WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 7th day of August, 1931 (C.W. 2009/31), in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council of the 19th July, 1912, the rank of Mate was instituted to enable Warrant Officers and Petty Officers to attain Commissioned rank at an age earlier than was possible under existing regulations:

"And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council of the 21st January, 1914, the rank of Mate (E) was instituted to enable Artificer Engineers, Chief Engine Room Artificers, and Engine Room Artificers to attain Commissioned rank at an age earlier than was possible under existing regulations:

"And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council of the 28th June, 1920, certain additions to and modifications in this system of promotion to Commissioned rank through the ranks of Mate and Mate (E) were approved:

"And whereas we are of opinion that further revisions in this system are desirable in order that Commissioned Officers promoted thereunder may enjoy opportunities equal in all ways with those of Officers who enter Your Majesty's Navy as Cadets, and that they should cease to be designated Mate or Mate (E):

"And whereas the revision in the system of promotion from the lower deck cannot be wholly introduced until 1933, and we are of opinion that Officers promoted under the system prior to the first day of January, 1933, should be treated for all purposes connected with their emoluments both on the Active and on the Retired List under present regulations:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the following proposals:—

(i) The titles of Mate and Mate (E) to be abolished forthwith, existing Officers of those ranks being given the ranks of Sub-Lieutenant and Sub-Lieutenant (E), and candidates selected for promotion to Commissioned rank hereafter the ranks of Acting Sub-Lieutenant and Acting Sub-Lieutenant (E.) respectively.

(ii) Existing Mates and Mates (E) and Officers promoted therefrom, as well as Officers promoted to the ranks of Acting Sub-

Lieutenant and Sub-Lieutenant (E) before the 1st January, 1933, and Officers promoted therefrom, to be eligible for full pay, unemployed pay, half pay, retired pay, and additional retired pay for disability, under the regulations at present applicable to Mates and Mates (E) and Officers promoted therefrom.

(iii) Officers promoted to Acting Sub-Lieutenant or Acting Sub-Lieutenant (E) after the 31st December, 1932, and Officers promoted therefrom to be eligible for full pay, unemployed pay, half pay, retired pay or gratuity on retirement, and additional retired pay for disability under the regulations applicable to Officers of corresponding rank promoted from Cadets.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence, where necessary, in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"Whereas the General Council of Medical Education and Registration of the United Kingdom have, in pursuance of Section 10 (1) (C) of the Medical Act, 1886, represented to the Privy Council that it is expedient to confer on the Registered Practitioners, resident in England and Wales, the power of returning an Additional Member to the General Council, but that the addition in question should not be made until the next ensuing election of Direct Representatives :

"And whereas the said Representation has been laid before both Houses of Parliament, in compliance with the provisions of the said Act, and no address against the same having been presented to Your Majesty, Their Lordships do agree humbly to report, as their opinion, to Your Majesty that it may be advisable for Your Majesty to give effect to the said Representation."

* Now, therefore, His Majesty, having taken the said Report into consideration, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve thereof, and His Majesty doth, by this Order, give effect to the said Representation of the General Council of Medical Education and Registration of the United Kingdom.

WHEREAS by the Aliens Order, 1920, hereinafter referred to as the principal Order, made in pursuance of the Aliens Restriction Acts, 1914 and 1919, His Majesty was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to impose certain restrictions on aliens, and to make provisions in accordance with the said Acts for giving effect to the said Order :

And whereas by the Expiring Laws Continuance Act, 1930, Section 1 of the Aliens Restriction (Amendment) Act, 1919, was continued until 31st December, 1931 :

And whereas His Majesty has power by Order in Council to revoke alter or add to any Order in Council made under the said Acts :

And whereas the principal Order was amended by Orders in Council dated 3rd December, 1920, the 12th March, 1923, and 24th July, 1925 :

And whereas it is expedient that the provisions of the principal Order, as amended, should be further amended in the manner hereinafter appearing :

And whereas the provisions of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with :

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :—

The principal Order shall be amended as follows :—

(1) For the words "he is not a lunatic, idiot, or mentally deficient" in sub-section (3) (c) of Article 1, there shall be substituted the words

"he is not a person of unsound mind or a mentally defective person".

(2) For the words "add such conditions . . . added. An alien who fails to comply with any condition so attached or added" in sub-section (4) of Article 1 there shall be substituted the words

"vary such conditions in such manner as he thinks fit and the alien shall comply with the conditions so attached or varied. An alien who fails to comply with any conditions so attached or varied",

and the following paragraph shall be added at the end of sub-section (4)

"where a condition limiting the period during which an alien may remain in the United Kingdom has been attached to the grant of leave to the alien to land in the United Kingdom or has been imposed by way of variation of any condition so attached, the condition so attached or varied shall remain in force notwithstanding that within the period so limited the alien has entered the Irish Free State, the Isle of Man or the Channel Islands".

(3) The following sub-section shall be substituted for sub-section (2) of Article 3.

"For the purpose of such inspection an alien may land temporarily and provided he submits himself forthwith to such inspection shall be deemed not to have

landed. Any such alien may be detained in such manner as the Secretary of State may direct and while so detained shall be deemed to be in legal custody."

(4) For the words "until dealt with under this Order be detained in such manner as the Secretary of State may direct" in sub-section (3) of Article 3, there shall be substituted the words

"notwithstanding any intervening prosecution be detained in such manner as the Secretary of State may direct, until dealt with under sub-section (5) of this Article, or otherwise in accordance with the provisions of this Order".

(5) In sub-sections (1) (d) and (5) of Article 6 the word "three" shall be substituted for the word "two".

(6) In sub-section (6) (b) (i) of Article 12 the words "poor relief" shall be substituted for the words "parochial relief".

(7) In sub-section (4) of Article 18 omit paragraph (a) and reletter the remaining paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d).

(8) In sub-section (1) of Article 23 the words "Department of Health for Scotland" shall be substituted for the words "Scottish Board of Health".

WHEREAS it is expedient that there should be established a distinguishing ensign which may be flown by British aircraft registered in the United Kingdom; and which also may be flown at aerodromes situated in the United Kingdom which are licensed under the Air Navigation Act, 1920; and which also may be flown by air transport undertakings, which own such aircraft as aforesaid, on, or in proximity to, buildings used by such undertakings for the purposes of air transport:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) The following ensign is hereby established and shall be recognised as the proper national colours to be flown by the aircraft and at the aerodromes and by the undertakings aforesaid, that is to say:—of light blue, a dark blue cross edged with white, in the first quarter the Union; and the said ensign may be so flown as aforesaid subject to any directions issued from time to time by the Air Council.

(2) The said ensign shall be called the "Civil Air Ensign."

2. This Order may be cited as the Civil Air Ensign Order, 1931.

2. This Order may be cited as the County Courts (Extended Jurisdiction No. 2) Order in Council, 1931, and shall come into operation on the first day of December, 1931, and the County Courts Order in Council, 1924, as amended, shall have effect as further amended by this Order.

WHEREAS by Section three of the Colonial Development Act, 1929, it is amongst other things provided that His Majesty may, if a representation is made to Him by the Treasury and the Secretary of State that it is desirable so to do, make an Order in Council directing that the Colonial Stock Acts, 1877 to 1900, shall be extended, subject to such modifications and to such conditions as may appear expedient to His Majesty, so as to apply to stock issued after the passing of that Act and forming part of the public debt of any territory specified in the Order which is under His Majesty's protection:

And whereas a representation has been made to His Majesty by the Treasury and the Secretary of State that it is desirable that an Order should be made directing that the Colonial Stock Acts, 1877 to 1900, shall, subject to the modifications for which provision is made by this Order, be extended so as to apply to stock issued after the passing of the said Act and forming part of the public debt of Northern Rhodesia as if Northern Rhodesia were a colony:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers vested in Him by the said Section three of the Colonial Development Act, 1929, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Colonial Stock Acts, 1877 to 1900, shall, subject to the modifications set out in the next succeeding paragraph of this Order, be extended so as to apply to stock issued

after the passing of the Colonial Development Act, 1929, and forming part of the public debt of Northern Rhodesia as if Northern Rhodesia were a colony.

2. For the purposes of Section two of the Colonial Stock Act, 1900, the following conditions shall have effect in relation to stock to which the Colonial Stock Acts, 1877 to 1900, apply by virtue of this Order as if they had been prescribed by the Treasury under that Section:—

(a) Provision must be made by legislation of Northern Rhodesia for the payment out of the Revenues of Northern Rhodesia of any sums which may become payable to stockholders under any judgment, decree, rule or order of a court in the United Kingdom:

(b) The Government of Northern Rhodesia must satisfy the Treasury that adequate funds, as and when required, will be made available in the United Kingdom to meet any such judgment, decree, rule or order:

(c) The Government of Northern Rhodesia must place on record a formal expression of their opinion that any legislation of Northern Rhodesia which appears to the Imperial Government to alter any of the provisions affecting the stock to the injury of the stockholders or to involve a departure from the original contract in regard to the stock would properly be disallowed, and that no legislation, whereby the control of the Secretary of State over the finances of Northern Rhodesia is impaired, ought to be passed unless and until the Treasury are satisfied that satisfactory arrangements have been made for safeguarding the interests of the stockholders.

3. This Order may be cited as the Colonial Stock Acts Extension (Northern Rhodesia) Order, 1931.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 16th day of July, 1931, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of

Saint Peter, Bryn, situate within the Parish of Ashton in Makerfield, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Liverpool:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Ashton in Makerfield and of the Parish of Saint Thomas, Ashton in Makerfield, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such Parishes:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Ashton in Makerfield and of the said Parish of Saint Thomas, Ashton in Makerfield, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Peter, Bryn, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Albert Augustus, Bishop of Liverpool, as such Bishop, with the consent of the Right Honourable Edward George Villiers, Earl of Derby, as the Patron of the Rectory of the said Parish of Ashton in Makerfield, and with the consent of the Reverend William Williams, Clerk in Holy Orders, the Rector or Incumbent of the Rectory of the said Parish of Ashton in Makerfield, and as such Rector or Incumbent, the Patron of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Saint Thomas, Ashton in Makerfield (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Ashton in Makerfield and of the said Parish of Saint Thomas, Ashton in Makerfield, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Peter, Bryn, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Peter, Bryn.'

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Peter, Bryn, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the Parish of Ashton in Makerfield, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Liverpool, which is bounded upon the south east by the Parish of Saint Thomas, Ashton in Makerfield, upon the east by the New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Abram, upon the north east by the New Parish of Saint Mary, Ince in Makerfield, upon the north west partly by the New Parish of Saint James, Wigan, and partly by the New Parish of Saint Paul, Goose Green, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west and upon the south west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Goose Green, from the said Parish of

Ashton in Makerfield, and also the boundary which divides the County Borough of Wigan from the Urban District of Ashton in Makerfield cross the middle of Park Lane, and extending thence southward along the middle of Park Lane, for a distance of 41 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Sougher's Lane, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Sougher's Lane for a distance of 34 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Downall Green Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Downall Green Road for a distance of $2\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the fence forming the eastern boundary of the premises attached to Moor Lane Farm (that is to say, the close numbered 175 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the said Urban District of Ashton in Makerfield published in the year 1928 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Representation) and extending thence first southward to and then in various directions along such fence and along the fence forming the southern boundary of the same premises for a distance in all of $8\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned fence meets the fence which divides the close numbered 174A upon the said maps from the close numbered 174 upon the same maps, and extending thence first southward and then in various directions along the fences which divide the said close numbered 174A and the closes numbered 221, 178, and 218 upon the said maps from the said close numbered 174 and the close numbered 181 upon the same maps for a distance of 32 chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence which divides the said close numbered 218 from the said close numbered 181 meets the fence forming the north western boundary of the Lancashire Union Line of the London Midland and Scottish Railway, and extending thence south-eastward in a straight line across the said line of railway for a distance of $1\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the footpath leading along the south eastern side of such railway, and extending thence south westward along the middle of such footpath for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the fence which divides the close numbered 261 upon the said maps from the close numbered 262 upon the same maps, and extending thence first southward to and then first southward and then in various directions along the fences which divide the said close numbered 261 and the close numbered 766 upon the said maps from the said close numbered 262 and the closes numbered 765 and 764 upon the same maps for a distance in all of 20 chains or thereabouts to the south eastern corner of the said close numbered 766, and extending thence eastward to and along the middle of Jack Brook for a distance of $10\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point at Knowles Brook Bridge where it is crossed by the boundary which divides the said Parish of Ashton in Makerfield from the said Parish of Saint Thomas, Ashton in Makerfield.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said Parish of Saint Thomas, Ashton in Makerfield, which is bounded upon the north west and upon the north by the above described portion of the Parish of Ashton in Makerfield and upon the remaining sides, that

is to say, upon the south east and upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Ashton in Makerfield from the said Parish of Saint Thomas, Ashton in Makerfield, at the junction of Nicol Road with Shaw Street, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Shaw Street for a distance of $2\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footpath leading into Wigan Road, and extending thence south westward to and along the middle of such footpath for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the eastern side of Wigan Road, and extending thence in a straight line due west (thereby crossing Wigan Road and the close numbered 757 upon the said maps) for a distance of $3\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Jack Brook, and extending thence westward along the middle of Jack Brook for a distance of $10\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point at Knowles Brook Bridge where it is crossed by the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint Thomas, Ashton in Makerfield, from the said Parish of Ashton in Makerfield."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Liverpool.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 30th day of July, 1931, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Coddington and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Newark upon Trent (Saint Mary Magdalene) both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Nottingham and in the Diocese of Southwell:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of Southwell, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the

said Benefice of Coddington with either the said Benefice of Newark upon Trent (Saint Mary Magdalene) or with the Benefice of Barnby in the Willows in the same County and Diocese and the annexation of the Extra Parochial Place called or known as Flawford situate partly in the said County of Nottingham and partly in the County of Lincoln and in the said Diocese of Southwell to the Parish of the said Benefice of Barnby in the Willows, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Southwell and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices of Coddington and Newark upon Trent (Saint Mary Magdalene), and the terms for effecting the union including the annexation of the said Extra Parochial Place called or known as Flawford to the United Benefice so recommended and proposed to be constituted and the said Bishop of Southwell signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union and annexation based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Newark upon Trent (Saint Mary Magdalene) is now full, the Reverend William Kay being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Coddington is at present vacant:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Henry, Bishop of Southwell (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said William Kay (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Coddington and the said Benefice of Newark upon Trent (Saint Mary Magdalene) shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Newark with Coddington' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said William Kay if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Newark upon Trent (Saint Mary Magdalene) shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the union taking effect provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice for obtaining the services of a Curate to assist in the performance of the duties of the United Benefice and to reside within the Parish of Coddington and a portion of the endowments of the United Benefice namely the whole of the endowments of the said Benefice of Coddington except the glebe shall be charged with a sum of £150 per annum as a fund to meet the expenses of providing for the services of such Curate as aforesaid which said fund of £150 per annum shall be held and administered by the Incumbent of the United Benefice but shall be applicable only to the purposes aforesaid, provided that it shall be lawful for the Bishop of the Diocese if he thinks proper at any time and from time to time to direct that the said charge of £150

per annum shall be paid by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as trustees to apply the same for the purpose of paying the stipend of a Curate as aforesaid.

"4. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Newark upon Trent (Saint Mary Magdalene) shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Coddington and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and applied by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for and towards the cost of the provision of a house of residence for the Curate referred to in Clause 3 of this Scheme.

"5. “Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Puckington and Stocklynch Ottersey with Stocklynch Magdalen duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Bath and Wells and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union including certain alterations of boundaries affecting the Parish of the said Benefice of Puckington, the Parish of the Benefice of Barrington in the said County and Diocese and the Parish of Ilminster, being one of the Parishes of the United Benefice of Ilminster with Whitelackington also in the said County and Diocese, and the said Bishop of Bath and Wells signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared

this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“And whereas the said Benefice of Stocklynch Ottersey with Stocklynch Magdalen is now full, the Reverend Albert Hill Mawson being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Puckington is at present vacant:

“Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Puckington shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Stocklynch Ottersey with Stocklynch Magdalen and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of the United Benefice.

"6. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Stocklynch Ottersey with Stocklynch Magdalen having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Puckington having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"7. That with the consents of the Patrons of the said Benefice of Barrington, namely The Community of the Resurrection Incorporated (in testimony whereof the seal of the Community has been affixed to this Scheme), and with the consent of the Reverend John Brent Glass, at present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Barrington (testified by his signing this Scheme), upon the union taking effect there shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Barrington all those two portions of the Parish of the said Benefice of Puckington, namely (a) a detachment lying between the localities known as Westport and Knighton and (b) a detachment at Little Puckington, which lie within the area of the Civil Parish of Puckington.

That with the consent of the Patron of the said United Benefice of Ilminster with Whitelackington, namely the said St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells (testified as aforesaid), and with the consent of the Reverend John Noble Boughton, at present Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Ilminster with Whitelackington (testified by his signing this Scheme), upon the union

“Whereas by an Order of His Majesty in Council dated the 29th day of June, 1931, made in pursuance of the said Act, which Order came into operation on its publication in the London Gazette on the 10th day of July, 1931, the Dean and Chapter of Liverpool was founded and statutes were established for the order rule and governance of the Cathedral Church of Liverpool and the dean and chapter so founded:

“And whereas under Section 25 of the said Act, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, are authorised to lay before Your Majesty in Council a Scheme or Schemes for transferring to the Dean and Chapter of Liverpool when founded the Liverpool Chapter Endowment Fund, and for making such provisions and arrangements as may be necessary for carrying into complete effect the foundation of the said Dean and Chapter of Liverpool and the establishment of any canonry or canonries minor or honorary canonry or canonries and other offices (lay or clerical) in the Cathedral Church of Liverpool:

“Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, namely:—

“1. That the Liverpool Chapter Endowment Fund constituted under the 20th Section of the said Liverpool Cathedral Act, 1885, and the stock securities cash and other property whereof the said Fund consists be transferred from us, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to and be vested in the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Liverpool (hereinafter called the dean and chapter) and that the income arising from the said Fund shall constitute the Maintenance Fund mentioned in the Statutes of the said Cathedral Church and shall be applied by the dean and chapter together with any other income coming into the hands of the dean and chapter and available for the same purposes or any of them to the payment of the stipends and allowances of the dean and residentiary canons and of all other officers clerical or lay on the staff of the cathedral and servants of the cathedral and of the dean and chapter and to the maintenance of the fabric and services of the cathedral and to making any provision for the Pensions and Gratuity Funds in accordance with the Statutes of the said Cathedral Church and to the discharge of all other the obligations and liabilities of the dean and chapter and subject thereto to making such provision as the dean and chapter may think fit for schools and colleges in connection with the cathedral and to the making of all such contributions to charitable or other objects in con-

nection with the cathedral or otherwise as the dean and chapter are authorised to make. -

“2. That out of the said Maintenance Fund (a) there shall as a first payment thereof be paid to a separate account to be known as the ‘Fabric Maintenance Account’ the sum of £400 every year which shall be used for the ordinary upkeep and repair of the fabric of the cathedral and any appurtenant buildings and, in so far as the same is not used in any year, shall remain in the said Fabric Maintenance Account available for use for the same purpose, if so required, in any subsequent year and the amount from time to time standing in the said account over and above what is needed to provide for current expenditure shall be invested and the income derived therefrom shall be added to the account and be available for use for the purposes for which all other moneys in the account are available; and if in any year the sum standing in the Fabric Maintenance Account is insufficient to defray the cost of the ordinary upkeep and repair of the fabric as aforesaid, the excess shall be a liability payable out of the Maintenance Fund and shall not be paid out of the Fabric Repair Fund next hereinafter mentioned; and (b) there shall next be paid to another separate Account to be known as the ‘Fabric Repair Account’ the sum of £500 in every year which with all interest or income arising therefrom shall be invested in the name of the dean and chapter and accumulated until the same shall be required to defray the cost of necessary substantial repairs to the cathedral and its appurtenant buildings of an extraordinary character, whether of occasional or periodic occurrence, and the whole or any part of the fund arising from such annual payments to the Fabric Repair Account and the investment and accumulation of the fund shall be available to defray the cost of such substantial repairs as aforesaid but no expenditure for such purposes shall be incurred and no payment made out of the fund without the previous approval of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners; and (c) there shall next be paid the annual stipends and allowances in accordance with the provisions of the Statutes of the said Cathedral Church of the dean and the four residentiary canons.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament, or of any Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England.”

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Liverpool.

"The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of All Saints, New Eltham, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Southwark, and to be annexed to the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Eltham, in the same County and Diocese, being:—

"And whereas the said John Francis William Deacon, Ernest Newton Sharpe, George Thomas Bethune Baker, and John Harold Richards have represented to us, and we are of opinion, that it is desirable that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within the Parishes of the said five Benefices, by means of that apportionment of the income of the said Benefice of Aston juxta Birmingham which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Aston juxta Birmingham is now vacant, the late Incumbent thereof being the Reverend William John Cole, Clerk in Holy Orders and an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Birmingham, in whose favour an annual pension of £375 is payable out of the income of the Benefice:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Ernest William, Bishop of the said Diocese of Birmingham, acting as such Bishop (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), and with the consents of the said John Francis William Deacon, Ernest Newton Sharpe, George Thomas Bethune Baker and John Harold Richards, acting as such Patrons as aforesaid (in testimony of which consents they have signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and as from the day of the date on which the aforesaid annual pension of £375 shall cease to be payable to the said William John Cole, all the Tithe rent-charges Glebe lands and all (if any) other the endowments which shall at the day aforesaid or which may thereafter belong to the same Benefice shall be charged and for ever thereafter chargeable in favour of the Incumbents for the time being of the said five

Benefices with the annual sums or yearly charges hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, a clear annual sum or yearly charge of £75 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Ashted, a clear annual sum or yearly charge of £55 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of the Holy Trinity, Bordesley, a clear annual sum or yearly charge of £50 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Saint Paul, Lozells, a clear annual sum or yearly charge of £50 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Saint Silas, Lozells, and a clear annual sum or yearly charge of £70 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Christ Church, Sparkbrook, such annual sums or yearly charges to be as from the day aforesaid due and payable to the Incumbents of the said five Benefices and the same annual sums or yearly charges to be apportionable between any outgoing Incumbent of any one of the said five Benefices or his representatives on the one hand and his successors in the same incumbency on the other hand; and to be receivable by the Incumbent in whose favour it is charged as aforesaid by equal quarterly payments on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in every year; and for the recovery of the said yearly charges the Incumbents of the said five Benefices and their successors shall have and be entitled to all the powers and remedies provided by Sections 121 and 122 of the Law of Property Act, 1925, in respect of rent-charges to which those Sections apply.

"Provided always that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Aston juxta Birmingham shall by any deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any Statute in that behalf enabling him, grant convey and annex to the said five Benefices or to any one or more of them any part or parts of the endowments belonging to the said Benefice of Aston juxta Birmingham which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Birmingham for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for the said annual sums or yearly charges or any one or more of them hereby proposed to be created as aforesaid then the same annual sums or yearly charges or one or more of them as the case may be shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and determine, and be no longer payable as hereinbefore recommended and proposed.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been

duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Birmingham.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Acton and of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Dunstan, East Acton, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such Parish and New Parish respectively:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Acton and of the said New Parish of Saint Dunstan, East Acton, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Gabriel, North Acton, situate as aforesaid:

the said New Parish of Saint Dunstan, East Acton (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Corporate Seal to be affixed to this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Acton and of the said New Parish of Saint Dunstan, East Acton, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Gabriel, North Acton, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Gabriel, North Acton.'

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Gabriel, North Acton, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Acton and of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Dunstan, East Acton, both in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London, which, taken together, are bounded upon part of the south by the New Parish of Saint Martin, West Acton, upon the west by the New Parish of Christ Church, Ealing, upon the north partly by the Parish of West Twyford, partly by the New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Stonebridge, and partly by the New Parish of All Souls, Harlesden, all in the said County and Diocese, upon the north east by the said New Parish of All Souls, Harlesden, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south east and upon the remaining part of the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of All Souls, Harlesden, from the said New Parish of Saint Dunstan, East Acton, at the centre of the bridge which carries the North and South Western Junction Railway across the Paddington Branch of the Grand Junction Canal, and extending thence south westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 50 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such line of railway across the main line of the Great Western Railway, and extending thence first south westward and then westward along the middle of the last mentioned line of railway (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Dunstan, East Acton, from the said Parish of Acton) for a distance of 1 mile or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Acton from the said New Parish of Saint Martin, West Acton."

"Whereas the Right Reverend John Augustine, now Bishop of Lichfield, is desirous that certain improvements should be made at the said Episcopal Residence, and has submitted to us the particulars of such improvements, and we have specified our general approval of the same:

"And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the aforesaid improvements a sum of £1,600 (being a sum which together with the outstanding balance of the sum already borrowed upon the same security under the authority of the statutes hereinbefore mentioned, does not exceed two years income of the See) should be provided by his borrowing the same by way of mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to the Bishopric of Lichfield:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said John Augustine, Bishop of Lichfield (testified by his having affixed his signature and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorised to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and that the said Governors be empowered to lend under the provisions of the above-mentioned Acts any sum not exceeding £1,600, and that as a security for the same the said Bishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments and endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to his said See to the said Governors by Deed for a term of twenty-five years or until the said sum of £1,600 with interest for the same as herein-after mentioned, and all costs and charges

which may attend the recovery thereof, shall be fully paid and satisfied and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest in the manner following, that is to say, during and in respect of the first period of twelve months of the said term computed from the day of the date of the mortgage, no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable but the said Bishop or his successors shall yearly at the end of the second period of twelve months so computed and at the end of every such like period of twelve months thereafter, pay to the said Governors their successors or assigns one twentieth part of the said principal sum of £1,600 until the whole thereof shall be repaid, and shall also at the end of the first and each succeeding period of twelve months, computed as aforesaid, pay interest at the rate of £4 per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid. And that if and when it shall happen that either the principal or the interest directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of forty days after the same shall have become due it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors their successors and assigns to recover the same and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof by distress and sale in the like manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in force at the time of such distress and sale. "We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Penwortham, partly out of the Chapelry of Longton and partly out of the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of Saint Paul, Farington, all in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Blackburn:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Penwortham, the said Chapelry of Longton, and the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Farington, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Penwortham, of the said Chapelry of Longton and of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Farington, which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas by Instruments published in the London Gazette on the 26th day of October, 1928, and the 28th day of October, 1930, respectively, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in consideration of benefactions of capital sums of £1333 6s. 8d. and £700 did, in pursuance of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111, grant out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act to the Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Penwortham, yearly sums or stipends amounting to £91 10s. 0d. such yearly sums or stipends to be paid only upon the production of a certificate that an Assistant Curate has been employed at All Saints, New Longton, within the said Parish of Penwortham, and to continue payable so long only as may appear to us to be expedient:

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us to be expedient that such yearly sums or stipends amounting to £91 10s. 0d. payable

by us as aforesaid should cease to be so payable and that in lieu thereof we should grant a yearly sum of £91 10s. 0d. to the Minister of the said proposed District when duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors Ministers or Incumbents of the said proposed District or New Parish:

"And whereas the said benefactions of the said capital sums of £1333 6s. 8d. and £700 now held by us, are available for the further endowment of the said proposed separate District and we have agreed to pay to the Minister of the said proposed District, when duly licensed as hereinbefore mentioned, and to his successors Ministers or Incumbents of the said proposed District, a further yearly sum of £91 10s. 0d. by equal quarterly instalments on the 1st day of February, the 1st day of May, the 1st day of August and the 1st day of November in each and every year, so long as the said capital sums shall remain in our hands:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £91 10s. 0d. will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the said Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £2000 towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church within and for the said proposed separate District:

"And whereas the said capital sum of £2000 has been contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof, should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Bishop of Blackburn for the time being as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Percy Mark, Bishop of Blackburn, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Penwortham, of the said Chapelry of Longton and of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Farington, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be con-

stituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of All Saints, New Longton'.

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Percy Mark, Bishop of Blackburn, and his successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of All Saints, New Longton, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Penwortham, of the Chapelry of Longton, and of the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of Saint Paul, Farington, all in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Blackburn, which, taken together, are bounded upon the south partly by the Parish of Hoole and partly by the New Parish of Saint James, Leyland, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south east, upon the east, upon the north east, upon the north west and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint James, Leyland, from the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Farington, crosses the middle of the Liverpool and Preston Line of the London Midland and Scottish Railway and extending thence north eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 51 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the roadway which leads past the Farington Naphtha Works into Chain House Lane, and extending thence northward to and along the middle of such roadway for a distance of 37 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Chain House Lane, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Chain House Lane for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the southern end of the fence forming the eastern boundary of the close numbered 1 upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme, and extending thence northward to and along the said fence for a distance of 13½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the boundary which divides the Civil Parish of Farington from the Civil Parish of Hutton and extending thence eastward along the said Civil Parish boundary for a distance of 15 yards or thereabouts to the point where such boundary meets the boundary which divides the Civil Parish of Penwortham

WHEREAS the Right Reverend William Shuckburgh, Lord Bishop of Lincoln, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

"I, The Right Reverend William Shuckburgh, Lord Bishop of Lincoln, in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, do hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:—

"There is in the City and Diocese of Lincoln the Vicarage or Benefice of Saint Nicholas with Saint John Newport, the Parishes whereof contain a population, including the Military Barracks, His Majesty's Prison, the County Hospital and the City Fever Hospital (according to the census of 1921), of 7,910 or thereabouts, with accommodation in the Parish Church for 400 persons and accommodation in the Chapel of Ease of Saint Matthias for 500 persons.

"The net annual value of the said Benefice of Saint Nicholas with Saint John Newport in the City of Lincoln is £611 or thereabouts.

"The said Vicarage or Benefice of Saint Nicholas with Saint John Newport in the City of Lincoln is in the alternate patronage of me the said William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln, by virtue of my Bishopric, and Robert Andrew Mitchell, Clerk, Master of Arts, Dean of the Cathedral Church of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Lincoln and the Chapter of the same Church.

"There is in the same City and Diocese the Perpetual Curacy or Benefice of Saint Peter in Eastgate with Saint Margaret, the Parishes whereof contain a population (according to the census of 1921) of 2,520 or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 400 persons.

"The net annual value of the said Benefice of Saint Peter in Eastgate with Saint Margaret in the City of Lincoln is £516 or thereabouts.

"The said Perpetual Curacy or Benefice of Saint Peter in Eastgate with Saint Margaret in the City of Lincoln is in the patronage of me the said William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln, by virtue of my Bishopric.

"There are in the same City and Diocese two Extraparochial strips or pieces of land known as the Monks Liberty which contain an estimated population of 500 or thereabouts and are situate at a distance of half a mile or thereabouts from the said Parish Church of Saint Peter in Eastgate with Saint Margaret in the City of Lincoln.

"That it appears to me and I do hereby represent to Your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838,

(1) Five portions of the Parishes of Saint Nicholas with Saint John Newport in the City of Lincoln (the Boundaries of which are delineated on the Map attached to the annexed Scheme and thereon verged blue) may be advantageously separated from the Parishes of Saint Nicholas with Saint John Newport in the City of Lincoln and be annexed to the Parish of Saint Peter in Eastgate in the City of Lincoln.

(2) Six portions of the Parishes of Saint Peter in Eastgate with Saint Margaret in the City of Lincoln (the Boundaries of which are delineated on the Map attached to the annexed Scheme and thereon verged brown) may be advantageously separated from the Parishes of Saint Peter in Eastgate with Saint Margaret in the City of Lincoln and be annexed to the Parish of Saint Nicholas in the City of Lincoln.

(3) The said two Extraparochial strips or pieces of land known as the Monks Liberty in the City of Lincoln (the Boundaries of which are delineated on the Map attached to the annexed Scheme and thereon verged yellow) may be advantageously annexed to the said Parish of Saint Peter in Eastgate in the City of Lincoln to which they are contiguous.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, I, the said Lord Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing appended to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alterations above proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect of Ecclesiastical jurisdiction, Glebe lands, Tithe rent charges, and other Ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested. And I do submit the same to your Grace together with the Consents thereto in writing of Robert Andrew Mitchell, Clerk, Master of Arts, Dean of the Cathedral Church of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Lincoln and the Chapter of the same Church, the Patrons, and the Reverend Patrick Andrew Clay, the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Nicholas with Saint John Newport in the City of Lincoln, and of me the said Lord Bishop, the Patron in right of my Bishopric, and the Reverend Arthur Malcolm Cook, the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Peter in Eastgate with Saint Margaret in the City of Lincoln, to the intent that if Your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such Consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council.

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"It is proposed to separate from the Parishes of Saint Nicholas with Saint John Newport in the City of Lincoln and annex to the Parish of Saint Peter in Eastgate in the City of Lincoln all those portions of the Parishes of Saint Nicholas with Saint John Newport in the City of Lincoln which are delineated on the said Map or plan hereto annexed and thereon verged blue.

"It is also proposed to separate from the Parishes of Saint Peter in Eastgate with Saint Margaret in the City of Lincoln and annex to the Parish of Saint Nicholas in the City of Lincoln all those portions of the Parishes of Saint Peter in Eastgate with Saint Margaret in the City of Lincoln which are delineated on the said Map or plan hereto annexed and thereon verged brown.

"It is also proposed to annex to the Parish of Saint Peter in Eastgate in the City of Lincoln the Extraparochial strips or pieces of land known as the Monks Liberty in the City of Lincoln which are delineated on the said Map or plan hereto annexed and thereon verged yellow.

"That the Incumbents of Saint Nicholas with Saint John Newport in the City of Lincoln and Saint Peter in Eastgate with Saint Margaret in the City of Lincoln shall have sole and exclusive Cura of Souls within those portions of the Parishes so to be separated from the Parishes of Saint Peter in Eastgate with Saint Margaret in the City of Lincoln and Saint Nicholas with Saint John Newport in the City of Lincoln respectively and annexed to their respective Parishes.

"That the Incumbent of Saint Peter in Eastgate with Saint Margaret in the City of Lincoln shall have sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within the limits of the said Extraparochial strips or pieces of land known as the Monks Liberty in the City of Lincoln so to be annexed to the said Parish of Saint Peter in Eastgate in the City of Lincoln.

"That the Inhabitants of such portions so to be separated shall be entitled to accommodation in the respective Parish Churches of the Parishes to which the portions are to be so annexed but shall cease to be entitled to any right of accommodation in the Parish Churches of the Parishes from which the several portions are respectively separated except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by Faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in either of the said Parish Churches and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

"That the Inhabitants of the aforesaid portions so to be separated shall have such and the same right to have marriages, baptisms, churchings and burials solemnized and performed in the respective Parish Churches of the Parishes to which the portions are to be so annexed as they might have had in the Parish Churches of the Parishes from which such portions were separated.

"That the Inhabitants of the said Extraparochial strips or pieces of land known as the Monks Liberty in the City of Lincoln so to be annexed to the said Parish of Saint Peter in Eastgate in the City of Lincoln shall

be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of such last mentioned Parish.

"That marriages, baptisms, churchings and burials in respect of the Inhabitants of the said Extraparochial strips or pieces of land known as the Monks Liberty in the City of Lincoln shall be performed and shall take place in the Church of Saint Peter in Eastgate in the City of Lincoln and in the Burial Ground thereto belonging and that the fees for the same and for other Ecclesiastical offices and the Ecclesiastical dues and offerings usually payable to the Incumbent of a Benefice shall belong and be paid to the Incumbent of the said Parishes and Benefice of Saint Peter in Eastgate with Saint Margaret in the City of Lincoln.

"That all fees Ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments (but excluding Tithes—Glebe and proceeds of sale of Glebe—if any) arising from the said portions so to be separated shall henceforth belong to the respective Incumbents of the Benefices to which such portions are respectively annexed.

"That no alteration shall be made in the endowments of the said Benefices or either of them.

"That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of them.
