Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been

duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the Diocese of London.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 17th and 18th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 84, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 26th day of February, 1931, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 17th and 18th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 84, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for apportioning the income of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Standish in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Blackburn, between that Benefice and a certain other Benefice namely the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Little Marsden, which said last named Benefice is situate in the said County of Lancaster and in the said Diocese of Blackburn:

" Whereas the Bishop of the said Diocese of Blackburn is the Patron in right of his See of the said Benefice of Standish and also of the said Benefice of Little Marsden:

" And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the said Benefice of Little Marsden is at present insufficiently endowed; and that the said Benefice of Standish has endowments of such an amount as that after the charge hereinafter recommended and proposed to be made shall have been placed upon the same endowments, the said Benefice of Standish will still be sufficiently endowed:

" And whereas the Right Reverend Percy Mark, Bishop of the said Diocese of Blackburn, has represented to us, and we are of opinion, that it is desirable that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within the New Parish of Little Marsden aforesaid, by means of that apportionment of the income of the said Benefice of Standish which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

" And whereas the said Benefice of Standish is now full, the Reverend Charles William Newton Hutton being the present Rector or Incumbent thereof:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, Archbishop of York, acting as Archbishop of the Province within which each of the said two Benefices is situate, and with the consent of the said Percy Mark, Bishop of the said Diocese of Blackburn, acting as such Bishop and also as the Patron in right of his See of each of the said two Benefices as aforesaid (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed this Scheme and sealed the same with their several Episcopal Seals), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and as from the day of the date at which the said Benefice of Standish shall from whatsoever cause be next voided, all the Tithe rent charges Glebe lands and all (if any) other the endowments which shall at the date of the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Standish or which may thereafter belong to the same Benefice shall be charged and for ever thereafter chargeable in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Little Marsden with the annual sum or yearly charge hereinafter mentioned that is to say a clear annual sum or yearly charge of £70 the same annual sum or yearly
