PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 5 of the Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1898 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Section"), it is, amongst other things, enacted as follows:—

"5.—(1) On and after the commencement of this Act, the general lighthouse authorities shall levy light dues with respect to the voyages made by ships or by way of periodical payment, and not with respect to the lights which a ship passes or from which it derives benefit, and the dues so levied shall take the place of the dues now levied by those authorities.

"(2) The scale and rules set out in the Second Schedule to this Act shall have effect for the purpose of the levying of light dues in pursuance of this Act, but Her Majesty may by Order in Council, alter, either generally or with respect to particular classes of cases, the scale or rules and the exemptions therefrom."

And whereas from time to time divers Orders in Council have been made in pursuance of the said Section:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the Scale and Rules set out in the Second Schedule to the said recited Act should be further altered in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him by the said Section, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Light Dues) Order, 1931, and shall have effect from the date of its publication in the *London Gazette*.

2. Each of the dues authorised to be levied in accordance with the Scale set out in the Second Schedule to the said recited Act shall be subject to an increase of twenty per cent. for the purpose of the levying of light dues in pursuance of the said recited Act.

3. The payments referred to in the proviso to Rule (1) and in the proviso to Rule (7) of the Rules set out in the Second Schedule to the said recited Act shall also be subject to an increase of twenty per cent.

WHEREAS by Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894, as modified by Article 14 of the Government of Ireland (Adaptation of the Taxing Acts) Order, 1922, and by Article 2 of the Irish Free State (Consequential Adaptation

of Enactments) Order, 1923, it is enacted that His Majesty The King may, by Order in Council, apply that section to any British Possession where His Majesty is satisfied that by the Law of such Possession, either no duty is leviable in respect of property situate in Great Britain when passing on death or that the Law of such Possession as respects any duty so leviable is to the like effect as the foregoing provisions of that Section:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the Law of the Province of Saskatchewan as respects the duty leviable in respect of property situate in Great Britain when passing on death is to the like effect as the provisions of sub-section (1) of the aforesaid Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894:

And whereas it is expedient that Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894, should be applied to the Province of Saskatchewan:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the power by the aforesaid Act in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894, shall apply to the Province of Saskatchewan as from the ninth day of January, nineteen hundred and thirty-one.

And the Right Honourable James Henry Thomas, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Dominion Affairs, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928 (7 E. 7 c. 29, 4-5, G. 5, c. 18, 9-10, G. 5, c. 80, and 18-19 G. 5, c. 3), it is provided that the said Section shall apply only to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state with respect to which His Majesty, by Order in Council, declares that the laws thereof confer corresponding rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the foreign state or the territorial waters thereof:

And whereas by Section 91 of the said Acts it is provided that the provisions of that Section shall apply only in the case of those foreign states with respect to which His Majesty by Order in Council declares them to be applicable:

And whereas at The Hague on the 6th November, 1925, His Majesty and the heads of certain foreign states having deemed it expedient to make certain modifications in and additions to the International Convention of the 20th March, 1883, for the creation of an International Union for the Protection of Industrial Property, as revised at Brussels on

the 14th December, 1900, and at Washington on the 2nd June, 1911, agreed upon a Convention (Treaty Series No. 16 (1928)), comprising the said International Convention as revised at Brussels and at Washington with the said modifications and additions, the ratification of which Convention was duly effected by Great Britain and certain other foreign states:

And whereas the United States of America have acceded to the said Convention:

And whereas by reason of the accession to the said Convention of the United States of America the laws thereof confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the United States of America or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in the said Section 48:

And whereas the said Convention is an arrangement of the nature contemplated by the said Section 91:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 12th July, 1887 (S.R. & O., Rev. 1904, IX, Patents, &c., p. 8), Her late Majesty Queen Victoria was pleased to declare that the provisions of Section 103 of the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks Act, 1883 (46-7, V. c. 57), should apply to the United States of America, and it is expedient, on the making of this Order, that the said Order should be revoked:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him in manner hereinbefore recited and of all other powers in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, as follows:—

1. The laws of the United States of America confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the United States of America or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928.

2. The provisions of Section 91 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928, shall be applicable to the United States of America.

3. The Order in Council dated the 12th July, 1887, is hereby revoked.

4. This Order may be cited as The Industrial Property Convention (United States) Order, 1931.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 26th day of February, 1931, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the unions (1) of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Tynemouth, Western Town, Holy Trinity, with a part of the Benefice (being a

Vicarage) of Tynemouth Low Town otherwise North Shields, Saint Peter (hereinafter referred to as the said Benefice of North Shields, Saint Peter) and (2) of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Tynemouth, Christ Church, with the remaining part of the said Benefice of North Shields, Saint Peter, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Northumberland and in the Diocese of Newcastle:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Harold, Bishop of Newcastle, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the unions (1) of the said Benefice of Tynemouth, Western Town, Holy Trinity, with a part of the said Benefice of North Shields, Saint Peter, and (2) of the said Benefice of Tynemouth, Christ Church, with the remaining part of the said Benefice of North Shields, Saint Peter, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Newcastle and therein recommended the said unions and the terms for effecting the same and the said Bishop of Newcastle signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefices of Tynemouth, Western Town, Holy Trinity, and Tynemouth, Christ Church, are now full, the Reverend Harry Aram Hand being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Tynemouth, Western Town, Holy Trinity, and the Reverend Christopher Milner being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Tynemouth, Christ Church, and the said Benefice of North Shields, Saint Peter, is at present vacant:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Harold, Bishop of Newcastle (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consents of the said Harry Aram Hand and Christopher Milner (testified by their signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Tynemouth, Western Town, Holy Trinity, and the western part of the said Benefice of North Shields, Saint Peter (all which part is more particularly described in the Schedule annexed to this Scheme), shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls and one Parish for all ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The Benefice of Tynemouth, Western Town, Holy Trinity' (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice of Tynemouth, Western Town, Holy Trinity).

"2. That the remaining part of the said Benefice of North Shields, Saint Peter, and the said Benefice of Tynemouth, Christ Church, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls and one Parish for all ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The Benefice of Tynemouth, Christ Church' (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice of Tynemouth, Christ Church).

"3. That the Church of the Parish of Tynemouth, Western Town, Holy Trinity, shall be the Parish Church of the Parish of the United Benefice of Tynemouth, Western Town, Holy Trinity, and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Tynemouth, Western Town,

Holy Trinity, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish of Tynemouth, Western Town, Holy Trinity.

"4. That the Church of the Parish of Tynemouth, Christ Church, shall be the Parish Church of the Parish of the United Benefice of Tynemouth, Christ Church, and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Tynemouth, Christ Church, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish of Tynemouth, Christ Church.

"5. That with the consents of the said Harry Aram Hand and Christopher Milner (testified as aforesaid) upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the unions shall forthwith take effect.

"6. That upon the unions taking effect the Register Books of Baptisms Marriages and Burials and other the Records and Muniments deposited in the Church of North Shields, Saint Peter, shall be transferred to the Church of Tynemouth, Christ Church, but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of North Shields, Saint Peter, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Tynemouth, Christ Church, to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"7. That after the said unions have taken effect (a) the Patronage of the United Benefice of Tynemouth, Western Town, Holy Trinity, shall belong wholly to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Tynemouth, Western Town, Holy Trinity, and (b) the Patronage of the United Benefice of Tynemouth, Christ Church, shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Tynemouth, Christ Church.

"8.—(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the unions have taken effect the Church of North Shields, Saint Peter, shall be taken down and the materials thereof (or so much of such materials as shall be found unsuitable for removal as hereinafter provided) and the site of the said Church of North Shields, Saint Peter, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"(b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the appropriation to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Newcastle under the said Measure of so much of such proceeds as may in our opinion be necessary to defray the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be applied by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as follows, that is to say, towards the cost of the provision of a Church or Chapel of Ease (to be dedicated to Saint Peter) at Balkwell, in the Parish of the Benefice of Percy, Tynemouth, in the said Diocese of Newcastle, including the cost of the removal of so much of the materials of the said Church of North Shields, Saint Peter, as may be found suitable for use in the erection of such proposed Church or Chapel of Ease; and any residue of such net proceeds after the provision

of such Church or Chapel of Ease shall be added to the said Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Newcastle.

"(c) That the font, communion table, sacramental plate, bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of North Shields, Saint Peter, or such of them as the Bishop of Newcastle shall select, shall be appropriated by the Bishop of Newcastle for use in the proposed Church or Chapel of Ease or be transferred to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Newcastle which the Bishop may select: provided always that any articles that shall not be so transferred or appropriated except the font, communion table and sacramental plate, may be sold and the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of North Shields, Saint Peter, as aforesaid.

"9. That upon the unions taking effect (a) a part of the endowment and property of the said Benefice of North Shields, Saint Peter, that is to say an annual payment of £20 being part of a larger annual payment at present made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of North Shields, Saint Peter, shall be excepted out of the unions and shall be appropriated by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the benefit of the United Benefice of Tynemouth, Christ Church, (b) a further part of the endowment and property of the said Benefice of North Shields, Saint Peter, that is to say an annual payment of £170 being part of the aforesaid larger annual payment at present made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of North Shields, Saint Peter, shall be excepted out of the unions and shall be appropriated by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of the said Benefice of Percy, Tynemouth, to the intent that the same shall be applied for and towards the stipend of a Curate to serve the proposed new Church or Chapel of Ease at Balkwell, and (c) the remaining part of the endowment and property of the said Benefice of North Shields, Saint Peter, including the Parsonage House at present belonging to the same Benefice of North Shields, Saint Peter, shall subject as hereinafter mentioned be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Tynemouth, Western Town, Holy Trinity, as an addition to the endowments thereof.

"10. That upon the unions taking effect provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Tynemouth, Western Town, Holy Trinity, for obtaining the services of a Curate or occasional clerical or lay assistance and a portion of the endowments of the United Benefice namely the endowments and property (other than the Parsonage House) mentioned in Clause 9 (c) of this Scheme shall be charged with a sum of £100 per annum as a fund to meet the expenses of providing for the services of a Curate or for occasional clerical or lay assistance as aforesaid which said fund of £100 per annum shall be held and administered by the Incumbent of the United Benefice but shall be applicable only to the purposes aforesaid, provided that it shall be lawful for the Bishop of the Diocese if he thinks proper at

any time and from time to time to direct that the said charge of £100 per annum shall be paid by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as trustees to apply the same for the purpose of paying the stipend of a Curate or the expense of occasional clerical or lay assistance as aforesaid.

"Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of the Church of North Shields, Saint Peter, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by that Measure of the site of any Church, shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of the said Church of North Shields, Saint Peter, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

"And provided also that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.

"SCHEDULE.

"The western part of the said Benefice of North Shields, Saint Peter, comprising:—all that part of the said Benefice of North Shields, Saint Peter, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the south east by the River Tyne, upon the south west, upon the west and upon the north west by the Benefice of Tynemouth, Western Town, Holy Trinity, and upon the remaining side, that is to say upon the north east by an imaginary line commencing at the junction of Railway Street with Bedford Street where the boundaries of the said Benefices of North Shields, Saint Peter; Tynemouth, Western Town, Holy Trinity and Tynemouth, Christ Church, all meet, and extending thence south eastwards along the middle of Bedford Street (thereby following in part the boundary between the said Benefices of North Shields, Saint Peter, and Tynemouth, Christ Church) to its junction with Olive Street and extending thence due east to the River Tyne."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make an alteration in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the

Bishop of Newcastle has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Newcastle.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 7th day of May, 1931, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Eltham and partly out of the new Parish (sometime Particular District) of Saint Peter, Eltham, both in the county of Kent and in the Diocese of Southwark:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Eltham and the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Eltham, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear

to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Eltham and of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Eltham, which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church within and for the said proposed separate District:

"And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Bishop of Southwark for the time being as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Cyril Forster, Bishop of Southwark (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Eltham and of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Eltham, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Saviour, Eltham.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of such New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Cyril Forster, Bishop of Southwark, and his successors for ever:

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Saviour, Eltham, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Paul, Coppenhall, in the County of Chester and in the Diocese of Chester, which is bounded upon

"And whereas the said Benefice of Little Oakley is now full, the Reverend James Hinton Knowles being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Great Oakley is at present vacant:

Whereas it is provided by sub-section (5) of Section 10 of the Finance Act, 1926 (16 & 17 Geo. 5, c. 22) that the Treasury may by order exempt from the duty imposed by Section one of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921 (11 & 12 Geo. 5, c. 47), as amended by the Finance Act, 1926, for such period as may be specified in the Order, any article in respect of which the Board of Trade are satisfied on a representation made by a consumer of that article that the article is not made in any part of His Majesty's Dominions in quantities which are substantial having regard to the consumption of that article for the time being in the United Kingdom, and that there is no reasonable probability that the article will within a reasonable period be made in His Majesty's Dominions in such substantial quantities:

And whereas the Board of Trade are satisfied on representations made by consumers of the

articles specified in the Schedule to this Order that those articles are not made in any part of His Majesty's Dominions in quantities which are substantial having regard to the consumption of those articles for the time being in the United Kingdom and that there is no reasonable probability that those articles will within a reasonable period be made in His Majesty's Dominions in such substantial quantities.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 30TH JUNE, 1931.)

NORTH OF ENGLAND AND SCOTLAND
(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) (CON-
TROLLED AREA) ORDER OF 1931.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Revocation.

1.—(1) From and after the commencement of this Order, the orders described in the Third Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.

(2) Where under the Orders specified in the Third Schedule hereto and hereby revoked animals have been moved under licence to a place of destination in Great Britain not comprised within either—

(a) the area described in the First Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as the Controlled Area); or

(b) any area declared for the time being to be an Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925 (hereinafter referred to as an Infected Area)

the conditions of any such licences shall, as from the date of the coming into operation of this Order, cease to operate.

Restrictions on Movement and Markets of Animals in the Controlled Area.

Movement out of the Controlled Area.

2. No animal shall be moved out of the Controlled Area except into any Infected Area and then only if accompanied by, and subject to the conditions of, the licence required under the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925.

Movement into the Controlled Area.

3. No animal shall be moved into the Controlled Area except direct to a farm or slaughterhouse, and then only if accompanied by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority under this Order, and subject to the detention of the animal on the farm premises for 14 days, or the slaughter of the animal in the slaughterhouse, as the case may be, in accordance with the conditions of the licence.

Provided that this article shall not be deemed to authorise the grant of a licence for the movement of any animal into the Controlled Area from any Infected Area.

Movement within the Controlled Area.

4. No animal shall be moved by road, railway, or water within the Controlled Area except with a licence which may be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority under this Order if in his opinion the movement is necessary, and subject to the conditions applicable to the licence: Provided that no licence shall be granted for the movement of any animal from any premises on which a licensed market or sale of fat animals is held

otherwise than direct to a slaughterhouse or back to the premises from which they were taken to the licensed market or sale for detention thereon for a period of six days.

Markets and Sales in the Controlled Area.

5.—(1) No market, fair, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held on any premises in the Controlled Area except in accordance with this Article.

(2) (a) A market or sale of animals intended for immediate slaughter may be held in any market, fairground, or saleyard if a licence to hold such market or sale is obtained from the Local Authority. Any movement of an animal from such market or sale shall be subject to the provisions of Article 4 of this Order.

(b) A sale of animals may be held on farm premises if a licence to hold such sale is obtained from the Local Authority. The movement of animals from such sale shall be subject to the provisions of Article 4 of this Order.

(3) A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend and examine the animals exposed at every market or sale licensed under this Article.

Forms and Conditions of Movement Licences.

6.—(1) Licences for the movement of animals granted under this Order shall be in the form, and subject to the conditions set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order and may be granted only by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

(2) No licence shall be available for the movement of the animals unless and until it is countersigned by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the premises from which the animals are to be moved are situate.

Movement of Animals through the Controlled Area by Railway without untrucking permitted.

7. This Order shall not prevent the movement of animals direct by railway through the Controlled Area from a place outside the Controlled Area to another place outside the Controlled Area.

Disposal of Slaughterhouse Manure and Refuse.

8. No manure or waste meat trimmings or any other refuse shall be moved from any slaughterhouse in the Controlled Area unless permission for such movement is given in writing by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the place of destination. Any person removing or receiving any such material and the occupier of any premises to which it is moved shall take all practicable steps to secure that it is not fed to or brought into contact with animals. Notwithstanding the definition of the term "slaughterhouse" contained in Article 12 of this Order, the term "slaughterhouse" for the particular purposes of this Article shall include any slaughterhouse which forms part of a farm or other premises.

Saving for Orders and Regulations.

9. No licence under this Order shall authorise the movement of animals in contravention

of any Regulations made by a Local Authority other than the Local Authority by whose Inspector the licence was issued, or authorise the movement of animals in contravention of any other Order of the Minister for the time being in force.

Production of Licences—Names and Addresses.

10. The person in charge of any animal being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall on demand made under this Order by an Inspector of the Ministry or of a Local Authority or by a Police Constable, produce the licence, and allow a copy of or extract from it to be taken, and shall also if required give his name and address.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

11. This Order shall, except where otherwise expressly provided, be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Meaning of Terms.

12. In this Order:—

“Animals” means cattle, sheep, goats, pigs or deer.

“Slaughterhouse” means premises used habitually and solely for the purpose of slaughtering animals, but does not include (1) a slaughterhouse which forms part of a farm, or (2) any premises on which animals other than those intended for immediate slaughter are kept.

Offences.

13. Any person committing or aiding, abetting, counselling or procuring the commission of any breach of the provisions of this Order or the conditions of any licence granted thereunder is liable, on summary conviction to the penalties provided by the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927.

Commencement.

14. This Order shall come into operation on the First day of July, nineteen hundred and thirty-one.

Short Title.

15. This Order may be cited as the NORTH OF ENGLAND AND SCOTLAND (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) (CONTROLLED AREA) ORDER OF 1931.

(To be printed as Endorsement to Licence.)

CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO LICENCES.

1. A licence for movement between different parts of the same farm or holding, if endorsed by the Inspector granting it "Occupation Licence," is available for movement of the animals as often as required, and shall remain in force until it is withdrawn by an Inspector of the Local Authority.

2. This Licence does not authorise movement of animals on any road within a radius of two miles of any Infected Place, nor movement out of the Controlled Area, except for the purpose of reaching a destination in a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

3. The animals shall be moved in the manner and by the route, if any, specified in the licence. If the route is not so specified the animals shall be moved by the nearest available route, and without avoidable delay to the place of destination specified in the Licence and not elsewhere and shall while being moved be kept separate as far as practicable from all other animals.

4. The Licence shall accompany the animals throughout the movement, shall be produced on demand to an Inspector of the Ministry or Local Authority or to the police, and shall on arrival of the animals at the specified place of destination, be delivered up, forthwith, to

the nearest Police Officer of the District, wherein the place of destination is situated, unless the Licence is marked "Occupation Licence."

5. Where the place of destination specified in Column IV is premises other than a slaughterhouse, market, or saleyard, the animals shall on arrival thereof be detained for a period of 14 days from the date of arrival, except that in the case of fat animals exposed at a licensed market or sale for fat animals and which, being unsold, are licensed back to the premises from which they came, the period of detention shall be six days only. (This condition does not restrict the movement of a carcase.) This condition does not apply in the case of movements wholly within the controlled area if the licence is an "Occupation Licence" or "For Breeding Purposes," and is so marked.

6. Where the number of animals to be moved (except with an Occupation Licence) is less than the number in respect of which the licence was granted the Inspector countersigning the licence must endorse thereon the number of animals proposed to be moved. The licence shall then be available only for the movement of the number of animals so endorsed.

Additional Conditions Applicable where the Movement of Animals is to a Licensed Market or Sale of Fat Stock, or to a slaughterhouse.

7. Before movement to the market or sale, or to the slaughterhouse as the case may be, all animals shall be marked as follows:—

Cattle.—A broad arrow, six inches long, clipped on left hindquarter, and hair clipped off end of tail.

Sheep.—A letter "M" six inches long, painted or stamped with red or blue adhesive composition on both sides of each sheep.

Pigs.—Letter "M" painted or stamped with red or blue adhesive composition on both sides of each pig.

8. The animals shall be slaughtered within 96 hours of arrival at the slaughterhouse, or such less period as may be specified by the Local Authority of the District, and shall not be removed therefrom alive.
