The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920-1925.
(SALOMON JULIUS ABRAHAMS.)

Whereas Salomon Julius Abrahams, L.R.C.P., L.R.C.S., L.R.F.P.S., of Abercromby Square, Liverpool, has been convicted of an offence against the Dangerous Drugs Acts:

And whereas the said Salomon Julius Abrahams cannot, in my opinion, properly be allowed to be in possession of or to supply any of the drugs or preparations to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Regulation 6 of the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921, as extended by the Coca Leaves and Indian Hemp Regulations, 1928, and by Regulation 7 of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928, I hereby give notice that I withdraw, as from to-day's date, from the said Salomon Julius Abrahams the authority granted by the said Regulations to duly qualified medical practitioners to be in possession of and to supply raw opium, coca leaves and Indian hemp and the drugs and preparations to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies.

And I also direct, as from the same date, that it shall not be lawful for the said Salomon Julius Abrahams to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928.

ROYAL WARRANT.

THE VICTORIA CROSS.

GEORGE R.I.

GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, to all to whom these Presents shall come,

GREETING!

Whereas Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, by a Warrant under Her Sign Manual dated the 29th day of January, 1856, did create a Naval and Military Decoration to be styled and designated "The Victoria Cross," and did express Her desire that this Decoration should be highly prized and eagerly sought after by the Officers and Men of Her Naval and Military Services:

And whereas by divers subsequent Warrants other Officers and Men were admitted to and made eligible for the Decoration, and certain amendments were made to the rules and ordinances attaching thereto:

And whereas the said Warrant and subsequent Warrants before referred to, as also the rules and ordinances affecting the same, were consolidated, varied and extended by a Warrant under Our Sign Manual dated the 22nd day of May, 1920:

Now, therefore, We do hereby declare that the rules and ordinances contained in Our said Warrant heretofore in force for the governance of the said Decoration, shall be abrogated, cancelled and annulled; and in substitution thereof We by these Presents, for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, are graciously pleased to make, ordain and establish the following rules and ordinances for the governance of the same which shall from henceforth be inviolably observed and kept:—

Firstly: It is ordained that the distinction shall as heretofore be styled and designated "The Victoria Cross," and shall consist of a Maltese Cross of bronze with Our Royal Crest in the centre and underneath it an escroll bearing this inscription: "For Valour."

Secondly: It is ordained that the Cross shall be suspended from the left breast by a red riband of one inch and a half in width, and on those occasions when only the riband is worn a replica of the Cross in miniature shall be affixed to the centre of the riband.

Thirdly: It is ordained that the Cross shall only be awarded for most conspicuous bravery or some daring or pre-eminent act of valour or self-sacrifice or extreme devotion to duty in the presence of the enemy.

Fourthly: It is ordained that the Cross may be awarded posthumously.

Fifthly: It is ordained that the names of all those persons upon or on account of whom We may be pleased to confer or present the Decoration shall be published in the London Gazette, and a Register thereof kept in the

Office of Our Principal Secretary of State for War.

Sixthly: It is ordained that:—

(1) Officers, Warrant Officers and subordinate Officers hereinafter referred to as Officers, Chief Petty Officers and Petty Officers hereinafter referred to as Petty Officers, men and boys hereinafter referred to as Seamen, serving in—(a) Our Navy or in ships of any description for the time being under Naval Command; (b) Our Indian Marine Service; (c) Navies or Marine Services of Our Dominions, Colonies, Dependencies or Protectorates; and (d) Our Mercantile Marine whilst serving under Naval, Military or Air Force Authority, or who in the course of their duties may become subject to enemy action;

(2) Officers, Warrant Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers, men and boys hereinafter referred to as Marines, serving in Our Marines;

(3) Officers, Warrant Officers, Classes I and II, Non-Commissioned Officers, men and boys hereinafter referred to as Privates, of all ranks serving in Our Army, Our Army Reserve, Our Territorial or other Forces, and the Forces of Our Dominions, Colonies, Dependencies or Protectorates;

(4) Officers, Warrant Officers, Classes I and II, Non-Commissioned Officers, and other Airmen serving in Our Air Force, Our Air Force Reserve, Our Auxiliary Air Force, or the Air Forces of Our Dominions, Colonies, Dependencies or Protectorates;

(5) British and Indian Officers and men of all ranks of Our Indian Army, the Imperial Service Troops of Native States of India, or any other Forces there serving under the command, guidance, or direction of any British or Indian Officer, or of a Political Officer attached to such Forces on Our behalf, and

(6) Matrons, Sisters, Nurses and the Staff of the Nursing Services and other Services pertaining to Hospitals and Nursing, and Civilians of either sex serving regularly or temporarily under the orders, direction or supervision of any of the above mentioned Forces

shall be eligible for the Decoration of the Cross.

Seventhly: It is ordained that if any recipient of the Cross shall again perform such an act of bravery, as would have made him or her eligible to receive the Cross, such further act of bravery shall be recorded by a Bar to be attached to the riband by which the Cross is suspended, and for every such additional act of bravery, an additional Bar shall be added, and any such Bar or Bars may be awarded posthumously. For every Bar awarded a replica of the Cross in miniature shall be added to the riband when worn alone.

Eighthly: It is ordained that every recommendation for the award of the Decoration

of the Cross shall be made and reported through the usual channel to the Senior Naval, Military or Air Force Officer Commanding the Force, who shall call for such description, conclusive proof as far as the circumstances of the case will allow, and attestation of the act as he may think requisite, and if he approve he shall recommend the grant of the Decoration to Our Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, Our Principal Secretary of State for War or Our Principal Secretary of State for Air as the case may be, who shall submit to Us the names of every one so recommended whom they shall consider worthy: in the case of their being no British or Indian Officer, then the Political Officer attached to the Force shall, after obtaining conclusive proof of the act of bravery as far as is possible, if he approve, submit the recommendation to Us through the proper channels.

Ninthly: It is ordained that in the event of any unit of Our Naval, Military or Air Forces, consisting in the case of Our Navy of a squadron, flotilla or ship's company, or of a detached body of seamen or marines; or in the case of Our Army of a regiment, squadron, battery or company, or of a detached body of soldiers; or in the case of Our Air Forces of a squadron or other body of airmen, having distinguished itself collectively by the performance of an act of heroic gallantry or daring in the presence of the enemy in such a way that the Flag, General, Air or other Officer in Command of the Force to which such a unit belongs, is unable to single out any individual as specially pre-eminent in gallantry or daring, then one or more of the personnel comprising the unit shall be selected to be recommended to Us for the award of the Victoria Cross in the following manner:—

(a) When the total personnel of the unit does not exceed 100, then one officer shall be selected for the Decoration by the officers engaged; and in like manner one warrant officer or petty officer or non-commissioned officer of the unit shall be selected by the warrant officers, petty officers or non-commissioned officers engaged, and one seaman, marine, private soldier, or aircraftman shall be selected by the seamen, marines, private soldiers or aircraftmen engaged:

(b) When the total personnel of the unit exceeds 100 but does not exceed 200 then the number of seamen, marines, private soldiers or aircraftmen to be selected in the manner described in (a) shall be increased to two;

(c) When the total personnel of the unit exceeds 200 in number, the number of Crosses to be awarded in accordance with these provisions shall be the subject of special consideration by Our Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty or by one of Our Principal Secretaries of State for submission to Us;

(d) The selection to be by a secret ballot in such manner as shall be determined in accordance with the foregoing provisions by the Officer directing the selection to be made;

(e) The death of any person engaged shall not be a bar to his selection;

(f) The names of the persons recommended in accordance with these provisions shall be submitted to Us in the manner laid down in the Eighth Clause of this Our Warrant.

Tenthly: It is ordained that every recipient of the Cross, not being or ranking as a Commissioned Officer and in the case of Our Navy and Our Marines, not being or ranking with a warrant officer, and not coming within the Eleventh Clause of this Our Warrant, shall from the date of the act by which the Decoration has been gained, be entitled to a special pension of ten pounds a year, and each additional Bar conferred under the Seventh Clause of this Our Warrant on such recipient shall carry with it an additional pension of five pounds a year.

Eleventhly: Every Indian Officer of Our Indian Army of rank junior to that of Second Lieutenant who shall have received the Cross shall, from the date of the act by which such Decoration has been gained, be entitled to a special pension of five hundred and twenty-five rupees a year, and each additional Bar conferred on such Indian Officer shall carry with it an additional pension of one hundred and fifty rupees a year. In the case of a Warrant or Non-Commissioned Officer or soldier of Our Indian Army aforesaid We ordain and award a special pension of one hundred and fifty rupees a year, with seventy-five rupees a year additional for each additional Bar. On the death of a recipient of the Cross to whom this clause applies, the pension shall be continued to his widow until her death or remarriage.

Twelfthly: It is ordained that reproductions of the Cross known as a Miniature Cross which may be worn on certain occasions by those to whom the Decoration is awarded shall be half the size of The Victoria Cross and that a Sealed Pattern of the said Miniature Cross shall be deposited and kept in the Central Chancery of Our Orders of Knighthood.

Thirteenthly: It is ordained that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, by an Order under Our Sign Manual and on the recommendation to that effect by or through our First Lord of the Admiralty or one of Our Principal Secretaries of State to cancel and annul the award of The Victoria Cross to any person, together with any pension appertaining thereto not already paid, and that thereupon his or her name in the Register shall be erased; but that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, to restore the Decoration when such recommendation has been withdrawn and with it such pension as may have been forfeited.

Fourteenthly: It is ordained that notice of cancellation or restoration in every case shall be published in the London Gazette.

Lastly: We reserve to Ourselves, Our Heirs and Successors full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting or

dispensing with these regulations, or any part thereof, by a notification under Our Sign Manual.

THE ROYAL RED CROSS.

GEORGE R.I.

GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, to all to whom these Presents shall come,

GREETING!

Whereas Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, by a Warrant under Her Sign Manual dated the 23rd day of April, 1883, did institute, constitute and create a Decoration designated "The Royal Red Cross," to be awarded in recognition of special services rendered in nursing the sick and wounded of Our Army and Navy, and did make, ordain and establish certain rules and ordinances for the governance of the same, which rules and ordinances were subsequently amended by Warrants dated the 11th day of December, 1897, the 24th day of July, 1902, the 8th day of September, 1909, the 10th day of November, 1915, the 15th day of December, 1917, and the 30th day of April, 1918:

And whereas the said Warrants were consolidated and varied by a Warrant under Our Sign Manual dated the 25th day of October, 1920:

And whereas We deem it expedient that Our said Warrant shall be amended:

Now therefore We do hereby declare that the rules and ordinances contained in Our said Warrant dated the 25th day of October, 1920, shall be abrogated, cancelled and annulled, and We are pleased to make, ordain and establish the following rules and ordinances in substitution for the same, which shall from henceforth be inviolably observed and kept:—

Firstly: It is ordained that:—

(i) The Decoration shall be styled and designated "The Royal Red Cross," and shall be divided into two Classes;

(ii) The First Class shall consist of a Cross, enamelled red, edged with gold, having on the arms thereof the words, Faith, Hope, Charity, with the date of the institution of the Decoration; the centre having thereon in relief the Royal and Imperial Effigy; and on the reverse thereof the Royal and Imperial Cipher and Crown shall be shown in relief on the centre; and

(iii) The Second Class shall consist of a Cross of the same form and size as the First Class, but of frosted silver, with a Maltese Cross enamelled red not exceeding half its dimensions superimposed

thereon, the centre having thereon in relief the Royal and Imperial Effigy; and the reverse shall have inscribed on the arms thereof the words Faith, Hope, Charity and the date of institution of the original Decoration, the centre having thereon in relief the Royal and Imperial Cipher and Crown.

Secondly: It is ordained that the Cross in either Class shall be attached to a dark blue riband edged red, of one inch in width, tied in a bow and worn on the left shoulder.

Thirdly: It is ordained that the Decoration may be worn by the Queen Regnant, the Queen Consort, or the Queen Dowager of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas; and that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, to confer at Our Pleasure either class of the Decoration upon any Princesses of the Royal Family; also upon the Queens or princesses of Foreign Countries who may have specially exerted themselves in providing for the nursing of the sick and wounded of Foreign Armies, Navies and Air Forces.

Fourthly: It is ordained that the First Class of the Decoration may be conferred upon a fully trained Nurse who is a member of one of the officially recognized Nursing Services, and who has shown exceptional devotion and competency in the performance of actual nursing duties with Our Army or Our Air Force in the Field, or in Our Naval, Military, or Air Force Hospitals, or in an Auxiliary War Hospital, over a continuous and long period, or who has performed some very exceptional act of bravery and devotion at her post of duty; and whose name has been brought to Our notice by Our Principal Secretary of State for War, Our First Lord of the Admiralty, or Our Principal Secretary of State for Air.

Fifthly: It is ordained that the Second Class of the Decoration may be conferred upon a fully trained Nurse, or an Assistant Nurse, Probationer, or Nursing Member of a Voluntary Aid Detachment, who belongs to one of the officially recognized Nursing Services, and who has shown special devotion and competency in the performance of actual nursing duties with Our Army or Our Air Force in the Field, or in Our Naval, Military, or Air Force Hospitals, or in an Auxiliary War Hospital, over a continuous and long period, or who has performed some very exceptional act of bravery and devotion at her post of duty; and whose name has been brought to Our notice by Our Principal Secretary of State for War, Our First Lord of the Admiralty, or Our Principal Secretary of State for Air.

Sixthly: It is ordained that the number of awards in the First Class of the Decoration shall not exceed two per cent. of the total establishment of Nurses, and that the number of awards in the Second Class of the Decoration shall not exceed five per cent. of the total establishment of Nurses, the allotments to be proportionate to the numbers of each Nursing Service; provided nevertheless, that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, to make such

additions as, under exceptional circumstances, We may deem fitting.

Seventhly: It is ordained that a recipient of the First Class of the Decoration shall not afterwards be awarded the Second Class; that recipients of the Second Class of the Decoration, if trained Nurses, shall be eligible for advancement to the First Class as vacancies may arise; and that on such advancement the Second Class Decoration shall be returned to the Office of Our Principal Secretary of State for War.

Eighthly: It is ordained that recipients of the First Class of the Decoration, who are Our Subjects, shall be designated Members of the Royal Red Cross, and shall be entitled to the letters R.R.C. following their names; and that recipients of the Second Class of the Decoration, who are Our Subjects, shall be designated Associates of the Royal Red Cross, and shall be entitled to the letters A.R.R.C. following their names.

Ninthly: It is ordained that:—

(i) Either Class of the Decoration may be conferred upon ladies (other than those referred to in the Fourth and Fifth Clauses of this Our Warrant), whether Our Subjects or foreign persons, who may be recommended to Our notice by Our Principal Secretary of State for War, Our First Lord of the Admiralty, or Our Principal Secretary of State for Air, as having voluntarily undertaken nursing duties, and shown special devotion and competency in the performance of such duties, over a continuous and long period in hospitals which have been specially established for the treatment of sick and wounded personnel of Our Naval, Military or Air Forces, including Our Indian Forces, and the Forces of Our self-governing Dominions beyond the Seas; but the First Class of the Decoration shall be conferred only upon a fully trained nurse;

(ii) Any foreign lady upon whom the First Class of the Decoration is conferred under this Our Warrant shall be regarded as an "Honorary Member", and such person upon whom the Second Class is conferred shall be regarded as an "Honorary Associate"; and

(iii) The numbers of each Class of the Decoration which may be conferred under this Clause shall be additional to the Establishment ordained in the Sixth Clause of this Our Warrant.

Tenthly: It is ordained that if anyone upon whom the First Class of the Decoration has been conferred is subsequently recommended for such approved service as would have rendered her eligible for the Decoration, had she not already received it, she shall be awarded a Bar to be attached to the Decoration.

Eleventhly: It is ordained that the names of those upon whom We may be pleased to confer the Decoration shall be published in the London Gazette, and a Register thereof kept in the Office of Our Principal Secretary of State for War.

Twelfthly: It is ordained that reproductions of both Classes of the Cross in miniature which may be worn on certain occasions

by those to whom the Decoration is awarded shall be half the size of The Royal Red Cross and that a Sealed Pattern of the said Miniature Cross shall be deposited and kept in the Central Chancery of Our Orders of Knighthood.

Thirteenthly: It is ordained that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, by an Order under Our Sign Manual and on the recommendation to that effect by or through Our First Lord of the Admiralty or one of Our Principal Secretaries of State to cancel and annul the award of The Royal Red Cross to any person and that thereupon her name in the Register shall be erased; but that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, to restore the Decoration when such recommendation has been withdrawn.

Fourteenthly: It is ordained that notice of cancellation or restoration in every case shall be published in the London Gazette.

Lastly: We reserve to Ourselves, Our Heirs and Successors, full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, interpreting, or dispensing with these regulations, or any part thereof, by a notification under Our Sign Manual.

THE MILITARY CROSS.

GEORGE R.I.

GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, to all to whom these Presents shall come,

GREETING!

Whereas We did by a Warrant under Our Sign Manual dated the 28th day of December, 1914, institute and create a Decoration entitled "The Military Cross" to be awarded to Officers of certain ranks in Our Army in recognition of distinguished and meritorious services in time of War, and did make, ordain and establish certain rules and ordinances for the governance of the same, which rules and ordinances were subsequently amended by Warrants dated the 23rd day of August, 1916, and the 25th day of June, 1917:

And whereas the said Warrants were consolidated and varied by a Warrant under Our Sign Manual dated the 6th day of November, 1920:

And whereas We deem it expedient that Our said Warrant should be amended:

Now therefore We do hereby declare that the rules and ordinances contained in Our said Warrant dated the 6th day of November, 1920, shall be abrogated, cancelled and annulled, and We are pleased to make, ordain and establish

the following rules and ordinances in substitution for the same, which shall from henceforth be inviolably observed and kept:—

Firstly: It is ordained that the Cross shall be designated "The Military Cross."

Secondly: It is ordained that The Military Cross shall consist of a Cross of Silver having on each arm the Imperial Crown, and bearing in the centre the Royal and Imperial Cipher.

Thirdly: It is ordained that The Military Cross may be awarded to a Captain, a Commissioned Officer of a lower grade, or a Warrant Officer, Class I or II, in any of Our Military Forces, and that The Military Cross shall be awarded only to Commissioned Officers and Warrant Officers of the above ranks for gallant and distinguished services in action, on a recommendation to Us by Our Principal Secretary of State for War. Officers not above the substantive rank of Captain who hold the acting or temporary rank of Major, and acting or temporary Chaplains to the Forces 3rd Class, shall also be eligible.

Fourthly: It is ordained that Officers and Warrant Officers of equivalent ranks and grades to those above-mentioned in any of Our Air Forces may be awarded The Military Cross for gallant and distinguished services in action on the ground, on a recommendation to Us by Our Principal Secretary of State for War.

Fifthly: It is ordained that Foreign Officers of equivalent ranks and grades to those above-mentioned who have been associated in Operations with Our Military Forces, or with Our Air Forces, shall be eligible for award of The Military Cross.

Sixthly: It is ordained that anyone who, after having performed services for which The Military Cross is awarded, subsequently performs an approved act of gallantry in action which, if he had not received the Cross, would have rendered him eligible for it, shall be awarded a Bar to be attached to the riband by which the Cross is suspended, and for every additional such act an additional Bar may be added.

Seventhly: It is ordained that:—

(1) a Warrant Officer, Class I or II, of any of Our Military or Air Forces who has been awarded The Military Cross shall be paid a gratuity of £20 on promotion to a Commission, or on transfer to Our Army or Air Force Reserve, or on discharge without pension;

(2) a Warrant Officer, Class I or II, of any of Our Military or Air Forces who has been awarded The Military Cross and who is discharged with a pension shall be eligible for an additional pension of 6d. a day if European (other than Maltese) and 3d. a day if non-European or Maltese, provided that he is not already in receipt of such additional pension;

(3) where a Warrant Officer who comes under sub-paragraph (1) of this Clause is awarded a Bar or Bars to The Military Cross each Bar shall for the purposes of gratuity be regarded as an original award of the Decoration, but no

gratuity or further addition to pension shall be issuable in respect of a Bar or Bars to a Warrant Officer who comes under sub-paragraph (2) of this Clause; and

(4) awards of The Military Cross to officers of an Allied or Associated Army or Air Force which may be granted under the fifth clause of this Our Warrant, shall not entitle the recipient to any pension or gratuity in respect thereof.

Eighthly: It is ordained that the names of those upon whom We may be pleased to confer this Decoration shall be published in the London Gazette, and that a Register thereof shall be kept in the Office of Our Principal Secretary of State for War.

Ninthly: It is ordained that The Military Cross shall be worn before Medals in such position in regard to other Decorations as We may from time to time assign to it, and shall be worn on the left breast pendent from a riband of one inch and three-eighths in width, which shall be in colour white with a purple stripe—watered.

Tenthly: It is ordained that The Military Cross shall not confer any individual precedence, but shall entitle the recipient to the addition after his name of the letters M.C.

Eleventhly: It is ordained that reproductions of the Cross in miniature which may be worn on certain occasions by those to whom the Decoration is awarded shall be half the size of The Military Cross and that a Sealed Pattern of the said Miniature Cross shall be deposited and kept in the Central Chancery of Our Orders of Knighthood.

Twelfthly: It is ordained that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, by an Order under Our Sign Manual and on the recommendation to that effect by or through Our Principal Secretary of State for War to cancel and annul the award of The Military Cross to any person together with any gratuity, or pension in lieu thereof, appertaining thereto not already paid, and that thereupon his name in the Register shall be erased; but that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, to restore the Decoration when such recommendation has been withdrawn and with it such gratuity, or pension in lieu thereof, as may have been forfeited.

Thirteenthly: It is ordained that notice of cancellation or restoration in every case shall be published in the London Gazette.

Lastly: We reserve to Ourselves, Our Heirs and Successors, full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting or dispensing with these regulations, or any part thereof, by a notification under Our Sign Manual.

THE DISTINGUISHED CONDUCT MEDAL.

GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, to all to whom these Presents shall come,

GREETING!

Whereas, Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, by a Warrant under Her Sign Manual dated the 30th day of September, 1862, did institute and create a silver medal bearing the words "For Distinguished Conduct in the Field," to be granted to Serjeants, Corporals and Privates of Our Regular Army, for individual acts of distinguished conduct in the Field in any part of the world:

And whereas the rules and ordinances for the governance of the same have been amended from time to time and were consolidated and varied by a Warrant under Our Sign Manual dated the 6th day of November, 1920:

And whereas we deem it expedient that Our said Warrant should be amended:

Now therefore We do hereby declare that the rules and ordinances contained in Our said Warrant dated the 6th day of November, 1920, shall be abrogated, cancelled and annulled, and We are pleased to make, ordain and establish the following rules and ordinances in substitution for the same, which shall from henceforth be inviolably observed and kept:—

Firstly: It is ordained that the Medal, which shall be of silver, shall be designated "The Distinguished Conduct Medal," and shall bear on the obverse the Royal Effigy; and on the reverse the words "For Distinguished Conduct in the Field."

Secondly: It is ordained that The Distinguished Conduct Medal may be awarded on the recommendation of a Commander-in-Chief in the Field to Warrant Officers, Classes I and II, non-commissioned officers and men serving in any of Our Military Forces for distinguished conduct in action in the Field.

Thirdly: It is ordained that should anyone who has been awarded The Distinguished Conduct Medal be subsequently recommended for such approved act or acts of distinguished conduct in action in the Field as would have rendered him eligible for the Medal, had he not already received it, he may be awarded a Bar to be attached to the ribbon by which the medal is suspended: and that for every additional such act or acts of distinguished conduct an additional Bar may be awarded.

Fourthly: It is ordained that The Distinguished Conduct Medal shall not confer any individual precedence, but shall entitle the recipient to the addition after his name of the letters D.C.M.

Fifthly: It is ordained that the names of those upon whom We may be pleased to confer The Distinguished Conduct Medal shall be published in the London Gazette, and that a Register thereof shall be kept in the Office of Our Principal Secretary of State for War.

Sixthly: It is ordained that The Distinguished Conduct Medal shall be worn before war medals in such order as We may from time to time assign to it, and that it shall be worn on the left breast pendent from a ribbon of one inch and one quarter in width, which shall be in colour crimson, having in the centre a dark blue stripe of a width equal to the crimson stripes on each side of it.

Seventhly: It is ordained that—

(1) a Warrant Officer, Class I or II, non-commissioned officer or man belonging to any of Our Military Forces who has been awarded The Distinguished Conduct Medal shall be paid a gratuity of £20 on promotion to a Commission, or on transfer to Our Army Reserve, or on discharge without pension;

(2) a Warrant Officer, Class I or II, non-commissioned officer or man belonging to any of Our Military Forces who has been awarded The Distinguished Conduct Medal and who is discharged with a pension shall be eligible for an additional pension of 6d. a day if he is European (other than Maltese) and 3d. a day if Maltese or non-European, provided that he is not already in receipt of such additional pension;

(3) where a Warrant Officer, non-commissioned officer or man who comes under sub-paragraph (1) of this Clause is awarded a Bar or Bars to The Distinguished Conduct Medal, each Bar shall for the purposes of gratuity be regarded as an original award of the Medal, but no gratuity or further addition to pension shall be issuable in respect of a Bar or Bars to a Warrant Officer, non-commissioned officer or man, who comes under sub-paragraph (2) of this Clause; and

(4) soldiers of an Allied or Associated Army of ranks equivalent to those of Our Military Forces specified in the second clause of this Our Warrant, who have been associated in operations with Our Military Forces, shall be eligible for the award of The Distinguished Conduct Medal but no pension or gratuity shall accompany such award.

Eighthly: It is ordained that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, by an Order under Our Sign Manual and on the recommendation to that effect by or through Our Principal Secretary of State for War to cancel and annul the award of The Distinguished Conduct Medal to any person, together with any gratuity, or pension in lieu thereof, appertaining thereto not already paid, and that thereupon his name in the Register shall be erased; but that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, to restore the Medal when such recommendation has been withdrawn and with it such gratuity, or pension in lieu thereof, as may have been forfeited.

Ninthly: It is ordained that notice of cancellation or restoration in every case shall be published in the London Gazette.

Lastly: We reserve to Ourselves, Our Heirs and Successors, full power of annulling,

altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting or dispensing with these regulations, or any part thereof, by a notification under Our Sign Manual.

GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, to all to whom these Presents shall come,

GREETING!

Whereas We did by a Warrant under Our Sign Manual dated the 25th day of March, 1916, institute and create a silver medal entitled "The Military Medal" to be awarded to non-commissioned officers and men for bravery in the Field, and did make, ordain and establish certain rules and ordinances for the governance of the same, which rules and ordinances were subsequently amended by Warrants dated the 21st day of June, 1916, the 1st day of August, 1918, and the 24th day of March, 1919:

And whereas the said Warrants were consolidated and varied by a Warrant under Our Sign Manual dated the 30th day of October, 1920:

And whereas We deem it expedient that Our said Warrant should be amended:

Now therefore We do hereby declare that the rules and ordinances contained in Our said Warrant dated the 30th day of October, 1920, shall be abrogated, cancelled and annulled, and We are pleased to make, ordain and establish the following rules and ordinances in substitution for the same, which shall from henceforth be inviolably observed and kept:—

Firstly: It is ordained that the Medal shall be designated "The Military Medal."

Secondly: It is ordained that The Military Medal shall bear on the obverse the Royal Effigy, and on the reverse the words "For bravery in the Field," encircled by a wreath surmounted by the Royal Cipher and a Crown.

Thirdly: It is ordained that The Military Medal may be awarded to Warrant Officers, Classes I and II, non-commissioned officers and men serving in any of Our Military Forces for individual or associated acts of bravery in the Field, on the recommendation of a Commander-in-Chief in the Field.

Fourthly: It is ordained that in cases where Warrant Officers, Classes I and II,

non-commissioned officers and men who have been awarded The Military Medal shall be recommended by a Commander-in-Chief in the Field for further acts of bravery, a Bar or Bars may be added to the Medal already conferred.

Fifthly: It is ordained that Warrant Officers, Classes I and II, non-commissioned officers and other airmen serving in Our Air Forces, may be awarded The Military Medal for individual or associated acts of bravery in action on the ground, on a recommendation to Us by Our Principal Secretary of State for War; and, where the Medal has already been conferred, a Bar or Bars to the Medal may be awarded to such personnel for further approved acts of bravery in action on the ground.

Sixthly: It is ordained that The Military Medal may under exceptional circumstances on the special recommendation of a Commander-in-Chief in the Field be awarded to women, whether Our subjects or foreign persons, who have shown bravery and devotion under fire, and a Bar or Bars may be added for further such acts.

Seventhly: It is ordained that personnel of an Allied or Associated Army or Air Force of ranks equivalent to those of Our Military Forces specified in the third clause of this Our Warrant, who have been associated in operations with Our Military Forces or Our Air Forces shall be eligible for the award of The Military Medal.

Eighthly: It is ordained that The Military Medal shall not confer any individual precedence, but shall entitle the recipient to the addition after his or her name of the letters M.M.

Ninthly: It is ordained that the names of those upon whom We may be pleased to confer The Military Medal shall be published in the London Gazette, and that a Register thereof shall be kept in the Office of Our Principal Secretary of State for War.

Tenthly: It is ordained that The Military Medal shall be worn before war medals in such order as We may from time to time assign to it, and that it shall be worn on the left breast pendent from a ribbon of one inch and one quarter in width, which shall be in colour dark blue having in the centre three white and two crimson stripes alternating.

Eleventhly: It is ordained that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, by an Order under Our Sign Manual and on the recommendation to that effect by or through Our Principal Secretary of State for War to cancel and annul the award of The Military Medal to any person and that thereupon his or her name in the Register shall be erased; but that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, to restore the Medal when such recommendation has been withdrawn.

Twelfthly: It is ordained that notice of cancellation or restoration in every case shall be published in the London Gazette.

Lastly: We reserve to Ourselves, Our Heirs and Successors, full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpret-

ing or dispensing with these regulations, or any part thereof, by a notification under Our Sign Manual.

THE MERITORIOUS SERVICE MEDAL.

GEORGE R.I.

GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, to all to whom these presents shall come,

GREETING!

Whereas Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, by a Warrant under Her Sign Manual, dated the 19th day of December, 1845, did ordain (a) that a certain sum of public money (£2,000) should be expended annually in awarding annuities of £20 to Serjeants of the Regular Army as a reward for their good, faithful and efficient service: (b) that the recipients of these annuities should be selected by the Commander-in-Chief of the Army: and (c) that the Serjeants so selected to receive the annuities should also receive The Meritorious Service Medal; and did by a Warrant dated the 10th day of June, 1884, apply the conditions of previous Warrants under Her Sign Manual regarding these Medals and annuities to all soldiers above the rank of Corporal:

And whereas the sum of £2,000 has been increased from time to time:

And whereas His late Majesty, King Edward VII, by a Warrant under His Sign Manual, dated the 31st day of August, 1906, did ordain that The Meritorious Service Medal without Annuity should be granted to such Yeomen of Our Body Guard not exceeding 12 in all, as would have been selected for the Medal with Annuity had they not belonged to Our Body Guard of the Yeomen of the Guard:

And whereas by a Warrant under Our Sign Manual dated the 12th day of July, 1911, We did ordain that The Meritorious Service Medal without Annuity should be granted to such pensioners, not exceeding 5 in all, as would have been selected for the Medal with Annuity had they not belonged to Our Yeomen Warders of the Tower:

And whereas by a Warrant under Our Sign Manual dated the 4th day of October, 1916, We did ordain that the grant of The Meritorious Service Medal should be extended to Non-Commissioned Officers and men in Our Military Forces below the rank of Serjeant for valuable and meritorious service; and by Our Warrant dated the 23rd day of November, 1916, We did institute a Bar or Bars which might be awarded to recipients of The

Meritorious Service Medal for subsequent approved acts of gallantry in the performance of military duty (not necessarily on active service), or in saving or attempting to save, the life of an officer or soldier; and by Our Warrant dated the 3rd day of January, 1917, We did still further extend the conditions under which The Meritorious Service Medal might be awarded to soldiers in Our Military Forces who were duly recommended for acts of gallant conduct while performing military duty otherwise than in action or for devotion to duty in a theatre of war:

And whereas the said Warrants excluding the Warrants dated the 31st day of August, 1906, and the 12th day of July, 1911, were consolidated and varied by a Warrant under Our Sign Manual dated the 6th day of November, 1920:

And whereas by a Warrant under our Sign Manual dated the 7th day of September, 1928, We did ordain and appoint that the third and fourth rules and ordinances of Our Warrant dated the 6th day of November, 1920, should be cancelled and annulled:

And whereas We deem it expedient that all the aforesaid Warrants, as well as the amendments now to be promulgated, should be incorporated in one Warrant:

Now therefore We do hereby declare that the rules and ordinances contained in Our said Warrants dated the 31st day of August, 1906, the 12th day of July, 1911, and the 6th day of November, 1920, shall be abrogated, cancelled and annulled, and We are pleased to make, ordain and establish the following rules and ordinances in substitution for the same, which shall from henceforth be inviolably observed and kept:—

Firstly: It is ordained that the Medal shall be of silver and designated "The Meritorious Service Medal" and shall bear on the obverse the Royal Effigy, and on the reverse the words "For Meritorious Service" encircled by a laurel wreath and surmounted by the Imperial Crown.

Secondly: It is ordained that:—

(a) a fixed sum of £7,500 part of the Public Monies for the upkeep of Our Army shall be devoted to the purpose of awarding Meritorious Service Annuities of not more than £10 in any one case;

(b) every Warrant Officer, Classes I and II, and every Non-Commissioned Officer above the rank of Corporal who has served with the Colours in Our Regular Army for 21 years, or who has been invalided from Our Regular Army after 18 years' Colour Service, shall be eligible to be considered for the grant of a Meritorious Service Annuity provided that he:—

(i) served in or above the rank of Serjeant in a Regular Unit;

(ii) is in possession of the Medal for long service and good conduct, and has been awarded, or is otherwise eligible for, an exemplary character on discharge; and

(iii) is duly recommended for the Annuity for good, faithful, valuable and meritorious service in respect of the whole period of his Army engagement, by the Commanding Officer of the last

Regular Unit with which he served, or by the Officer in charge of his records:

(c) instructions as to procedure in submitting such applications for registration for the Medal and Annuity shall be laid down in "The King's Regulations for the Army and the Army Reserve";

(d) the names of candidates for the Meritorious Service Annuity who are recommended and accepted shall be entered, in the order in which such acceptance is approved, in a Register which shall be kept in the Office of Our Principal Secretary of State for War;

(e) the Military Secretary to Our Principal Secretary of State for War shall select from the list of registered candidates the names of those whom he considers to be most deserving to receive any Annuities that may fall vacant;

(f) a Warrant Officer or Non-Commissioned Officer of Our Regular Army who is thus selected for the grant of a Meritorious Service Annuity shall also be awarded The Meritorious Service Medal, except that a candidate who is already in possession of The Meritorious Service Medal shall receive the Annuity only;

(g) a Meritorious Service Annuity may be held in addition to ordinary pension, and in conjunction with any additional pension to which the annuitant may be entitled;

(h) when a Meritorious Service annuitant is promoted to a Commission the Annuity shall be surrendered, but he shall receive annually in lieu thereof pay equivalent to such Annuity.

Thirdly: It is ordained that The Meritorious Service Medal without Annuity may be awarded to such Yeomen of Our Body Guard, not exceeding 12 in all, and to such Yeomen Warders of Our Tower of London, not exceeding 5 in all, as would have been selected for the Medal with Annuity had they not belonged to Our Body Guard of the Yeomen of the Guard of Our Yeomen Warders of Our Tower of London, and who are duly recommended for the Medal by the Captain of Our Body Guard of the Yeomen of the Guard, or the Constable of Our Tower of London respectively.

Fourthly: It is ordained that The Meritorious Service Medal shall be worn after war medals, in such order as We may from time to time assign to it, and that it shall be worn on the left breast, pendent from a ribbon of one inch and a quarter in width, which shall in colour be crimson with white edges, and a white stripe down the centre.

Fifthly: It is ordained that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, by an Order under Our Sign Manual and on the recommendation to that effect by or through Our Principal Secretary of State for War to cancel and annul the award of The Meritorious Service Medal for Gallantry, to any person, together with any Annuity, or pension or pay in lieu thereof, appertaining thereto not already paid and that thereupon his name in the Register shall be erased; but that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, to restore the

Medal when such recommendation has been withdrawn and with it such Annuity or pension or pay in lieu thereof, as may have been forfeited.

Provided always that Our Army Council may, in respect of recipients of The Meritorious Service Medal, for Meritorious Service, make regulations for the forfeiture and restoration of the Medal.

Lastly: We reserve to Ourselves, Our Heirs and Successors, full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting interpreting, or dispensing with these regulations, or any part thereof, by a notification under Our Sign Manual.

ROYAL WARRANT AMENDING THE STATUTES OF THE DISTINGUISHED SERVICE ORDER.

GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, and Sovereign of the Distinguished Service Order, to all to whom these Presents shall come,

GREETING!

Whereas by the last Clause of the Statutes of Our said Distinguished Service Order, dated the 1st day of April, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen, We have reserved to Ourselves, Our Heirs, and Successors, full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting, or dispensing with the said Statutes or any part thereof by a notification under Our Sign Manual:

And whereas it is Our Will and Pleasure that Our said Order shall be conferred only as a reward for distinguished services in action before the enemy:

And whereas it is Our Will and Pleasure that the rule and ordinance contained in Our said Statutes regarding the erasure of the name of a Member from the register of Members of Our said Order and the restoration of the name thereto shall be amended:

And whereas reproductions of the Badges of Our said Order, known as Miniature Badges, are worn on certain occasions and it appears to Us to be expedient that the size and pattern of such Miniature Badges should be clearly defined:

Now therefore, We do, by these Presents for Us, Our Heirs, and Successors, ordain and appoint that the Fourth Clause of Our said Statutes shall be cancelled and annulled and the following substituted therefor:—

Fourthly: It is ordained that no person shall be eligible for this distinction who doth not actually hold, at the time of his

nomination, a Commission in Our Navy, in Our Land Forces or Marines, in Our Air force or in Our Indian, Dominion or Colonial Naval, Military or Air Forces, or a Commission in one of the Departments of Our Navy, Army or Air Force, the holder of which is entitled to Honorary or relative Navy, Army or Air Force rank, nor shall any person be nominated unless his services shall have been marked by the especial mention of his name, by the Admiral or Senior Naval Officer Commanding a Squadron or detached Naval Force, by the Commander in-Chief of the Military Forces in the Field, or by the Air or other officer commanding the Air Forces engaged, in despatches for distinguished services under fire or under conditions equivalent to services in actual combat with the enemy.

Now, Therefore, We do, by these Presents for Us, Our Heirs, and Successors, ordain and appoint that the Thirteenth Clause of Our said Statutes shall be cancelled and annulled and the following substituted therefor:—

Thirteenthly: It is ordained that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, by an Order under Our Sign Manual, and on the recommendation to that effect by or through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State to cancel and annul the appointment of any person to this Order and that thereupon his name in the register of Members shall be erased; but that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, to restore to the Order any person whose appointment may have been so cancelled and annulled when such recommendation has been withdrawn; and notice thereof of cancellation or restoration in every case shall be published in the London Gazette.

And We do further ordain and appoint that Miniature Badges worn by Members of Our said Order shall be half the size of the Badges of Our said Order and that Sealed Patterns of the said Miniature Badges shall be deposited and kept in the Central Chancery of Our Orders of Knighthood.

And whereas We deem it expedient that the size and pattern of such Miniature Decorations shall be clearly defined:

Now therefore We do, by these Presents for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, ordain and appoint that the Twelfth Clause in the said Warrant shall be cancelled and annulled and the following substituted therefor:—

Omnibus Company, Limited, or Thomas Tilling, Limited, who is maintaining at the date hereof a regular service in accordance with Section 6 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, on weekdays, upon any approved route shown in Column 1 of the second Schedule hereto from using, for the purpose of plying for hire in any of the streets or parts thereof declared to be "restricted streets" by any Order made by the Minister of Transport under the aforesaid Section of the London Traffic Act, 1924, and forming part of those routes, such number of omnibuses as shown in Column 2 of the said second Schedule additional to the number of omnibuses which he may so use in those streets or parts thereof under the said Regulations;

provided that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to affect or derogate from the powers of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis under the provisions of Section 52 of the Metropolitan Police Act, 1839, to give directions to constables for keeping order and for preventing any obstruction to the thoroughfares.

LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924.

ACT, 1924.

Whereas the Agricultural Wages Committee for the area comprising the administrative county of Durham which, for the purposes of the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, shall be deemed to include the county boroughs of Darlington, Gateshead, South Shields, Sunderland and West Hartlepool, have, in pursuance of the above Act, duly fixed minimum and overtime rates of wages for workers employed in agriculture for time work in that

area and the said rates are set out in the Schedule to this Order. Now the Agricultural Wages Board, in pursuance of the said Act, and for the purpose of carrying out the decision of the said Committee, hereby order that the provisions contained in the Schedule to this Order shall become effective on 14th May, 1931.

SCHEDULE.

1. The wages payable for the employment of male workers of 21 years of age and over (other than casual workers) shall be not less than wages at the following minimum rates:—

(a) Workers employed wholly or mainly as horsemen:—

(i) Workers who are householders: 32s. per week of 50 hours with in addition 7s. per week to cover all time customarily spent in attention to horses.

(ii) Workers who are not householders and do not receive board and lodging provided by the employer: 31s. per week of 50 hours with in addition 3s. 6d. per week to cover all time customarily spent in attention to horses.

(iii) Workers who receive board and lodging provided by the employer: 31s. (which sum shall include the value of such board and lodging as defined by the Committee) per week of 50 hours and any additional time customarily spent in attention to horses.

(b) Workers employed wholly or mainly as stockmen or shepherds:—

(i) Workers who are householders: 43s. per week of the hours customarily spent in attention to stock.

(ii) Workers who are not householders and do not receive board and lodging provided by the employer: 36s. 10½d. per week of the hours customarily spent in attention to stock.

(iii) Workers who receive board and lodging provided by the employer: 35s. (which sum shall include the value of such board and lodging as defined by the Committee) per week of the hours customarily spent in attention to stock.

(c) Other male workers (except casual workers): 31s. per week of 50 hours (excluding Sunday, Christmas Day and Good Friday).

2. The wages payable for the employment of male workers under 21 years of age (other than casual workers of 19 years of age and over) shall be not less than wages at the following minimum rates:—

3. The wages payable for the employment of male casual workers of 19 years of age and

over shall be not less than wages at the rate of 6d. per hour.

4. For the purpose of the above rates a casual worker shall be deemed to be a worker employed by the same employer for any number of days, whether consecutive or otherwise, not exceeding 28 in any one year.

5. Where a whole-time male worker is employed by the week or any longer period and the hours of work agreed between the worker and the employer in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment) are:—

(a) In the case of a horseman of 21 years of age or over less than 50 hours and time customarily spent in attention to horses,

(b) In the case of a stockman or shepherd of 21 years of age or over less than customary hours,

(c) In the case of any other male worker of 21 years of age or over less than 50 hours, or

(d) In the case of any male worker under 21 years of age less than 50 hours and time customarily spent in attention to horses or stock,

the rate of wages applicable to that worker shall be such as to secure to the worker the wages which would have been payable if the agreed hours had been the full hours mentioned above in the case of that worker.

(i) All employment on a Sunday, Christmas Day and Good Friday except time customarily spent in attention to horses.

(b) In the case of male workers of 21 years of age and over employed wholly or mainly as stockmen or shepherds all employment in any week (including Sunday, Christmas Day and Good Friday) in excess of the hours customarily spent in attention to stock.
