At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 20th day of *March*, 1931.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 10th day of March, 1931 (G.H.), in the words following, viz:—

“Whereas by Section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that the Admiralty shall from time to time continue or appoint such officers, clerks and servants for the purposes of the Hospital and Schools as seem fit, and may (subject to the approval of Your Majesty in Council) fix the salaries of such officers and clerks:

“And whereas by Section 8 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1872, it is enacted that the provisions of Section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, so far as the same relate to salaries, shall extend to pensions and pecuniary benefits of any kind:

“And whereas Mr. H. E. Sharpe, a former Assistant Master in the Royal Hospital School, Greenwich, is eligible for the award of a superannuation allowance from the funds of Greenwich Hospital in respect of his service at Greenwich from 1st March, 1887, to 27th April, 1889:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by

Your Order in Council to sanction the payment from the funds of Greenwich Hospital to Mr. H. E. Sharpe of a Superannuation Allowance (Lump sum) of twenty-seven pounds and four shillings (£27 4s.)”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
