INCOME TAX.

Whereas it has become necessary to renew the list of persons to supply vacancies amongst the Commissioners appointed to act in the division of Scarsdale, in the county of Derby, as Com-missioners for the general purposes of the Acts of Parliament relating to Income Tax: Now we, two of the Commissioners of Inland Revenue, in pursuance of the powers vested in us in that behalf, do hereby convene a Meeting of the Land Tax Commissioners having jurisdiction with regard to Land Tax within the division aforesaid being respectively qualified to act as such Commissioners, to be holden at the Station Hotel, Chesterfield, on Thursday, the 2nd day of April, 1921, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, for the purpose of choosing fit and proper persons to be Commissioners to supply vacancies amongst the Commissioners for the general purposes of the aforesaid Acts for the division of Scarsdale aforesaid.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction consisting of a Central Board of Finance of the Church of England four and a half pounds per centum Registered Debenture for the sum of seven hundred pounds, heretofore held by us for the spiritual benefit of the New Parish of All Saints, Southport, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Liverpool, and now specifically appropriated for the endowment of the Consolidated Chapelry and Benefice (hereinafter called the Benefice) of All Souls, Southport, which has recently been formed partly out of the said New Parish of All Saints Southport, Do Hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, Grant out of the Common Fund under our control to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of All Souls, Southport, and to his successors Incumbents of the same Benefice, all and singular, one yearly sum or stipend of thirty-one pounds and ten shillings, such yearly sum or stipend to be calculated from the seventeenth day of February in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one and to be payable in equal quarterly portions on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August and the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always that the yearly sum or stipend hereby granted shall be and shall be taken to be in lieu of and in full substitution for the yearly sum or stipend of like amount heretofore payable by us towards the stipend of the Curate serving the Church of All Souls, in the said New Parish of All Saints, Southport, under the authority of another Instrument which was sealed by us on the sixteenth day of October in the year one thousand

nine hundred and thirty and was published in the London Gazette on the twenty-eighth day of the same month. Provided also that if at any time lands, tithes or other hereditaments sufficient in our opinion to produce the yearly sum or stipend of thirty-one pounds and ten shillings hereby secured, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said Benefice of All Souls, Southport, in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of the yearly sum or stipend or of such part thereof as the case may be shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.

In witness whereof we have hereunto set our Common Seal this twelfth day of March in the year one thousand nine (L.S.) hundred and thirty-one.

The First Commissioner of His Majesty's Works and Public Buildings has appointed Major-General Godfrey Tate, C.I.E., I.M.S. URBAN DISTRICT OF EARBY.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

DY an Order dated the 2nd day of March, 1931, the Minister of Health has Declared that, on and after the 23rd day of March, 1931, the following provisions of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, shall be in force in the Urban District of Earby, namely:--

Part II (streets and buildings), other than sections 21, 24, 27 and 31;

Part III (sanitary provisions), other than section 51;

Part IV (infectious diseases), other than sections 61, 66, 67 and 68; and

Section 95, comprised in Part X (Miscellaneous provisions):

The above provisions are declared to be in force subject, as regards Sections 23, 25, 30, 35 and 38, to the conditions specified in the Order.

A copy of the Order may be inspected at the Office of the Clerk to the Council, Council Offices, Earby, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on any weekday other than Saturday, and between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturday.
