BERKS, BUCKS AND OXON JOINT VAGRANCY COMMITTEE.

To empower the directors of the Company to issue so as to be redeemable preference shares or stock and debenture stock, to make provision with respect to the redemption of such stock either by a payment in cash or by the issue of other stock (redeemable or otherwise) and to authorise the creation and issue of new stock for any such purpose and the re-issue of any redeemable preference shares or stock or debenture stock after redemption.

6. To make provision prescribing the minimum holdings of stock and debenture stock of the Company.

7. To make special provisions as to the payment of commissions on the sale of capital of the Company.

8. To make further provision with reference to the Company's affairs including provisions to relieve the Company of any obligation to see to the execution of trusts to which their shares or stock or debenture stock may be subject, as to the holding of annual meetings, the notices of meetings, the appointment of proxies, joint holders, the closing of transfer books, the number, qualification and appointment of directors; directors holding office under or contracting with the Company, notice of candidature of or of opposition to re-election of directors and the appointment of a managing director.

9. To relieve the Company of the obligation to keep a shareholders' address book, and to authenticate by the affixing of the common seal or otherwise the register of shareholders.

10. To make provisions as to the number qualification and election of the auditors of the Company and to empower the directors to fill occasional vacancies in the office of auditor and to determine the remuneration of the Secretary of the Company.

11. To provide for the giving of an indemnity before the issue of a new debenture or mortgage bond or a new certificate of any capital or debenture stock or a new warrant in respect of interest or dividend in lieu of any debenture bond certificate or warrant lost or destroyed or alleged to be lost or destroyed.

12. To authorise the Company or the Directors to establish superannuation schemes and to grant superannuation and other allowances, gratuities and pensions and to make other payments to officers and employees and the widows, families and dependants of such persons and to any superannuation fund established for the benefit of officers and employees and to the widows, families and dependants of such persons, to enter into, and carry into effect agreements with insurance companies or others for securing such gratuities, pensions and other payments and to apply the funds and revenues of the Company for all or any of those purposes.

13. To provide for the setting up of schemes for enabling employees of the Company to participate in the profits of the undertaking, for the issue to the employees of shares or stock of the Company and for the disposal of shares or stock and deposits on the death of any employee.

14. To provide that the Company shall continue to charge for gas supplied by them according to the number of heat units contained therein and to enact provisions as to the method of ascertainment for the purposes of the Order of the number of heat units supplied.

To define or fix a basic price or basic prices for the gas to be supplied by the Company within their limits of supply or any part or parts thereof with liberty (if thought fit) to charge different prices in different parts of the said limits and to make provision as to the revision of such basic price or prices.

18. To prescribe a basic rate or basic rates of dividend on the ordinary capital of the Company and to provide for the application of the whole or part of the profits in excess of those required for payment of dividends at

such basic rate or rates in reduction of the price of gas to consumers and in increasing dividends on the ordinary capital beyond the said basic rate or rates and in forming or increasing a reserve fund and for the benefit of all or some of the employees of the Company or in any one or more of those ways and to provide (if thought fit) that in determining the rate or rates at which dividends may be paid on the ordinary capital of the Company the prices charged to certain consumers or for certain supplies or in certain parts of their limits of supply shall not be taken into account; and to make provision for determining from time to time the amount of the profits to be applied as aforesaid.

19. To make new provisions with respect to the payment of interim dividends by the directors without the sanction or direction of a general meeting and as to the preparation of the Company's Accounts.

20. To empower the Company or the directors thereof to establish a Reserve Fund a Special Purposes Fund and a Renewal Fund, to provide for the application of those Funds respectively and to make provision with respect to the appropriation of the existing reserved and insurance funds of the Company.

21. To authorise the Company to adapt lands for the purpose of sports or recreation grounds and upon such lands to erect, construct and maintain dressing-rooms and other buildings, works and conveniences and to make provision with respect to the admission of persons to any such sports or recreation ground.

22. To make new provisions with respect to the holding and use of patent rights by the Company and with respect to the grant of patents to the Company jointly with other persons and the rights and remedies of the joint grantees.

23. To make new or further provisions for the prevention of the improper use of gas, as to the mode of cutting off supplies, the expenses of reconnecting a discontinued supply, the giving of a supply of gas where the consumer has a separate supply, fittings let for hire to remain the property of the Company, the construction and placing of pipes, etc., the provision of valves where high pressure air or gas not supplied by the Company is used, the provision of anti-fluctuators in connection with gas engines, the entry on premises to which a supply of gas is laid on, the removal of fittings where a supply of gas is discontinued, the exemption of the Company from obligation to supply gas when the capacity of the main is insufficient, the period of error in defective meters, the charges for special reading of meters, the laying of pipes for ancillary purposes, the authentication and service of notices by the Company, the inclusion of several sums in one summons and the recovery of penalties and demands.

24. To authorise the Company and any local authority, company or person to enter into and carry into effect agreements and arrangements as to the supply to or by the Company of gas in bulk.

25. The Order will vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would impede or

interfere with its purposes and confer other rights and privileges.

26. To repeal, alter or amend all or any of the provisions of the Kidderminster Gas Acts, 1867 and 1906, the Kidderminster Gas (Charges) Order, 1921, and any other Act or Order relating to the Company or their undertaking.

27. To incorporate with the Order with or without modification or to render inapplicable all or some of the provisions of the Gasworks Clauses Act, 1847, the Gasworks Clauses Act, 1871, and the Companies Clauses Acts, 1845, 1863, and 1869.

Any local or other public authority, company or person desiring to bring before the Board of Trade any objection to the draft Order may do so by registered letter addressed to the Director of Gas Administration, Board of Trade, Great George Street, London, S.W. 1, and despatched on or before the 13th day of July, 1931.

Any such objection shall state:—

- (a) The specific grounds of objection; and
- (b) The omissions, additions or modifications asked for.
