

APPOINTMENT OF STANDINGS FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES WITHIN THE METROPOLITAN POLICE DISTRICT, AND REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED.

By virtue of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, chapter 7, intituled "An Act for Consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis, and making other provisions in regard to the Consolidated Offices."

I, the undersigned, Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby APPOINT Standings for Hackney Carriages at the following places, and do make the following Regulations with regard to the Boundaries for the same, viz. :—

APPOINTMENTS.

AT REGENT STREET, S.W.

In two portions.

Three Hackney Carriages:

First Portion.—One carriage in centre of roadway, to stand at a point ten feet South of Refuge at junction with Piccadilly Circus.

Front of vehicle toward the North.

NOTE.—The First portion of this Standing will be available between Midnight and 6 a.m. only.

Second Portion.—Two carriages in centre of roadway, commencing at a point fifteen feet South of Refuge opposite No. 31, Regent Street and extending Southward as far as necessary for two carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the North.

The First portion of this Standing will be fed exclusively by carriages from the Second portion.

STOKE NEWINGTON.

Six Hackney Carriages:

On the North side of roadway, commencing at a point five yards East of the apex of the railings surrounding the Green of St. Olave's Parish Hall and extending Eastward, by kerb, as far as necessary for six carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the West.

Provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriage-way, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriage-way.
