of the Animals (Importation) Order of 1930 hereinafter referred to as the "Principal" Order and of this Order.

Definition of Quarantine Station.

2. The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby defined as an Imported Animals Quarantine Station for the purposes of the landing and detention of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto.

*Regulations applicable to the Sheep before and
on Landing.*

3.—(1) The sheep before being landed, shall be examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry, and if found by him to be free from symptoms of disease, shall forthwith be landed and moved in a float, cart, van, or other suitable vehicle under the supervision of the Inspector from the place of landing to the Imported Animals Quarantine Station described in the Second Schedule hereto; the said vehicle shall be cleansed and disinfected before and after such use in the manner prescribed by the Inspector.

(2) The animals shall be detained and isolated in the said Quarantine Station in accordance with the provisions of the Principal Order for a period of at least twenty-eight days after landing and when moved therefrom the animals shall be accompanied by the certificate and licence required by Article 40 (8) of the Principal Order.

(3) The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries may, if he thinks fit, cause any test to be applied to the animals landed under this Order.

Transshipment of animals from Channel Islands.

1. The transshipment of the animals specified in the Schedule to this Order at the port of Plymouth or at any other port in Great Britain is hereby prohibited except in accordance with the following conditions:—

Conditions of Transshipment.

(a) The animals specified in the Schedule hereto shall be transhipped from the s.s. "Ringwood" to the s.s. "Maryland" or other steamship at the port of Plymouth on or before the sixteenth day of March, 1931.

(b) The aforesaid vessels and any barge or craft used for the purpose of the transshipment, shall be cleansed and disinfected, at intervals not exceeding twenty-four hours while in any port in Great Britain, and while any animal described in the Schedule hereto remains on such vessel, and immediately after the removal of the animals therefrom for transshipment, in the manner hereinafter described.

(i) All parts of the vessel, barge or craft with which an animal or its dung has come in contact shall be scraped and swept, then thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water and then disinfected by being thoroughly coated or washed with an approved disinfectant.

(iii) All scrapings and sweepings, dung, litter and other matter removed shall if possible be thoroughly mixed with quicklime and thereafter without delay be effectually destroyed by fire on board the vessel. Such scrapings and sweepings, dung, litter and other material shall not be landed unless and until they have been well mixed with quicklime, and if landed be forthwith effectually removed from con-

tact with animals or effectually destroyed by fire.

(iv) For the purposes of this Order an approved disinfectant is either a five per cent. solution of standard phenol or a disinfectant approved by the Minister for the purpose of the Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Order of 1926, used at the dilution at which such disinfectant is approved.

(c) The Animals transhipped under the provisions of this Order shall continue to be deemed imported animals and shall not be landed in Great Britain without the authority of the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries.

Offences.

2.—(1) If anything is done or omitted to be done as regards cleansing and disinfection in contravention of this Order, the owner and the charterer and the Master of any vessel aforesaid and the owner and person in charge of the animals, fittings, pens, hurdles, gangways, utensils, dung, litter, or other thing, shall, each according to and in respect of his acts or defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2) Any person otherwise committing or aiding, abetting, counselling, or procuring the commission of any breach of the provisions of this Order shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(b) The aforesaid vessels and any barge or craft used for the purpose of the transhipment, shall be cleansed and disinfected, at intervals not exceeding twenty-four hours while in any port in Great Britain, and while any animal described in the Schedule hereto remains on such vessel, and immediately after the removal of the animals therefrom for transhipment, in the manner hereinafter described.

(i) All parts of the vessel, barge or craft with which an animal or its dung has come in contact shall be scraped and swept, then thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water and then disinfected by being thoroughly coated or washed with an approved disinfectant.
