WHEREAS the Right Reverend Cyril Forster, Lord Bishop of Southwark, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

"I, Cyril Forster, by Divine Permission Bishop of Southwark, do, in pursuance of the 26th section of the Act of Parliament of the first and second years of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 106, hereby represent to your Grace:—

"1. There is in the County of Surrey and my Diocese of Southwark the Rectory of Tooting Graveney the Parish whereof lies adjacent to the Ecclesiastical Parishes of St. Mary Summerstown, Christ Church, Mitcham and St. Barnabas, Mitcham and contains according to the census of One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one a population of twenty-seven thousand eight hundred and sixty-six and the net annual value thereof is seven hundred and fifty pounds:

In the same County and Diocese is the Vicarage of St. Mary Summerstown the Parish whereof lies adjacent to the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Tooting Graveney and contains according to the census of One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one a population of seven thousand six hundred and fifty-nine and the net annual value thereof is four hundred and fifty-four pounds:

In the same County and Diocese is the Vicarage of Christ Church, Mitcham, the Parish whereof lies adjacent to the said Ecclesiastical Parishes of Tooting Graveney and St. Barnabas Mitcham and contains according to the census of One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one a population of fifteen thousand seven hundred and thirty-seven and the net annual value thereof is four hundred pounds:
