The KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the Award of the Medal of the Military Division of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire to the under-mentioned:—

For Meritorious Service.

Able Seaman Vincent Nagle, O.N. D/J. 92388.
Able Seaman Edmund George Holt, O.N. P/J. 100203.

Able Seamen Nagle and Holt were in the fore part of the submarine when H.M.S. "Poseidon" was sunk by collision with the S.S. "Yuta" on the 9th June, 1931. Under the charge of Petty Officer Willis, they assisted in closing the door of the compartment, with themselves and others inside, as this step might mean saving the submarine.

When it was decided to flood the compartment to equalise the pressure and to attempt to escape with the Davis apparatus, Able Seaman Nagle passed the time in instructing the Chinese boy in the use of his apparatus, and was undoubtedly instrumental in saving his life.

The first two men to escape from the submarine were Able Seamen Lovock and Holt; the former came to the surface unconscious

and died immediately, but his body was supported by Able Seaman Holt, himself in a state of great exhaustion, until both were picked up by boats waiting on the scene.

Able Seaman Nagle came to the surface with three others at the second attempt.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the Award of the Medal of the Military Division of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire to the under-mentioned:—

For Gallantry.

No. 1006 Trooper Cyril Anthony Bayley, Surma Valley Light Horse, Auxiliary Force, India.

On the night of the 18th/19th April, a party of insurgents attacked the armoury at Chittagong, Bengal, and subsequently fled into the hills. During the afternoon of the 22nd April, 1930, information was received as to their whereabouts and a troop of the Surma Valley Light Horse and about 20 Eastern Frontier Rifles were despatched at once to the village of Jijiribahtali in motor cars.

After this force had moved into the jungle for about three quarters of a mile, the insurgents were found to be occupying a wooded hill. Trooper Bayley was in one of the two sections which were sent up on the left flank. Being the extreme left hand man himself, he worked round under heavy fire through the thick jungle to within about 30 yards of the insurgents' position, and succeeded in killing three of them, including one of their leaders, besides wounding several others. Bayley himself was not actually hit though his helmet was shot off his head.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the award of the Albert Medal in Gold to Petty Officer (now Chief Petty Officer) Patrick Henry Willis, R.N., Official No. D/J. 19570.

The following is the account of the services in respect of which the decoration has been conferred:—

On the 9th June, 1931, H.M. Submarine "Poseidon" collided with a merchant ship and eventually sank as a result of the severe damage sustained.

After the collision occurred and the order "Close watertight doors" had been given, Petty Officer Willis took charge of the hands in the fore part, calling upon them to close the door of the torpedo compartment with those inside as this step might mean the saving of the submarine. The operation was difficult, as the bulkhead had buckled, but by their united efforts the door was eventually closed, leaving only a slight leak. Whilst this work was in progress the ship lurched to starboard and sank with heavy inclination by the bows. The electric light leads were all cut at the moment of the collision and from that time

until the final evacuation the imprisoned men were working with the occasional illumination of an electric torch. Willis first said prayers for himself and his companions and then ordered them to put on their escape apparatus, making sure that they all knew how to use it. He then explained he was going to flood the compartment in order to equalise the pressure with that outside the submarine, and how it was to be done, telling off each man to his station. He also rigged a wire hawser across the hatchway to form a support for men to stand on whilst the compartment was flooding. During the long period of waiting which ensued, Willis kept his companions in good heart, while one Able Seaman passed the time in instructing a Chinese Boy in the use of his apparatus. The other men worked cheerfully at the various valves and rigging the platform. After two hours and ten minutes when the water was about up to the men's knees, Willis considered the pressure might be sufficient to open the hatch. With considerable difficulty the hatch was opened sufficiently to release two men, but the pressure then reclosed the hatch, and it was necessary to make the pressure more equal by further flooding before a second attempt could be made. After another hour, by which time the men in the compartment were nearly up to their necks in water and the air lock was becoming very small, a second effort was made. This was successful and the hatch opened, and four other men came to the surface, including Petty Officer Willis.

It is abundantly clear that all the men imprisoned in the slowly flooding compartment in almost total darkness, faced a situation more than desperate, with courage and fortitude in accordance with the very highest traditions of the Service. The coolness, confidence, ability and power of command shown by Petty Officer Willis, which no doubt were principally responsible for the saving of so many valuable lives, are deserving of the very highest praise.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

SEDGLEY GAS.

(Application for Special Order under Gas Undertakings Acts 1920 and 1929).

NOTICE is hereby given that the Urban District Council of Sedgley (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") whose address is the Council House, Sedgley, intend to apply to the Board of Trade for a Special Order under the above-named Acts for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

1. To empower the Council upon the lands hereunder described to erect and maintain gas works with all necessary machinery and apparatus and thereon to make and store gas and work up and convert residual products (that is to say):—

First, a piece of land in the urban district of Sedgley containing 36 perches and 17 square yards or thereabouts formerly the site of Gas Street and lying between Musk Lane and Bird Street bounded on the south in part by the land on which the existing gas works of the Council are constructed and in part by lands belonging to or reputed to belong to James Wakelam and bounded on the north in part by the lands secondly hereunder described and in part by land belonging or reputed to belong to Samuel Horton.

Secondly, a piece of land in the urban district of Sedgley containing 2 roods 19 perches and 11 square yards or thereabouts bounded on the north by premises belonging or reputed to belong to Thomas Horton Samuel Horton Howard Horton Ernest Horton Joseph Abbiss Thomas Baker and Benjamin Southall known as numbers 29 to 35 Barr Street and 8 Bird Street bounded on the south by the land first above described bounded on the west by premises belonging or reputed to belong to Samuel Horton and bounded on the east by Bird Street.

2. To empower the Council to contract with any company, body or person producing or offering coke oven gas within the limits within which the Council are for the time being authorised to supply gas (hereinafter referred to as "the limits of supply") with reference to the purchase and taking by the Council of a supply of coke oven gas and also to empower the Council to supply such coke oven gas for any purpose subject to such limitations and restrictions as may be prescribed by the Order.

3. In relation to the supply by the Council of coke oven gas, to exempt them from the provisions of the Acts and Orders relating to their gas undertaking with respect to the calorific value, purity, pressure, testing or price of the gas supplied, and to empower the Council to break up streets within the limits of supply for the purpose of laying pipes in connection with the purchase and supply of coke oven gas.

4. To prescribe the conditions under which coke oven gas may be supplied by the Council for industrial purposes, lighting purposes and other purposes, including any conditions or regulations which may be prescribed by any Government Department.

5. To empower the Council to contract with any local authority, company, body or person

for the supply by the Council to them or for the supply to the Council by them of gas in bulk.

6.
