The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 29th day of April, 1931 (C.W. 10213/30), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas under various Orders in Council regulations have been laid down governing the extension of full pay to Officers of Your Majesty's Naval Service in respect of leave after the expiration of their appointments:

“And whereas under the said regulations officers whose leave after the expiration of an appointment is interrupted by a further appointment not exceeding 91 days may, on the

termination of the latter, be granted an extension of full pay for the balance of untaken leave earned in the earlier appointment:

“And whereas we consider that this rule requires modification as regards Naval Officers of or above the rank or equivalent rank of Captain who are eligible for full pay leave in respect of a period of foreign service rendered in such ranks:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to empower us, at our discretion and with effect from the 25th day of July, 1930, to grant to any such officer, who, before the expiration of any full pay leave due to him in respect of an appointment for service abroad, is given an appointment of more than three months' but not more than one year's duration, on the expiration of the later appointment, at his option, either—

(a) a period of full pay leave equal to the unexpended balance of foreign service leave due in respect of the earlier appointment, at the rate of pay appropriate to the rank in which such foreign service was rendered, or

(b) a period of full pay leave equal to the unexpended balance of leave due in respect of the later appointment at the rate of pay appropriate to the rank in which such later service was rendered,

provided, however, that such period of full pay leave shall in no case extend beyond the

day preceding that on which the officer may become due for compulsory retirement, and provided also that the option, once exercised, shall be final.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 21st day of April, 1931 (N. 496/31), in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we consider that for greater efficiency it is expedient to take steps to amalgamate, as regards future entrants, the Officers' Cook and Ship's Cook branches of the Royal Navy, which now have separate systems of entry, training and advancement, by the creation of a new Naval Cook Branch:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve the establishment as from the first day of April, 1931, of a new branch of the Royal Navy, with titles and rates of pay as shown in the attached Schedule, and the immediate substitution of the new Officer titles for those at present in use by the corresponding ranks of the existing establishment.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being, or having been, an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 10th day of August, 1922, to sanction the payment of certain allowances to Officers' Stewards in Your Majesty's Navy for the care of mess traps supplied to Flag Officers' and Commanding Officers' messes:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that the allowances payable for the care of mess traps of Flag Captains, Commanders, Lieutenant Commanders and Lieutenants in Command should be revised:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve the payment of an allowance of 3d. a day to Officers' Stewards for the care of mess traps supplied to Flag Captains, Commanders, Lieutenant Commanders and Lieutenants in Command of Ships of Your Majesty's Navy on commissioning or recommissioning in lieu of the present allowances of 4d., 3d. and 2d. a day respectively.

(C.W. 10025/30), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Orders in Council bearing dates the 25th July, 1927, and the 5th November, 1929, to provide, *inter alia*, that Medical and Dental Officers of Your Majesty's Navy who have held approved appointments in recognised Civil Hospitals before their entry into the Service may be granted additional seniority in respect of such Civil Hospital service, subject, among other restrictions, to the concession not ordinarily being granted where the interval between the termination of the hospital appointment and the date of entry into the Service exceeds six months:

"And whereas we are of opinion that it is in the interest of Your Majesty's Naval Service that this restriction should be abolished:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to empower us, at our discretion, to apply the provisions of Orders in Council dated the 25th July, 1927, and 5th November, 1929, relating to the grant of ante-date of seniority to Medical and Dental Officers in respect of Civil Hospital appointments, without regard to the length of the interval between the termination of Civil Hospital appointment and the date of entry into the Service, subject to the condition that where the interval between the termination of the Civil Hospital appointment and the date of entry into the Service exceeds six months, the time covered by any ante-date of seniority approved shall not be allowed to reckon as service for retired pay in the case of an officer who may apply to retire voluntarily unless he shall have completed 12 years' service counting for retired pay independently of such time.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Dockyard Ports Regulation Act, 1865, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council from time to time, by Order in Council, to define

the limits of a Dockyard Port for the purposes of that Act, and to make regulations in relation to any Dockyard Port for all or any of the purposes in the said Act particularly mentioned, and for such other purposes as from time to time seem necessary, with a view to the proper protection of His Majesty's vessels, dockyards, or property, or to the requirements of His Majesty's Naval Service:

And whereas by the same Act it is also enacted that in relation to any Dockyard Port it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council from time to time, by Order in Council, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, to make rules concerning the lights or signals to be carried or used, and the steps for avoiding collisions to be taken by His Majesty's vessels and other vessels navigating the waters of the Port and of the approaches thereto:

And whereas, in pursuance of the said Act, certain regulations and rules were made by Orders in Council, dated the 16th day of December, 1912, the 9th day of February, 1914, the 4th day of September, 1918, the 21st day of December, 1920, the 13th day of October, 1922, the 20th day of February, 1924, the 12th day of October, 1925, the 29th day of March, 1926 and the 7th day of May, 1928 with reference to the Dockyard Port of Portsmouth:

And whereas it appears expedient to repeal the said Orders in Council and regulations and rules and to substitute therefor this Order and the regulations and rules contained in the First and Second Schedules hereto respectively:

And whereas the provisions of section one of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the said Act or otherwise in Him vested, and so far as regards the rules contained in the Second Schedule hereto, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

#### PRELIMINARY.

1. This Order shall take effect from one calendar month from the date hereof.

2. On this Order taking effect the said Orders of the 16th December, 1912, the 9th February, 1914, the 4th September, 1918, the 21st December, 1920, the 13th October, 1922, the 20th February, 1924, the 12th October, 1925, the 29th March, 1926 and the 7th May, 1928, shall cease to operate, and in lieu of the regulations and rules thereby made the regulations and rules set forth in the First and Second Schedules to this Order are hereby made and shall have effect in relation to the Dockyard Port of Portsmouth.

3. In this Order and in the Schedules hereto:—

The term "vessel" shall mean and include ship, boat, lighter and craft of every kind however propelled;

The term "steam vessel" shall include any vessel propelled by machinery;

The term "master" shall mean the person having command or charge of the vessel for the time being;

The term "King's Harbour Master" shall mean the person for the time being appointed to be King's Harbour Master of the Dockyard Port of Portsmouth under the Dockyard Ports Regulation Act, 1865;

The term "Dockyard Port" shall mean the Dockyard Port of Portsmouth as defined in paragraph 4 hereof;

The term "Harbour" shall mean Portsmouth Harbour as defined in paragraph 4 hereof.

#### DESCRIPTION OF LIMITS.

##### *Dockyard Port of Portsmouth.*

4. The limits of the Dockyard Port of Portsmouth shall be as follows:—

On the east a straight line drawn from the Coast Guard Station at  $1\frac{1}{2}$  nautical miles to the westward of Eastoke Point in a direction S.  $7\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  W. (true) for a distance of  $8\frac{1}{2}$  nautical miles.

On the south a straight line running in a direction East (true) from the hill 148 feet high situated in the south part of Sandown Bay, about half a mile north of Shanklin Pier, until the Coast Guard Station  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles west of Eastoke Point bears N.  $7\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  E. (true).

On the south-west the high-water mark of the eastern and northern shores of the Isle of Wight, from the aforesaid hill 148 feet high in Sandown Bay to Old Castle Point, with all bays, creeks, lakes, pools, and rivers as far as the tide flows between these points.

On the west a straight line drawn from Old Castle Point to Hill Head Point.

On the north the line of high-water mark between Hill Head and the Coast Guard Station near Eastoke Point, including Portsmouth and Langston Harbours, with all bays, creeks, lakes, pools, and rivers, as far as the tide flows between those limits, including all that are connected with the said harbours. (Langston Harbour for this purpose is considered to terminate at Hayling Bridge.)

##### *Limits of Portsmouth Harbour.*

The seaward boundary of Portsmouth Harbour shall be as follows, viz.:—Straight lines passing from the centre of Fort Monckton successively through the Spit Fort, and the outer Spit Buoy, to the Horse Fort, and thence to Southsea Castle; and the said Harbour shall comprise all portions of the Dockyard Port aforesaid which are on the inner or landward side of the said boundary.

#### DELINEATION OF LIMITS.

5. On the chart accompanying this Order are drawn all the limits of the Dockyard Port of Portsmouth and of Portsmouth Harbour.

#### PENALTIES.

6. Any infringement of the regulations contained in the First Schedule hereto shall render the person infringing liable to the penalty prescribed in clause 32 of the said Schedule.

## FIRST SCHEDULE.

## REGULATIONS.

## GENERAL.

1. Moorings for His Majesty's vessels, mark buoys, and other aids to navigation, and such other buoys as may be required for any purpose in connection with naval or military operations, may be placed by the King's Harbour Master in such positions as he may from time to time consider the requirements of His Majesty's Service demand.

2. No person shall lay moorings for private vessels, hulks, rafts, pontoons, bathing stages, houseboats, timber, or any floating structures in the Dockyard Port without the permission in writing of the King's Harbour Master, and all such moorings shall be in such positions as the King's Harbour Master shall deem fit, and shall be forthwith removed on the requisition of the King's Harbour Master to that effect.

3. If at any time the anchor of any merchant or other private vessel hooks any Government moorings, or any electric cables, or moorings of buoys, the master of such vessel shall not proceed to unhook the same, but shall forthwith give notice thereof to the Admiral Superintendent or to the King's Harbour Master, in order that aid may be given for clearing such moorings or cables without doing damage to the same.

4. No merchant or other private vessel of above five tons, compelled or allowed to anchor in or near any of the navigable channels of the Dockyard Port, shall be left at any time without a shipkeeper.

5. No fishing from boats shall be carried on within one hundred feet of His Majesty's Dockyards or other Government establishments.

No trawling or fishing by nets, whether drift nets or set nets, shall be at any time carried on in the main fairway of Portsmouth Harbour inside the Outer Spit Buoy.

6. No ballast, stones, sand, earth, clay, refuse, ashes, rubbish, dust, filth of any description, nor refuse from any quarry, mine, or pit, nor any other matters solid or liquid whatsoever shall be unladen, cast or allowed to fall into the waters of the Dockyard Port, except in such places as may be appointed by the King's Harbour Master, or upon the banks or any portion of the shore of the Dockyard Port where the same may be liable to be washed into the waters of the Dockyard Port by rain, tide, or otherwise; or into or upon the shores of any rivers or streams discharging into the Dockyard Port where the same may be liable to be washed into the said rivers or streams by rain, flood, or otherwise.

7. The steam syren shall not be used within the limits of the Harbour except to prevent collision or in case of fog.

8. No firearm nor air-gun shall be discharged from any vessel or from the shore, over the water of the Harbour of Portsmouth, including Forton Lake and Haslar Creek as far as Haslar Bridge between the following limits, namely:—on the south, a line from Blockhouse Point to the Round Tower, and on the north, a line from Foxbury Point to Hilsea Point; or within two hundred yards of any vessel in the remainder of the Dockyard Port, excepting

always such discharge of firearms as may be necessary by His Majesty's naval and military forces, and the metropolitan police employed within the limits of the said port, for drill or practice, and for the protection of His Majesty's vessels and the naval and military magazines and establishments.

9. No ship's gun on board any merchant or other private vessel lying in the Harbour shall be kept loaded, nor shall any such gun be discharged except as a signal of distress.

10. Whenever it may be necessary for mining or gunnery operations or experiments, dredging operations, or other naval or military purposes, to reserve any area for such operations or purposes, the area will be marked by buoys coloured Green and White, or by posts coloured Red, and after twenty-one days' warning notice has been issued by the Admiralty, and published in the London Gazette, prohibiting within the area so marked either trawling, or anchoring and kedging, or trawling, anchoring, kedging and passing through the said area, no vessel shall act in contravention of the said warning notice, unless compelled to do so by stress of weather or to avoid accident; nor when such area is uncovered or nearly uncovered at low water shall any person pass through or remain in it, unless by permission of and under such arrangements as may from time to time be made by the Officer in charge of such operations.

11. Merchant and other private vessels having jibbooms or running bowsprits shall run them in on entering the Harbour within Blockhouse Point, and keep them in until the day of their leaving the Harbour.

## ANCHORAGE.

## General.

12. All merchant or other private vessels shall be subject to the direction of the King's Harbour Master.

13. No merchant or other private vessel shall lie, or be moored, so as to impede the free approach to any pier in the Dockyard Port used for purposes of regular passenger traffic, and when buoys are placed by the King's Harbour Master to mark an approach to such pier, no vessel shall lie within the space so marked.

14. No merchant or other private vessel shall make fast to, or lie at, any of the buoys marking the channels or shoals in the Dockyard Port.

15. No merchant or other private vessel shall, without licence in writing from the Port Admiral, Admiral Superintendent, or King's Harbour Master, be moored or fastened to any of the forts, government moorings, buoys, piles or vessels in the Dockyard Port.

16. No vessel shall anchor on the line of any electric cable laid down in the Dockyard Port, when such line is indicated by whitewashed posts, or other discernible marks erected on shore, and a warning has been conveyed to mariners by notice issued by the Admiralty and published in the London Gazette.

## Spithead.

17. No merchant or other private vessel shall be anchored or moored at Spithead within two cables of any of His Majesty's vessels or foreign men-of-war lying there, and every merchant or other private vessel shall, on being

required to do so, anchor in or remove to such place as the King's Harbour Master or the Senior Naval Officer at Spithead may direct.

18. When owing to special circumstances it is necessary to keep the anchorage at Spithead clear of merchant and other private vessels, the following signal will be hoisted at Horse Sand Fort:

By day: A large black pendant.

By night: A white light over two red lights vertical.

While either of these signals is hoisted no merchant or other private vessel shall anchor within an area bounded

on the west, by a line drawn 180° through the centre of Gilkicker Fort to Sturbridge Shoal;

on the east, by a line drawn 180° through Southsea Castle Light to a point  $2\frac{1}{2}$  cables 090° from Noman's Fort;

on the north, by the 3 fathom line; and

on the south, by the 10 fathom line;

and any vessel already anchored in this area is to shift berth accordingly.

19. No merchant or other private vessel shall be moored, anchored, or grounded within one cable of the Spit Fort, the Horse Fort, the Noman's Fort or the St. Helen's Fort.

#### *Portsmouth Harbour.*

20. Masters of vessels in the service of His Majesty's Government or having Government cargoes on board are, immediately on arrival, to report themselves to the King's Harbour Master and take the berth assigned to them by him.

21. All merchant and other private vessels using the Harbour inside Blockhouse Point shall, unless special permission is obtained from the King's Harbour Master to do otherwise, anchor, moor or lie on the shore only at the following places within the Harbour, namely:—

(a) On the Gosport shore, on that part of it which lies between a straight line drawn true east from the Hard at Gosport and another such line drawn true east from the north corner of the wharf at Stony Steps, and extending into the Harbour to within fifty fathoms from the centre of any of His Majesty's moorings, but not so as to obstruct the main passage-way of the Harbour;

(b) On the Portsmouth shore, within the area indicated by the following marks:—

On the west: Lighthouse on Spit Fort in line with the western house at Point;

On the north: Tower of Town Hall touching the south wall of the Gun Wharf Camber;

and vessels shall not lie so as to obstruct the channel into the Gun Wharf Camber, nor approach the piles in front of the Gun Wharf nearer than forty feet.

22. Merchant and other private vessels may also (subject to clauses 8, 9 and 10 of the Second Schedule of this Order) proceed to, and lie alongside Flathouse Wharf in the vicinity of the Gasworks in Fountain Lake on the Portsmouth shore.

23. Small yachts and other small vessels may lie off Southsea beach, but out of the fairway into the Harbour, in such areas as the King's Harbour Master may from time to time permit.

24. No merchant or other private vessel shall lie or be moored, anchored, grounded, deposited or run on shore in the fairway of the channel of the Harbour, or in the passages leading into that fairway, between the Outer Spit Buoy and Blockhouse Point on the west side and between the Horse Fort and the Round Tower on the east side.

25. Small vessels may discharge by permission of the King's Harbour Master between the Common Hard and that part of the Timber Pound called the Logs.

26. Pilot and fishing boats which frequent the Harbour shall occupy the space above the Pontoon in Haslar Creek, or that part of the Gosport shore which lies between Blockhouse Point and the Gosport Pier; provided they do not interfere with any of His Majesty's vessels, moorings or buoys, and that they leave a clear passage for any vessel into or out of the Creek at Haslar.

27. Yachts having the privilege of laying up in Haslar Creek shall so moor as to leave the channel clear and the anchors by which they are moored shall be buried.

28. No vessel laid by or neglected as unfit for sea service shall lie within any part of the Harbour except on the shore between the point lying due east (true) of Whale Island and Mile End cemetery wall.

#### *PREVENTION OF FIRE.*

29. No merchant or other private vessel shall be breamed in any part of the Harbour except on the beach at Gosport or Blockhouse at a distance of at least two hundred yards from any of His Majesty's vessels or moorings.

30. Within the distance of two hundred yards from any of His Majesty's vessels, or of any hired vessel in His Majesty's service, or of any of His Majesty's docks, dockyards, arsenals, powder magazines or wharves:—

(a) No pitch, tar, resin, turpentine, grease, tallow, oil, nor other combustible matter, shall be boiled or heated on board of any merchant or other private vessel in the Harbour;

(b) No fire shall be kept on board any merchant or other private vessel in the Harbour, except in steam vessels' furnaces, between eleven o'clock in the evening and five o'clock in the morning from the 1st of October to the 31st of March inclusive, or between eleven o'clock in the evening and four o'clock in the morning between the 1st of April and the 30th of September inclusive.

31. No merchant or other private vessel laden wholly or in part with petroleum shall pass within the limits of the Harbour until certificates to the effect hereinafter mentioned have been lodged with the King's Harbour Master and his permission has been obtained.

*First.*—A test certificate from the port of shipment signed by a person skilled in the testing of petroleum and countersigned, if the port of shipment be a foreign port by the British Consul, and if the port of shipment be a British port by the Collector or other proper Officer of Customs, to the effect that the oil does not give off inflammable vapour below the temperature of 73 degrees of Fahrenheit's thermometer.

*Second.*—A certificate from the importers or brokers of the petroleum to the same effect.

Any ship laden as above shall anchor near the edge of the Spit Sand with the Spit Fort bearing north-east by east, until permission to pass within the limits of the Harbour is obtained.

#### PENALTIES.

32. The master of every merchant or other private vessel to which this Order relates shall observe and cause to be observed the said regulations in this Schedule so far as they relate to his vessel, and if any master or other person acts in any respect in contravention of any of the said regulations, or fails to observe or to cause the same to be observed, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding the sum of ten pounds.

### SECOND SCHEDULE.

#### RULES.

##### GENERAL.

#### *Observance of "Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea."*

1. All vessels when within the limits of the Dockyard Port shall, except as is otherwise provided in Clauses 12 and 17 of this Schedule, carry such lights as are prescribed by the "Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea" made from time to time under the Merchant Shipping Act; and all vessels of every description shall also observe the steering and sailing rules set forth in such regulations, except in so far as they are affected by the rules hereinafter contained.

#### *Vessels to keep clear of any Fleet or Squadron assembled at Spithead.*

2. When any Fleet or Squadron is assembled at Spithead, no vessel shall pass through the line of such Fleet or Squadron, except in such directions and in such manner as shall be announced at the time by notice issued by the Admiralty and published in the London Gazette. Should the master of any vessel act contrary to such notice, the King's Harbour Master may cause such vessel to be removed from the area occupied by such Fleet or Squadron.

#### *Vessels not to approach Vessels carrying Royal or other Standard at Masthead.*

3. No vessel shall unnecessarily approach within 2 cables of any vessel carrying the royal or any other standard at the masthead, when under way in the waters of the Dockyard Port outside the limits of the Harbour.

#### *Sound Signals for Vessels in Sight of one another.*

4. Whenever steam vessels within the limits of the Dockyard Port are in risk of collision, they shall, in addition to any signals required by Article 28 of the "Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea," indicate their own action as follows:—

If steaming ahead, by one long blast on the whistle or syren.

If stopped, by two long blasts.

#### *Regulations for Vessels going alongside certain Piers.*

5. Steam vessels approaching or leaving Clarence pier, Ryde pier, or other piers are to confine themselves to the lanes of approach marked by pecked lines on the Admiralty charts, in which lanes anchorage is prohibited.

#### *Speed of Vessels navigating the Port.*

6.—(a) No merchant or other private vessel, when navigating inside of Blockhouse Fort or when within half a mile of the shore in any part of the Dockyard Port outside Blockhouse Fort shall proceed at a greater speed than 7 knots, subject as hereinafter provided.

(b) No merchant or other private vessel shall exceed the speed of 12 knots in any part of the Dockyard Port when within half a mile of any of His Majesty's vessels, whether those vessels are under way or at anchor.

(c) The owners of certain small craft possessing propelling machinery making it impracticable for them to observe a speed limit of 7 knots may be granted permission by the King's Harbour Master to proceed at a speed up to but not in any case exceeding 10 knots, when inside Blockhouse Fort or when within half a mile of the shore in any other part of the Dockyard Port; such craft shall be navigated with caution and in accordance with the terms of the permission and shall give His Majesty's vessels a wide berth. A permission so granted shall not affect or limit in any way the liability of the owner in respect of damage caused by the craft by wash or otherwise.

#### *Marking of Wrecks.*

7. Should a vessel sink or become a wreck in any part of the Dockyard Port so that an obstruction in a navigable fairway is caused, which in the opinion of the King's Harbour Master it is necessary to mark, such wreck shall be indicated in accordance with the Uniform system of Wreck-Marking off the coasts of the British Isles, as follows:—

(1) Green shall be the colour for all purposes connected with Wreck-Marking, namely, for lights, buoys, balls, shapes, wreck-marking vessels, &c.

(2) Vessels and buoys shall have the word "WRECK" painted in white letters on their sides.

(3) Throughout these regulations the term "Starboard Hand" shall denote that side which would be on right hand of the mariner, either going with the mainstream of the flood or approaching a harbour, river, or estuary from seaward; the term "Port Hand" shall denote the left hand of the mariner in the same circumstances.

(4) *Shapes and Characteristics of Wreck-marking Buoys.*

When a wreck-marking buoy is used, it shall be of one of the following shapes, and (if a light is carried) it shall be lighted in one of the manners following to indicate to the mariner on which hand he should pass the buoy.

(a) To be passed on the mariner's Port Hand—

Shape.—Can.

Light.—If lighted, a Green Light giving two flashes.

(b) To be passed on the mariner's Starboard Hand—

Shape.—Conical.

Light.—If lighted, a Green Light giving three flashes.

(c) To be passed on either side—

Shape.—Spherical.

Light.—If lighted, a Green Light giving one flash.

#### (5) *Characteristics of Wreck-Marking Vessels.*

When a wreck-marking vessel is used, it shall carry the lights and shapes and give the sound signals following to indicate to the mariner on which hand he should pass the vessel:—

##### (1) *Lights.*

(i) Between sunset and sunrise to carry the following lights:—

(a) To be passed on the mariner's Port Hand—

Two green lights in a vertical line not less than 6 feet apart from the end of a cross-yard, the lower light to be of a height not less than 15 feet above the hull.

(b) To be passed on the mariner's Starboard Hand—

Three green lights in a vertical line not less than 6 feet apart from the end of a cross-yard, the lowest light to be of a height not less than 9 feet above the hull.

(c) To be passed on either side—

Four green lights, two in a vertical line one over the other, not less than 6 feet apart, on each end of a cross-yard with a horizontal distance between the lights at either end of the cross-yard not less than 15 feet, and not exceeding 25 feet. The height of the two lower lights to be not less than 15 feet above the hull.

(ii) A wreck-marking vessel shall not carry the ordinary riding light for a vessel at anchor.

##### (2) *Shapes.*

Between sunrise and sunset to carry green balls or shapes corresponding in number and arrangement to the green lights as detailed above.

##### (3) *Sound signals.*

A wreck-marking vessel during fog, mist, falling snow, or heavy rain-storms, whether by day or night, to ring a deep-toned bell at intervals of not more than 30 seconds as follows:—

(a) To be passed on the mariner's Port Hand—

Two strokes in succession.

(b) To be passed on the mariner's Starboard Hand—

Three strokes in succession.

(c) To be passed on either side—

Four strokes in succession.

#### PORTSMOUTH HARBOUR.

##### *Regulations for Vessels of and above 700 tons.*

8. Vessels of and above 700 tons net register, with the exception of regular trading vessels having fixed days for arriving and sailing, shall enter or leave the Harbour under the directions of the King's Harbour Master.

9. The directions referred to in the preceding rule shall be applied for weekly, on a form rendered for that purpose, by the agent or the shipowner, showing vessels due for arrival and departure during the ensuing week. The times stated shall be as precise as is reasonably practicable and any excessive or unexpected departure therefrom, due to stress of weather, strikes or other unforeseen causes, shall be communicated by telephone to the King's Harbour Master during office hours, viz., on every weekday except Saturday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. and on Saturday from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m.

10. Sailing vessels of and above 700 tons net register not previously notified under rule 9 above shall, on arrival at Spithead, apply to the King's Harbour Master at the Dockyard, by signal through Horse Fort and Dockyard Tower, for the said directions.

##### *Ferries.*

11. Any ferry vessel however propelled plying across the harbour shall between sunrise and sunset keep out of the way of all seagoing vessels and of tugs towing trains of barges.

12. Every such ferry vessel, propelled by means of chains or in any other way confined to a fixed track, shall, instead of the lights directed to be carried by the "Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea," carry four lights, one at each corner, showing white ahead and astern in the direction of the ferry track, and red on the beam or athwart the ferry track, each light to be visible for at least 2 miles.

##### *Vessels to keep clear of H.M. Vessels or other vessels in charge of H.M. Officers.*

13. When one of H.M. Vessels or other vessel in charge of H.M. Officers hoists the Red Ensign over M Flag (International Code—Alphabetical) by day, or a red light by night at the foremast head, denoting that she is under way for the purpose of passing in or out of the Harbour, all other vessels under way in the harbour shall keep out of the way of the said vessel, provided always that the said vessel shall be navigated with due care and at a moderate speed. When any vessel is showing either of the aforementioned signals the Pilot Jack shall be hoisted as a general warning by day by all other of H.M. Ships present in the port, at the Semaphore Tower, at Fort Blockhouse, at "Vernon" Shore Establishment, and at the sub-signal station at the South West corner of No. 3 basin. By night for the same purpose the same ships and stations, with the addition of Horse Fort, shall show position lights (two white lights vertical, 8 feet apart, hoisted at the peak, or if no gaff, hoisted abreast of the maintop in the middle line of the ship or on the Ensign Staff).

14. When and so long as the Pilot Jack is hoisted at the Semaphore Tower, at "Vernon" Shore Establishment, and at the sub-signal station at the South West corner of No. 3 basin denoting that one of H.M. Vessels is

intending to enter or leave one of the docks, basins, jetties, etc., at H.M. Dockyard at Portsmouth all other vessels under way in the Dockyard Port including all boats and small craft shall keep out of the way of H.M. Vessel which is being moved and of the tugs which may be in attendance upon her.

*Signal directing vessels and boats to keep out of the way.*

15. When any sea-going steam vessel, steam vessel towing, steam dredger or steam hopper within the limits of the Dockyard Port shall by reason of the crowded nature of the channel or anchorage, or from any other cause find it unsafe or impracticable to keep out of the way of other vessels or boats she shall signify the same by four short blasts of the steam whistle or siren blown in rapid succession, and all vessels and boats shall keep out of the way of the vessel making this signal; provided always that the latter shall be navigated with due care and at a moderate speed.

*Harbour Channel. When to be kept clear.*

16. When it is specially necessary to keep the harbour channel clear, owing to a very large vessel or Royal Yacht entering or leaving harbour, a red oblong flag with a white diagonal bar will be hoisted by day, or one red light either above or below two white lights vertical by night at the Semaphore Tower, at Fort Blockhouse, at Horse Fort, at "Vernon" Shore Establishment, and at the sub-signal station at the South West corner of No. 3 basin; and while this flag is flying (whether or not accompanied by other flags) or these lights are being shown, no vessel is to enter the channel from either end.

*Lights and Signals for Dredgers.*

17. A dredger when at work or in position for working shall carry the following Lights and Signals, viz. :—

*Lights between Sunset and Sunrise:—*

(a) *Forward.*—In the forward part of the dredger at a height of not less than 20 and not exceeding 40 feet above the hull a white light in a lantern so constructed as to show a clear, uniform and unbroken light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least one mile.

(b) *Amidships.*—Three such white lights placed in a triangular form at least 8 feet apart, at right angles to the keel and with the apex uppermost, the base of the triangle to be at least 10 feet higher than the forward light and to be also higher than and clear of the framework, funnels or other erections upon the dredger. If so moored or working as to make it necessary to prohibit the passage of vessels on one or both sides, a red light or lights in a lantern so constructed as to show a clear, uniform and unbroken light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least one mile, is, or are, to be substituted for the lower light or lights of the triangle on the side or sides on which passage is prohibited.

(c) *Aft.*—One such white light at or near the stern of the dredger and at such a height that it shall not be less than 15 feet lower than the forward light.

*Signals between Sunrise and Sunset:—*

*Amidships.*—Three black balls of not less than two feet in diameter placed in a triangular form at least 8 feet apart, at right angles to the keel with the apex uppermost, the base of the triangle to be higher than and clear of the framework, funnels or any other erection upon the dredger. If so moored or working so as to make it necessary to prohibit passage on one or both sides, a red flag or flags at least 5 feet in the hoist is, or are, to be substituted for the lower ball or balls of the triangle on the side or sides on which passage is prohibited.

*Signal in Fog:—*

In fog, mist, falling snow or heavy rain storms a dredger at work or in a position for working, shall at intervals of not more than one minute sound a gong rapidly for about five seconds.

**PENALTIES.**

*Note.*—The master of every merchant or other private vessel to which the rules in this Schedule relate must observe and cause to be observed the provisions of these rules as far as they relate to his vessel, and any such master by his wilful default infringing or causing any infringement of any of the provisions of these rules is guilty of a misdemeanour.

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. In paragraph 39 of Schedule IV to the principal Order the word "these" shall be omitted.

2. Paragraph 13 of Schedule V to the principal Order shall be amended by inserting at the end thereof the following words, namely, "and references to carrying passengers or goods for hire or reward shall be construed as including references to carrying passengers or goods (whether for hire or reward or not) on behalf of an air transport undertaking".

3.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1931.

(2) This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of June, 1931.

WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879," it is provided that the following goods may, by Proclamation or Order in Council, be prohibited either to be exported or carried coastwise:—Arms, ammunition and gunpowder, military and naval stores, and any articles which His Majesty shall judge capable of being converted into or made useful in increasing the quantity of military or naval stores, provisions, or any sort of victual which may be used as food for man:

And whereas by Section 17 of the Finance Act, 1921, it is enacted that Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, shall extend to weapons and munitions of war of every description and firearms not being weapons of war, and ammunition for such firearms, as it applies to the goods therein mentioned, and that the said section, as so amended by this section, shall extend so as to give power to prohibit the shipment as ship's stores, whether on vessels proceeding to foreign ports or on coastwise voyages, of any of the goods to which the said section applies:

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 13th December, 1921, made in pursuance of Section 8 of "the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879," the exportation from the United Kingdom of certain articles was prohibited:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Order in Council should be revoked:

And whereas it is expedient to prohibit the exportation or shipment as ship's stores on vessels proceeding to foreign ports of the articles hereinafter enumerated:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

(1) As from the 1st June, 1931, the following articles shall be, and the same are hereby prohibited to be exported from the United Kingdom, or to be shipped as ship's stores on vessels proceeding to foreign ports, that is to say:—

- i. Cannon and other ordnance and component parts thereof;
- ii. Carriages and mountings and accessories for mountings for cannon and other ordnance and component parts thereof;
- iii. Cartridges, charges of all kinds, and component parts thereof;
- iv. Explosives of every description;
- v. Firearms of every description and component parts thereof;
- vi. Grenades and component parts thereof;
- vii. Machine guns, interrupter gears, mountings for machine guns and component parts thereof;
- viii. Projectiles of all kinds (except air-gun pellets) and component parts thereof;
- ix. Mines, land or sea, and component parts thereof;
- x. Depth charges, apparatus for the discharge of depth charges, and component parts thereof;
- xi. Bombs, bombing apparatus, and component parts thereof;
- xii. Flame-throwers and component parts thereof;
- xiii. Fuses and component parts thereof;
- xiv. Torpedoes and component parts thereof;
- xv. Torpedo tubes, or other apparatus for discharging torpedoes;
- xvi. Fire-control and gun-sighting apparatus and component parts thereof;
- xvii. Appliances for use with arms and apparatus exclusively designed and intended for land, sea or aerial warfare;
- xviii. Bayonets, swords and lances, and component parts thereof;
- xix. Tanks and armoured cars and component parts thereof;
- xx. Aircraft, assembled or dismantled, and aircraft engines.

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this Order shall not apply to any exportation or shipment as ship's stores which shall be expressly permitted by a licence given by the Board of Trade, and in accordance with the conditions (if any) of such licence.

(2) The said Order in Council, dated the 13th December, 1921, is hereby revoked.

(3) This Order may be cited as The Arms Export Prohibition Order, 1931.

1. This Order may be cited as "The Northern Rhodesia (Amendment) Order in Council, 1931," and shall be construed and read as one with the Principal Order and the Northern Rhodesia (Amendment) Order in Council, 1928.

2. Article 3 of the Northern Rhodesia (Amendment) Order in Council, 1928, is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following words:—

"within such Districts or Areas as may from time to time be assigned to them by the Governor by notice in the Gazette."

3. His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, in Council may from time to time revoke add to or amend this Order.

4. This Order shall come into operation forthwith and shall be published in the Gazette and thereafter the Governor shall give directions for the further publication of this Order at such places and in such manner and for such time or times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto.

And the Right Honourable Lord Passfield, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

ATWICK, SKIRLINGTON AND ARRAM.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Saint Lawrence and in the part of the Churchyard attached thereto, which is situate on the south side of the path leading from the entrance gate of the Churchyard to the wall of the former Vicarage House.

# MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

(4) footholds made wholly or mainly of rubber;

to bear an indication of origin, they have made a reference to the Standing Committee appointed by them under the Act in respect thereof.

Attention is called to the fact that, while under the provisions of the above Act the Committee must in every case referred to them consider whether the goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of sale or exposure for sale, they may also at their discretion consider and report upon the question whether such goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of importation.

1.—(1) Part II (*Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of a Movement Area*) of the Sheep Scab Order of 1928, hereinafter referred to as the principal Order, is hereby applied to the Area described in the Schedule hereto, which shall be a Movement Area for the purposes of that Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the twentieth day of July, nineteen hundred and thirty-one.

##### *Application of Part III of Sheep Scab Order of 1928.*

2. Part III (*Double Dipping of Sheep in a Double Dipping Area*) of the principal Order is also hereby applied to the Area described in the Schedule hereto, which shall also be a Double Dipping Area for the purposes of that Order.

*Period Prescribed as Double Dipping Period.*

3. The period during which all sheep in the Area, described in the Schedule hereto are, to be double-dipped, within the Area by the owner or person in charge of the sheep under and in accordance with Part III, of the principal Order shall extend from the nineteenth day of July to the twenty-first day of September, nineteen hundred and thirty-one.

## ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 20TH MAY, 1931.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Application of Part II of the Sheep Scab Order of 1928.*

1.—(1) Part II (*Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of a Movement Area*) of the Sheep Scab Order of 1928, hereinafter referred to as the "principal Order," is hereby applied to the Area described in the Schedule hereto, hereinafter referred to as "the Area" and the Area so described shall thereupon become a "Movement Area" for the purposes of the principal Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the twenty-fourth day of July, and shall cease to operate on the tenth day of September, nineteen hundred and thirty-one.

*Restrictions on Exposure of Sheep at Markets, etc., within the Area during the period from 24th July to 9th September (inclusive).*

2.—(1) Sheep on any premises in the Area shall not (except as hereinafter provided) be permitted to enter, or be exposed for sale or exhibition in any market, fairground, sale-yard or place of exhibition in that Area, during

the period from 24th July to 9th September (inclusive), in the current year, unless they have within fifty-six days before the date of entry or exposure been double-dipped and are accompanied by a declaration signed by the owner of the sheep, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, stating that the sheep have been so dipped, and the dates of dipping, and that since the second dipping the sheep have been kept separate as far as practicable while in the Area from other sheep not so dipped.

(2) An Inspector of the Local Authority acting under the direction of the Local Authority, may grant an exemption, subject to such conditions (if any) as may be specified therein, exempting sheep in the Area from one or both of the dippings in any particular case in which the Inspector is satisfied that it is impracticable or inexpedient to dip the sheep. In any such case the reasons for granting the exemption shall be stated therein, and the Local Authority shall forthwith cause a copy of the exemption to be forwarded to the Ministry. If the Minister considers that the exemption is for any reason undesirable, and directs the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate, but not so as to affect the previous operation of the exemption.

*Special Provision as to Fat Stock for Immediate Slaughter.*

3.—(1) Where an Inspector of a Local Authority is satisfied that any sheep in his district in the Area are intended for immediate slaughter, and that it is impracticable or inexpedient that the same should in accordance with this Order be dipped before exposure for sale or exhibition, he may subject to any directions by the Local Authority, by licence in the Form H described in the First Schedule to the principal Order authorise the movement of the sheep to any market, fairground, sale-yard or place of exhibition in the Area, subject to such conditions (if any) as are inserted in the licence.

(2) Such conditions may, if the Local Authority think fit, be varied so as to enable any sheep, which are returned unsold from a market in the Area with a licence (Form H) to any premises, to be moved to another market, fairground, or sale-yard without the sheep being previously double-dipped.

*Interpretation.*

4. The expressions used in this Order have the same meaning as in the principal Order.

*Offences.*

5. Any person committing, or aiding, abetting, counselling or procuring the commission of any breach of the provisions of this Order is liable, on summary conviction, to the penalties provided by the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927.
