WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 1st day of May, 1931 (C.W. 10736/30), in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Your Orders in Council bearing dates the 9th day of March, 1921, and the 16th day of December, 1925, we were empowered to grant special rates of pay to certain married and widower Warrant Officers whose promotion to Warrant rank would otherwise involve pecuniary loss:

"And whereas we are of opinion that in fixing such special rates of pay we should be

permitted to take into account the mess subscription of 1s. a day for which, on promotion, Warrant Officers become liable:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorize us to grant to any such married and widower Warrant Officers special rates of pay in accordance with the regulations set forth in the Schedule annexed hereto.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

" SCHEDULE.

"REGULATIONS FOR THE GRANT OF SPECIAL RATES OF PAY TO WARRANT OFFICERS OF THE ROYAL NAVY AND ROYAL MARINES WHO BEFORE PROMOTION TO WARRANT RANK WERE MARRIED OR WIDOWERS ELIGIBLE FOR MARRIAGE ALLOWANCE.

"1. Subject to Rule 6 below, any Warrant Officer to whom a special rate of pay may have been granted under the Orders in Council of the 9th March, 1921, or the 16th December, 1925, may be granted, whenever it would be more advantageous to him than the normal rate of full pay appropriate to his rank and seniority, a special rate of pay greater by 1s. a day than the special rate previously granted to him.

" 2. Subject to Rule 6 below, any Warrant Officer at present serving, to whom a special rate of pay has not hitherto been awarded, and any rating or marine rank hereafter promoted to Warrant rank whose rate of full pay, if calculated on the normal scale applicable to his rank and seniority, would be less than 1s. in excess of his daily emoluments as a rating, calculated in the manner prescribed in Rule 3 below, may be granted a special rate of full pay greater by 1s. a day than such daily emoluments as a rating, provided that immediately before his promotion to Warrant rank he was married or a widower with a child or children to, or in respect of, whose wife or child or children marriage allowance was in course of payment.

" 3. The daily emoluments as a rating on which the comparison between emoluments as a rating and full pay as an officer is to be made for the purpose of Rule 2, are to be based on the daily rates of Substantive and Non-Substantive Pay, Badge Pay, Kit Upkeep Allowance, and Marriage Allowance, of which the officer was in receipt on the day preceding that of his promotion to Warrant rank, subject to the following provisos:—

(i) Where the total daily emoluments as a rating thus determined are not an exact multiple of 2d., they shall be deemed to be a sum equal to the next multiple of 2d.;

(ii) Where the full pay of an officer, although at the date of his promotion at least 1s. in excess of his daily emoluments as a rating, has since ceased, or may hereafter cease, to be so as the result of a general reduction in his scale of pay, marriage allowance shall be calculated at the rates in force at the date of such reduction, but with reference to the Officer's condition as regards wife and children on the day preceding that of his promotion to Warrant rank.

" 4.—(a) An officer in receipt of a special rate of pay under these regulations shall not be permitted to receive concurrently the specialist allowance which is payable continuously in respect of qualification in advanced gunnery, but an officer to whom a special rate of pay under these regulations has been granted, and who, after the date of the award thereof may qualify for such specialist allowance may be permitted to receive the normal rate of full pay appropriate to his rank and seniority, together with the allowance when such payment is more to his advantage than the special rate of pay.

(b) Allowances which depend on the performance of special duties, such as Command Money and Store Allowance, or which are of a compensatory nature such as lodging money and provision allowance, may be paid concurrently with the special rate of pay.

" 5. An officer in receipt of a special rate of pay under these regulations shall not be granted any increment of pay until such time as under ordinary regulations he may become eligible by length of service as Warrant Officer for a higher rate on the normal scale, but any officer who has qualified by length of service for a higher rate of pay on the normal scale applicable to his rank shall be allowed, subject to the maximum prescribed in Rule 6 below, to revert to the special rate of pay previously granted if his current rate of pay on

the normal scale become less than such special rate.

" 6. No officer shall receive a special rate of pay under these regulations from a date earlier than the 1st December, 1930, or the date of his promotion to Warrant rank if later, and no officer shall receive a special rate of pay greater than the maximum rate of pay on the normal scale prescribed from time to time for his rank."

" The three Councillors for Old Town Ward shall be the three Councillors in office for St. Mary's Ward at the date of this Scheme."

(iv) All employment on any other day in excess of 9½ hours in summer or 8½ hours in winter as the case may be.

(b) In the case of female workers:—

(i) All employment in excess of 5½ hours on Saturday or such other day (not being Sunday) in each week as may be agreed between employer and worker.

(ii) All employment on a Sunday.

(iii) All employment on Good Friday, Easter Monday, Whit Monday, August Bank Holiday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day except employment on such a day up to 3 hours worked consecutively in connection with milking and the care of and attendance upon stock but so that any additional employment in connection with milking and the care of and attendance upon stock on such a day shall not rank as overtime employment if equivalent time off on full pay is given.

(iv) All employment on any other day in excess of 8½ hours.

For the purpose of this Order employment in summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the second Monday in February and terminating on the last Sunday in October and employment in winter shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the year.

(g) (i) In the case of a worker who is given a clear day's holiday in the week in which Easter Monday falls, all employment in that week in excess of 43½ hours (excluding all hours which are treated as overtime employment).

(ii) In any other case, all employment in excess of 43½ hours (excluding all hours which are treated as overtime employment) in the week in which Good Friday falls.

(h) All employment in excess of 53½ hours (excluding all hours which are treated as overtime employment) in any week in summer, except as provided in Clause (g) above.

For the purpose of this Order employment in summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March and terminating on the first Sunday in November, and employment in winter shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the year.

ST. HELENS CANAL.

And whereas by a public Act of Parliament 28 George II Cap. 8 certain persons were appointed Undertakers and empowered to make and maintain and use the River or Brook called Sankey Brook and the three several Branches thereof "navigable portable and passable for Boats Flats and other Vessels" from the River Mersey below Sankey Bridges up to Boardman's Stone Bridge on the South Branch to Gerard's Bridge on the Middle Branch thereof and Penny Bridge on the North branch thereof all in the county Palatine of Lancaster.

And whereas by a public Act of Parliament, 2 George 3 Cap. 56 in order to render more effectual the navigation of the Sankey Brook the surviving undertakers appointed by the above-mentioned Act of Parliament 28 George 2 Cap. 8 were empowered to make and complete a cut or canal from a distance of two hundred and fifty yards from the lock called Sankey Lock on the Sankey Brook to join and communicate with the River Mersey at Fidler's Ferry:

And whereas the Sankey Brook Navigation and the Canal connected therewith were accordingly completed and the Undertakers incorporated by the name of the Company of Proprietors of the Sankey Brook Navigation by virtue of the Sankey Brook Navigation Consolidation and Amendment Act, 1830 (II George IV Cap 50) by which Act the Company were empowered to make and maintain a Canal from the Sankey Brook Navigation and Canal at or near Fidler's Ferry into and through the Townships of Penketh Cuerdley and Widnes in the County of Lancaster to join and communicate with the River Mersey at Widnes Wharf:

And whereas the Canal was accordingly completed and the powers of the Company of Proprietors of the Sankey Brook Navigation were vested in the St. Helens Canal and Railway Company by virtue of the Sankey Brook Navigation and St. Helens and Runcorn Gap Railway Amalgamation Act 1845 (8 and 9 Vict. cap. 117).
