COLONIAL STOCK ACT 1900 (63 AND 64 VIC. C. 62).

ADDITION TO LIST OF STOCKS UNDER SECTION 2.

Pursuant to Section 2 of the Colonial Stock Act 1900 the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that the provisions of the Act have been complied with in respect of the undermentioned Stock registered or inscribed in the United Kingdom:—

Gold Coast Government 4½ per cent. Inscribed Stock 1960-70.

The restrictions mentioned in Section 2, Subsection (1) of the Trustee Act 1925 apply to the above Stock (see Colonial Stock Act 1900, Section 2).

The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts of women of 18 and young persons of 16 years of age and over in the winding, warping and sizing departments at the works of Messrs. Courtaulds Limited, Marlborough Road, Nuneaton, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not

be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks and that suitable accommodation for clothing put off during working hours, messroom accommodation and washing facilities shall be provided; and that the Secretary of State may at any time require the occupiers to make such special arrangements for the conveyance of workers living at a distance, or otherwise for the welfare of such workers, as may be necessary to prevent hardship.

The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts, of male young persons of 16 years of age and over in clay milling and brick pressing at the works of the Dinnington Main Coal Company Limited Dinnington Main Colliery, near Sheffield, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks and that suitable messroom accommodation and washing facilities shall be provided.
