UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON
TUESDAY, 17TH FEBRUARY, 1931.

Whereas it is expedient to provide that the emoluments of vacant Professorships shall be paid to the Common University Fund: Now THE UNIVERSITY in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it, ENACTS, subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council, AS FOLLOWS.

In Statt. Tit. IV. Sect. i. § 2 (a), cl.^o 4 (*Statuta*, ed. 1930, p. 55), the words "office; and the emoluments of it accruing during that period" shall be struck out, and the words "office. 5. The emoluments of a Professorship during a vacancy or period of suspension" shall be substituted.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 6th March, 1931, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £30,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 9th March, 1931, to Saturday, the 14th March, 1931, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

SAFEGUARDING OF INDUSTRIES.

ORDER DATED TWENTY-FOURTH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1931, MADE BY THE TREASURY UNDER SECTION 12 OF THE FINANCE ACT, 1926 (16 AND 17 GEO. V, c. 22).

Whereas Subsection (1) of Section 12 of the Finance Act, 1926, provides that the Treasury may by Order exempt any articles mentioned in the Order which are liable to duty under the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, as amended by that Act from that duty if they are satisfied that, having regard to the nature or small value of the articles it is inexpedient that the duty should be charged.

And whereas having regard to the nature or small value of the articles specified in the Schedule to this Order, it appears to the Treasury, after consultation with the Board of Trade, that it is inexpedient that duty should be charged under the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, as amended by the Finance Act, 1926, on those articles.

Now therefore we, the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the powers conferred on us by the said Section 12 of the Finance Act, 1926, hereby order as follows:—

Such of the articles mentioned in the Schedule to this Order as are not entered under the Customs Acts before the tenth day of March, 1931, shall be exempt from the duty imposed on the said articles by the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, as amended by the Finance Act, 1926.

SAFEGUARDING OF INDUSTRIES.

ORDER DATED TWENTY-FOURTH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1931, MADE BY THE TREASURY UNDER SECTION 10 OF THE FINANCE ACT, 1922 (12 AND 13 GEO. V, c. 17).

Whereas it is provided by Section 10 of the Finance Act, 1922, that where the Treasury, after consultation with the Board of Trade, are satisfied as respects any article which is liable to duty under the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, by reason only that some ingredient or part of the article is liable to duty under that Act, that it is inexpedient,

having regard to the nature of that ingredient or part and to the smallness of its value in comparison with the total value of the article, that duty should be charged under that Act the Treasury may by order exempt that article from duty under the said Act.

And whereas the articles specified in the Schedule to this Order are liable to duty under Part I of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, as amended by the Finance Act, 1926, by reason only that some ingredient or part of each such article is liable to duty under Part I of that Act as amended.

And whereas the Treasury, after consultation with the Board of Trade, are satisfied as respects the articles specified in the said Schedule that it is inexpedient, having regard to the nature of the dutiable ingredients or parts and to the smallness of their value in comparison with the total value of the said articles, that duty should be charged under Part I of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, as amended.

Now therefore we, the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the power conferred on us by the said Section 10 of the Finance Act, 1922, hereby order as follows:—

Such of the articles mentioned in the Schedule to this Order as are not entered under the Customs Acts before the tenth day of March, 1931, shall be exempt from the duty imposed on the said articles by Part I of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, as amended.

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACTS, 1901 to 1929.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, in pursuance of Section 80 of the Factory and Workshop Act,

1901, that he has amended the draft Regulations under Section 79 of the Act, for factories and workshops, or parts thereof, in which the processes of handling, moving, breaking, crushing, grinding or sieving of refractory material containing not less than 80 per cent. total silica or any processes in the manufacture of silica bricks or other articles containing not less than 80 per cent. total silica are carried on, and that he proposes to make the Regulations as in the amended draft.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE NON-ESTABLISHED SITUATION OF JUNIOR TECHNICAL EXAMINER (MALE) IN THE LANDS BRANCH OF THE WAR DEPARTMENT.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 18 and 22; candidates must be of the prescribed

age on the first day of the examination. A candidate who attained the age of 18 on the first day of the examination would be admitted, but a candidate who attained the age of 22 on that day would not be admitted.

The following exceptions to the above age limits are allowed:—

(i) Persons who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy, or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding five years during which they have so served.

(ii) Persons who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made—

(a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.

(c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalisation or by any other voluntary and formal act.

The consent of the authorities of the War Office is required before a candidate either of whose parents was of other than British nationality at birth can be appointed to that Department.

3. No person actually serving in the Army, Navy, or Air Force will be eligible for admission to the examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the competition.

4. The subjects of examination and the marks they will carry are as follows:—

1. English	200
2. Arithmetic	100
3. Surveying	200
4. Drawing	300
5. Law	100

Candidates must pass to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners in Drawing and in the aggregate of the marks obtained.

5. Application for permission to attend an examination must be made in the writing of the candidate, at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

6. A fee of £1 10s. will be required from each candidate attending an examination.

7. A successful candidate will be appointed in a non-established capacity subject to his satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners that he is eligible in respect of age, nationality, health and character; he will be eligible for subsequent appointment to the established grade of Technical Examiner when a vacancy occurs therein, a further fee of £1 10s. being the balance of the prescribed fee of £3 being payable on establishment.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination

will be held in London under the foregoing Regulations, commencing on the 27th May, 1931.

At least one vacancy will be filled on the result of this examination, if the necessary candidate should be found to be qualified in all respects.

No person will be admitted to Examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 16th April, 1931, an application, in the candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.
