At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 29th day of *June*, 1931.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the *Liverpool Cathedral Act, 1885*, it is enacted (1) that whenever the Ecclesiastical Commissioners certify to His Majesty under their Common Seal that the net income of the *Liverpool Chapter Endowment Fund* (being the Fund established under Section 20 of the said Act and held by the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners upon the trusts in the said Act declared) will provide such minimum income as in the said Act mentioned for a dean and not less than four residentiary canons (such minimum income being for a dean a net annual income of £1,000 and for a canon a net annual income of £300 exclusive in both cases of the value of any residence) His Majesty may by Order in Council found a dean and chapter of *Liverpool* and constitute them a body corporate with all the rights and powers of other cathedral chapters in England or with such of them as to His Majesty may seem fit and may subject them to the jurisdiction of the Bishop of *Liverpool* as Visitor;

(2) that the dean and chapter of *Liverpool* and the endowment thereof shall be deemed for all purposes to be subject to the same laws as the dean and chapter of any other cathedral

church in England and the endowment thereof and the deanery shall be in the direct patronage of His Majesty and every canonry shall be in the patronage of the Bishop of *Liverpool* for the time being;

(3) that it shall be lawful for His Majesty from time to time by Order in Council to make and when made to alter and revoke statutes for the order rule and governance of the dean and chapter of *Liverpool* and the members officers and endowment thereof:

And whereas by a Certificate under their Common Seal dated the eleventh day of *June*, 1931, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners certified to His Majesty that the net income of the said *Liverpool Chapter Endowment Fund* would provide the minimum incomes in the said Act mentioned (that is to say the net annual income of £1,000 for a dean and £300 for a canon in each case exclusive of the value of any residence) for a dean and four residentiary canons:

And whereas by an Order of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council made in pursuance of the *Bishoprics Act 1878* the 31st day of *July 1880* and published in the *London Gazette* on the 3rd day of *August 1880* twenty-four honorary canonries were founded in the Cathedral Church of *St. Peter* in *Liverpool*:

And whereas under and by virtue of the 19th Section of the *Liverpool Cathedral Act, 1902*, the Church of *St. Peter* in *Liverpool* has

ceased to be the cathedral church of the bishopric of Liverpool and the cathedral church (or the portion thereof for the time being used for Divine Service) erected by the Liverpool Cathedral Committee pursuant to the power given to them by the said Liverpool Cathedral Act 1902 upon the site in the said Act referred to as the site of St. James' Mount and dedicated by the name of The Cathedral Church of Christ in Liverpool is now by virtue of the last mentioned Act for all intents and purposes the cathedral church of the bishopric of Liverpool with all rights and privileges attaching thereto:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Liverpool Cathedral Act, 1885, His Majesty by and with the advice of His Most Honourable Privy Council is pleased hereby to order and declare as follows, that is to say:—

(1) The dean and chapter of the Cathedral Church of Liverpool (hereinafter called the dean and chapter of Liverpool or the said dean and chapter) is hereby founded.

(2) The said dean and chapter shall be a body corporate having perpetual succession and a Common Seal and the constituent members thereof shall be the dean and four residentiary canons.

(3) Subject to the provisions of this Order and the Statutes hereby made and established the dean and each of the said residentiary canons shall hold his deanery or residentiary canonry by the same tenure as the incumbent of any other deanery or residentiary canonry as the case may be in England and the law relating to other deaneries or residentiary canonries in England shall so far as may be consistently with the tenour thereof and with the circumstances of the case apply to the said deanery and each of the said canonries respectively and to the incumbents thereof.

(4) The deanery shall be in the direct patronage of His Majesty and each of the said four residentiary canonries shall be in the patronage of the Bishop of Liverpool for the time being.

(5) The said dean and chapter shall possess and enjoy all the rights and powers of other cathedral chapters in England and the said dean and chapter and the endowment thereof shall be deemed for all purposes to be subject to the same laws as the dean and chapter of any other cathedral church in England and the endowment thereof.

(6) The dean and chapter shall be subject to the jurisdiction of the Bishop of Liverpool for the time being as Visitor thereof.

(7) The Statutes hereinafter set forth are hereby made and established for the order rule and governance of the Cathedral Church of Liverpool and the said dean and chapter and the members officers and endowments thereof.

THE STATUTES OF THE CATHEDRAL CHURCH OF LIVERPOOL.

PREAMBLE.

The Cathedral Church of Christ in Liverpool was founded and built to be an enduring witness of faith in the Incarnation of our Lord, and in the glory of His Resurrection; to express that faith in the worship of Almighty God; to foster it in the City and the

Diocese by spiritual ministrations to the clergy and the people; and to extend it in evangelism both at home and overseas.

To this end it will be the first duty of all who bear rule in the Cathedral, all who serve and all who minister therein, each in his part and station, so to labour together that through the dignity, the beauty and the simplicity of its services God's Name may be truly hallowed and magnified in the ministry of the word and sacraments, in prayer and in praise.

And seeing that the practice of worship calls for manifold activities of mind and spirit, and that for its exercise men have need to be prepared by instruction, guidance and example, it shall be the concern of the Cathedral, as well throughout the Diocese as within itself, to encourage all studies appertaining thereto; such as that of music, taking heed that none but the best and purest worthily performed and shared, shall be offered in the services of the Church; of art and craftsmanship, whereby through reverent design and dedicated skill, the work of the Spirit may herein also be acknowledged, and His inspiration accepted and employed; and, more than all, of sacred learning, unto a better understanding of past teachings, and a more perfect apprehension of God's continuous revelation of Himself from age to age.

For the due performance of these and other functions, and for the avoidance so far as may be of all dissension and perplexity among those who shall be charged therewith, these Statutes are ordained. But since no such ordering in one generation can fully suffice for those that are to come, consideration may from time to time be given how to meet by change of Statute new opportunities which cannot be fitly used without such change. Wherefore, if need be, let further order under lawful authority be taken for the Cathedral, provided always that the spirit and purpose of its foundation, as herein declared, shall ever be maintained, and further that the fabric of the building be preserved, not only from ruin, but in its present strength and beauty, and, so far as is possible, at the charges of its own funds.

Finally, as Mother Church of the Diocese, the Cathedral should be a home and centre of fellowship. Wherefore it behoves the Principal and General Chapters in their several degrees to make its whole corporate life, maintained by a sharing of worship and study, and by constant personal contact, an exemplar of ministerial brotherhood. So, being at unity in itself, may the Cathedral ever reveal to the clergy of the Diocese, and encourage them to cherish, their oneness in the service of Him to whose most blessed name it is dedicated, and in whose love all its work is done.

STATUTE I.—THE BISHOP.

1. The Bishop shall have the right upon reasonable notice, not being less than two weeks, to use the Cathedral or any part thereof for Synods, Ordinations, Confirmations, and for other special services, to determine the form and ordering of all such services, and to appoint the preachers thereat. He shall also preach and celebrate the Holy Communion at such times as he shall see fit, the same notice being given. He may appoint one preacher at a Sunday service in every month.

2. The Bishop as Visitor shall hold a regular visitation once in every three years, at which all members of the Principal Chapter, together with the Treasurer, the lay officers and all persons employed in the service of the Cathedral shall appear before him, shall answer his enquiries, and shall if they desire, prefer complaints, which he shall note and consider. And when the Bishop has delivered such admonition as he shall think expedient, all but the Principal Chapter shall withdraw, and the visitation shall go forward.

He may hold special visitations at the request of the Dean or of two members of the Principal Chapter for the settlement of questions in dispute regarding the interpretation of these Statutes. On these questions his decision shall be conclusive except some question of law be moved.

3. The Bishop shall be the Ordinary of the Cathedral. Any change in the ordering of the regular services, by which phrase in these Statutes is meant the offices of the Book of Common Prayer, or any question regarding these or the special services on which disagreement shall arise in the Principal Chapter, shall be referred by the Dean to the Bishop as Ordinary, whose decision shall be conclusive.

STATUTE II.—THE PRINCIPAL CHAPTER.

1. The Dean and four Residentiary Canons by this Order constituted the body corporate of the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Liverpool shall be The Principal Chapter.

2. The Dean shall receive an annual stipend of £1,500 until such time as the Visitor shall declare that the Maintenance Fund hereinafter mentioned is sufficient to provide the full stipend of £2,000 and thenceforth the Dean shall receive the annual stipend of £2,000, and in addition to the said stipend of £1,500 or £2,000 the Dean shall receive an annual allowance of £100 until a Deanery House shall be provided.

3. Of the four Residentiary Canons, two, neither of whom shall hold together with his Canonry any benefice with cure of souls or the office of Suffragan Bishop or Archdeacon, shall receive annual stipends of £1,000 with an annual allowance in each case of £100 until a Canon's House is provided for him; two, who may hold benefices with cure of souls or other preferment in the Diocese, subject to the provision of the Pluralities Acts, shall receive annual stipends of £300, and the tenure of their Canonries may, by the instrument of appointment, be expressed to terminate on their ceasing to hold any such benefice or other preferment.

4. Subject to the temporary provisions hereinafter in these Statutes contained, the Dean and every Residentiary Canon shall cease to hold his office and shall no longer be entitled to any of the rights and emoluments thereof as soon as he shall attain the age of seventy-five years and shall thereupon become qualified for such pension as may be granted under the pensions scheme hereinafter set forth.

5. The Bishop may in his discretion confer upon a retired Dean or Canon the title of Dean or Canon Emeritus, with a Stall in the Cathedral and such part in the services as the Dean may assign to him.

6. The Principal Chapter shall have the charge, care and administration of the Maintenance Fund, consisting of the income from the Liverpool Chapter Endowment Fund and from all property held by or in trust for the Cathedral or its services, and of moneys raised by Collections and Offertories for Cathedral expenses, and shall administer all real and personal property vested in or belonging to the Dean and Chapter.

7. The Principal Chapter shall have the care of the fabric of the said Cathedral Church vested in the said Dean and Chapter of Liverpool.

8. Subject to the rights and jurisdiction of the Bishop hereinbefore defined, and except as herein otherwise provided, the Principal Chapter shall have the ordering of all regular services, the appointment and dismissal of the Organist, the Choral Conductor, the Cathedral Chaplains, the Chapter Clerk, and of all stipendiary persons engaged in the service of the Cathedral.

9. Meetings of the Principal Chapter shall be holden at least eight times in the year, notice of at least ten days being given of each Meeting. Special Meetings shall be called at the Dean's discretion or at the request of two members of the Principal Chapter. Minutes of each Meeting shall be taken and preserved by the Chapter Clerk. A copy of the Minutes of each Meeting shall be sent to the Bishop within seven days. A quorum of three shall suffice for the transaction of business.

10. Seeing that the geographical and other conditions of Liverpool Cathedral present unusual obstacles to the maintenance of that common life and worship which should distinguish the Principal Chapter as a brotherhood and body corporate, it is the more incumbent upon all members of the Chapter to make special effort to join in such worship, and especially in the ordinary services, even at times when their attendance is not obligatory. And further it is much to be desired that such other means be devised by the Chapter as in the changing times and circumstances shall best serve to foster corporate life and brotherly unity and concord, especially by the sharing of private intercessions and recitations of the Psalms, by frequent corporate communions, and by common meals.

STATUTE III.—THE DEAN.

1. The Dean shall be Chairman of the Principal Chapter with a second or casting vote, and shall be a member of all Committees and Governing Bodies attached to the Cathedral. He shall have special responsibility for the custody and care of the fabric and of all the possessions and property of the Cathedral, and of its records and archives. Save as herein otherwise provided, he shall have full authority in the Cathedral and full control of all services, he shall superintend and control all its ministrations day by day, and the work of all who serve it.

2. He shall after consultation with the Bishop preach or provide the preachers at the Sunday afternoon services throughout the year, at all services in the season of Lent, and at all the greater festivals of the Church.

STATUTE IV.—THE MEMBERS OF THE PRINCIPAL CHAPTER.

1. Of the Members of the Principal Chapter one shall be appointed by the Bishop to hold the office of Chancellor. It shall be his duty to supervise the educational work of the Cathedral, and especially to encourage and assist the pursuit of sacred learning by the clergy of the Diocese.

2. Another may be appointed by the Bishop to hold the office of Precentor. If so appointed, he shall superintend and in Chapter represent all matters pertaining to the performance of music in the worship of the Cathedral and to the direction of the musical influence of the Cathedral within the Diocese. He shall assist in drafting forms of special services, and in the due ordering of all ceremonial.

3. The Residentiary Canons shall undertake in addition to their statutory duties such further charges and labours in the Cathedral and the Diocese as shall be assigned to them by the Bishop, but so that these shall not interfere with the adequate discharge of their duties to the Cathedral and its services.

STATUTE V.—OF RESIDENCE.

1. The Dean shall reside within the City of Liverpool for nine months in every year. During these months he shall attend at least one regular service daily during five days (of which Sunday shall be one) in every week and shall keep such other attendance in the Cathedral as shall be necessary for efficient personal superintendence of all that shall be done within it.

2. Those of the Residentiary Canons who are not permitted by these Statutes to hold benefices or other preferments shall reside within the City of Liverpool. Those who hold benefices or other preferments may reside at such place within the Diocese as the Bishop shall approve.

For not less than eight nor more than nine weeks in each year in the case of a Residentiary Canon holding another benefice or preferment, and for not less than 18 nor more than 21 weeks in each year in the case of any other Residentiary Canon, each Canon shall be Canon in Residence, and shall keep close residence, during which he shall attend at least one of the regular services for five days (of which Sunday shall be one) in each week. During a further period which, when added to the close residence, will amount to a total of nine months in each year, each Residentiary Canon shall take such part in the life and work of the Cathedral as may be assigned to him by the Dean and Chapter, regard being had in the case of Canons holding other benefices or preferments to the duties thereof.

3. The Canon in Residence shall preach or appoint the preacher at the regular Morning Services, saving always the appointments herein reserved and such others as shall be from time to time reserved by the Bishop or the Dean and Chapter. He shall have precedence next after the Dean and in the absence of the Dean shall act as Vice-Dean in the decision of all questions requiring immediate settlement. He shall exercise such other rights and duties as the Dean and Chapter may assign to him.

4. For every month there shall be appointed a Deputy Canon and one Diocesan Canon on

duty, for whom special functions shall be from time to time prescribed by the Dean and Chapter.

5. Before the end of September of every year the Dean, after consultation with the Principal Chapter, shall draw up and cause to be circulated a Rota of Canons, Deputy Canons and Diocesan Canons on duty for the ensuing year.

6. Notwithstanding anything contained in these Statutes, it shall be lawful for the Bishop to excuse the Dean or any of the Canons from attendance at any service, and to allow them to be absent from Liverpool for the purpose of work for the Church within the Diocese or elsewhere, but not so as to interfere with the adequate discharge of their duties to the Cathedral or its services. Such periods of permitted absence as also absence in attendance at Convocation or the Church Assembly as a Member thereof shall be deemed to be part of their residence or close residence.

STATUTE VI.—CANONS THEOLOGIAN.

1. The Bishop may appoint to the staff of the Cathedral by the title of Canons Theologian not more than four persons in Holy Orders, being graduates of distinction in any University of the British Islands, to hold their appointments for a term of five years in each case, to assist in the educational work of the Cathedral, particularly among the clergy of the Diocese, and to maintain its contact with great centres of learning.

2. Each Canon Theologian shall receive a yearly stipend of not more than £75.

STATUTE VII.—CANONS DIOCESAN.

1. The 24 Honorary Canons of the Cathedral shall be designated Canons Diocesan. They shall take their shares in Chapter recitations and intercessions, in their turns shall assist in the daily services so far as is convenient, and shall be under honourable obligation to co-operate in every effort to interpret the Cathedral and to extend its spiritual ideals and activities throughout the Diocese.

2. When an Honorary Canon, otherwise Canon Diocesan, ceases to reside in the Diocese, he shall relinquish both his stall and title. But the Bishop may at his discretion confer upon him the title of Canon Emeritus.

STATUTE VIII.—THE GENERAL CHAPTER.

1. There shall be a General Chapter consisting of the Bishop who shall be Chairman, the members of the Principal Chapter, the Bishop or Bishops Suffragan, the Archdeacons, the Canons Theologian, and the twenty-four Honorary Canons or Canons Diocesan. A Quorum of eighteen shall suffice for the transaction of business.

2. The function of the General Chapter shall be to afford to the Bishop advice and counsel on matters pertaining both to the Cathedral and to the Diocese, the members being his chosen counsellors.

3. The General Chapter shall meet at the least twice in every year. The Bishop shall summon special Meetings at the written request of six members.

4. Rural Deans, the Bishop's Honorary Chaplains, and Proctors in Convocation may be invited by the Bishop to attend meetings of the General Chapter as assessors and may speak but not vote.

5. The General Chapter shall elect the capitular Proctor representing the Cathedral in Convocation, and on a vacancy in the See shall receive the *congé d'élire*.

STATUTE IX.—CATHEDRAL CHAPLAINS.

1. There may be not more than three Cathedral Chaplains appointed by the Principal Chapter for a term of five years, which may be extended by a further term of not more than three years.

Their duty shall be to sing the Priest's parts in Choral Services; in other services to take such parts as may from time to time be assigned to them according to the terms of their appointment; and to undertake such further duties both within and without the Cathedral as the Bishop with the consent of the Principal Chapter may from time to time appoint.

2. The Senior Chaplain shall receive an annual stipend of not more than £500, and the two Juniors annual stipends of not more than £400 per annum, to be fixed from time to time by the Principal Chapter.

3. It shall be lawful for the Principal Chapter, if they think it expedient, to appoint as Assistant Chaplains Priests licensed to officiate in the Diocese, with duties and stipends and upon such terms and conditions as from time to time may be determined by the Principal Chapter.

STATUTE X.—THE TREASURER.

1. The Principal Chapter shall appoint a Treasurer, who shall be either a member of the Principal Chapter or a layman being a communicant member of the Church of England. They may also, if they deem it fit, appoint and pay a stipend to an Assistant Treasurer.

2. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to keep full accounts of all moneys whatsoever coming into the hands of the Dean and Chapter, which account shall be duly audited, laid before the Principal Chapter and presented to the Bishop once in every year.

STATUTE XI.—THE FINANCE COMMITTEE.

1. There shall be a Finance Committee consisting of the Dean, who shall be Chairman, the Treasurer, the Canon in Residence, and one other appointed by the Principal Chapter.

2. It shall be the duty of the Finance Committee on behalf of the Principal Chapter to watch and supervise expenditure.

3. The Finance Committee shall take heed that the fabric of the Cathedral and its contents are adequately insured.

4. In matters requiring expert advice they shall take care to consult those best qualified to give it and may, with the consent of the Chapter, co-opt from time to time, and for such period as they shall determine, one additional member for this purpose.

STATUTE XII.—THE ORGANIST.

1. The Organist shall be appointed by the Principal Chapter upon an agreement terminable by either party after six months' notice. He shall have the care and control of the organs. His duties and tenure of office shall be further set forth in the agreement, and shall be subject to alteration after 12 months' notice.

2. He shall receive a stipend to be fixed from time to time by the Dean and Chapter. He shall not be continued in office after reaching the age of 70 and, on retirement at that age or with the consent of the Principal Chapter at an earlier age if permanently incapacitated, he shall have the benefit of the pensions provisions hereinafter contained. He shall be required to attend all services prescribed by the Dean unless prevented by illness and except during vacations, which shall not exceed seven weeks or in all eight Sundays in the year.

3. The Principal Chapter may appoint a Choral Conductor or Deputy Organist to hold office for a term of years, whose duties, term of office, and stipend shall be prescribed by the Principal Chapter after consultation with the Organist.

STATUTE XIII.—THE CHOIR.

1. There shall be not fewer than twelve gentlemen of the Choir, who shall be appointed by the Principal Chapter in consultation with the Organist, for a period not exceeding ten years, upon such conditions of service, emolument, and pension-gratuities, if any, as shall from time to time be determined by the Principal Chapter. Contracts of Service may be renewed for periods not exceeding five years.

2. There shall be at least twenty-four choristers, or children of the Choir, who, having been examined by the Organist, may upon his recommendation be appointed by the Principal Chapter. During their time of service in the Choir, and if possible until they are at least 18 years of age, they shall be educated as directed by the Principal Chapter. Special allowance in this regard shall be made for choristers who are sons of clergy.

STATUTE XIV.—THE COLLEGE OF STEWARDS.

1. There shall be a College of Stewards, consisting of lay persons being communicant members of the Church of England, appointed for a term of three years as follows:—Two by every Ruridecanal Conference of the Diocese; not more than twelve by the Principal Chapter; and not more than twenty-four by the Bishop and twenty-four by the Dean. Their services shall be honorary.

2. Their function shall be twofold; first to undertake such duties relevant to the comfort, good order, and safety of worshippers as shall be assigned to them by the Principal Chapter, and secondly to represent the interest and influence of the Cathedral throughout the Diocese.

3. Of the members of the College twelve shall be appointed by the Dean as Senior Stewards.

4. The Senior Stewards shall meet at least twice in every year under the Dean as Chairman, and the whole College at least once in every year under the Dean as Chairman, and, so meeting, shall have opportunity to make suggestions for the consideration of the Principal Chapter in regard to any matter pertaining to the ordering and work of the Cathedral.

STATUTE XV.—THE CATHEDRAL SCHOOL OF DIVINITY.

1. There shall be a Cathedral School of Divinity, which shall provide lectures, classes and tutorial assistance at the Cathedral or

elsewhere for the encouragement of religious learning among:

- (a) the Clergy of the Diocese;
- (b) Candidates in the Diocese for Holy Orders;
- (c) Deaconesses, Lay Readers and others engaged in lay service;
- (d) Sunday School Teachers, Social Workers and Church Councillors;
- (e) the Christian public;

and shall, so far as possible, make provision for theological research.

2. The School shall be governed by a Council consisting of the Bishop, who shall be president, the Chancellor, who shall be Chairman, three members appointed by the Principal Chapter, three appointed by the Diocesan Board of Education, and not more than three co-opted by the Council.

3. The Council shall observe such regulations as the Principal Chapter with the Bishop's consent may from time to time enact.

STATUTE XVI.—OTHER SCHOOLS AND COLLEGES.

For the purpose of making more effective the influence and co-operation of the Cathedral in promoting the study and practice of the art of worship and all that pertains thereto, it shall be lawful for the Dean and Chapter with the consent of the Bishop to constitute other similar Schools or Colleges, and to regulate their governance or to devise other means to this same end.

STATUTE XVII.—STALLS AND PRECEDENCE.

1. Stalls in the Cathedral shall be assigned by the Principal Chapter at the request of the Bishop.

2. At all services precedence shall be regulated by the Dean, subject to an appeal to the Bishop.

STATUTE XVIII.—PENSIONS AND GRATUITIES.

1. A sum of £400 may be paid annually into a Chapter Pension Fund, which shall be invested in the name of the Dean and Chapter and the annual interest shall be added to the Fund so far as not required for making any payments to be made out of the Fund.

2. The Principal Chapter may, if and in so far as the amount to the credit of the Chapter Pension Fund from time to time will permit, pay pensions (a) of not less than £100 or more than £250 a year to each of the following persons, that is to say, the Dean and the two Residentiary Canons whose annual stipends are £1,000, upon retirement after not less than ten years' service at the age of 75, or earlier if in the judgment of the Visitor he is permanently incapacitated by ill-health, and to the Organist on the same conditions except that the age 70 shall be substituted for 75 and (b) of £50 a year to each of the two Residentiary Canons whose annual stipends are £300 a year and to any Choral Conductor or Deputy Organist, under the same conditions in the case of these Canons as are applicable to the Dean and the other two Residentiary Canons and in the case of any Choral Conductor or Deputy Organist as are applicable to the Organist, any such pension to a Dean

or Canon to be in addition to and not in substitution for any pension under the Clergy Pensions Measure. No such pension shall be legally recoverable but shall be deemed to be a voluntary payment.

3. If at any time the Dean and Chapter shall decide that this charge of £400 is excessive or insufficient, it may with the consent of the Visitor be diminished or increased.

4. The Principal Chapter may pay each year to the credit of a Staff Gratuity Fund such a percentage of the stipend paid to laymen in their service as in their judgment would enable them, if they so think fit, to pay every such layman, at the termination of his appointment after not less than ten years' service, a gratuity not exceeding 5 per cent. of the amount of his last annual stipend for every year of his service. The Chapter may pay such gratuities (so far as the amount standing to the credit of the Staff Gratuities Fund will admit) or withhold the sum at their absolute discretion. The Fund shall be invested in the name of the Dean and Chapter and any interest added to it, so far as not required for making any payments out of the Fund.

STATUTE XX.—TEMPORARY PROVISIONS.

For the purpose of facilitating arrangements necessary in respect to the Officers who have been responsible for the conduct of the affairs of and the maintenance of the services in the Cathedral on the transition to the constitution established by these statutes and the Order of His Majesty in Council establishing the same, it shall be lawful for the Bishop to add to the Principal Chapter two of those who have been serving under the style of Canons of the Cathedral to be members of the Principal Chapter during their lives or until their voluntary retirement and with, if the Bishop thinks fit in either case, the title of Canon Emeritus and a special annual allowance to be paid out of the Maintenance Fund, and to appoint either of them to one of the Offices mentioned in Statute IV.

This Order shall come into operation on the publication of the same in the London Gazette.

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Beer Crocombe and Hatch Beauchamp duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Bath and Wells and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, including certain alterations of boundaries affecting the Parishes of the said Benefices of Beer Crocombe and Hatch Beauchamp, and also the parish of Swell, being one of the Parishes of the United Benefice of Fivehead with Swell and the Parishes of the Benefices of Isle Abbots, Curry Rivel, Broadway, and Staple Fitzpaine with Bickenhall, all in the said County of Somerset and in the said Diocese of Bath and Wells, and the said Bishop of Bath and Wells signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union and alterations of boundaries, which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas the said Benefice of Beer Crocombe is now full, the Reverend Thomas Law being the present Incumbent thereof, and the said Benefice of Hatch Beauchamp is at present vacant:

“ And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said two Benefices of Beer Crocombe and Hatch Beauchamp now belongs to one and the same Patron or Patrons:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Thomas Law (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Beer Crocombe and the said Benefice of Hatch Beauchamp shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls, under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Hatch Beauchamp with Beer Crocombe ’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 4. That with the consents of the Patrons of the said Benefices of Isle Abbots, Staple Fitzpaine with Bickenhall, Broadway, Curry Rivel, and Fivehead with Swell, namely the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Holy Trinity at Bristol, being the Patrons of the said Benefices of Isle Abbots and Fivehead with Swell (testified by their causing their Common or Capitular Seal to be affixed to this Scheme); the Right Honourable Edward Claud Berkeley, Viscount Portman, being the Patron of the said Benefice of Staple Fitzpaine with Bickenhall (testified by his signing this Scheme); the said St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells, the Right Reverend and Venerable Charles Fane De Salis, Archdeacon of Taunton, Lieutenant Claude Mowbray Kirby-Smith, R.A., of Osmington House, Hernes Road, in the City of Oxford, and Lieutenant Commander Frank Doria Pitt Palmer, R.N., being the Patrons of the said Benefice of Broadway (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme); and Lieutenant Colonel Walter Hanning Speke, D.L., J.P., of Jordans, Ilminster, in the said County of Somerset, being the Patron of the said Benefice of Curry Rivel (testified by his signing this Scheme), and with the consents of the Incumbents of the said Benefices of Isle Abbots, Staple Fitzpaine with Bickenhall, Broadway, Curry Rivel, and Fivehead with Swell, namely the Reverend Julian Frederick Alexander, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Isle Abbots, the Reverend Frederick George Coote, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Staple Fitzpaine with Bickenhall, the Reverend William Harold Allen, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Broadway, the Reverend Frederic John Speke, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Curry Rivel, and the Reverend George Herbert Bode, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Fivehead with Swell (which consents are testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), upon the union taking effect:—

(a) All that detached portion of the said Parish of Beer Crocombe which is situate within the area of the Civil Parish of Isle Abbots shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Isle Abbots;

(b) All those two detached portions of the said Parish of Hatch Beauchamp which are situate within the area of the Civil Parish of Bickenhall shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the

Parish of the said Benefice of Staple Fitzpaine with Bickenhall;

(c) All that detached part of the said Parish of Broadway known as Capland and comprised within the area of the Civil Parish of Hatch Beauchamp shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Hatch Beauchamp;

(d) All that detached portion of the said Parish of Beer Crocombe which is situate within the area of the Civil Parish of Curry Rivel shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Curry Rivel; and

(e) All that detached portion of the said Parish of Hatch Beauchamp which is situate within the area of the Civil Parish of Swell shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the Benefice of Swell, being part of the said United Benefice of Fivehead with Swell.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Bath and Wells has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

The following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the Urban District Council of Barking, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882":—

Whereas section 213 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, provides that where a Petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Privy Council, and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the municipal borough to be created by the Charter the Committee may settle a scheme for the adjustment of the powers, rights, privileges, franchises, duties, property and liabilities of any then existing local authority whose district comprises the whole or any part of the area of that borough, either with or without any adjoining or other place and also of any officer of that authority:

And whereas sections 214 to 218 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, section 1 of the School Boards Act, 1885, and section 54 of the Local Government Act, 1894, contain supplemental provisions as to schemes made under section 213 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882:

And whereas section 310 of the Public Health Act, 1875, provides that where a district under the jurisdiction of an urban district council is constituted or included in a borough, all the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, obligations and property exercisable by attaching to or vested in that council under the Public Health Act, 1875, or under any local Act for purposes the same as or similar to those of that Act or under any general Act of Parliament within or for the benefit of such district shall pass to and be exercisable by and vested in the council of such borough:

And whereas the Urban District of Barking Town in the Administrative County of Essex, comprises the parish of Barking, and is an urban district for the purposes of the Public Health Act, 1875, for which the Urban District Council of Barking Town are the local authority:

And whereas it is proposed by a Charter of Incorporation to create the Urban District of Barking Town a municipal borough to incorporate its inhabitants and to extend to that Urban District and its inhabitants the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Acts:

And whereas in pursuance of the powers for that purpose contained in section 62 of the Local Government Act, 1894, the Urban District Council of Barking Town are the Burial Board for their district:

And whereas by the Representation of the People Act, 1918, the Rural District of Romford and the Urban Districts of Barking Town and Romford were constituted a parliamentary division and return one member to serve in Parliament:

And whereas in pursuance of the Education Act, 1921, the Urban District Council are a local education authority for elementary education, and a Scheme for the constitution of an Education Committee was approved by the Board of Education on the 31st day of October, 1922:

And whereas the District Council on the 28th day of November, 1916, under section 74 of the Elementary Education Act, 1870, as amended by the Education Acts, 1876 to 1916, made Bye-laws with respect to school attendance which were allowed by the Board of Education on the 9th day of November, 1917, and such Bye-laws now apply to the Urban District:

And whereas the District Council on the 26th day of February, 1924, and the 25th day of February, 1930, under Part VIII of the Education Act, 1921, made Bye-laws with respect to the Employment of Children and Street Trading by young persons, which Bye-laws were confirmed by the Secretary of State on the 24th day of April, 1924, and the 29th day of April, 1930, respectively, and such Bye-laws now apply to the Urban District:

And whereas this Scheme has been referred for consideration to the Secretary of State, Ministers and Government Departments to whom it is required to be referred by the enactments in that behalf:

Now, therefore, pursuant to the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and the School Boards Act, 1885, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Committee of Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby direct, order, and declare as follows:—

SHORT TITLE AND INTERPRETATION.

1.—(1) This Scheme may be cited as the Borough of Barking Scheme, 1931.

(2) In this Scheme unless the context otherwise requires:—

"The appointed day" means the day appointed for the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough of Barking;

"The Borough" means the Municipal Borough of Barking;

"The Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough acting by the Council of the Borough;

"The District" means the existing Urban District of Barking Town;

"The District Council" means the existing Urban District Council of Barking Town;

"The Municipal Corporations Acts" means the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and the Acts amending and extending that Act;

"Duties" includes responsibilities and obligations and any proceeding to which the District Council may be liable for the enforcement of any duty or for punishing the breach of any duty;

"Liabilities" includes all debts and liabilities to which the District Council are or would but for this Scheme be liable whether accruing before, on, or after the appointed day;

"Local Authority" means a local authority as defined in section 3 of the Local Government and other Officers' Superannuation Act, 1922;

"Powers" includes rights, jurisdiction, capacities, privileges, franchises and immunities.

"Property" includes all property, real and personal and all estates, interests, easements and rights (whether equitable or legal) in to and out of property real and personal, including things in action and all franchises, rights of common and commonable rights and all charters, records, deeds, books and documents.

COMMENCEMENT.

2. This Scheme shall come into operation on the day of its confirmation whether by Order in Council or by Act of Parliament.

POWERS, ETC., OF CORPORATION UNDER PUBLIC GENERAL ACTS.

3.—(1) On the appointed day the Borough shall be placed under the jurisdiction of the Corporation as the local authority for the purposes of the Public Health Acts, 1875 to 1925, and save as provided in this article the Corporation shall have all the powers and duties conferred or imposed by any public general Act of Parliament on the council of a borough containing according to the census of 1881 or any later census a population of 10,000 or upwards.

(2) Nothing in this Scheme shall affect the provisions of the Rating and Valuation Act, 1925.

(3) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (1) of this article the Corporation shall not exercise the powers or be subject to the duties of the council of a borough in relation to the appointment of a watch committee, a police force of special constables, or the levy of a watch rate under Part IX of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882; and the Borough for the purposes of police shall continue to form part of the Metropolitan Police District.

(4) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (1) of this article the Corporation shall not exercise any of the powers or duties or be subject to the liabilities in relation to the execution of the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, but all the powers, duties and liabilities in respect of such matters shall be exercised by and be attached to the County Council of the Administrative County of Essex and the area of the Borough shall for all purposes of the

Acts relating to the matters mentioned above form part of the County in like manner as if it were not a Borough.

DISSOLUTION, TRANSFER OF POWERS, ETC., OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

4.—(1) On the appointed day the District Council shall cease to exist and subject to the provisions of this Scheme their powers and duties including those under any local Act, Provisional Order or Order shall be transferred to and attach to the Corporation, and the Corporation shall be the successors of the District Council.

(2) All powers and duties which immediately before the appointed day are exercisable by or attach to the District Council for the benefit of the District shall be exercisable by or attach to the Corporation for the benefit of the Borough.

PROPERTY AND LIABILITIES OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

5. Subject to the provisions of this Scheme:—

(1) All property or liabilities which immediately before the appointed day are vested in or attach to the District Council shall on the appointed day by virtue of this Scheme be transferred to, vest in and attach to the Corporation, subject to all trusts affecting the same, and where the property was acquired or the liabilities incurred in the execution of an Act of Parliament the property and liabilities shall be held by and be discharged by the Corporation in accordance with such of the provisions of that Act as apply to the council of a borough.

(2) All property which immediately before the appointed day is vested in the District Council for the benefit of the District shall by virtue of this Scheme be held by the Corporation for the benefit of the Borough, and all liabilities which immediately before the appointed day attach to the District Council in respect of the District shall on the appointed day attach to them in respect of the Borough.

6. Any balance immediately before the appointed day to the credit or debit of any fund of the Urban District shall on the appointed day become a balance to the credit or debit of a corresponding fund to be opened for the Borough.

LOANS OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

7.—(1) Subject to the provisions of this Scheme:—

(a) The liability for the repayment of so much of any moneys borrowed by the District Council as immediately before the appointed day are owing and for the payment of the interest thereon shall by virtue of this Scheme be transferred to and attach to the Corporation;

(b) So much of any moneys borrowed by the District Council as immediately before the appointed day are owing and charged upon a fund or rate of that Council shall be charged upon that fund or rate of the Borough from which the expenses of the Council of a borough in the execution of the Act authorising the borrowing of the moneys are directed to be defrayed;

(c) So much of any moneys borrowed by the District Council as a Burial Board as immediately before the appointed day are owing shall by virtue of this Scheme be

charged upon the general fund and general rate of the Borough.

(2) All borrowed moneys to which this article applies shall together with the interest to accrue due thereon be repaid by the Corporation within the respective periods for which the loans in respect of which the said sums are owing were originally sanctioned or within which the same are otherwise required to be repaid or are made repayable.

(3) Nothing in this Scheme shall prejudice or affect any mortgage or other security which has been granted in respect of any borrowed moneys the liability for the repayment of which is transferred from the District Council to the Corporation by this article or the powers of any person entitled under any such mortgage or other security to enforce the same as if this Scheme had not been confirmed, and where for any such purpose it is necessary to continue the exercise of a power which would have existed but for this Scheme the power may continue to be exercised as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.

LOCAL ACTS, PROVISIONAL ORDERS, ETC.

8.—(1) Subject to the provisions of this Scheme the unrepealed provisions of:—

(a) the local Acts mentioned in the First Schedule to this Scheme and the Confirmation Acts mentioned in the second Schedule to this Scheme (so far as the last mentioned Acts relate to the Provisional Orders specified in that Schedule), and

(b) the orders specified in the third Schedule to this Scheme, and

(c) any other local Act or Provisional Order duly confirmed and affecting the District or the District Council (including any such local Act or Provisional Order passed or confirmed during the present session of Parliament)

as the same respectively are in force within the District immediately before the appointed day shall extend and apply to the Borough.

(2) Any reference in any local Act, Confirmation Act or Provisional Order:—

(a) To the Barking Town Local Board or the Barking Town Urban District Council shall be read as a reference to the Corporation; and

(b) To the Local Government District of Barking Town or the Urban District of Barking Town shall be read as a reference to the Borough.

9. The provisions of any protective clause for the benefit of the District Council (or their predecessors) contained in any local Act, Confirmation Act or Order (by whomsoever obtained) shall in respect of all matters relating to or affecting any part of the District enure to the benefit of the Corporation and shall be construed as if a reference to the Corporation were substituted for any reference to the District Council (or their predecessors) as the case may be.

ADOPTIVE ACTS.

10.—(1) Such of the provisions of:—

(a) Baths and Wash-houses Acts, 1846-1925;

(b) Infectious Diseases (Prevention) Act, 1890;

(c) Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890 (Parts II, III and V);

(d) Public Libraries Acts, 1892-1919;

(e) Small Dwellings Acquisition Acts, 1899-1923;

(f) Notification of Births Act, 1907;

(g) Local Government and other Officers' Superannuation Act, 1922;

(h) Public Health Act, 1925,

as shall have been adopted for the District immediately before the appointed day shall be in force and apply to the Borough as if the same had been adopted for the Borough.

BURIAL ACTS, 1852 TO 1906.

11.—(1) All the powers and duties which immediately before the appointed day are exercisable by or attach to the District Council under or by virtue of the Burial Acts, 1852 to 1906, shall be exercisable by or attach to the Corporation.

(2) Such of the provisions of the Burial Acts, 1852 to 1906, as apply to a town council acting as a burial board shall extend to the Corporation acting as a burial board and the expenses of the Corporation in the execution of those Acts shall accordingly be chargeable upon and paid out of the general fund and general rate of the Borough.

BYE-LAWS, REGULATIONS, ORDERS, ETC.

12.—(1) All bye-laws made before the 1st January, 1921, which under the Ministry of Health Act, 1919, are subject to confirmation by the Minister of Health whether made before or after the passing of that Act shall cease to be in force within the Borough on the expiry of one year from the appointed day;

(2) Any reference to the Barking Town Local Board or the Barking Town Urban District Council in:—

(a) any bye-law, regulation, scheme, list of tolls, table of fees and payments or scale of charges; or

(b) any Order in Council or Order of a Government Department or local authority, which immediately before the appointed day is in force shall be read as a reference to the Corporation.

(3) Any reference in any document to which paragraph (1) of this article applies to the Local Government District of Barking or the Urban District of Barking Town shall be read as a reference to the Borough.

13. Any bye-laws made by the County Council of Essex under section 16 of the Local Government Act, 1888, which immediately before the appointed day are in force within the District shall until the 1st day of January, 1934, apply to the Borough and be enforced by the Corporation as if those bye-laws had been made by the Corporation, but on that day shall cease to be in force within the Borough unless the bye-laws shall previously have been repealed or altered as respects the Borough by bye-laws made by the Corporation.

EDUCATION COMMITTEE.

14.—(1) The hereinbefore recited Scheme for the constitution of the Education Committee of the District Council shall until duly revoked or altered continue in force and have effect as if references to the Corporation and the Borough were substituted for references to the Barking Town Urban District Council and the Urban District of Barking Town and reference to the quarterly meeting of the Council of the Borough on the 9th day of

November were substituted for the reference to the annual meeting of the District Council.

(2) The members of the Education Committee of the District Council who shall be in office immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall be deemed to have been appointed by the Borough Council under the said Scheme for the constitution of the Education Committee and shall hold office until the quarterly meeting of the Council of the Borough on the 9th day of November, 1931.

15. The said recited School Attendance by-laws and bye-laws with respect to the Employment of Children and Street Trading by young persons made under the Education Acts in force in the Urban District at the commencement of this Scheme shall apply to the Borough until revoked or altered by the Corporation.

COMPENSATION CLAUSE.

16.—(1) In case any officer of the District Council who was employed by such Council immediately before the date of the confirmation of this Scheme and who shall have been employed by such Council for a period of not less than five years shall not be employed by the Council of the Borough nor offered by that Council a position in their employ of a similar character and of an equal value to that formerly held by him he shall be entitled to be paid compensation for the loss of his position, and the amount to be paid in each case shall be determined having regard to the conditions and circumstances mentioned in the Eighth Schedule to the Local Government Act, 1929, and the compensation shall not exceed the limit therein mentioned.

Provided nevertheless that if any such Officer shall be so employed by the Corporation, he shall, if his services are dispensed with or if his salary is reduced by the Corporation within four years after the commencement of this Scheme, because his services are not required or his duties are diminished, and not on the ground of misconduct, be deemed, unless the contrary is shown, to have suffered a direct pecuniary loss in consequence of this Scheme.

(2) Any compensation payable to any officer shall be paid out of the General Rate Fund of the Borough and the provisions of the said Schedule (except paragraph 11 thereof) shall apply subject to the following and any other necessary modifications:—

(a) any reference in that Schedule to "the Council" shall be construed as a reference to the Corporation, and

(b) any reference in that Schedule to "the appointed day" shall be construed as a reference to the appointed day as defined in this Scheme.

(3) All fees or remuneration received and retained by an officer in connection with the preparation of the jurors book or the register of electors under the Representation of the People Acts shall, subject to a reasonable deduction for any expenses incurred by the officer, be regarded as part of the emoluments of the officer for the purposes of compensation.

(4) No officer shall be entitled to receive both compensation under this Scheme for pecuniary loss and a superannuation or retiring allowance in respect of the same period of service and the same pecuniary loss.

(5) For the purposes of this Article and of the provisions of the Eighth Schedule to the said Act of 1929 as applied by this Article:—

(i) the expression "officer" includes a servant, and

(ii) a teacher employed in a public elementary school maintained but not provided by the District Council or the Corporation shall be deemed to be an officer employed by the District Council or the Corporation, and if his services are dispensed with by the direction or with the consent of the Corporation, he shall be deemed to be an officer whose services are dispensed with by the Corporation.

ACCOUNTS OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

17.—(1) The accounts of the District Council and of their committees and officers shall be made up to the appointed day and shall be audited by the district auditor in like manner and subject to the like incidents and consequences as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.

(2) Any sum certified at the audit by the district auditor to be due from any person shall be paid to the Treasurer of the Borough.

SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS.

18.—(1) The District Council shall by the levy of a rate liquidate as far as practicable before the appointed day all their current debts and liabilities.

(2) All rates made by the District Council which are not collected immediately before the appointed day and all other sums then due to the District Council may be recovered by the Corporation.

19.—(1) Nothing in this Scheme shall cause to abate or shall prejudicially affect or prevent the continuance of any action, cause of action or proceeding which immediately before the appointed day is pending or existing by or against the District Council or any contract, deed, bond, agreement or other instrument (subsisting immediately before the appointed day) entered into or made by the District Council or their predecessors:

Provided that:—

(a) Any action, cause of action or proceeding which immediately before the appointed day is pending or existing by or against the District Council may be continued, prosecuted and enforced by or against the Corporation; and

(b) All contracts, deeds, bonds, agreements and other instruments (subsisting immediately before the appointed day) entered into or made by the District Council (or their predecessors) may be continued and enforced as fully and effectually as if instead of that Council (or their predecessors) the Corporation had been a party thereto.

(2) All legal proceedings pending immediately before the appointed day may be amended in such a manner as may be necessary or proper in consequence of this Scheme.

20. Nothing in this Scheme shall prejudice, vary or affect any right, interest or jurisdiction in or over any charitable endowment.

21. All contributions, orders and precepts made or issued before the appointed day shall be as valid in law as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.

22. Notwithstanding the incorporation of the Borough and the provisions of this Scheme,

all Assessments, Orders, Apportionments, Notices, compositions, charges, acts, matters and things made, entered into or done before the appointed day by, or with reference to the District Council shall be as good, valid and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsoever for, against and with reference to the Corporation, as if the same had been made, done, entered into or done by, or with reference to the Corporation, instead of the District Council and may be proceeded on, or enforced

in the same manner in all respects as if the Corporation instead of the District Council had been party or privy to the same and had been named or referred to therein.

23. The Corporation shall on or before the thirty-first day of December, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three present a Petition under the Municipal Corporations Acts praying for a re-arrangement of the Wards of the Borough and the re-distribution of Councillors representing the same.

Contraction of Kirkcudbright Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1931 (No. 21) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area described in the Schedule to that Order.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the tenth day of July, nineteen hundred and thirty-one.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1931 (No. 23).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Isolation of certain animals at the Royal Agricultural Society's Show at the Royal Showground, Warwick.

1.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority of the District, with a view to prevent the spread of Foot-and-Mouth Disease may by notice require the removal to

a convenient and isolated place approved by him of any animal now at the Royal Agricultural Society's Show, at the Royal Show-ground, Warwick, which has been brought from any area which is after the movement of the animals to the said Show declared to be an Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925, and of any other animal at the Show which, in the opinion of the Minister or of the Local Authority, has been exposed to the risk of infection of Foot-and-Mouth Disease. This notice shall require any such animal to be detained and isolated at the said place of isolation until the notice is withdrawn by a further notice of an Inspector of the Ministry.

(2) A notice under this Article shall be served upon the owner or person in charge of the animal, and a copy shall be sent to the Ministry, to the Local Authority and to the Secretary of the Show.

(3) The removal, detention and isolation of any animal under a notice served under this Article shall be carried out at the expense of the owner of the animal.

Restriction of Movement of Animals from the Royal Agricultural Society's Show at the Royal Showground, Warwick.

2.—(1) No animal shall be moved out of the Show Ground of the Royal Agricultural Society at Warwick, except with a licence granted by an Inspector or officer of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, and then only to some suitable premises approved by the Inspector of the Ministry and subject to such conditions as the Minister considers necessary or expedient for the purpose of preventing the spread of disease, and are inserted in the licence.

(2) No licence shall be required under the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925, in respect of any animal being moved from the Show with a licence under this Order.

3. The term "animal" in this Order means cattle, sheep, goats and swine.

Offences.

4. Any person committing, or aiding abetting, counselling, or procuring the commission of any breach of the provisions of this Order or the conditions of a licence granted thereunder, is liable on summary conviction to the penalties provided by the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927.
