PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 27th day of June, 1931, (C.E. 1839/31), in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas under various Orders in Council, regulations have been laid down from time to time for the retirement, retired pay and disability retired pay of Officers of Your Majesty's Naval and Marine Force, and scales of pensions and allowances for their widows, children and other dependent relatives:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the rules relating to these matters require amendment in certain respects to cover Officers of

Your Majesty's Naval and Marine Force who are employed on certain Inspection, Research, Design and Experimental Ordnance duties:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the Regulations set forth in the annexed Schedule with effect from the 21st November, 1929.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

" SCHEDULE.

" Naval and Royal Marine Officers employed on certain Inspection, Research, Design and Experimental Ordnance duties.

" Conditions of Service.

" 1. *To whom applicable.*—The conditions laid down in this Schedule shall apply to Naval and Royal Marine Officers employed in such posts of the nature indicated above as the Admiralty, with the concurrence of the Treasury, may decide to include in the scheme from time to time. Posts included in the scheme shall be divided into Higher posts, Senior posts and Junior posts respectively. Naval and Royal Marine Officers, whether on the Active or Retired Lists, shall be regarded as eligible for employment under the scheme subject to such qualifications as the Admiralty

may lay down from time to time and, if on the Active List, they shall be regarded as supernumerary to the establishment of their respective ranks while subject to these conditions or when undergoing training prior to appointment.

"2. *Remuneration during employment.*—The standard rates of the salaries of the Officers included in the scheme shall be such as the Admiralty may lay down from time to time with the concurrence of the Treasury under the provisions of Order in Council of the 29th November, 1879, and shall be subject to review according to the cost of living at the same dates and in the same manner as the ordinary rates of full pay of Officers on the general Active List.

(ii) The retired pay of Retired Officers serving in any of these appointments shall be suspended during their service.

"3. *Remuneration during periods of temporary unemployment.*—Officers on the Active List serving in any of these appointments will be eligible for unemployed pay or half pay at the rates appropriate to their substantive rank and seniority and under the conditions applicable to Officers on the general Active List.

(ii) Officers on the Retired List will be eligible to receive unemployed pay at a rate equal to their retired pay plus the addition to retired pay, if any (Section 7) for which they would have been eligible, if on the date of ceasing salary their services had been finally terminated at their own request.

"4. *Counting of service for increase of retired pay.*—All time in respect of which salary is drawn shall count as full time for increase of retired pay. Time in respect of which unemployed pay or half pay is drawn shall, in the case of Officers on the Active List, count in the same manner as for Officers on the general Active List and in the case of Retired Officers be ignored.

"5. *Termination of employment.*—Employment shall be terminated compulsorily at the following ages:—

Higher posts	57
Senior posts	52
Junior posts	47

except in the case of Officers already holding confirmed appointments in such employment on the 21st November, 1929, where the Admiralty may decide to extend the age limit.

(ii) Officers may be unemployed for two consecutive years but will not be eligible for further employment subsequently.

(iii) The employment of an Officer may be terminated at any time if, in the opinion of the Admiralty, he has been guilty of misconduct or has unsatisfactorily performed his duties or is otherwise unsuitable or is physically unfit for further service.

(iv) Voluntary termination of employment may be allowed at the discretion of the Admiralty at or after the age of 45.

(v) The Admiralty reserve to themselves the right to terminate an officer's employment under this scheme if, having regard to the posts he has held and the necessity for providing opportunity for promotion of more Junior Officers, they are unable to offer him further suitable employment.

"6. *Retirement from the Active List and Retired Pay.*—Officers on the Active List serving in any of these appointments, if not previously retired at their own request or otherwise, shall be placed on the Retired List as soon as they become qualified for the maximum rate of retired pay laid down for their rank or upon reaching the age for compulsory retirement under the Regulations applicable to Officers on the general Active List, whichever is the earlier, but such retirement shall not necessitate termination of their employment.

(ii) Officers whose employment under this scheme (otherwise than on probation) is finally terminated for any cause while on the Active List shall be placed on the Retired List at once with the rate of retired pay for which they are eligible under the regulations applicable to Officers retired from the general Active List. Officers whose services are finally terminated under rule 5 of these regulations, either after two consecutive years of unemployment, or on account of unsatisfactory performance of their duties or on account of unsuitability, shall be granted the retired pay prescribed for retirement from the general Active List for non-service.

"7. *Addition to retired pay of Retired Officers whose employment is finally terminated after retirement from the Active List.*—Officers whose employment is finally terminated after their retirement from the Active List may be granted, in addition to the retired pay earned by their service prior to retirement, an increase in retired pay in respect of their subsequent service calculated, irrespective of the appointment held, under the following regulations:—

I. Except as provided in clause III below, Officers whose services are terminated

(a) otherwise than for misconduct after 10 or more years' service subsequent to their retirement, or

(b) after less than 10 years' service subsequent to their retirement either at their own request or for unsuitability or for unsatisfactory performance of their duties,

may be granted an addition to retired pay, the standard rate of which shall be calculated at the rate of one-sixtieth of the standard salary of the appointment held immediately prior to discharge for each complete year of their service after retirement, excluding any periods for which unemployed pay under Rule 3 above may have been issued.

II. Except as provided in clause III below, Officers whose services are terminated otherwise than for misconduct or any of the causes mentioned at Clause I (b) of this Rule and after less than 10 years' service subsequent to their retirement may be granted an addition to retired pay, the standard rate of which shall be calculated at the rate of one fiftieth of the standard salary of the appointment held immediately prior to discharge for each complete year of service after retirement, excluding any periods for which unemployed pay under Rule 3 above may have been issued, provided, however, that the standard rate of addition to retired pay shall in no case exceed one-sixth of the standard salary of the appointment held immediately prior to discharge.

III. An Officer who on or after the 1st April, 1919, has been retired from the Active List of the Royal Navy or Royal Marines with a special rate of retired pay higher than that permissible under the ordinary Regulations applicable to Officers on the general Active Lists at the date of retirement for an Officer of like age, rank and service, shall not, on the final termination of his employment receive retired pay and addition to retired pay in excess of the greater of the two following sums:—

(a) The retired pay for which he would have been eligible had he, on retirement from the Active List of the Royal Navy or Royal Marines, been awarded the rate of retired pay permissible under the ordinary regulations in force at the date of such retirement for an Officer of like age, rank and service and permitted to count the whole of his subsequent service for addition to retired pay under Clause I or Clause II hereof whichever be appropriate, and

(b) the actual rate of retired pay awarded to him on retirement from the Active List without any addition for subsequent service.

IV. Officers whose services are terminated on account of misconduct may be granted such rate of addition to retired pay, if any, as the Admiralty at their discretion may see fit to award, provided that it be lower than the rate for which they would have been eligible if their services had been terminated for unsuitability or unsatisfactory performance of their duties.

(ii) The standard rates of additional retired pay hereby authorised shall be regarded as comparable with the standard rates of retired pay established by Order in Council of the 22nd January, 1920, and subject to revision in the light of changes in the cost of living at the same dates and in the same manner as retired pay.

"8. *Rank on the Retired List.*—Officers who on retirement hold, or who may subsequently be appointed to, a Higher Post under these regulations may, at the discretion of the Admiralty, be granted the rank or equivalent rank of Captain, R.N., or the rank of Colonel, R.M., on the retired list, and, similarly, Officers who on retirement hold, or who may subsequently be appointed to, a Senior Post under these regulations may, at the discretion of the Admiralty, be granted the rank or equivalent rank of Commander, R.N., or the rank of Lieutenant-Colonel, R.M., on the retired list.

"9. *Additional retired pay on account of disablement attributable to the conditions of service.*—Officers, whether on the Active or on the Retired List, serving in any of the appointments to which these rules apply, shall be eligible at the discretion of the Admiralty for additional retired pay in respect of disability certified by the competent medical authority as attributable to the conditions of service at the rates and under the conditions applicable from time to time to Officers on the general Active List.

"10. *Pensions and other grants to widows and dependent relatives of deceased Officers.*—The widows and other dependent relatives of

deceased Officers, who have served in any of the appointments to which these rules apply, shall be eligible at the discretion of the Admiralty for the award of pensions or other grants under the regulations from time to time in force for Officers of the Navy and Royal Marines, except that—

(a) for the purpose of determining the eligibility of any applicant for a pension or other grant, service on the Retired List in an appointment to which these rules apply shall be regarded as equivalent to service on the Active List, and

(b) for the purpose of assessing the pension or other grant, the rank of Captain, R.N., or Colonel, R.M., on the Retired List conferred under Rule 8 of these regulations shall be regarded as the equivalent of the rank of Captain, R.N., on the Active List, and similarly the rank of Commander, R.N., or Lieutenant Colonel, R.M., on the Retired List shall be regarded as the equivalent of the rank of Commander, R.N., on the Active List."

"His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 21st day of July, 1931 (C. (2) 2807/31), in the words following, viz:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being, or having been, an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are, from time to time, directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas the Regulations for the government of Your Majesty's Naval Service provide for the award of the Naval Long Service and Good Conduct Medal with Gratuity, under certain conditions, to Petty Officers and men of Your Majesty's Naval Service and to Royal Marines:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 2nd November, 1922, to empower us to award, at our discretion, the Naval Long Service and Good Conduct Medal, without Gratuity, to those native ratings whose records of service and character conform to the

requirements of the Regulations governing the award of that Medal:

"And whereas the Regulations above mentioned preclude the grant of the Long Service and Good Conduct Medal to Non-Continuous Service Officers' Stewards and Cooks Third Class, unless they have served at least 5 years as Officers' Stewards and Cooks First or Second Class, or the two combined:

"And whereas we consider that this condition operates harshly in the case of Native Officers' Stewards and Cooks Third Class owing to limited opportunities of promotion and to the fact that other native ratings of correspondingly low status are eligible for awards of the Long Service and Good Conduct Medal:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize us to award, at our discretion, the Naval Long Service and Good Conduct Medal, without Gratuity, to Native Officers' Stewards and Cooks Third Class irrespective of the qualification of service in a higher rating, provided that they are otherwise eligible by length of service and character; this proposal to be applicable to native ratings serving in the Royal Navy on or after the 1st January, 1931.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS His Majesty by virtue of the authority conferred on Him by the Copyright Act, 1911 (1-2 G. 5. c. 46), was pleased to make an Order in Council dated the 24th June, 1912 (S.R. & O. 1912, No. 913) (hereafter called the Principal Order), extending the protection of such Act to certain classes of works:

And whereas by the Copyright Act, 1911 (Extension to the Tanganyika Territory), Order, 1924, dated the 16th day of April, 1924 (S.R. & O. 1924, No. 521), the Copyright Act, 1911, extends to Tanganyika Territory:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Principal Order dated the 24th June, 1912 (S.R. & O. 1912, No. 913), should apply to Tanganyika Territory:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Copyright Act, 1911, or otherwise in His

Majesty vested, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Principal Order as amended by any subsequent Order in Council shall apply to Tanganyika Territory as if it were included amongst the territories named in Article 5 (b) of the Principal Order subject to the following modifications:—

(a) In the application of the provisions of Article 3 of the Principal Order the date of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the Act and for the commencement of the Principal Order, and Tanganyika Territory for the parts of His Majesty's Dominions to which the Principal Order applies.

(b) In the application to works enjoying rights under Article 3 of the Principal Order as amended by this Order of Sections 1 (2) (d) and 19 of the Copyright Act, 1911, the date of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the Act and for the passing of the Act in Sections 19 (7) and 19 (8) wherever those expressions occur.

(c) In the application to existing works of the provisions of Section 24 of the Copyright Act, 1911, the date of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the Act wherever that expression occurs in Sub-Section 1 (a) and for the 26th July, 1910, in Sub-Section 1 (b).

2. This Order may be cited as the Copyright (Tanganyika Territory) Order, 1931.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 25th day of June, 1931, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation

to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Stockerston, in the County of Leicester, and in the Diocese of Leicester:

"Whereas by an Indenture made the 31st day of December, 1925, between William Jesse Freer, of 'The Stony Gate,' in the City of Leicester, Esquire, of the first part, the Venerable William Philip Hurrell, of 'Brookfield,' in the said City of Leicester, of the second part, and the Venerable Frederick Brodie Macnutt, Archdeacon of Leicester, of the third part, the said William Jesse Freer did thereby convey to the said Frederick Brodie Macnutt, Archdeacon of Leicester, one moiety of the said Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Stockerston; to hold the same unto and to the use of the said Frederick Brodie Macnutt, Archdeacon of Leicester, and his successors in fee simple:

"And whereas the said Conveyance was made with the intention of vesting the said moiety of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage or presentation in the said Frederick Brodie Macnutt, Archdeacon of Leicester, and his successors in the same Archdeaconry, and the parties thereto are desirous that anything which by way of further assurance or otherwise may be required effectually to carry out that intention may be done and have applied to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that a Scheme under the Acts hereinbefore mentioned may be prepared for the said purpose and submitted to Your Majesty in Council:

"And whereas the said William Jesse Freer, William Philip Hurrell and Frederick Brodie Macnutt, are consenting to this Scheme:

"And whereas the other moiety of the advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Stockerston is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in William Brown Frearson, of Number 8, Friar Lane, in the said City of Leicester, Solicitor, and he is desirous that the said moiety of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage or presentation so vested in him, the said William Brown Frearson, should be transferred to and be vested in the said Frederick Brodie Macnutt, Archdeacon of Leicester, and his successors in the same Archdeaconry:

"And whereas the said Frederick Brodie Macnutt, Archdeacon of Leicester, is willing to accept such transfer and in token of such his willingness has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Cyril Charles Bowman, Bishop of Leicester, has to the said transfer given that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary, and in token of the same consent has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Stockerston which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Stockerton:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said William Jesse Freer, William Philip Hurrell, Frederick Brodie Macnutt, and William Brown Frearson (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Cyril Charles Bowman, Bishop of Leicester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Stockerston shall be transferred to the said Frederick Brodie Macnutt, Archdeacon of Leicester, and his successors in the same Archdeaconry, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Frederick Brodie Macnutt, Archdeacon of Leicester, and by his successors in the same Archdeaconry for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Leicester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 13th day of March, 1930, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the unions (1) of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Lincoln, Saint Martin, and a portion of the Benefice (being an United Benefice) of

Lincoln, Saint Peter at Arches with Saint Benedict, and (2) of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Lincoln, Saint Mary below Hill, and the remaining portion of the said Benefice of Lincoln, Saint Peter at Arches with Saint Benedict, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Lincoln and in the Diocese of Lincoln:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the unions (1) of the said Benefice of Lincoln, Saint Martin, with a portion of the said Benefice of Lincoln, Saint Peter at Arches with Saint Benedict and (2) of the said Benefice of Lincoln, Saint Mary below Hill, with the remaining portion of the said Benefice of Lincoln, Saint Peter at Arches with Saint Benedict duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Lincoln and therein recommended the said unions and the terms for effecting the same, and the said Bishop of Lincoln signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefices of Lincoln, Saint Martin and Lincoln, Saint Mary below Hill, are now full, the Reverend Canon Edmund Akenhead being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Lincoln, Saint Martin and the Reverend Canon Walter Easton Boulter being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Lincoln, Saint Mary below Hill and the said Benefice of Lincoln, Saint Peter at Arches with Saint Benedict is at present vacant:

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said three Benefices of Lincoln, Saint Martin; Lincoln, Saint Peter at Arches with Saint Benedict and Lincoln, Saint Mary below Hill, now belongs to one and the same Patron:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Lincoln, Saint Martin and so much of the said Benefice of Lincoln, Saint Peter at Arches with Saint Benedict (containing the Church of Saint Peter at Arches) as lies to the north of the middle of the River Witham shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls and one parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided under the style of 'The United Benefice of Lincoln, Saint Martin with Saint Peter at Arches.'

"2. That the said Benefice of Lincoln, Saint Mary below Hill and the remaining part of the said Benefice of Lincoln, Saint Peter at Arches with Saint Benedict shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls and one parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided under the style

of 'The United Benefice of Lincoln, Saint Mary below Hill with Saint Benedict.'

"3. That the Church of the Parish of Lincoln, Saint Martin, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish of Lincoln Saint Martin with Saint Peter at Arches and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Lincoln, Saint Martin, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the same United Parish.

"4. That the Church of the Parish of Lincoln, Saint Mary below Hill shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish of Lincoln, Saint Mary below Hill with Saint Benedict and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Lincoln, Saint Mary below Hill shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the same United Parish.

"5. That upon the unions taking effect the register books of baptisms marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Lincoln, Saint Peter at Arches, shall be transferred to the Church of Lincoln, Saint Martin, but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Lincoln, Saint Peter at Arches, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Lincoln, Saint Martin with Saint Peter at Arches to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"6. That upon the unions taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Lincoln, Saint Benedict if not already removed shall be transferred to the Church of Lincoln, Saint Mary below Hill, but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Lincoln, Saint Benedict, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Lincoln, Saint Mary below Hill with Saint Benedict, to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"7. Saint Peter at Arches with Saint Benedict shall be appropriated as follows, that is to say (a) there shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Lincoln, Saint Mary below Hill with Saint Benedict the capital sum of £1,512 19s. 1d. at present held by the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty on behalf of the said Benefice of Lincoln, Saint Peter at Arches with Saint Benedict and also a sum of £3,487 4s. 5d. Local Loans three pounds per centum per annum Stock being part of a larger sum of such Stock now held by the said Governors on behalf of the same Benefice, (b) there shall be transferred and annexed to the proposed new District referred to in Clause 9 (b) of this Scheme as an endowment therefor a portion namely £60 per annum of the yearly sum or stipend of £95 per annum at present payable by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Lincoln, Saint Peter at Arches with Saint Benedict, and during the period between the date of the taking effect of the said unions and the date of the licence or institution of the first Minister or Incumbent of the said proposed new District the said sum of £60 per annum shall be accumulated in our hands as an addition to the endowment of such proposed new District, and (c) there shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Lincoln, Saint Martin with Saint Peter at Arches all the endowments of the said Benefice of Lincoln, Saint Peter at Arches with Saint Benedict, remaining after the appropriations herein recommended and proposed to the United Benefice of Lincoln, Saint Mary below Hill with Saint Benedict and to the said proposed new District.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Fleet Marston, the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Waddesdon, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Over Winchendon, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Buckingham and in the Diocese of Oxford:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Thomas Banks, Bishop of Oxford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said three Benefices of Fleet Marston, Waddesdon and Over Winchendon, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Oxford, and therein recommend the union of the said three Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Oxford signified in writing his approval of the said Report;

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said three Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas all of the said three Benefices are now full, the Reverend Herbert John Sanders being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Fleet Marston and the Reverend George Dixon being the present Incumbent of the said Benefices of Waddesdon and Over Winchendon, which he holds together in plurality under the authority of a Dispensation:

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said two Benefices of Waddesdon and Over Winchendon now belongs to one and the same Patron:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Thomas Banks, Bishop of Oxford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said George Dixon (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Fleet Marston, the said Benefice of Waddesdon and the said Benefice of Over Winchendon shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Waddesdon with Over Winchendon and Fleet Marston' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if at the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the said Benefice of Fleet Marston shall be vacant the union shall forthwith take effect, and the said George Dixon, if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefices of Waddesdon and Over Winchendon, shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if at that date the said Benefice of Fleet Marston shall not be vacant, then the union shall take effect upon the first avoidance after that date of the said

Benefice of Fleet Marston, and pending such avoidance:—

"(a) the said Benefice of Waddesdon and the said Benefice of Over Winchendon shall forthwith be united together and form one Benefice with cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Waddesdon with Over Winchendon' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects;

"(b) the said George Dixon, if he is then Incumbent of both of the said Benefices of Waddesdon and Over Winchendon shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Waddesdon with Over Winchendon, and his admission thereto shall be without any form or fee of or for presentation or nomination and he shall not be required to pay any fees in respect of his collation, institution, licence, or induction to such United Benefice beyond such fees as he would have been liable to pay if his admission to the same United Benefice had been an admission solely to that one of the said two Benefices of Waddesdon and Over Winchendon for the holding of which in plurality with the other a Dispensation was heretofore granted to him, and for the purpose of the 5th Section of the Incumbents' Resignation Act, 1871, and of Schedule A thereto, his tenure of the said Benefices of Waddesdon and Over Winchendon shall be deemed to continue notwithstanding his admission to the United Benefice;

"(c) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Waddesdon shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Waddesdon with Over Winchendon.

"3. That upon the union referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Waddesdon shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Waddesdon with Over Winchendon and Fleet Marston.

"4. That upon the union referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme taking effect two Curates shall be appointed to assist the Incumbent in performing the duties of the United Benefice and at no time shall less than two Curates be so employed unless with the written permission of the Bishop of the Diocese, and a portion of the endowments of the United Benefice, namely the whole of the endowments of the said Benefice of Waddesdon shall be charged with such annual sum as the Bishop may from time to time determine, not less than £300 and not exceeding £400 as a fund to meet the expenses of providing for the services of such Curates as aforesaid which said fund shall be held and administered by the Incumbent of the United Benefice but shall be applicable only to the purposes aforesaid, provided that it shall be lawful for the Bishop of the Diocese if he thinks proper at any time and from time to time to direct that the said charge shall be paid by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as trustees to apply the same for the purpose of paying the stipends of such Curates as aforesaid.

"5. That after the union referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme has taken effect the

course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of five successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union, the Patron of the said Benefices of Waddesdon and Over Winchendon shall have the first, the second, the fourth and the fifth turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of Fleet Marston shall have the third turn.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, after giving full consideration to such objections, have deemed right to make certain alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Oxford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme, and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Oxford.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF MALE TELEGRAPHIST IN LONDON IN THE DEPARTMENT OF THE POSTMASTER-GENERAL.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 15 and 18. If an Examination begins in one of the first six months of any year, candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st day of April in that year. If an Examination begins in one of the last six months of any year, candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of October in that year. A candidate who attained the age of 15 on the governing date would be admitted to the examination, but a candidate who attained the age of 18 on that date would not be admitted.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalisation or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

4. At each Examination the number of candidates to be selected will be such as the Postmaster-General may from time to time fix.

5. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz. :—

1. English.
2. History.
3. Geography.
4. Arithmetic.

Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners in Handwriting and in the Examination as a whole.

6. The Examination is open only to candidates actually resident in the London district; and no candidate will be eligible for appointment unless he can satisfy the Postmaster-General that he possesses the required local residential qualification. It will be within the authority of the Postmaster-General to decline to employ a candidate successful in the Examination if he is not satisfied on enquiry that the candidate complies with this requirement.

7. Candidates must be at least 5 feet in height, and no officer will be retained in the Service who does not attain the height of 5 feet 4 inches before completing his nineteenth year.

8. (i) Persons actually serving in the Army, Navy, or Air Force are ineligible to compete. (ii) Persons holding situations in the Civil Service, Probationary Engineer Cadets in the Navy, and Apprentices in His Majesty's Dockyards must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination, before the commencement of the competition.

9. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

10. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

11. A fee of 10s. will be required from every candidate attending an Examination.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalisation or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

4. At each Examination the number of candidates to be selected will be such as the Postmaster-General may from time to time fix.

5. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz. :—

1. English.
2. History.
3. Geography.
4. Arithmetic.

Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners in Handwriting and in the Examination as a whole.

6. The Examination is open only to local candidates. A local candidate is regarded as one whose family home is situated where she can travel to and from the office conveniently and without detriment to her health or the interests of the Department. It will be within the authority of the Postmaster-General to decline to employ a candidate successful in the Examination if he is not satisfied on enquiry that the candidate complies with this requirement.

7. Candidates must be at least 5 feet in height.

8. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the competition.

9. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

10. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

11. A fee of 10s. will be required from every Candidate attending an Examination.

(a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

“ Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied, in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.”

3. Omnibus Company, Limited or Thomas Tilling, Limited, who is maintaining at the date hereof a regular service in accordance with Section 6 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, on weekdays, upon any approved route, from using, for the purpose of plying for hire along a restricted street or part thereof in the maintenance of a regular service on the approved route, on Saturday and Tuesday, the 1st and 4th days of August, 1931, in addition to the number of omnibuses which he may operate in that street or part thereof under the said Regulations a number equal to 10 per cent. of the total number of omnibuses (excluding spare vehicles) scheduled by him at the date hereof for operation upon approved routes, pro-

vided that where such person ordinarily operates less than 10 omnibuses he shall be allowed so to operate one additional omnibus;

provided that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to affect or derogate from the powers

of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis under the provisions of Section 52 of the Metropolitan Police Act, 1839, to give directions to constables for keeping order and for preventing any obstruction of the thoroughfares.

THE SKEGNESS URBAN DISTRICT GAS ACT, 1915.

THE SKEGNESS GAS ORDER, 1925.

SPECIFICATION AS TO PIPES AND FITTINGS.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Urban District Council of Skegness under the provisions of Section 4 of the Skegness Gas Order, 1925, did at their Monthly Meeting held on the 24th day of March, 1931 (subject to the approval of the Board of Trade) make and adopt the following specification or specifications with regard to the minimum size and the material of the pipes with the fittings

thereof which are to be laid by the owner or occupier of any premises within the limits of The Skegness Urban District Gas Act, 1915, namely:—

SPECIFICATION.

With regard to the minimum size and the material of the pipes and fittings to be laid to and on premises either in the first instance or on the occasion of any renewal.

Service Pipes.

1. The sizes of service pipes between the Council's main and the meter to be as follows:—

For dwelling houses of 7 or under 7 rooms	... 1" (nominal size) iron barrel.
For dwelling houses of 8 to 10 rooms	... 1½" (nominal size) iron barrel.
For dwelling houses of 11 or more rooms	... Of such size as may be agreed between the owner or occupier and the Council with a minimum size of 1½".
Premises other than dwelling houses	... Of such size as may be agreed between the owner or occupier and the Council having regard to the probable maximum consumption of gas upon such premises at any one time.

If any such service pipe exceeds 60 feet in length the next higher standard gas size to be used.

2. All such service pipes and fittings to be of Wrought Iron Tube, steam quality, the thickness of the 1" tube to be No. 8 Standard Wire Gauge, of the 1½" tube to be No. 7 Standard Wire Gauge, of the 1½" and 2" to be No. 6 Standard Wire Gauge, and of the 3" to be No. 5 Standard Wire Gauge.

3. All bends to be of not less than the following radii:—

Internal diameter.	Radii.
1"	3½"
1½"	4½"
1½"	5"
2"	6½"

Elbow fittings must not be used.

4. All sockets must be reversed and joint threads treated with red and white lead or

graphite. Oxide must not be used for this purpose.

5. All tubes and fittings must be examined as and when they are laid to see that they are free from obstructions and defects, and only clear and sound tubes and fittings may be used.

6. The support of all service pipes must be adequate and such as to obviate any danger of the pipe sagging. Water or drain trenches must not be utilised for gas services unless a step is cut on one side for their support by solid ground.

7. Syphon boxes must be of a size adequate to the diameter and length of the service pipe which is to drain into them, and shall have attached to them a 1" diameter suction pipe carried to ground level and covered with a service case of form approved by the Council. They must be fixed upon the service pipe line in an outdoor position and the service pipe given a minimum fall of 1" in 10 feet towards them, unless the service pipe can be given a minimum fall of 1" to 10 feet throughout its length towards the Council's main.

8. Every meter to be used in a new building or a building not previously supplied with gas, or in connection with a new or substituted pipe laid between the main and the meter shall be placed as near as practicable to the Council's main but within the outside wall of the building.

(a) Provided that in the case of any building in connection with which there is provided outside the building accommodation reasonably approved by the Council for the meter or a separate meter house, such meter may be placed in such position or meter house instead of within the outside wall of the building.

(b) Positions for meters must be approved by a duly authorised official of the Council.

(c) They must be cool and dry, not adjacent to any fireplace, at least 18" distant from any electrical service or appliance, easily accessible for meter reading, and such as to afford adequate protection to the meter from accidental damage.

Interior Pipes.

9. The sizes (measured internally) of supply pipes within dwelling houses from the meter to consumer's fittings shall be as follows:—

For Dwelling Houses of 7 or under 7 Rooms:—

	Minimum Size.
A. Rising pipe from meter to first floor	$\frac{3}{4}$ "
B. From pipe "A" or "C" to each gas fire if length of pipe from this connection does not exceed 30 feet	$\frac{1}{2}$ "

D. From pipe "C" to cooker	$\frac{1}{2}$ "

F. For apparatus having a maximum consumption not exceeding 25 cubic feet of gas per hour, if connection taken from pipes "A", "B", "C" or "D", and the length of pipe from this connection to apparatus does not exceed 20 feet	$\frac{3}{4}$ "

G. For apparatus having a maximum consumption exceeding 25 cubic feet but not exceeding 50 cubic feet per hour ... $\frac{1}{2}$ "

For apparatus having a maximum consumption exceeding 50 cubic feet but not exceeding 120 cubic feet per hour ... $\frac{3}{4}$ "

For apparatus having a maximum consumption exceeding 120 cubic feet but not exceeding 240 cubic feet per hour ... 1"

For apparatus having a maximum consumption exceeding 240 cubic feet of gas per hour, of such size as may be agreed between the owner or occupier and the Council.

If any such supply pipes exceeds 30 feet in length the next higher standard gas size to be used.

For dwelling houses of 8 to 10 rooms, as above, except that pipes "A" and "C" shall be 1".

For dwelling houses of over 10 rooms, as above, except that pipes "A" and "C" shall be of such size as may be agreed between the owner or occupier and the Council.

For premises other than dwelling houses as "G".

All lead and compo piping used to be of not less than the following weights:—

and to be adequately supported. When holdfasts are necessary lead clips or malleable holdfasts to be used. Lead or compo piping must not be laid in close proximity to any furnace or heat producing apparatus, and must not be embedded in concrete.

All cocks to be of good quality with accurately ground-in plugs fitting with niting washers and to be of patterns approved by the Council.

All copper or brass tubing to be solid drawn and of not less thickness than 16 Standard Wire Gauge.

All tubes and fittings must be examined as and when they are laid to see that they are free from obstructions and defects and only clear and sound tubes and fittings may be used.

All pipes shall be laid with a fall towards the meter wherever possible, and a suitable fitting provided from which condensed water may be run off.

All pipes shall be laid at least 12 inches distant from any electrical service or appliance, and where this is not possible, the Council shall be specially notified and their approval of the proposed piping obtained.

All material used shall be of good quality and laid in a workmanlike manner and the

* In cases in dwelling houses where a piece of apparatus may require a supply pipe larger than the minimum size meter outlet pipe ordinarily specified, the outlet pipe from the meter to the point from which the supply pipe is taken off shall be increased to a size which shall be at least equal to the size of the aforesaid supply pipe.

whole shall be capable when laid, and having had the pipe ends carefully capped or plugged, of maintaining a suitably applied pressure of air and gas which will balance a column of water six inches in height in a U Gauge to be attached to the supply pipes and maintain such a column without further admission of air or gas for a period of 15 minutes.

Upon request by the Council such test shall be carried out in the presence of one of their authorized officials.

10. When any such pipe or fittings as aforesaid is or are about to be laid or placed, notice thereof shall be given to the Council accompanied by a description of the size and materials of the proposed pipe or fittings and of the purposes for which the gas to be supplied through the same is intended to be used.

11. The Council shall as soon as practicable after receiving such notice (after making such inspection of any of the said pipe or fittings and of the premises in which the same is or are proposed to be laid or placed as they may deem necessary) intimate in writing to the person giving the notice their approval or disapproval of the pipe or fittings as complying or not complying with the appropriate specification.

12. No such pipe or fittings as aforesaid shall be laid or placed unless or until the same shall have been approved as aforesaid and when any such pipe or fittings has or have been laid or placed notice thereof shall be given to the Council and the pipe or fittings shall not be covered over until after the expiration of twenty-four hours from the service of such notice on the Council or until the pipe or fittings as laid or placed has or have been inspected and approved by the Council which ever shall first happen.

13. Any officer of the Council duly appointed may between nine o'clock in the morning and five o'clock in the afternoon attend for the purpose of any such inspection as aforesaid and if the officer is not permitted to make the inspection or if the pipe or fittings are not according to the appropriate specification of the Council the Council may refuse to supply gas to the premises until the provisions of this section have been complied with.

Notice is hereby further given that any person desiring to bring before the Board of Trade any objection to the draft specification may do so by letter addressed to The Director of Gas Administration, Board of Trade, Great George Street, London, S.W. 1, and despatched on or before the 31st day of August, 1931.

Any such objection shall state:—

- (a) the specific grounds of objection; and
- (b) the omissions, additions or modifications asked for.

A copy of the objection shall be forwarded to the Council or their Agents at the same time as it is sent to the Board of Trade.
