ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1930.

SECTION 19.

The Minister of Transport has received two joint applications, from organisations representative of employers and workpeople in the section of the road transport industry concerned with the conveyance of goods by road, for variations in certain circumstances of the periods of time laid down in Section 19 of the Road Traffic Act, 1930, for the employment of drivers of road vehicles of certain types.

The parties to the two joint applications are as follows:—

(1) The Transport and General Workers' Union, the North of England Commercial Section of the same Union, and the Liverpool and District Carters' and Motormen's Union on the one hand, and the Commercial Motor Users' Association, the Association of British Chambers of Commerce, the Cotton and Allied Trades Transport Committee, the Electric Vehicle Committee of Great Britain. the Furniture, Warehousemen and Removers' Association, the Incorporated Association of Retail Distributors, the Wholesale Distributors' Association, the Mansion House Association on Railway and Canal Traffic, the National Road Transport Employers' Federation, and fourteen other Associations representative of employers on the other: and

(2) The National Union of Railwaymen on the one hand and the Railways Staff Conference on the other.

As is provided in Sub-section (3) of Section 19 of the Road Traffic Act, 1930, the Minister has referred the matter to the

Industrial Court for advice. The Court has fixed 10.30 a.m. on Tuesday, the 24th March, at No. 5, Old Palace Yard, Westminster, S.W. 1, as the time and place for hearing the parties to both applications.
