The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*General Restrictions on Movement and Markets of Animals in Great Britain.**Movement within Great Britain.*

1. No animal shall be moved by road, railway, or water within Great Britain except with a licence which may be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority under this Order if in his opinion the movement is necessary, and subject to the conditions applicable to the licence.

Provided that—

(a) no licence shall be granted hereunder for the movement of any animal contrary to the provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925 or any Order applying that Order to a particular Area; and

(b) no licence shall be granted for the movement of any animal from any place in which a licensed market or sale of fat animals is held otherwise than direct to a slaughterhouse or back to the premises from which they were taken to the said place for detention thereon for a period of six days.

Markets and Sales.

2.—(1) No market, fair, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held on any premises in Great Britain except in accordance with this Article.

(2)—(a) A market or sale of animals intended for immediate slaughter may be held

in any market, fairground, or saleyard if a licence to hold such market or sale is obtained from the Local Authority. Any movement of an animal from such market or sale shall be subject to the provisions of Article 1 of this Order.

(b) A sale of animals may be held on farm premises if a licence to hold such sale is obtained from the Local Authority. The movement of animals from such sale shall be subject to the provisions of Article 1 of this Order.

(3) A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend and examine the animals exposed at every market or sale licensed under this Article.

Forms and Conditions of Movement Licences.

3.—(1) Licences for the movement of animals granted under this Order shall be in the form, and subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule to this Order and may be granted only by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

(2) No licence shall be available for the movement of the animals unless and until it is countersigned by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the premises from which the animals are to be moved are situate.

Disposal of Slaughterhouse Manure and Refuse.

4. No manure or waste meat trimmings or any other refuse shall be moved from any slaughterhouse unless permission for such movement is given in writing by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the place of destination. Any person removing or receiving any such material and the occupier of any premises to which it is moved shall take all practicable steps to secure that it is not fed to or brought into contact with animals. Notwithstanding the definition of the term "slaughterhouse" contained in Article 8 of this Order, the term "slaughterhouse" for the particular purposes of this Article shall include any slaughterhouse which forms part of a farm or other premises.

Saving for Orders and Regulations.

5. No licence under this Order shall authorise the movement of animals in contravention of any Regulations made by a Local Authority other than the Local Authority by whose Inspector the licence was issued, or authorise the movement of animals in contravention of any other Order of the Minister for the time being in force.

Production of Licences—Names and Addresses.

6. The person in charge of any animal being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall on demand made under this Order by an Inspector of the Ministry or of a Local Authority or by a Police Constable, produce the licence, and allow a copy of or extract from it to be taken, and shall also if required give his name and address.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

7. This Order shall, except where otherwise expressly provided, be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Meaning of Terms.

8. In this Order:—

"Animals" means cattle, sheep, goats, pigs or deer.

"Slaughterhouse" means premises used habitually and solely for the purpose of slaughtering animals, but does not include

(1) a slaughterhouse which forms part of a farm, or

(2) any premises on which animals other than those intended for immediate slaughter are kept.

Offences.

9. Any person committing or aiding, abetting, counselling or procuring the commission of any breach of the provisions of this Order or the conditions of any licence granted thereunder is liable, on summary conviction to the penalties provided by the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927.

Commencement.

10. This Order shall take immediate effect.

A licence for movement between different parts of the same farm or holding, if endorsed by the Inspector granting it "Occupation Licence," is available for movement of the animals as often as required, and shall remain in force until it is withdrawn by an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority.

2. This Licence does not authorise movement of animals on any road within a radius of two miles of any Infected Place.

3. The animals shall be moved in the manner and by the route, if any, specified in the licence. If the route is not so specified the animals shall be moved by the nearest available route, and without avoidable delay to the place of destination specified in the Licence and not elsewhere and shall while being moved

be kept separate as far as practicable from all other animals.

4. The Licence shall accompany the animals throughout the movement, shall be produced on demand to an Inspector of the Ministry or Local Authority or to the police, and shall on arrival of the animals at the specified place of destination, be delivered up, forthwith, to the nearest Police Officer of the District, wherein the place of destination is situated, unless the Licence is marked "Occupation Licence."

5. *Where the place of destination specified in Column IV is premises other than a slaughterhouse, market, or saleyard, the animals shall on arrival thereat be detained for a period of 14 days from the date of arrival, except that in the case of fat animals exposed at a licensed market or sale for fat animals and which, being unsold, are licensed back to the premises from which they came, the period of detention shall be six days only. (This condition does not restrict the movement of a carcass.) This condition does not apply in the case of movements if the licence is an "Occupation Licence" or "For Breeding Purposes," and is so marked.*

6. (2) The Bye-Laws and Regulations herein after set forth shall extend and apply to every carriage and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power to make Bye-Laws and Regulations.

(3) Every passenger shall enter or depart from a carriage by the step of the hindmost or Conductor's platform and not otherwise unless so directed by the Conductor. Persons desiring to board a carriage for the purpose of travelling thereon shall first permit all persons to alight who may be intending to do so.

(4) No person shall enter or mount or leave or attempt to enter, mount or leave any carriage which is in motion.

(5) No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar, or cigarette inside any carriage except in a compartment or on seats specially set apart for that purpose.

(6) No person in a state of intoxication, or affected with any dangerous contagious or infectious disorder, nor any person who from any other cause in the opinion of the Conductor is unfit to be a passenger, shall mount or enter upon any carriage and any such person found in or upon any carriage shall leave the carriage immediately on being requested to do so by the Conductor and in the event of refusal to leave may be removed by or under the direction of the Conductor.

(7) No person shall spit or swear or use obscene or offensive language or conduct himself offensively or sing or play on any musical instrument or distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind or beg or collect money, alms or subscriptions or sell any article or play any game or gamble or deposit remnants of food or fruit or waste paper or other refuse in or upon any carriage, station, waiting room, premises or buildings used in connection with the Transport system or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage or premises as aforesaid or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

(8) No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the seats, cushions, curtains, or

linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice in or upon any carriage or break or scratch any window or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-Laws and Regulations in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

(9) No person whose dress or clothing might in the opinion of the Conductor of a Carriage or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation, soil, injure, or damage the seats, linings, curtains, or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, nor any person who, in the opinion of the Conductor, or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation, might for any other reason be offensive to any passenger, shall be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any carriage and may be prevented from entering or remaining in or upon any carriage. No such person shall enter in or upon any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the Conductor, or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation; and if any such person be found in or upon any carriage, he shall, on the request of the Conductor, leave such carriage upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned or tendered to him, and on his refusal to do so, he may be removed by or under the direction of the Conductor, or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation. Provided that on carriages specially run for artisans, mechanics and daily labourers, no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or upon a carriage, under the provisions of this Bye-Law, on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

(10) Each passenger shall upon demand and whether the fare shall have been demanded or not before leaving the carriage, pay to the Conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation the fare legally payable for his journey and accept a ticket therefor. Any person leaving a carriage shall be deemed to have completed his journey except when transferring from one carriage to another as provided by Bye-Law (19).

Any passenger paying for a stage less than the whole journey run by the carriage shall be deemed to have completed his journey at the end of the stage paid for; if the passenger remains on the carriage he shall pay the fare legally payable for the remainder of his journey as a new passenger.

(11) Each passenger shall immediately upon demand show his ticket to any officer or servant of the Corporation, and shall also when required to do so either deliver up his ticket or in default thereof pay the fare legally demandable. No passenger shall alter, cut, tear or deface his ticket so as to render the number or any material portion thereof illegible. Tickets shall not be transferable, and shall only be available for the carriage on which they are issued, except as provided by Regulation 19.

(12) No passenger shall bring on to any carriage any luggage other than his own personal luggage, not exceeding 28 lbs. in weight;

and any such luggage shall be placed by the passenger in such position on or in the carriage as shall be directed by the Conductor.

The Conductor may decline to take, and may prevent any person from taking upon any carriage any personal or other luggage exceeding 28 lbs. in weight, and any luggage which from its size or otherwise is, in the opinion of the Conductor, unsuitable for conveyance in or upon the carriage.

(13) No person not being an Officer or duly authorised servant of the Corporation shall travel or ride on the steps, platforms, outside rails, buffers, or guards of any carriage, and no person not being an officer or duly authorised servant of the Corporation shall stand on the platforms or on the upper deck of any carriage or shall sit on any part of any carriage not intended for passengers, and any person so travelling, riding, standing or sitting shall cease to do so immediately on request by the Conductor or other duly authorised servant of the Corporation.

(14) No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or mount any carriage, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any carriage, or travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers, except in the lower deck of the carriage with the consent of the Conductor.

(15) When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount or remain in or on any such carriage when warned by the Conductor not to do so.

(16) No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or upon any carriage, except by permission of the Conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers.

No person shall take a dog or other animal into any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the Conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any carriage in breach of this Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request by the Conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the Conductor.

(17) No person shall place upon, or bring in or upon any carriage, loaded firearms, or any article, instrument, or implement, or any material or substance which may be dangerous or offensive to the passengers or likely to cause a nuisance or to soil or damage any carriage or the clothing of any passenger.

(18) No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any carriage of the Corporation, and no person other than the Conductor or Driver shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord, or any other part of a carriage or its equipment.

(19) If at any time a carriage becomes disabled or in any way injured or damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the Conductor, leave the same; and if such passengers

have paid their fares, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid; but on production of their tickets shall be entitled to travel by the next available carriage the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares.

(20) Any person who shall commit whilst in or upon any carriage any breach of these Bye-Laws and Regulations, shall, if the offence is continued, be liable, in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, to be immediately removed from the carriage by or under the direction of the Conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare he shall not be entitled to claim its return.

(21) Every Inspector, Conductor, or Driver of a carriage shall, to the best of his ability, enforce these Bye-Laws and Regulations and prevent any breach thereof.

(22) Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-Laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.
