

2. There shall be offered for competition in each year not less than six Eton Foundation Scholarships, of which not less than four shall be offered as Entrance Scholarships, and not less than six Open Foundation Scholarships. Subject to this provision the Council shall settle, in such manner as they think fit, what Foundation Scholarships, Minor Scholarships and Exhibitions shall be offered or awarded, subject to any regulations that may be made by Ordinance. All Entrance Scholarships (other than Eton Scholarships) and Open Exhibitions under this Statute shall be awarded upon the result of an open examination held for the purpose.

3. [A Scholarship or Exhibition to which the holder was elected before entering the College shall be tenable in the first instance for two years, but may be prolonged by the Council for a further period or further periods; provided that the total period of prolongation shall in no case exceed two years, the tenure being in each case reckoned from the first day of the term in which the holder begins residence.]

Delete paragraph 3 and substitute—

“An Entrance Scholarship or Exhibition shall be tenable in the first instance for two years, reckoned from the first day of the term in which the holder begins residence. A Scholarship or Exhibition awarded after entrance shall be tenable in the first instance for one year.”

4. [A Senior Foundation Scholarship shall be tenable until the holder completes four years from the 29th day of September next preceding the date of his beginning residence in the University. Such a Scholarship may be prolonged by the Council for a further period or further periods, provided that the total period of prolongation shall in no case exceed two and a half years.]

Delete paragraph 4 and substitute—

“A Scholarship or Exhibition may be prolonged by the Council for a further period or further periods; provided that the total period of tenure shall in no case extend beyond seven years in the case of a Scholarship and beyond four and a half years in the case of a Minor Scholarship or an Exhibition from the 25th day of March next preceding the date of the holder's beginning residence in the University.”

5. [A Minor Scholarship or Exhibition to which the holder was elected after entering the College shall be tenable for one year. But such a Scholarship or Exhibition may be prolonged by the Council for a further period or further periods, provided that the total period of prolongation shall in no case go beyond the completion of four years from the 29th day of September next preceding the date of his beginning residence in the University.]

Delete paragraph 5 and substitute—

“A Scholarship or Exhibition shall be *ipso facto* vacated by the holder of it on his going out of residence, unless the condition of residence is expressly waived by the Council; but the holder of a Scholarship or Exhibition who vacates it under this section shall be eligible for re-election to it by the Council, subject to the same conditions as to tenure as before.”

6. No Scholarship or Exhibition shall be tenable with another Scholarship or Exhibition in the College, or with a Fellowship in any College in the University, or, unless the Council otherwise determine, with any office or emolument in any other College in the University.

7. Every candidate for a Scholarship, not being already a member of the College, shall bring a satisfactory certificate of moral character.

8. The time and manner of examinations for Scholarships, and the day or days of election and admission thereto, shall from time to time be fixed by the Council.

9. The electors to Scholarships and Exhibitions awarded before entrance shall be the Provost, or in his absence the Vice-Provost, and two or more Fellows to be appointed annually by the Council, who may also appoint any examiners to assist the electors; and the electors to Scholarships and Exhibitions awarded after entrance shall be the members of the Council, unless the Governing Body determine otherwise by Ordinance.

10. The manner of electing to Scholarships and Exhibitions and all proceedings relating to the election shall be in the discretion of the electors; provided that no candidate shall be elected a Scholar without the concurrence of at least one half of the electors present, the Provost, or in his absence the Vice-Provost, or in the absence of both the senior elector present, having a second or casting vote in case of an equality of votes; provided also that no person shall vote at an election to Entrance Scholarships who has not taken part in the examination for the same.

11. The electors shall not be bound to elect to a Scholarship or Exhibition any candidate whom they shall not consider of sufficient merit for election, and they shall have power to require from any candidate a declaration that he intends to devote himself to the studies of the University during the whole of the time preceding his admission to his first degree, or such other declaration as to his intention as they may think desirable.

12. Every candidate elected to a Scholarship shall be admitted a Scholar by the Provost, or in his absence the Vice-Provost. The emoluments of a Scholarship awarded before entrance shall begin when the Scholar begins residence, those of a Scholarship awarded after entrance from the time of his election, subject to any custom of reckoning from a quarter day. [provided that no holder of a Scholarship awarded before entrance shall, upon election to a Senior Scholarship, be required to be again admitted a Scholar.]

Paragraph 12—

Delete the words in brackets.

13. The Council shall from time to time make such regulations as they shall think proper with respect to the residence and studies of Scholars; and any Scholar who shall fail to conform to such regulations, or shall not make reasonable progress in his studies, may be deprived by the Council of his Scholarship, or of the whole or part of the emoluments of the same.

14. Every Scholar shall proceed to his degree of Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Laws, or to some equal degree at his regular time, except
