AGRICULTURAL WAGES (REGULATION) ACT, 1924.

Whereas the Agricultural Wages Committee for the area comprising the administrative counties of Anglesey and Caernarvon have, in pursuance of the above Act, duly varied the minimum and overtime rates of wages fixed by them and made effective by an Order of the Agricultural Wages Board, dated 10th December, 1928, for workers employed in agriculture for time work in that area, and the said rates, as varied, are set out in the Schedule to this Order. Now the Agricultural Wages Board in pursuance of the said Act, and for the purpose of carrying out the decision of the said Committee, hereby cancel as from 12th May, 1931, the said Order of 10th December, 1928, and hereby order that the provisions contained in the Schedule to this Order shall become effective on 13th May, 1931.

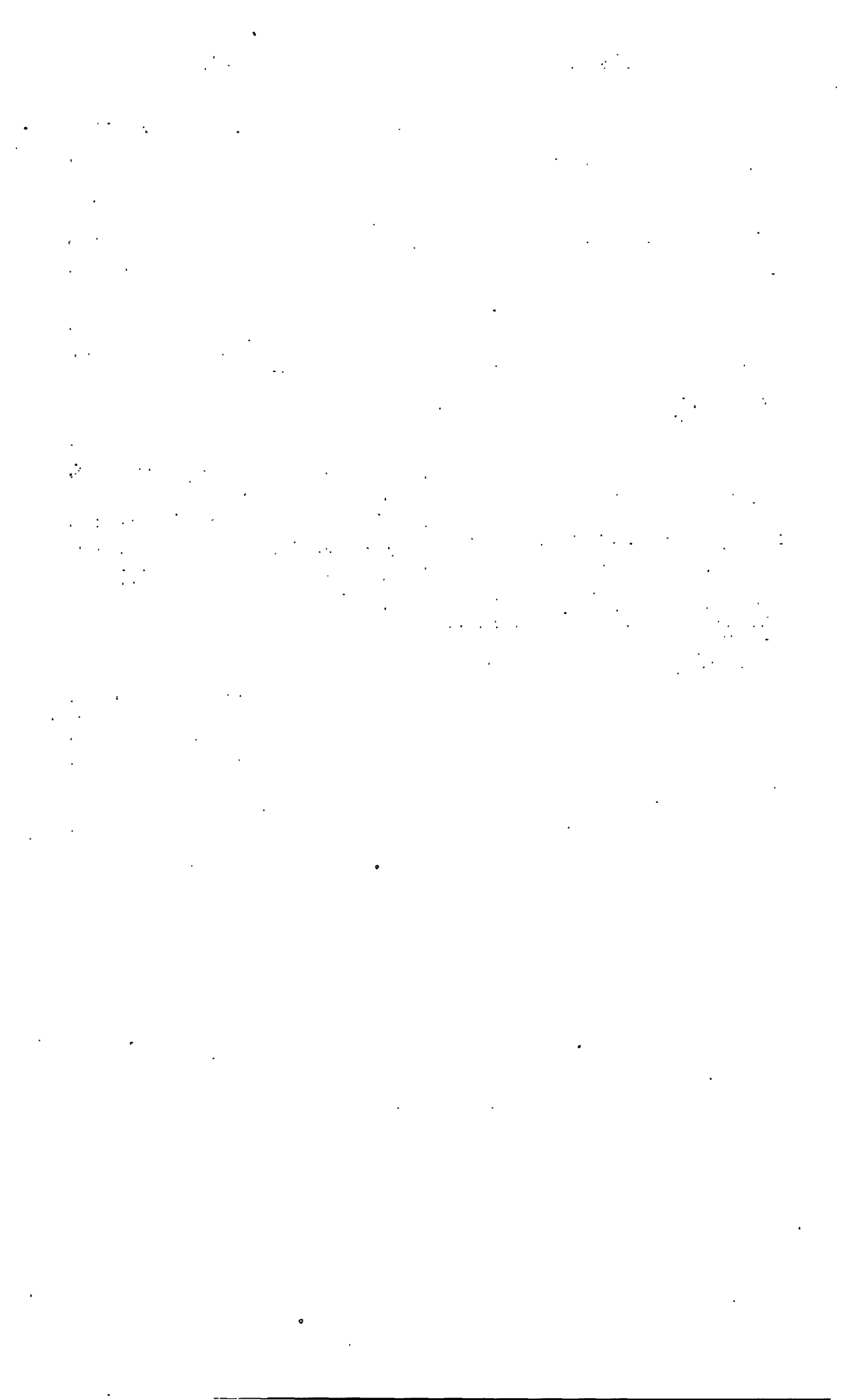
