WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 (33 and 34 Vict. c. 52) to 1906 (6 Edw. VII c. 15) it was, amongst other things, enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State, with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His. Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas Treaty arrangements exist between His Majesty and foreign States set forth in the accompanying Schedule for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals which have been duly put in force by Order in Council:

And whereas there was concluded on the fourth day of May, 1910, between His Majesty

and the foreign States enumerated therein among which are those set forth in the accompanying Schedule, a convention for the suppression of the White Slave Traffic which contains Articles in the terms following:—

"Article 1.

"Doit être puni quiconque, pour satisfaire les passions d'autrui, a embauché, entrainé ou détourné, même avec son consentement, une femme ou fille mineure, en vue de la débauche, alors même que les divers actes qui sont les éléments constitutifs de l'infraction auraient été accomplis dans des pays différents.

"Doit être aussi puni quiconque, pour satisfaire les passions d'autrui, a par fraude ou à l'aide de violences, menaces, abus d'autorité, ou tout autre moyen de contrainte, embauché, entrainé ou détourné une femme ou fille majeure en vue de la débauche, alors même que les divers actes qui sont les éléments constitutifs de l'infraction auraient été accomplis dans des pays différents.

"Article 5.

"Les infractions prévues par les articles 1 et 2 seront, à partir du jour de l'entrée en vigueur de la présente Convention, reputées être inscrites de plein droit au nombre des infractions donnant lieu à extradition

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d'après les Conventions déjà existantes entre les Parties contractantes.

"Dans les cas où la stipulation qui précède ne pourrait recevoir effet sans modifier la législation existante, les Parties contractantes s'engagent à prendre ou à proposer à leurs legislatures respectives les mesures nécessaires.

"Article 11.

"Si un Etat contractant désire la mise en vigueur de la présente Convention dans une ou plusieurs de ses colonies, possessions ou circonscriptions consulaires judiciaires, il notifiera son intention à cet effet par un acte qui sera déposé dans les archives du Gouvernement de la République française. Celui-ci en enverra, par la voie diplomatique, copie certifiée conforme à chacun des Etats contractants et les avisera en même temps de la date du dépôt.

"Six mois après la date du dépôt de l'acte de notification, la Convention entrera en vigueur dans les colonies, possessions ou circonscriptions consulaires judiciaires visées dans l'acte de notification."

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Him, by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1906, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said Acts shall apply in respect of the above mentioned parts of His Majesty's Dominions in the case of the foreign States in the accompanying Schedule in accordance with the Treaties therein described as supplemented by the said Convention.

This Order shall come into operation on the 24th August, 1931.

Provided that where one of the foreign States set forth in the accompanying Schedule has not notified its intention that the said Convention shall come into force in any of its Colonies, Possessions or Consular Judicial Districts by a declaration to that effect deposited in the archives of the Government of the French Republic, the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended in respect of any such Colonies, Possessions or Consular Judicial Districts until such declaration shall have been so deposited, and no longer.

WHEREAS by Section 102 of the Merchant Shipping Act 1894 (57-8 V. c. 60) (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act) it is enacted that where the legislature of any British possession provides for the examination of, and grant of certificates of competency to, persons intending to act as masters, mates, or engineers, on board ships, and the Board of Trade report to His Majesty that they are satisfied that the examinations are so conducted as to be equally efficient with the examinations for the same purpose in the United Kingdom under that Act, and that the certificates are granted on such principles as to show the like qualifications and competency as those granted under that Act, and are liable to be forfeited for the like reasons and in the like manner, His Majesty may by Order in

(i) declare that the said certificates shall be of the same force as if they had been granted under that Act; and

(ii) declare that all or any of the provisions of that Act which relate to certificates of competency granted under that Act, shall apply to the certificates referred to in the Order; and

(iii) impose such conditions and make such regulations with respect to the certificates and to the use, issue, delivery, cancellation and suspension thereof, as His Majesty may think fit, and impose fines not exceeding fifty pounds for the breach of those conditions and regulations:

And whereas by the Merchant Shipping (Certificates) Act 1914 (4-5 G. 5. c. 42) the law relating to the examinations in the United Kingdom for certificates of competency ...was amended, and it was enacted that the provisions of that Act should be construed as if they were contained in Part II of the principal

And whereas by Section 738 of the principal Act it is provided that where His Majesty has power under that Act to make an Order in Council, His Majesty may from time to time by Order in Council revoke, alter or add to any Order so made:

And whereas by the Navigation Act 1912-1926 (hereinafter referred to as the Navigation Act) the Legislature of the Commonwealth of Australia provided for the examination of, and grant of certificates of competency to persons intending to act as Masters, Mates or Engineers on board ship:

And whereas the Board of Trade have reported to His Majesty that they are satisfied that the examinations held under the Navigation Act are so conducted as to be equally efficient with the examinations for the same purpose in the United Kingdom under the principal Act, and that the certificates granted under the Navigation Act are granted on such principles as to show the like qualifications and competency as those granted under the principal Act and are liable to be forfeited for the like reasons and in the like manner:

And whereas there is in force an Order in Council namely the $\mathbf{Merchant}$ Shipping

(Australian Certificates of Competency) Order 1923 (S.R. & O. 1923, No. 1288) relating in part to certificates of competency granted under the Navigation Act 1912-1926, and it is expedient that so much of the said Order as relates to such certificates should be revoked:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act 1893 have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers vested in Him by the principal Act, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare as follows, that is to say:

1. Certificates of competency as master, first mate or second mate of a foreign-going ship, as first-class or second-class engineer, or as first-class or second-class motor engineer, granted on and after the first day of October 1923 under the Navigation Act by the proper authority, shall be of the same force as if they had been granted in the United Kingdom

under the principal Act.

2. The provisions of the principal Act which relate to certificates of competency granted under that Act, except those relating to certificates for a home-trade passenger ship, and also except so much of Section 470 as requires a Court cancelling or suspending a certificate to send the certificate cancelled or suspended to the Board of Trade shall apply to such certificates of competency as are referred to in Article 1 of this Order; provided that in the application of Section 101 of the principal Act to such certificates, references in that Section to the Board of Trade, or to the Registrar-General of Shipping and Seamen, shall be construed as references to the proper authority.

3. The Regulations set out in the Schedule hereto shall have effect with respect to such certificates of competency as are referred to in Article 1 of this Order and to the use, issue delivery, cancellation and suspension

thereof.

- 4. In this Order the expression the "proper authority" shall mean the authority for the time being empowered by the Legislature of the Commonwealth of Australia to grant certificates of competency under the Navigation Act.
- 5. Articles 3, 4 and 5 of the Merchant Shipping (Australian Certificates of Competency) Order 1923, and the Schedule thereto are hereby revoked.
- 6. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Australian Certificates of Competency) Order 1931.

SCHEDULE.

REGULATIONS WITH RESPECT TO THE USE, ISSUE, DELIVERY, CANCELLATION AND SUSPENSION OF Australian Certificates of Competency.

1. In these Regulations the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:-

"Certificate of Imperial validity" means a certificate of competency (other than a certificate for a home-trade passenger ship) granted under the principal Act, or one of such certificates, granted under provisions made by the legislature of a British possession, as are declared by Order in Council to

be of the same force as if they had been granted under that Act.

granted under that Act.
"Australian certificate" means certificate
of Imperial validity granted under the
Navigation Act.

- 2. Every Australian certificate of any grade shall be as like as possible in form and size to a certificate of the same grade issued in the United Kingdom, save that on the face and cover the words "Commonwealth of Australia" shall appear conspicuously.
- 3. No Australian certificate shall be granted to a person who has been the holder of any certificate of competency which, having been granted under the principal Act or under any provision made by the legislature of a British Dominion, Colony or possession has been cancelled or suspended by any authority, court or tribunal in His Majesty's dominions except:—

(i) as provided by the next following

Regulation; or

(ii) in accordance with a recommendation made by the court or authority by whom the certificate was cancelled or suspended, that a certificate of a lower grade should be granted; or

(iii) where the period of suspension has expired, and every certificate granted for a limited period, or pending the expiry of the period of suspension, has been delivered up to the authority by whom it was issued; or

- (iv) where the authority by whom the cancelled or suspended certificate was granted, has informed the proper authority that no objection to the grant is known to exist.
- 4.—(1) Where an Australian certificate has been cancelled or suspended in Australia, then if in the opinion of the proper authority the justice of the case requires it; or where an Australian certificate has been cancelled or suspended in some part of His Majesty's dominions outside Australia, then if the proper authority is requested so to do by the authority exercising like powers in that part of those dominions; the proper authority may return or re-issue the certificate, or shorten the period of suspension or grant in place thereof a certificate of the same or any lower grade.
- (2) Where a certificate of Imperial validity, other than an Australian certificate, has been cancelled or suspended in Australia, the proper authority, if of the opinion that the justice of the case requires it, may grant in its place an Australian certificate of the same or any lower grade: provided that such Australian certificate is expressed to have force only for such limited period as the proper authority may direct, and that immediately upon the issue thereof the authority by whom the cancelled or suspended certificate was granted is notified by the proper authority of the issue of such Australian certificate.
- 5. When a certificate of competency is cancelled or suspended under a power conferred by the principal Act, and the person who held the certificate then also held an Australian certificate, the cancellation or suspension shall, unless the authority exercising the power otherwise directs, extend as well to such Australian certificate.
- 6. Every authority, court or tribunal by whom an Australian certificate is cancelled or suspended shall send to the proper authority

- a full report upon the case together with a copy of the evidence taken therein and also the cancelled or suspended certificate: provided that where any such certificate is suspended in a part of His Majesty's dominions outside Australia for a period not exceeding nine months, the authority for the time being empowered to grant certificates of competency in that part of those dominions, if satisfied that the circumstances render it desirable, may retain the certificate and return it to the grantee at the expiration of the period of suspension.
- 7. Subject to these regulations, an Australian certificate, which has from any cause been cancelled or suspended, shall be renewed or reissued only by the proper authority.
- 8. The proper authority shall from time to time cause to be furnished to the Registrar-General of Shipping and Seamen in London, accurate lists of all Australian certificates that may be granted, or that may for any cause be cancelled, suspended, renewed or re-issued, and also duplicates of the applications for examination made by the persons to whom such certificates are granted.
- 9. Any Officer of the Board of Trade, or the Registrar-General of Shipping and Seamen, or any of his Officers, or a Superintendent, or a duly appointed Shipping Officer in a British Dominion, Colony or possession or a British Consular Officer may demand the delivery to him of any Australian certificate which he has reason to believe has been improperly issued, or forged, altered, cancelled, or suspended, or to which the person using it is not, in the belief of such Officer, justly entitled and may detain such certificate for a reasonable period for the purpose of making inquiries respecting such suspected improper issue, forgery, alteration, cancellation, suspension, or possession, and any person who, without reasonable cause, neglects or refuses to comply with such demand shall incur a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds sterling or its equivalent in local currency, which may be recovered wherever in His Majesty's dominions such person may be found, if in the United Kingdom in the same manner as fines may be recovered under the principal Act, or if in some other part of His Majesty's dominions, in such summary manner as may be provided by the law of that part of those dominions.
- 10. Nothing in these Regulations shall prejudice or derogate from any power conferred upon the Board of Trade by the principal Act, or any amendment thereof for the time being in force.

- 1. In these Regulations the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:
 - "Certificate of Imperial validity" means any certificate of competency (other than a certificate for a home-trade passenger ship) granted under the principal Act, or any such certificate of competency granted under provisions made by the legislature of a British possession, as is declared by Order in Council to be of the same force as if granted under that Act.
 - "South African certificate" means any such certificate of competency granted under the South African Act as is declared by this Order to be of the same force as if granted under the principal Act.

When a certificate of competency is cancelled or suspended under a power conferred by the principal Act, and the person who held the certificate then also held a South African certificate, the cancellation or suspension shall, unless the authority exercising the power otherwise directs, extend as well to such South African certificate.
- 6. Every authority, court or tribunal by whom a South African certificate is cancelled or suspended shall send to the proper authority a full report upon the case together with a copy of the evidence taken therein and also the cancelled or suspended certificate; provided that where any such certificate is suspended in a part of His Majesty's dominions outside the Union for a period not exceeding nine months, the authority for the time being empowered to grant certificates of competency in that part of those dominions, if satisfied that the circumstances render it desirable, may retain the certificate and return it to the grantee at the expiration of the period of suspension.
- 7. Subject to these Regulations, a South African certificate, which has from any cause been cancelled or suspended, shall be renewed or re-issued only by the proper authority.
- 8. The proper authority shall from time to time cause to be furnished to the Registrar-General of Shipping and Seamen in London, accurate lists of all South African certificates that may be granted, or that may for any cause be cancelled, suspended, renewed or reissued, and also duplicates of the applications for examination made by the persons to whom such certificates are granted.

- 9. Any officer of the Board of Trade, or the Registrar-General of Shipping and Seamen, or any of his Officers, or a Superintendent, or a duly appointed Shipping Officer in a British Dominion, Colony or possession or a British Consular Officer may demand the delivery to him of any South African certificate which he has reason to believe has been improperly issued, or forged, altered, cancelled, or suspended, or to which the person using it is not, in the belief of such Officer, justly entitled, and may detain such certificate for a reasonable period for the purpose of making inquiries respecting such suspected improper issue, forgery, alteration, cancellation, sus-pension, or possession, and any person who, without reasonable cause, neglects or refuses to comply with such demand shall incur a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds sterling or its equivalent in local currency, which may be recovered wherever in His Majesty's dominions such person may be found, if in the United Kingdom in the same manner as fines may be recovered under the principal Act, or if in some other part of His Majesty's dominions, in such summary manner as may be provided by the law of that part of those dominions.
- 10. Nothing in these Regulations shall prejudice or derogate from any power conferred upon the Board of Trade by the principal Act, or any amendment thereof for the time being in force.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 21st August, 1931, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-19, to the amount of £35,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 24th August, 1931, to Saturday, the 29th August, 1931, inclusive and will be payable at three months after date.

- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6.
