TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 1st May, 1931, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £35,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 4th May, 1931, to Saturday, the 9th May, 1931, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or

a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

**SHORES OR BANKS OF THE SEA AT
WITHERNSEA.**

PROHIBITION OF REMOVAL OF MATERIALS.

Whereas the Board of Trade acting in pursuance of the Harbours Act, 1814, as amended by the Harbours Transfer Act, 1862, found it necessary for the protection of the harbour or haven of the River Humber and of the shores and banks thereof and of the works thereof to issue an Order, dated the 1st day of August, 1868, prohibiting the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks at Spurn Point from the Low Lighthouse southward to the extreme of the Point at low water and northward two and a half statute miles on both sides of the Spurn Point.

And whereas for the further protection of the said harbour or haven or port and also for the protection of the shores or banks of the Port of Kingston-upon-Hull and of the works thereof the Board of Trade did by an Order dated the 6th day of September, 1869, prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks of the said harbour or haven or from the shores or banks of the Port of Kingston-upon-Hull and the works thereof between the northernmost boundary of the Parish of Hornsea and the limits north of Spurn Point defined by the said Order of the 1st day of August, 1868.

And whereas by Indenture dated the 9th day of July, 1900, the Board of Trade leased to the Urban District Council of Withernsea the foreshore below high-water mark adjacent to the Urban District of Withernsea with the exception therein mentioned.

And whereas the said Urban District Council desiring to construct certain sea defence works at Withernsea and to remove for the purposes of the said sea defence works a quantity of 3000 tons or thereabouts of shingle and ballast from

the shores or banks within the limits hereafter specified the Board of Trade did by an Order dated the 3rd day of January, 1911, revoke the said Order of the 6th day of September, 1869, so far only as that Order prohibited the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks between two points situated respectively 200 feet north of the seaward end of the road known as Northgate and 500 feet south of the seaward end of Pier Road within or adjacent to the said Urban District of Withernsea.

And whereas the said Urban District Council have completed for the said purpose the removal of the quantity of shingle and ballast above specified.

Now therefore the Board of Trade do by this Order revoke the said Order of the 3rd day of January, 1911, and declare the same to be void and of no effect and do further declare that in all respects the said Order of the 6th day of September, 1869, shall again be and remain in full force and operate as heretofore.

Whereas the Agricultural Wages Committee for the area comprising the administrative county of Chester, which for the purposes of the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, shall be deemed to include the city and county borough of Chester, and the county boroughs of Birkenhead, Stockport and Wallasey have, in pursuance of the above Act, duly fixed minimum and overtime rates of wages for workers employed in agriculture for time work in that area, and the said rates are set out in the Schedule to this Order. of overtime employment) are less than 54 the rate of wages applicable to that worker shall be such as to secure to the worker the wages which would have been payable if the agreed hours had been 54.

3. For the purpose of the above rates, the hours of work shall not include meal times, but shall include any time during which by reason of weather conditions, an employer has prevented from working a worker who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

For the purpose of this clause the expression "week" shall be deemed to mean a week consisting of the following number of hours:—

- (a) During the week in which Good Friday falls, 44½.
- (b) During any other week in summer, 54.

3. Where a whole-time male worker to whom Clause 2 of this Order applies is employed by the week or any longer period and the hours of work agreed between the worker and the employer in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment) are less than the full number of hours mentioned in Clause 2 above in respect of that week the rate of wages applicable to that worker shall be such as to secure to the worker the wages which would have been payable if the agreed hours had been the full number of hours mentioned in Clause 2 above in respect of that week.

Provided that this provision shall not apply where the worker has agreed with the employer to take time off without pay.

4. For the purpose of the above rates employment in winter shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the last Sunday in October and terminating on the last Sunday in February, and employment in summer shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the year.

“Any worker employed in agriculture in any county on piece work for which no minimum piece rate has been fixed or any person authorised by such a worker may complain to the agricultural wages committee for the county that the piece rate of wages paid to the worker for that work is such a rate as would yield in the circumstances of the case to an ordinary worker a less amount of wages than the minimum rate for time work applicable in the case of that worker and the committee may, on any such complaint, after giving the employer an opportunity of making such representations as he thinks desirable, direct that the employer shall pay to the worker such additional sum by way of wages for any piece work done by him at that piece rate at any time within fourteen days before the date of complaint or at any time after the date of complaint and before the decision of the committee thereon as in their opinion represents the difference between the amount which would have been paid if the work had been done by an ordinary worker at the minimum rate for time work and the amount actually received by the worker by whom or on whose behalf the complaint is made, and any sum so directed to be paid may be recovered by or on behalf of the worker from the employer summarily as a civil debt.”

Northern Area.—The county boroughs of Blackpool and Preston, the boroughs of Lancaster, Lytham St. Annes and Morecambe and Heysham, the petty sessional divisions of Amounderness, Garstang, Hornby, Kirkham and South Lonsdale, and such parts of the petty sessional divisions of Blackburn and Clitheroe as lie north and west respectively of the river Ribble.

(d) In the case of male workers under 21 years of age all employment in excess of 60 hours in any week (including Sunday but excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment).

(i) that clause (a) (ii) above shall not apply in the case of any worker (whether of the special classes described or not) who, under an agreement with his employer is entitled to twelve days' holiday in each year or to one week's holiday in each half-year on full pay, or to payment of double pay for one week's work in each half-year, and

(ii) That excepting employment on Christmas Day, no employment in connection with the feeding and cleaning of stock shall rank as overtime employment.

Grazing land (other than a garden provided with a cottage) provided by an employer for the sole use of a worker.

DESTRUCTIVE INSECTS AND PESTS ACTS 1877 TO 1927.

IMPORTATION OF RAW CHERRIES ORDER OF 1931.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made the above Order under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts 1877 to 1927. The effect of the Order is to prohibit the landing in England or Wales after the 2nd June of French cherries except those accompanied by certificates issued by the French Phytopathological Service to the effect that the cherries were grown within a small district in the north of France. This area is defined in a Schedule to the Order.

After the 5th June the landing in England or Wales of Italian cherries is prohibited, except of those grown in the Region of Emilia. After the 10th June the importation of cherries grown in any part of Italy is entirely prohibited. Consignments imported between the 6th and 10th June must be accompanied by certificates issued by the Italian Phytopathological Service.

German cherries imported after the 2nd June must be accompanied by certificates of origin; after the 29th June the importation of German cherries is prohibited, except of those accompanied by certificates issued by the German Phytopathological Service to the effect that the cherries were not grown south of latitude 53° N. or in East Prussia.

Cherries grown in other European countries and imported after the 2nd June must be accompanied by certificates of origin.

The certificates prescribed in the Order must be delivered to the Officer of Customs and Excise with the entry relating to the consignment.

Cherries landed without the certificates prescribed in the Order must be destroyed at the expense of the importer unless they are re-exported or are disposed of in accordance with the terms of a licence issued by an Inspector of the Ministry.

An Inspector may enter any premises and open, examine and take samples of any cherries shipped or believed to have been shipped from any European country; any person wilfully obstructing or impeding an Inspector in the exercise of these powers, or failing to comply with the provisions relating to destruction or re-exportation, or with the terms of a licence, is liable to a penalty of £10, or in respect of a second or subsequent offence, to a penalty of £50.

The Order remains in force until the 30th September, 1931.
