PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Grenada (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1924, made in pursuance of the powers in His Majesty vested in virtue of the Saint Vincent, Tobago, and Grenada Constitution Act, 1876, it was ordered that there should be in and for the Island of Grenada a Legislative Council which should be constituted as is therein mentioned:

And whereas by the said Order His Majesty reserved to Himself, His heirs and successors, full power and authority from time to time to revoke, alter or amend the said Order as to Him or them should seem fit:

And whereas it is expedient to make other provision than is contained in the Second, Sixth, Eighth, Tenth and Thirty-sixth Clauses of the said Order:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers in His Majesty vested in virtue of the said Act, and of the powers reserved to His Majesty by the said Order, it is hereby ordered by His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, as follows:—

I. This Order may be cited as the Grenada (Legislative Council) Amendment Order in Council, 1930.

II. As from the date of the coming into operation of this Order the Second, Sixth, Eighth, Tenth and Thirty-sixth Clauses of

the Grenada (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1924, are hereby revoked, but without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, and from and after such date the said Grenada (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1924, shall be read and construed as if, instead of the Second, Sixth, Eighth and Tenth Clauses thereof, the following Clauses had been inserted therein:—

“II. In this Order ‘His Majesty’ includes His Majesty's heirs and successors; ‘Secretary of State’ means one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State; ‘Governor’ means the Governor and Commander-in-Chief for the time being of the Windward Islands and includes every person for the time being administering the Government of the Windward Islands; ‘the Island’ and ‘Grenada’ mean the Island of Grenada and its Dependencies; ‘the Council’ means the Legislative Council in and for the Island of Grenada and its Dependencies, which Council shall be known as the Legislative Council of Grenada; words importing the masculine gender shall, unless the context otherwise requires, include the feminine.”

“VI. No person shall be capable of being elected a Member of the Council, or, having been elected, shall sit or vote in the Council, who—

- (1) Is the holder of any office of emolument under the Crown, or under a Municipal Corporation within the Island; or
- (2) Is a minister of religion; or,

(3) Is the returning officer of the district for which the election is held; or,

(4) Is not entitled to vote at the election of a Member of the Council for some electoral district.

The term 'Minister of Religion' in this clause and in Clause VIII means any clergyman, minister, priest, or other person who exercises spiritual functions or performs the offices of religion for or in respect of any Christian or other church, community, or body within Grenada.

The term 'office of emolument' in this clause does not include a pension or other allowance to an officer who has ceased to be in the service of the Crown or of a Municipal Corporation.

No person shall be capable of being elected a Member of the Council for any electoral district, or having been elected, shall sit or vote in the Council, unless he possesses a clear annual income of £200, and either has resided in that electoral district for twelve months immediately preceding the day of election, or is the owner of real property situate in that electoral district of the value of at least £500 above all charges and encumbrances affecting the same."

"VIII. If any Elected Member of the Council shall, by writing under his hand, addressed to the Governor, resign his seat in the Council, or shall cease to possess an income or property qualification as required by Clause VI of this Order, or shall, without the leave of the Governor previously obtained, be absent from the sittings of the Council for three months, or shall make any declaration or acknowledgment of allegiance to any Foreign State or Power, or shall become a citizen or subject of any Foreign State or Power, or shall be adjudicated a bankrupt, or shall be sentenced in any part of His Majesty's dominions to death, penal servitude, or imprisonment with hard labour or for a term exceeding twelve months, or shall accept any office of emolument under the Crown or under a Municipal Corporation within Grenada, or shall become a Minister of Religion, his seat in the Council shall thereupon become vacant.

Whenever it shall be shown to the satisfaction of the Governor that the seat of an Elected Member has become vacant, the Governor shall, as soon as possible, issue a writ for the election of a new member in the place of the member whose seat has become vacant, but if any question shall arise as to the fact of such vacancy, it shall be referred to and decided by the Supreme Court of Grenada."

"X. If any Nominated Member of the Council shall, without the leave of the Governor previously obtained, be absent from the sittings of the Council for three months, or shall make any declaration or acknowledgment of allegiance to any Foreign State or Power, or shall become a citizen or subject of any Foreign State or Power, or shall be adjudicated a bankrupt, or shall be sentenced in any part of His Majesty's dominions to death or penal servitude, or to imprisonment with hard labour or for a term exceeding twelve months, his seat in the Council shall thereupon become vacant."

III. His Majesty hereby reserves to Himself, His heirs and successors, full power and authority from time to time to revoke, alter or amend this Order as to Him or them shall seem fit.

IV. This Order shall be published in the Grenada Government Gazette and shall thereupon come into operation.

And the Right Honourable Lord Passfield, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE LONDON MINT.

VERDICT.

WE, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the third day of March One thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's silver-coins in the Pyx of the Royal Mint in London, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Mint from the 1st day of January One thousand nine hundred and thirty to the 31st day of December One thousand nine hundred and thirty, both days inclusive. We found that there were no gold coins in the said Pyx. We ascertained the number of coins in each packet produced to us, and that such number corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took one coin from each of such packets of silver coins with four additional coins from one of such packets, making altogether three crowns, four half-crowns, twenty-four florins, thirteen shillings, forty-one sixpences, one fourpence, five threepences, two twopences and one penny. We then weighed each one pound troy weight (at its standard weight) of the coins so taken out and ascertained that the said coins so bulked were within the remedy as to weight prescribed by the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920. We then took for assay one pound troy (at its standard weight) of the coins so weighed comprising three crowns, four half-crowns, twelve florins, eleven shillings, ten sixpences, one fourpence, one threepence, two twopences and one penny, and we ascertained that the amount of variation from the standard weight allowed under the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920, was for such pound so taken for assay minus four thousandths ($-\cdot004$) of an ounce on the whole, and that, therefore, such pound troy of silver coins weighed and assayed as aforesaid was on the whole within the variation from standard weight so allowed. We then assayed separately the coins in the pound troy so taken for assay, comparing them with the standard Trial Plate made of pure silver (as prescribed by the Coinage Act 1920) produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal of the said coins was on the whole within the remedy as to fineness prescribed by the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920, and we found that the amount of variation from the standard fineness so prescribed was minus twenty-nine ten thousandths ($-\cdot0029$) on the whole of the coins in such pound, and that, therefore, the said pound troy of silver coins weighed and assayed as aforesaid was, on the whole, within the variation from fineness allowed under the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920. We weighed in bulk the residue of the coins remaining in the said packets of silver coins

and we ascertained that they were on the whole within the remedy as to weight allowed under the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920, being eighty-two thousandths of an ounce ($-\cdot082$) below the standard weight prescribed by the said Acts.

TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE PRETORIA BRANCH MINT.

VERDICT.

WE, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the third day of March One thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's gold coins in the Pyx of the Branch Mint at Pretoria in the Union of South Africa, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Branch Mint from the first day of January one thousand nine hundred and thirty to the thirty first day of December one thousand nine hundred and thirty, both days inclusive. We ascertained the number of coins in each packet produced to us and that such number corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took out one coin from each of such packets of gold coins, amounting altogether to one hundred and one sovereigns or twenty-shilling pieces, and we weighed separately each of the said coins so taken out, and ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed by the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920. We found that the amount of variation from the standard weight so prescribed was nil on the whole of such coins. We then melted all the said gold coins so taken out and separately weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard Trial Plate of gold produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal of the said ingot was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed as aforesaid, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the standard fineness so prescribed was nil, and that therefore the said metal was within the remedy as to fineness allowed under the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920. We weighed in bulk the residue of the said coins remaining in the said packets of gold coins, and we ascertained that they were on the whole within the variation from the standard weight allowed under the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920, being twenty two thousandths of an ounce below the standard weight prescribed by the said Acts. We then took from such residue six sovereigns and

weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such sovereigns weighed respectively,—the first 123·274 grains, the second 123·292 grains, the third 123·269 grains, the fourth 123·154 grains, the fifth 123·287 grains, and the sixth 123·155 grains, and that therefore the said sovereigns were respectively the first nil above or below the second eighteen thousandths of a grain above (+·018), the third five thousandths of a grain below (−·005), the fourth one hundred and twenty thousandths of a grain below (−·120), the fifth thirteen thousandths of a grain above (+·013), the sixth one hundred and nineteen thousandths of a grain below (−·119), the standard weight prescribed by the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920.

We then assayed the said six sovereigns separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such sovereigns to be, the first 916·65, the second 916·66, the third 916·65, the fourth 916·45, the fifth 916·63, and the sixth 916·52, and that therefore the said sovereigns were respectively,—the first one hundred thousandth below (−·00001), the second nil above or below, the third one hundred thousandth below (−·00001), the fourth Twenty one hundred-thousandths below (−·00021), the fifth three hundred thousandths below (−·00003), and the sixth fourteen hundred thousandths below (−·00014), the standard fineness prescribe as aforesaid.

WE, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the third day of March One thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's gold coins in the Pyx of the Branch Mint at Melbourne in the State of Victoria, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Branch Mint from the first day of January One thousand nine hundred and thirty to the thirty-first day of December One thousand nine hundred and thirty, both days inclusive. We ascertained the number of coins in each packet produced to us and that such number corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took out one coin from each of such packets of gold coins, amounting altogether to six sovereigns or twenty-shilling pieces, and we weighed separately each of the said coins so taken out, and ascertained that they were within the

remedy as to weight prescribed by the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920. We found that the amount of variation from the standard weight so prescribed was plus one thousandth of an ounce (+·001 oz.) on the whole of such coins. We weighed in bulk the residue of the said coins remaining in the said packets of gold coins, and we ascertained that they were on the whole within the variation from the standard weight allowed under the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920, being one thousandth of an ounce above the standard weight prescribed by the said Acts. WE, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the third day of March One thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's gold coins in the Pyx of the Branch Mint at Perth in the State of

Western Australia, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Branch Mint from the first day of January One thousand nine hundred and thirty to the thirty-first day of December One thousand nine hundred and thirty, both days inclusive. We ascertained the number of coins in each packet produced to us and that such number corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took out one coin from each of such packets of gold coins, amounting altogether to twenty-six sovereigns or twenty-shilling pieces and we weighed separately each of the said coins so taken out, and ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed by the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920. We found that the amount of variation from the standard weight so prescribed was plus one thousandth of an ounce (+·001 oz.) on the whole of such coins. We then melted all the said gold coins so taken out and separately weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard Trial Plate of gold produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal of the said ingot was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed as aforesaid, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the standard fineness so prescribed was minus five hundred thousandths (or -·00005), and that therefore the said metal was within the remedy as to fineness allowed under the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920. We weighed in bulk the residue of the said coins remaining in the said packets of gold coins, and we ascertained that they were on the whole within the variation from the standard weight allowed under the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920, being one thousandth of an ounce above the standard weight prescribed by the said Acts. We then took from such residue two sovereigns and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such sovereigns weighed respectively,—the first 123·268 grains, the second 123·213 grains, and that therefore the said sovereigns were respectively the first six thousandths of a grain below (-·006), the second sixty-one thousandths of a grain below (-·061), the standard weight prescribed by the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920.

We then assayed the said two sovereigns separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such sovereigns to be, the first 916·64, the second 916·51, and that therefore the said sovereigns were respectively,—the first two hundred thousandths below (-·00002), the second fifteen hundred thousandths below (-·00015) the standard fineness prescribed as aforesaid.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 13TH MAY, 1931.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Authorisation of Landing of Animals for Exceptional Purposes.

1. The landing of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto, which are intended for exceptional purposes, is hereby allowed subject to the provisions of Part II (Quarantine) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of Part VI of the Animals (Importation) Order of 1930, and of this Order.

Definition of Quarantine Station.

2. The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, are hereby defined as an Im-

ported Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the detention of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto.

Examination before Landing.

3. No such animal as aforesaid shall be landed except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry, which licence shall not be granted unless and until the animal has been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry and certified by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease.

Regulations applicable to the Animals on Landing.

4.—(1) The animals on being landed, shall forthwith be moved direct and without avoidable delay from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days. During the said period the animals shall be kept separate from all other animals and no other animal shall be moved into such premises.

(2) The animals shall not be removed from the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto otherwise than under the authority of the licence from an Inspector of the Ministry required under Article 40 (8) of the Animals (Importation) Order of 1930.

(3) A copy of every licence authorising the movement of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto shall be forwarded to the Ministry by the Inspector who grants the licence.

AGRICULTURAL WAGES (REGULATION) ACT, 1924.

Whereas the Agricultural Wages Committee for the area comprising the administrative counties of East Suffolk and West Suffolk which for the purposes of the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, shall be deemed to include the county borough of Ipswich,

have, in pursuance of the above Act, duly cancelled the minimum and overtime rates of wages for male workers employed in agriculture for time work fixed by them and made effective by an Order of the Agricultural Wages Board dated 16th July, 1929, and have duly fixed minimum and overtime rates of wages in substitution therefor, and the said rates are set out in the First Schedule to this Order. Now the Agricultural Wages Board, in pursuance of the said Act, and for the purpose of carrying out the decision of the said Committee hereby cancel as from 6th June, 1931, the said Order of the 16th July, 1929, and hereby order that the provisions contained in the First Schedule to this Order shall become effective on 7th June, 1931.

The minimum rates of wages for female workers employed in agriculture for time work fixed by the Suffolk Agricultural Wages Committee and made effective by an Order of the Agricultural Wages Board dated 24th February, 1925, are set out in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

1. The wages payable for the employment of male workers (other than workers of 18 years of age and over employed wholly or mainly as horsemen, cowmen or shepherds) shall be not less than wages at the following minimum rates:—

2. The wages payable for the employment of male workers of 18 years of age and over wholly or mainly as horsemen, cowmen or shepherds shall be not less than wages at the rates set out in Clause 1 above in respect of employment other than employment up to 10 hours per week in connection with the duties of feeding, cleaning, milking, bedding down and mucking out stock, or other similar duties in connection with the immediate care of animals with, in addition, an inclusive weekly sum of 6s. in respect of employment up to 10 hours per week on such duties.

3. Where a worker fails in any week, through his own default, to complete during hours which are not hours of overtime employment, the following number of hours, that is to say:—

(i) In the case of a worker (other than a worker of 18 years of age or over employed wholly or mainly as a horseman, cowman or

shepherd) 39½ in the week in which Christmas Day falls, 48 in any other week in winter, or 50 in any week in summer; or

(ii) In the case of a worker of 18 years of age or over employed wholly or mainly as a horseman, cowman or shepherd, 39½ in the week in which Christmas Day falls, 48 in any other week in winter, or 50 in any week in summer on work other than employment in connection with the duties of feeding, cleaning, milking, bedding-down and mucking out stock, or other similar duties in connection with the immediate care of animals,

he shall only be entitled to be paid wages at such of the rates set out in Causes 1 or 2 above as are applicable to him for such hours as he has in fact worked, and in such case the provisions of Clause 4 below shall not apply.

4. Where a whole-time worker is employed by the week or any longer period and the hours of work agreed between the employer and the worker in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment and, in the case of workers of 18 years of age and over employed wholly or mainly as horsemen, cowmen or shepherds, excluding also employment up to 10 hours in connection with the duties of feeding, cleaning, milking, bedding-down and mucking out stock or other similar duties in connection with the immediate care of animals) are less than 39½ in the week in which Christmas Day falls, 48 in any other week in winter, or 50 in any week in summer the rate of wages applicable to that worker shall be such as to secure to that worker the wages which would have been payable if the agreed hours had been 39½ in the week in which Christmas Day falls, 48 in any other week in winter or 50 in any week in summer.

5. For the purpose of the above rates a worker employed wholly or mainly as a horseman, shall be deemed to be a worker to whom the duties of feeding, cleaning, bedding-down and mucking out horses are assigned by his employer and who at the request of his employer, regularly works more than 50 hours per week in summer and 48 hours per week (other than the week in which Christmas Day falls) in winter.

6. For the purpose of the above rates employment in summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March and terminating on the last Sunday in October, and employment in winter shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the year.

7. For the purpose of the above rates the hours of work shall not include meal times but shall include any time during which by reason of weather conditions an employer has prevented from working a worker who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

8. The differential rates of wages for overtime employment of male workers shall be not less than the following minimum rates:—

9. These rates shall continue in operation until 24th December, 1932.

10. For the purpose of the application of the above differential rates of wages for overtime employment, the Suffolk Agricultural Wages Committee have by Order dated 17th June, 1929, defined the following employment as the employment which is to be treated as overtime employment:—

(a) All employment on a Sunday and on Christmas Day.

(b) All employment after 12.30 p.m. in summer and 1.30 p.m. in winter on a Saturday, or on such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between employer and worker.

(c) All employment in excess of 50 hours (excluding all hours which are treated as hours of overtime employment, and in the case of workers of 18 years of age and over employed wholly or mainly as horsemen, cowmen or shepherds, excluding also employment up to 10 hours per week in connection with the duties of feeding, cleaning, milking, bedding-down and mucking out stock or other similar duties in connection with the immediate care of animals) in any week in summer.

(d) All employment in excess of 39½ hours (excluding all hours which are treated as hours of overtime employment and in the case of workers of 18 years of age and over employed wholly or mainly as horsemen, cowmen or shepherds, excluding also employment up to 10 hours in connection with the duties of feeding, cleaning, milking, bedding-down and mucking out stock or other similar duties in connection with the immediate care of animals) in the week in which Christmas Day falls.

(e) All employment in excess of 48 hours (excluding all hours which are treated as hours of overtime employment and in the case of workers of 18 years of age and over employed wholly or mainly as horsemen, cowmen or shepherds, excluding also employment up to 10 hours per week in connection with the duties of feeding, cleaning, milking, bedding-down and mucking out stock or other similar duties in connection with the immediate care of animals) in any other week in winter.

But so that, in the case of workers of 18 years of age and over employed wholly or mainly as horsemen, cowmen or shepherds, no employment up to 10 hours per week in connection with the duties of feeding, cleaning, milking, bedding-down and mucking out stock or other similar duties in connection with the immediate care of animals shall rank as overtime employment.
