PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend William, by Divine Providence Lord Archbishop of York, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Report to His Majesty in Council, in the following terms:—

"1. That there is in the County and Diocese of York the Parish of Stonegrave (being a Rectory) the boundaries of which are well known and defined, and comprise certain isolated portions situate within the boundaries of the Parish of Nunnington which are coloured green on the map annexed hereto, and also comprise the Township of West Ness which is coloured yellow and hatched green on the said map also that part of the Township of East Ness which is coloured pink and hatched green on the said map and also that portion of the District known as Waterholmes which is coloured green and hatched green on the said map.

"2. That there is also in the said County and Diocese of York that Parish of Hovingham (being a Vicarage) the boundaries of which are well known and defined and comprise that part of the Township of East Ness which is coloured pink on the said map and that part of the said

District known as Waterholmes which is coloured green and hatched red on the said map.

"3. That there is also in the said County and Diocese of York the Parish of Nunnington (being a Rectory) the boundaries of which are well known and defined which adjoin the said Parish of Stonegrave.

"4. That the population of the Parish of Stonegrave exclusive of the Township of West Ness, part of the Township of East Ness and part of the District known as Waterholmes, according to the last census amounts to 213 persons, the population of the Township of West Ness to 30 persons and that there is no population in part of the District known as Waterholmes.

"5. That the net annual value of the said Rectory of Stonegrave amounts to £625 13s. 6d. or thereabouts.

"6. That the population of the said Parish of Hovingham exclusive of the said Township of East Ness and part of the District known as Waterholmes, according to the last census amounts to 780 persons, the population of the said Township of East Ness to 40 persons, and there is no population of part of the District known as Waterholmes.

"7. That the net annual value of the said Vicarage of Hovingham amounts to £350 or thereabouts.

"8. That the population of the said Parish of Nunnington according to the last census amounts to 218 persons.

"9. That the net annual value of the said Rectory of Nunnington amounts to £314 or

thereabouts,

"10. That the Patronage of the said Rectory of Stonegrave is vested in Your Majesty and the Patronage of the said Vicarage of Hovingham is vested in William Arthington Worsley of Hovingham in the County of York a Captain (retired) in His Majesty's Army and that the Patronage of the said Rectory of Nunnington is vested in Sir Edward Clive Coates, Baronet, and that the Incumbent of the said Vicarage of Hovingham is the Reverend George Foster, Master of Arts, and that the Incumbent of the said Rectory of Nunnington is the Reverend Bernard Scott Cockin, Master of Arts, all of whom are consenting parties to the separation and annexation hereinafter proposed, the said Rectory of Stonegrave at present being vacant.

"11. That it appears to the said Archbishop that under the provisions of an Act of Parliament passed in the 1st and 2nd years of the Reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Cap. 106, the said isolated portions of the Parish of Stonegrave situate within the boundaries of the Parish of Nunnington which are coloured green on the said map, the Township of West Ness which is coloured yellow and hatched green on the said map, that part of the Township of East Ness which is coloured pink and hatched green on the said map and that part of the District known as Waterholmes which is coloured green and hatched green on the said map may be advantageously separated from the said Parish of Stonegrave to which they at present belong and be annexed for all Ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Nunnington and that the Township of East Ness which is coloured pink on the said map and that part of the District known as Waterholmes which is coloured green and hatched red on the said map may also be advantageously separated from the Parish of Hovingham to which they at present belong and be annexed for all Ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Nunnington.

"12. That pursuant to the directions contained in the before mentioned Act the Archbishop has prepared a Scheme in writing appended to this Report describing the mode in which it appears to him the alterations above proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent upon such alterations in respect of Ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, Tithes, rent charges and other Ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments and in respect of Patronage and right to pews may be made with justice to all parties concerned.

"13. And the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with such Scheme doth by this Report to Your Majesty in Council submit the same to Your Majesty in Council together with the Consents in writing to the said Scheme of the Patrons and Incumbents of the Parishes affected to the intent that Your Majesty in Council in case it should be thought expedient and proper so to do may make an Order for carrying the Scheme into

"WILLIAM EBOR."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Archbishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

" SCHEME.

"That the isolated portions of the Parish of Stonegrave which are situated within the boundaries of the Parish of Nunnington and which are coloured green on the said map annexed hereto;

"That the Township of West Ness now forming part of the Parish of Stonegrave, which is coloured yellow and hatched green on the

said map;

"That that portion of East Ness now forming part of the Parish of Stonegrave, which is coloured pink and hatched green on the said map;

"That that portion of the District known as Waterholmes now forming part of the Parish of Stonegrave, which is coloured green and hatched green on the said map;

"That the Township of East Ness now forming part of the Parish of Hovingham, which is coloured pink on the said map;

"That that portion of the District known as Waterholmes now forming part of the Parish of Hovingham, which is coloured green and hatched red on the said map.

hatched red on the said map, shall all be separated from their respective Parishes of Stonegrave and Hovingham aforesaid (to which they at present belong) and be annexed for all Ecclesiastical purposes to the

said Parish of Nunnington.

"That all fees and payments received from baptisms, churchings, marriages, and burials and all other Ecclesiastical offices solemnized in respect of the said portions so transferred from the Parishes of Stonegrave and Hovingham to the Parish of Nunnington and all other Ecclesiastical dues, fees, and emoluments usually payable to the Incumbent of a Parish shall henceforth belong to and be received by the Rector of the said Rectory of Nunnington.

"That there shall be transferred from the said Rectory of Stonegrave to the said Rectory of Nunnington on the coming into effect of the Order in Council which carries out this Scheme the sum of £2000 0s. 0d. London, Midland & Scottish Railway 5 per cent. Redeemable Preference Stock (1955) held by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners on behalf of the said Benefice of Stonegrave, the said Stock being part of the total sum of £5,663 0s. 0d. of the same stock so held by them.

"That there shall be no alteration in the Patronage of any of the said Benefices.

"That the inhabitants of the said portions so transferred from the Rectory of Stonegrave and the Vicarage of Hovingham to the Rectory of Nunnington shall cease to have the right of accommodation in the Parish Church and Churchyard of Stonegrave and Hovingham respectively but shall have the same right of accommodation in the Parish Church and Churchyard of Nunnington as have the other inhabitants of the said Parish of Nunnington.

"That the present Incumbent of the Rectory of Nunnington is the Reverend Bernard Scott Cockin, Clerk, M.A., and the present Incumbent of the Vicarage of Hovingham is the Reverend George Foster, Clerk, M.A., and the Rectory of Stonegrave is at present vacant.

"That the consents of the said Rector of Nunnington and the said Vicar of Hovingham and the Consents of the Patrons of the said Benefices of Stonegrave, Hovingham and Nunnington are annexed hereto.

" CONSENTS.

"We, The Reverend Bernard Scott Cockin, Clerk, M.A., Rector of Nunnington in the County and Diocese of York, and The Reverend George Foster, Clerk, M.A., Vicar of Hovingham in the County and Diocese of York, and His Most Gracious Majesty King George the Fifth (by the Right Honourable James Ramsay MacDonald, Prime Minister) Patron of the Rectory of Stonegrave, William Arthington Worsley of Hovingham in the County of York, Captain (retired) in His Majesty's Army, Patron of the said Vicarage of Hovingham, and Sir Edward Clive Coates of Helperby Hall in the County of York, Baronet, the Patron of the said Rectory of Nunnington, do hereby signify our consent to the foregoing Report and Scheme.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal in Silver to Arthur Devere Thomas in recognition of his gallantry in the following circumstances:—

On the 14th January, 1931, Ernest Percival, who was engaged in dismantling a wooden staging fixed across the track of the Metropolitan Railway Station at Kings Cross, slipped and fell, from a height of about 20 feet, to the permanent way of the down Inner Circle line. He was rendered unconscious and lay face downwards across one running rail with his head close to the negative rail of the electrified system.

Arthur Devere Thomas, who was acting as flagman for the protection of the workmen, saw Percival fall and at the same time heard a down train approaching the station round the curve. Realising that a signal could not be seen by the driver in time for him to stop the train, Thomas immediately jumped down from the platform to the up line and, running across two positive and two negative rails carrying 600 volts, snatched Percival up from almost under the wheels of the approaching train, and held him, still unconscious, in a small recess in the wall whilst the train passed within a few inches of them. By reason of his employment, Thomas must have been fully aware of the risks he faced and he displayed conspicuous gallantry in successfully effecting the rescue of Percival.

ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1930.

PART I.

Variation of Provisions of Section 19 so far as it relates to motor vehicles referred to in Section 19 (1) (a) of the Act (Public Service Vehicles).

Paragraph (i) of sub-section (1) of Section 19 of the Act shall be varied so as to provide that in the case of a stage carriage where in any period of 24 hours one period of duty only is worked not exceeding 81 hours in length then the limit of 81 hours may be substituted for the limit of 51 hours imposed by the said paragraph in respect of a continuous period of driving if the driver of the vehicle is allowed intervals of time for signing on and off and for looking over the vehicle before the vehicle leaves and after the vehicle returns to the garage, and for lay over to an extent which in the aggregate is not less than 45 minutes provided that where the continuous period of duty does not exceed 8 hours the allowed intervals of time need not exceed 40 minutes.

Paragraph (iii) of sub-section (1) of Section 19 of the Act shall be varied so as to provide that if between any two periods of driving an express carriage or a contract carriage there is an interval of not less than four consecutive hours at a destination during which the driver of the vehicle is able to obtain rest and refreshment, the period of eight consecutive hours may be substituted for the period of ten consecutive hours of rest on one day in any period of seven consecutive days, or on two days in any period of seven consecutive days if the said period includes a Bank Holiday.

The proviso to sub-section (1) of Section 19 of the Act shall be varied so as to provide that in the case of a stage carriage the period of 8 consecutive hours may on one day in any period of 7 consecutive days be substituted for the period of 9 consecutive hours for rest.

PART II.

Variation of Provisions of Section 19 so far as it relates to motor vehicles referred to in Section 19 (1) (b) and (c) of the Act, (Locomotives, Tractors, and Goods carrying vehicles).

In the case of heavy locomotives, light locomotives, motor tractors, and motor vehicles constructed to carry goods other than the effects of passengers:—

(a) paragraph (i) of sub-section (1) of Section 19 of the Act shall be varied so as to provide that where in any period of 24 hours one period of duty only is worked not exceeding 8 hours in length then the limit of 8 hours may be substituted for the limit of 5½ hours imposed by the said paragraph in respect of a continuous period of driving if the driver of the vehicle is allowed intervals of rest and time for refreshment of not less than 40 minutes in the aggregate, and if one such interval is of not less than 20 minutes to be taken not earlier than 2 hours after the beginning nor later than 5 hours after the beginning of the 8 hours' period of duty; and

(b) paragraph (ii) of sub-section (1) of Section 19 of the Act shall be varied so as to provide that where a driver is employed by the week and receives at least one complete day's rest of 24 hours in each week on not more than 2 days in any week the limit of 12 hours may be substituted for the limit of eleven hours imposed by the said paragraph in respect of the aggregate of continuous periods of driving, provided that some part of the said 12 hours is occupied by the driver in waiting or on work in connection with the loading or unloading of the vehicle.

The Order comes into operation on the 1st day of April, 1931, and is to remain in force unless previously revoked until the 31st day of March, 1933.

DATED 28TH MARCH, 1931.

(D.I.P. 559.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, orders as follows:—

Examination of Fruit Trees.

1. If it appears to the Local Authority from a complaint made to it by a grower of fruit trees that there is reason to suspect that any fruit trees growing on any premises within the district are so affected with any of the pests specified in the Schedule to this Order that any such pest is likely to spread to fruit trees growing on his premises, it shall thereupon cause an Officer (hereinafter called "the

appointed Officer") to examine as soon as may be practicable, the fruit trees suspected of being so affected.

Prevention of Spread of Infection.

- 2. After the examination of the fruit trees under Article 1 hereof the appointed Officer shall make a report thereon to the Local Authority, and the Local Authority, if satisfied that the fruit trees or any of them are so affected as aforesaid
 - (a) shall send to the occupier of the premises a copy of the report of the appointed Officer as soon as reasonably practicable after such report shall have been received by the Local Authority;
 - (b) having sent to the occupier a copy of the said report as required by sub-paragraph (a) hereof may serve upon him notice of its intention to serve upon him such notice as is mentioned in sub-paragraph (c) hereof, specifying therein a time within which objections may be made by him in writing to the serving of such last mentioned notice; and
 - (c) after serving such notice as is mentioned in sub-paragraph (b) hereof, and after considering the objections, if any, duly made by the occupier within the specified time, may serve upon him a notice requiring him, within such time as may be prescribed in the notice, to treat the fruit trees in such manner as may be prescribed in the notice. Such notice may in addition to any other treatment require the cutting out and burning of any branch that is dead or is affected with any of the pests specified in the Schedule to this Order, and the picking and burning of any fruit so affected.
 - (d) Nothing in this Order shall prevent an occupier of premises, upon whom a notice has been served under sub-paragraph (c) hereof, completely destroying by fire or otherwise any fruit trees in respect of which a notice has been served upon him, and if he does so destroy them, he shall be deemed to have complied with the notice.
 - (e) Where a notice has been served under sub-paragraph (c) hereof, the appointed Officer shall, if so directed by the Local Authority, ascertain whether the notice has been complied with.

Powers of appointed Officer.

3. For the purpose of making an examination under Article 1 hereof, or for the purpose of ascertaining whether a notice served under Article 2 (c) hereof has been complied with, the appointed Officer, upon production if so required of his appointment, may at all reasonable times enter upon any premises in the district, and examine any fruit trees thereon, and the occupier of the premises shall give to him all reasonable facilities for carrying out the examination.

Reports and copies of Notices to be sent to the Ministry.

4. The Local Authority shall furnish to the Ministry a report of any action taken by it under this Order, together with details of any

complaints received by it, and a copy of any notice served under Article 2 (c) hereof.

Service of Notices.

5. For the purpose of this Order, a notice shall be deemed to be served on any person if it is delivered to him personally or left for him at his last known place of abode or business, or sent through the post in a letter addressed to him there, and a notice purporting to be signed by the Clerk to the Local Authority shall be prima facie evidence that is was signed by him as Clerk to the Local Authority.

Appointment of Officers.

6. The Local Authority may appoint such persons as the Local Authority may deem desirable to be appointed Officers for the execution of this Order.

Penalties.

- 7. Every person shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, or in the case of a second or subsequent offence, to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds, who
 - (i) fails to comply with any notice served under Article 2 (c) of this Order; or
 - (ii) fails to give to an appointed Officer all reasonable facilities as required by this Order; or
 - (iii) wilfully obstructs or impedes an appointed Officer in the exercise of his powers under this Order.

Definitions.

8. "The District" means the Petty Sessional Divisions of Freebridge Marshland and Clackclose in the Administrative County of Norfolk.
