PURSUANT to section 5 of the County Courts Act, 1903, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Schedule to the County Courts Order in Council, 1924, shall be amended as follows:—

In Circuit 58, (a) Circuit No. 58 is removed from the first column of the said Schedule; (b) Exeter is removed from the second column thereof; and (c) Crediton and Okehampton are removed from the third column thereof.

2. This Order may be cited as the County Courts (Extended Jurisdiction) Order in Council, 1931, and shall come into operation on the first day of April, 1931, and the County Courts Order in Council, 1924, as amended, shall have effect as further amended by this Order.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Dockyard Ports Regulation Act, 1865, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council, from time to time, by Order in Council, to define the limits of a Dockyard Port for the purposes of that Act, and to make regulations in relation to any Dockyard Port for all or any of the purposes in the said Act particularly mentioned, and for such other purposes as from time to time seem necessary, with a view to the proper protection of His Majesty's vessels, dockyards or property, or to the requirements of His Majesty's Naval Service:

And whereas by the same Act it is also enacted that in relation to any Dockyard Port it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council, from time to time, by Order in Council, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, to make rules concerning the Lights or Signals to be carried or used, and the steps for avoiding collision to be taken by His Majesty's vessels, and other vessels navigating the waters of the Port and of the approaches thereto:

And whereas in pursuance of the said Act certain Regulations and Rules were made by Orders in Council dated the 14th day of February, 1921, and the 12th day of March, 1923, with reference to the Dockyard Port of Rosyth:

And whereas it appears expedient to amend such Rules as hereinafter provided:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the said Act or otherwise in Him vested, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order shall take effect from one calendar month from the date hereof.

2. The Second Schedule to the said Order in Council dated the 14th day of February, 1921, as amended by the said Order in Council dated the 12th day of March, 1923, is hereby repealed.

3. The following Rules shall have effect in relation to the Dockyard Port of Rosyth, and shall be read and construed as the Second Schedule of the said Order in Council of the 14th day of February, 1921:—

SECOND SCHEDULE.

RULES.

Vessels to keep clear of H.M. Vessels or other vessels in charge of H.M. officers.

1. When one of H.M. Vessels or other vessel in charge of H.M. Officers intending to pass into, through or out of the Dockyard Port of Rosyth or under way within the limits of the Dockyard Port hoists the Red Ensign over M Flag (International Code—Alphabetical) by day, or a red light by night at the foremast head, all other vessels under way within the Dockyard Port shall keep out of the way of the said vessel, provided always that she shall be navigated with due care and at a moderate speed. When any vessel is showing either of the aforementioned signals, all other of H.M. Ships present in the port shall as a general warning hoist the Pilot Jack by day, or by night show position lights (two white lights vertical, 8 feet apart, hoisted at the peak, or if no gaff, hoisted abreast the maintop in the middle line of the ship or on the Ensign Staff). The same signals shall also be exhibited at the signal stations at Inchkeith and at H.M. Dockyard at Rosyth for the same purpose.

Passage through the Forth Bridge.

2. No vessel may pass another vessel under the Forth Bridge. Outgoing steamers shall have priority of passage through the Bridge over incoming steamers, and incoming steamers shall not approach the Bridge within a distance of half a mile until it shall have been ascertained that no vessel is coming out. Provided that this rule shall not apply when an incoming vessel is showing either of the signals laid down in Rule 1, when it is the duty of all other vessels to keep out of her way and to wait until she has passed through the Bridge before approaching the Bridge. If an outgoing vessel and an incoming vessel are both showing the same signal, the outgoing vessel shall have priority of passage.

Lights and Signals for Dredgers.

3. A dredger when at work or in position for working shall carry the following Lights and Signals, viz.:—

Lights between Sunset and Sunrise:—

(a) *Forward*.—In the forward part of the dredger at a height of not less than 20 and not exceeding 40 feet above the hull a white light in a lantern so constructed as to show a clear, uniform and unbroken light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least one mile.

(b) *Amidships*.—Three such white lights placed in a triangular form at least 8 feet apart, at right angles to the keel and with the apex uppermost, the base of the triangle to be at least 10 feet higher than the forward light and to be also higher than and clear of the framework, funnels or other erections upon the dredger. If so moored or working as to make it necessary to prohibit the passage of vessels on one or both sides, a red light or lights in a lantern so constructed as to show a clear, uniform and unbroken light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least one mile, is, or are, to be substituted for the lower light or lights of the triangle on the side or sides on which the passage is prohibited.

(c) *Aft*.—One such white light at or near the stern of the dredger and at such a height that it shall not be less than 15 feet lower than the forward light.

Signals between Sunrise and Sunset:—

Amidships.—Three black balls of not less than two feet in diameter placed in a triangular form at least 8 feet apart, at right angles to the keel with the apex uppermost, the base of the triangle to be higher than and clear of the framework, funnels or any other erection upon the dredger. If so moored or working so as to make it necessary to prohibit passage on one or both sides, a red flag or flags at least 5 feet in the hoist is, or are, to be substituted for the lower ball or balls of the triangle on the side or sides on which passage is prohibited.

Signal in Fog:—

In fog, mist, falling snow or heavy rain-storms a dredger at work or in a position for working, shall at intervals of not more than one minute sound a gong rapidly for about 5 seconds.

Signal directing vessels and boats to keep out of the way.

4. When any seagoing steamer, steamer towing, steam dredger or steam hopper within the limits of the Dockyard Port shall by reason of the crowded nature of the channel or anchorage or from any other cause find it unsafe or impracticable to keep out of the way of other vessels or boats, she shall signify the same by four short blasts of the steam whistle or syren blown in rapid succession, and all vessels and boats shall keep out of the way of the vessel making this signal; provided always that the latter shall be navigated with due care and at a moderate speed.

Penalties.

Note.—The master of every vessel to which these rules relate must observe and cause to

be observed the provisions thereof so far as they relate to his vessel, and any such master by his wilful default infringing or causing any infringement of any of the provisions of these rules is guilty of an offence.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Keyworth, in the County of Nottingham, and in the Diocese of Southwell:

"Where the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Keyworth is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in the Reverend Henry Pratt Ling, of Westwood, Kings Drive, Willingdon, in the County of Sussex, Clerk in Holy Orders:

"And whereas the said Henry Pratt Ling is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Keyworth now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Southwell for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Henry, now Bishop of Southwell, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Henry, Bishop of Southwell, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Keyworth which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter

recommended and proposed will, in our opinion, tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Keyworth:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Henry Pratt Ling (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Henry, Bishop of Southwell (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Keyworth, now vested in him, the said Henry Pratt Ling, as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Henry, Bishop of Southwell, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Henry, Bishop of Southwell, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwell.

"And whereas the said Gordon Gillott Hartwright is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Woodford now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Chelmsford for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Henry, now Bishop of Chelmsford, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary, he, the said Henry, Bishop of Chelmsford, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Woodford which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Woodford:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Gordon Gillott Hartwright (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Henry, Bishop of Chelmsford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Woodford, now vested in him, the said Gordon Gillott Hartwright, as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Henry, Bishop of Chelmsford, and his

successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Henry, Bishop of Chelmsford, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of April, 1929, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting (1) the union of the Benefice of Flixton and the Benefice of South Elmham, Saint Margaret (now part of the United Benefice of South Elmham, Saint Margaret, with South Elmham, Saint Peter); (2) the union of the Benefice of South Elmham, Saint Peter (now part of the said United Benefice of South Elmham, Saint Margaret with South Elmham, Saint Peter) and the Benefice of Ilketshall, Saint Margaret; (3) the union of the Benefice of South Elmham, All Saints with Saint Nicholas, and the Benefice of South Elmham, Saint James, and (4) the alteration of the boundaries of the Parish of the said Benefice of South Elmham, All Saints with Saint Nicholas by the transfer of a portion of such Parish to the Parish of the Benefice of Rumburgh (being one of the Parishes of the United Benefice of Rumburgh with South Elmham, Saint Michael) all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Suffolk and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon (1) the union of the said two Benefices of Flixton and South Elmham, Saint Margaret (2) the union of the said two Benefices of South Elmham, Saint Peter and Ilketshall, Saint Margaret (3) the union of the said two Benefices of South Elmham, All Saints with Saint Nicholas, and South Elmham, Saint James, and (4) the transfer of a portion of the Parish of the said Benefice of South Elmham, All Saints with Saint Nicholas, to the Parish of the said Benefice of Rumburgh duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended the said unions of Benefices and alteration of boundaries and the terms for effecting the same, and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions of Benefices and alteration of boundaries based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas all of the said Benefices are now full, the Reverend Donald Macaulay being the present Incumbent of the said Benefices of Flixton and South Elmham, Saint Margaret, with South Elmham, Saint Peter, the Reverend John Frederick Hughes being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ilketshall, Saint Margaret, the Reverend William Linton Wilson being the present Incumbent of the said Benefices of Rumburgh with South Elmham, Saint Michael, and South Elmham, All Saints with Saint Nicholas, and the Reverend Thomas Bennett being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of South Elmham, Saint James:

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of Flixton, South Elmham, Saint Margaret, with South Elmham, Saint Peter, South Elmham, All Saints with Saint Nicholas, and South Elmham Saint James, now belongs to one and the same Patron or Patrons:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Flixton and the part of the said United Benefice of South Elmham, Saint Margaret, with South Elmham, Saint Peter, which consists of the said Benefice of South Elmham, Saint Margaret, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of South Elmham, Saint Margaret, with Flixton' but the Parishes of the said Benefices of Flixton and South Elmham, Saint Margaret, shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That the said Benefice of Ilketshall, Saint Margaret, and the part of the said United Benefice of South Elmham, Saint Margaret with South Elmham, Saint Peter, which consists of the said Benefice of South Elmham, Saint Peter, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with

cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of South Elmham, Saint Peter, with Ilketshall, Saint Margaret' but the Parishes of the said Benefices of South Elmham, Saint Peter, and Ilketshall, Saint Margaret, shall continue distinct in all respects.

"3. That the said Benefice of South Elmham, All Saints with Saint Nicholas, and the said Benefice of South Elmham, Saint James, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of South Elmham, Saint James, with South Elmham, All Saints and Saint Nicholas' but the Parishes of the said Benefices of South Elmham, All Saints with Saint Nicholas, and South Elmham, Saint James, shall continue distinct in all respects.

"4. That with the consent of the said Donald Macaulay (testified by his signing this Scheme), upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the unions referred to in Clauses 1 and 2 of this Scheme shall forthwith take effect if the said Benefice of Ilketshall, Saint Margaret shall then be vacant, but if such Benefice be not then vacant then such unions shall take effect upon the next avoidance after that day of the said Benefice of Ilketshall, Saint Margaret, and in either case the said Donald Macaulay if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Flixton shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of South Elmham, Saint Margaret, with Flixton.

"5. That with the consent of the said Thomas Bennett (testified by his signing this Scheme), upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union referred to in Clause 3 of this Scheme shall forthwith take effect if the said Benefice of South Elmham, All Saints with Saint Nicholas shall then be vacant, but if such Benefice be not then vacant then such union shall take effect upon the next avoidance after that day of the said Benefice of South Elmham, All Saints with Saint Nicholas, and in either case the said Thomas Bennett, if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of South Elmham, Saint James, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of South Elmham, Saint James with South Elmham, All Saints and Saint Nicholas.

"6. That upon the taking effect of the unions referred to in Clauses 1 and 2 of this Scheme the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Flixton shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of South Elmham, Saint Margaret, with Flixton and the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Ilketshall, Saint Margaret, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of South Elmham, Saint Peter, with Ilketshall, Saint Margaret, and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of South Elmham, Saint Margaret, with South Elmham, Saint Peter, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such

manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners in equal shares for the benefit of the two United Benefices of South Elmham, Saint Margaret, with Flixton and South Elmham, Saint Peter, with Ilketshall, Saint Margaret.

"7. That upon the taking effect of the union referred to in Clause 3 of this Scheme the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of South Elmham, Saint James, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of South Elmham, Saint James, with South Elmham, All Saints and Saint Nicholas and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of South Elmham, All Saints with Saint Nicholas, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that out of the net proceeds of such sale there shall first be appropriated such sum, not exceeding £200, as to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners and the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich shall appear desirable for improving the Parsonage House of the said Benefice of Rumburgh with South Elmham, Saint Michael, and the balance of such net proceeds (together with any accumulations of income as hereinafter mentioned) shall be held and invested by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in equal shares for the benefit of the two United Benefices of South Elmham, Saint Margaret with Flixton, and South Elmham, Saint Peter, with Ilketshall, Saint Margaret, and if the union referred to in Clause 3 of this Scheme shall have taken effect before the taking effect of the unions referred to in Clauses 1 and 2 of this Scheme, the income arising in respect of the balance of such net proceeds during the intervening period shall be accumulated and added to the capital fund.

"8. And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Coventry has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon (1) the union of the said Benefice of Campsea Ashe and part of the said Benefice of Rendlesham and (2) the union of the said Benefices of Eyke and Bromeswell and the remaining part of the said Benefice of Rendlesham duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended the said unions of Benefices and the terms for effecting the same, and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions of Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas all of the said Benefices are now full, the Reverend Charles Page Cory being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Campsea Ashe, the Reverend Graves Lombard being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Rendlesham, the Venerable Archdeacon James George Reginald Darling being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Eyke and the Reverend Felix Shadwell being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bromeswell:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent also of the said Charles Page Cory and of the said James George Reginald Darling (in testimony whereof they have signed this Scheme respectively), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Campsea Ashe and the northern part of the said Benefice of Rendlesham (all which part is more particularly described in the Schedule annexed hereto) shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The Benefice of Campsea Ashe' (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice of Campsea Ashe).

"5. That upon the taking effect of the union of the said Benefice of Eyke and the part of the said Benefice of Rendlesham referred to in Clause 2 of this Scheme or upon the taking effect of the union referred to in Clause 2 of this Scheme the whole of the endowments of the said Benefice of Rendlesham shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Eyke with Rendlesham or to the United

Benefice of Eyke with Bromeswell and Rendlesham as the case may be subject nevertheless to the several rentcharges referred to in Clause 9 of this Scheme.

"6. That upon the union referred to in Clause 2 of this Scheme taking effect a Curate shall be appointed to assist the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Eyke with Bromeswell and Rendlesham in performing the duties of such United Benefice and to reside at Bromeswell and that the stipend to be assigned to the Curate out of the revenues of such United Benefice shall be of such amount not exceeding £300 per annum as the Bishop may from time to time determine, this recommendation and proposal being made to the intent that the Bishop shall have the power of requiring the appointment of a Curate in accordance with and subject to the conditions and provisions of Sub-section (b) of Section 18 of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

That upon the said unions taking effect respectively the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Campsea Ashe shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Campsea Ashe and the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Eyke shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Eyke with Bromeswell or Eyke with Rendlesham or Eyke with Bromeswell and Rendlesham as the case may be and so soon as conveniently may be both the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Bromeswell and the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Rendlesham and the sites and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale or sales shall be applied by us towards the cost of providing a house of residence in the Parish of Bromeswell for the Curate referred to in Clause 6 of this Scheme and any balance of such net proceeds shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923. Provided that it shall be lawful for us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, with the approval of the Bishop as an alternative to the sale of the Parsonage House of the said Benefice of Bromeswell as herein recommended and proposed to declare that such Parsonage House shall not be sold but retained as part of the property and endowments of the United Benefice of Eyke with Bromeswell or, as the case may be, of the United Benefice of Eyke with Bromeswell and Rendlesham with a view to its use as a Curate's residence, and in that case the net proceeds of the sale herein recommended and proposed of the Parsonage House of the said Benefice of Rendlesham or so much thereof as to us and to the Bishop shall appear necessary shall be applied towards the cost of adapting the Parsonage House of the said Benefice of Bromeswell for the purposes of a Curate's residence.

"8. That after the said unions have taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefices from time to time as

the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, (a) in the case of the United Benefice of Campsea Ashe in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to such United Benefice after the union the Patron of the said Benefice of Rendlesham shall have the first turn and the Patron of the said Benefice of Campsea Ashe shall have the second and third turns, (b) in the case of the United Benefice (if any) of Eyke with Bromeswell the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices of Eyke and Bromeswell alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Bromeswell having the right upon the first presentation to such United Benefice to be made after the union, (c) in the case of the United Benefice (if any) of Eyke with Rendlesham the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices of Eyke and Rendlesham alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Rendlesham having the right upon the first presentation to such United Benefice to be made after the union, and (d) in the case of the United Benefice of Eyke with Bromeswell and Rendlesham in every series of four successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to such United Benefice after the union the Patron of the said Benefice of Bromeswell shall have the first turn, the Patron of the said Benefice of Eyke shall have the second and fourth turns, and the Patron of the said Benefice of Rendlesham shall have the third turn.
