WHEREAS by section 4 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (57-8 V. c. 60) (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act) it is (amongst other things) enacted that His Majesty may by Order in Council declare, with respect to any British possession named in the Order, not being the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man, the description of persons who are to be registrars of British ships in that possession:

And whereas by section 738 of the principal Act, it is (amongst other things) provided that where His Majesty has power under that Act to make an Order in Council His Majesty may from time to time by Order in Council revoke any Order so made:

And whereas there is in force an Order in Council namely the Merchant Shipping (Registrars of British ships in British India) Order, 1926, whereby the description of persons who are to be registrars of British ships in British India was declared, and it is expedient that the said Order be revoked:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Him by the principal Act, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare as follows, that is to say:—

1. At any port of registry in British India, the Principal Officer, Mercantile Marine Department, or where there is no such officer, the Port Officer, shall be the registrar of British ships.

2. The Merchant Shipping (Registrars of British Ships in British India) Order, 1926, is hereby revoked.

3. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Registrars of British ships in India) Order, 1931.

WHEREAS by the Palestinian Citizenship Order, 1925 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Order), provision was made for the regulation of the grant and acquisition of Palestinian citizenship:

And whereas it is expedient to amend the Principal Order as hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) Turkish subjects who were habitually resident in the territory of Palestine upon the sixth day of August, 1924, but ceased to be so habitually resident before the first day of August, 1925, shall be deemed to have become Palestinian citizens, unless before the date of this Order they shall have voluntarily acquired another nationality.

(2) Nevertheless, the High Commissioner shall have power in the case of any person who becomes a Palestinian citizen by virtue of the preceding paragraph and shall make an application to this effect within four years of the date of this Order, to apply to any such person the provisions of paragraphs 2 and 3 of Article 1 of the Palestinian Citizenship Order, 1925, and to extend the period of option provided for therein.

2.—(1) Article 10 (1) of the Principal Order is hereby repealed and the following is substituted therefor:

“Where it appears to the High Commissioner that a certificate of naturalization granted by him has been obtained by false representation or fraud or by concealment of material circumstances, or that the person to whom the certificate is granted has, since the grant, been for a period of not less than three years ordinarily resident out of Palestine and has not maintained substantial connection with Palestine, or has shown himself by act or speech to be disaffected, or disloyal to the Government of Palestine, the High Commissioner may, subject to the approval of one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by order revoke the certificate, and the order of revocation shall have effect from such date as the High Commissioner may direct.”

(2) Article 10 (2) of the Principal Order is hereby repealed, and the following is substituted therefor:—“The High Commissioner may, for the like reasons, and subject to the like approval, annul a Certificate of Citizenship granted under the provisions of Articles 4 and 5 hereof, or a declaration of the acquisition or resumption of citizenship made under the provisions of Articles 12 (1) and 14 (2) of this Order.”

3. Article 11 (1) (b) of the Principal Order is hereby repealed, and the following is substituted therefor:—“The High Commissioner

shall not make any such Order as aforesaid in the case of a wife who was at birth, or who became, in virtue of Articles 1 and 6 of this Order, a Palestinian citizen, unless he is satisfied that if she had held a certificate of naturalization in her own right, the certificate could properly have been revoked under this Order.”

4. His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, in Council, may at any time revoke, alter, or amend this Order.

5. This Order shall be published and proclaimed in Palestine, and the date of such publication shall be deemed to be the date of the commencement of this Order.

6. This Order shall be known as the Palestinian Citizenship (Amendment) Order, 1931, and shall be read and construed as one with the Principal Order.

WHEREAS by Section three of the Colonial Development Act, 1929, it is amongst other things provided that His Majesty may, if a representation is made to Him by the Treasury and the Secretary of State that it is desirable so to do, make an Order in Council directing that the Colonial Stock Acts, 1877 to 1900, shall be extended, subject to such modifications and to such conditions as may appear expedient to His Majesty, so as to apply to stock issued after the passing of that Act and forming part of the public debt of any territory specified in the Order which is under His Majesty's protection:

And whereas a representation has been made to His Majesty by the Treasury and the Secretary of State that it is desirable that an Order should be made directing that the Colonial Stock Acts, 1877 to 1900, shall, subject to the modifications for which provision is made by this Order, be extended so as to apply to stock issued after the passing of the said Act and forming part of the public debt of the Uganda Protectorate as if that Protectorate were a colony:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers vested in Him by the said Section three of the Colonial Development Act, 1929, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Colonial Stock Acts, 1877 to 1900, shall, subject to the modifications set out in the next succeeding paragraph of this Order, be extended so as to apply to stock issued after the passing of the Colonial Development Act, 1929, and forming part of the public debt of the Uganda Protectorate, as if that Protectorate were a colony.

2. For the purposes of Section two of the Colonial Stock Act, 1900, the following conditions shall have effect in relation to stock

to which the Colonial Stock Acts, 1877 to 1900, apply by virtue of this Order as if they had been prescribed by the Treasury under that Section:—

(a) Provision must be made by legislation of the Protectorate for the payment out of the revenues of the Protectorate of any sums which may become payable to stockholders under any judgment, decree, rule or order of a Court in the United Kingdom;

(b) The Government of the Protectorate must satisfy the Treasury that adequate funds, as and when required, will be made available in the United Kingdom to meet any such judgment, decree, rule or order;

(c) The Government of the Protectorate must place on record a formal expression of their opinion that any legislation of the Protectorate which appears to the Imperial Government to alter any of the provisions affecting the stock to the injury of the stockholders or to involve a departure from the original contract in regard to the stock, would properly be disallowed, and that no legislation, whereby the control of the Secretary of State over the finances of the Protectorate is impaired, ought to be passed unless and until the Treasury are satisfied that satisfactory arrangements have been made for safeguarding the interests of the stockholders.

3. This Order may be cited as the Colonial Stock Acts Extension (Uganda) Order, 1931.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 26th day of February, 1931, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the unions (1) of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Saxelbye with Shoby with a portion of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Grimston with Wartnaby and (2) of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Ab Kettleby with Holwell with the remaining portion of the said Benefice of Grimston with Wartnaby, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Leicester and in the Diocese of Leicester:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Cyril, Bishop of Leicester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the unions (1) of the said Benefice of Saxelbye with Shoby with a portion of the said Benefice of Grimston with Wartnaby and (2) of the said Benefice of Ab Kettleby with Holwell with the remaining portion of the said Benefice of Grimston with Wartnaby duly made their Report to the said

Bishop of Leicester and therein recommended such unions, and the terms for effecting the same, and the said Bishop of Leicester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas all of the said Benefices of Saxelbye with Shoby, Grimston with Wartnaby and Ab Kettleby with Holwell are now full, the Reverend Edward Richard Jefferys Nicolls being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saxelbye with Shoby the Reverend Elgar Hicks being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Grimston with Wartnaby, and the Reverend Thomas Hatfield Birks being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ab Kettleby with Holwell:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Cyril, Bishop of Leicester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Saxelbye with Shoby and a portion of the said Benefice of Grimston with Wartnaby, namely all that portion of the Parish of the said Benefice of Grimston with Wartnaby which is comprised within the area of the Civil Parish of Grimston shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls, under the style of ‘The United Benefice of Saxelbye with Grimston and Shoby,’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That the said Benefice of Ab Kettleby with Holwell and the remaining portion of the said Benefice of Grimston with Wartnaby shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls, and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes, under the style of ‘The United Benefice of Ab Kettleby with Wartnaby and Holwell.’

“ 3. That the Church of the Parish of Ab Kettleby with Holwell shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish of Ab Kettleby with Wartnaby and Holwell.

“ 4. That with the consent of the said Thomas Hatfield Birks (testified by his signing this Scheme) if upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme both of the said two Benefices of Saxelbye with Shoby and Grimston with Wartnaby shall be vacant then the unions shall forthwith take effect, but if upon that day one only of the said two Benefices of Saxelbye with Shoby and Grimston with Wartnaby shall be vacant then the unions shall take effect immediately upon the first vacation thereafter of the other of the said two Benefices of Saxelbye with Shoby and Grimston with Wartnaby, and if upon that day neither of the said two Benefices of Saxelbye with Shoby and Grimston with Wartnaby shall be vacant then the unions shall take effect immediately upon the first vacation of that one of the said two Benefices of Saxelbye with Shoby and Grimston with Wartnaby which shall the later be vacated after that day, and in any case the said Thomas Hatfield Birks if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ab Kettleby with Holwell shall become the first Incumbent of

the United Benefice of Ab Kettleby with Wartnaby and Holwell.

"5. That upon the unions referred to in Clauses 1 and 2 of this Scheme taking effect (a) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Saxelbye with Shoby shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Saxelbye with Grimston and Shoby (b) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Ab Kettleby with Holwell shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Ab Kettleby with Wartnaby and Holwell and (c) so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Grimston with Wartnaby and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient, and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us for the benefit of the United Benefice of Ab Kettleby with Wartnaby and Holwell.

"6. That upon the unions referred to in Clauses 1 and 2 of this Scheme taking effect the endowments of the said Benefice of Grimston with Wartnaby shall be divided as follows, that is to say, there shall be transferred to the United Benefice of Saxelbye with Grimston and Shoby a portion namely a sum of £180 per annum of the conditional grant of £220 per annum at present payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Grimston with Wartnaby and there shall be transferred to the United Benefice of Ab Kettleby with Holwell and Wartnaby all the other or remaining endowments of the said Benefice of Grimston with Wartnaby including the remaining part, namely a sum of £40 per annum of the said conditional grant.

"7. That upon the unions referred to in Clauses 1 and 2 of this Scheme taking effect provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Ab Kettleby with Wartnaby and Holwell for obtaining the services of a Curate or occasional clerical assistance and a portion of the endowments of such United Benefice namely that part of the endowments of the said Benefice of Grimston with Wartnaby which are assigned to the United Benefice of Ab Kettleby with Wartnaby and Holwell under the provisions of Clause 6 of this Scheme, shall be charged with a sum of £50 per annum as a fund to meet the expenses of providing for the services of a Curate or for occasional clerical assistance as aforesaid, which said fund of £50 per annum shall be held and administered by the Incumbent of the same United Benefice, but shall be applicable only to the purposes aforesaid, provided that it shall be lawful for the Bishop of the Diocese if he thinks proper at any time and from time to time to direct that the said charge of £50 per annum shall be paid by the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Ab Kettleby with Wartnaby and Holwell to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as trustees to apply the same for the purpose of paying the stipend of a Curate or the expense of occasional clerical assistance as aforesaid.

"8. That after the unions referred to in Clauses 1 and 2 of this Scheme have taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the respective United Benefices from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, (a) that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice of Saxelbye with Grimston and Shoby after the unions the Patron of the said Benefice of Saxelbye with Shoby shall have the first and the third turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of Grimston with Wartnaby shall have the second turn and (b) that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice of Ab Kettleby with Wartnaby and Holwell after the unions the Patron of the said Benefice of Grimston with Wartnaby shall have the first turn and the Patron of the said Benefice of Ab Kettleby with Holwell shall have the second and the third turns.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Leicester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been proceeded with to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be

effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Leicester.

CENTRAL CHANCERY OF THE ORDERS OF KNIGHTHOOD.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the Award of the Medal of the Military Division of the Most Excellent Order

of the British Empire to the undermentioned:—

For Gallantry.

No. 4394271 Lance-Sergeant Thomas Edward Alder, 2nd Battalion, The Green Howards.

On the 14th November, 1930, Lance-Sergeant Alder, of the 2nd Battalion, The Green Howards, in charge of a party of three other ranks of that Regiment, and employed on anti-piracy duties on board the S.S. "Siangtan," on the Yangtse Kiang River, arrived at Hankow, and immediately embarked on the S.S. "Wuhu."

On the 15th and 16th November, whilst proceeding up river, their ship was fired upon by Communists with guns and rifles on no less than four occasions. The fire was returned and a number of casualties was observed.

At 4.30 p.m. on the 16th, Lance-Sergeant Alder and his party left the S.S. "Wuhu" in order to proceed to the assistance of the S.S. "Kiatung" (which had run ashore and was being attacked by Communists in sampans). They proceeded 2½ miles up river in an open sampan under rifle fire the whole time from both banks. Having arrived at the S.S. "Kiatung," they boarded this vessel and disposed themselves for its defence. During the whole time that they were on the S.S. "Kiatung" until the S.S. "Kian" arrived to their assistance at 12.30 p.m. on the 17th November, Lance-Sergeant Alder and his men were exposed to rifle and gun fire from both sides of the river: at that time they had only 43 rounds of small arm ammunition left between them.

Eventually the S.S. "Kiatung" was towed off the sandbank, and the party of Green Howards returned in her to Ichang, arriving there on the 19th November; during the return down river the S.S. "Kiatung" was again fired upon on several occasions.

The Chancellor of the Exchequer informs the Board that the Governor and Company of the Bank of England have represented to him this day that it is in their opinion expedient to increase the amount of the fiduciary note issue from 260 million pounds to 275 million pounds. He proposes accordingly to authorise the Bank to issue fiduciary bank notes to the increased total amount of 275 million pounds for a period of three weeks.

My Lords approve and direct that the Bank of England be notified accordingly.

Let a copy of this Minute be laid before both Houses of Parliament under section 8 subsection (3) of the Currency and Bank Notes Act, 1928.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF PROBATIONARY INSPECTOR (MALE) IN THE ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT OF THE POST OFFICE.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. AGE.—The limits of age for this situation are 17 and 23. Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st March or the 1st September of the year in which they are examined, according as the examination is held in the first or second half of the year.

In reckoning age for this purpose candidates who have served, or are serving, in the Army, Navy or Air Force, may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

2. NATIONALITY.—Every candidate must be a natural born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made :—

(a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.

(c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had

acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. HEALTH AND CHARACTER.—Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

4. No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for admission to the examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service and Apprentices in H.M. Dockyards must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the competition.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

5. SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.—The examination will be in the following subjects :—

1. Pure Mathematics.
2. Applied Mathematics.
3. Electricity and Heat.
4. Engineering Drawing and Design.
5. One of the following three subjects :—

- (a) Sound and Optics.
- (b) Telegraphy and Telephony.
- (c) Chemistry.

6. Personal Qualities.

The candidate must attain in each subject he offers such a standard as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners.

The examination may be held in one part or in two parts, at the discretion of the Civil Service Commissioners. In the latter case the first part of the examination will be used to reduce the number of competitors to be admitted to the second part. Of those who pass and obtain the highest aggregate marks on the first part a certain number, to be determined by the Civil Service Commissioners, will be admitted to the second part of the examination. The successful list will consist of those candidates who pass and obtain the highest aggregate marks on the whole examination.

6. APPLICATIONS for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such time and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint.

7. FEE.—A fee of £2 will be required from every candidate attending an Examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination will be held under the foregoing Regulations, commencing on the 8th December, 1931. The written examination will be held in London, and, provided in each case candidates present themselves in sufficient number, in Belfast, Edinburgh and Manchester.

Not fewer than 11 candidates will be appointed on the result of this examination, if so many should be found to be duly qualified.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 31ST JULY, 1931.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Authorisation of Landing of Animals for
Exceptional Purposes.*

1. The landing of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto, which are intended for exceptional purposes, is hereby allowed subject to the provisions of Part II (Quarantine) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of Part VI of the Animals (Importation) Order of 1930, and of this Order.

Definition of Quarantine Station.

2. The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, are hereby defined as an Imported Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the detention of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto.

Examination before Landing.

3. No such animal as aforesaid shall be landed except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry, which licence shall not be granted unless and until the animal has been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry and certified by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease.

*Regulations applicable to the Animals on
Landing.*

4.—(1) The animals on being landed, shall forthwith be moved direct and without avoidable delay from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days. During the said period the animals shall be kept separate from all other animals and no other animal shall be moved into such premises.

(2) The animals shall not be removed from the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto otherwise than under the authority of the licence from an Inspector of the Ministry required under Article 40 (8) of the Animals (Importation) Order of 1930.

(3) A copy of every licence authorising the movement of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto shall be forwarded to the Ministry by the Inspector who grants the licence.

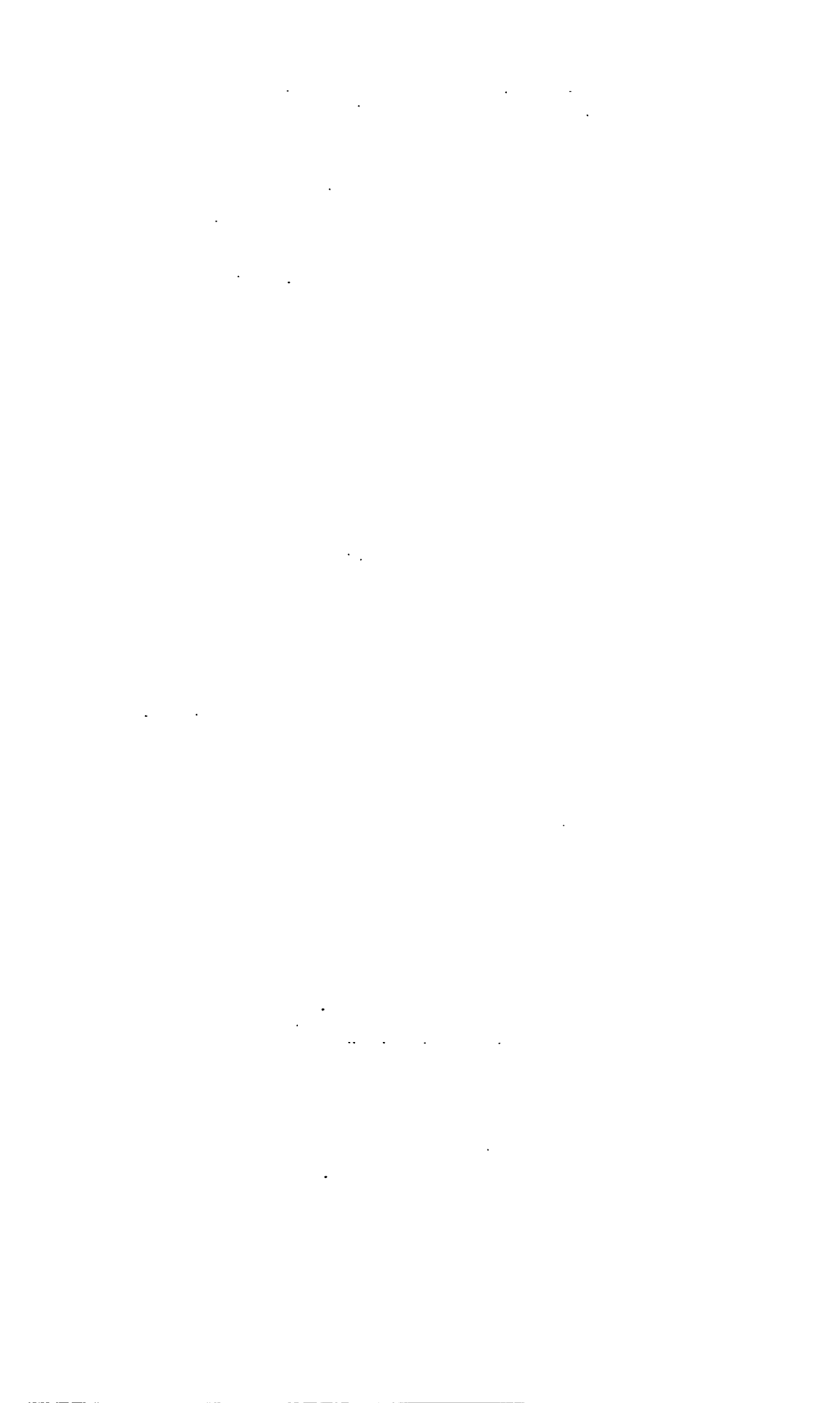
