And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 29th day of June, 1931, to approve the Report of the Committee to the effect that, the Statutory Notice that the Petition had been presented having expired, it rested with the Secretary of State to appoint a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme in accordance with the provisions of Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882:

And whereas on the 17th day of July, 1931, the Right Honourable John Robert Clynes, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did appoint Charles Matthew Knowles, Esquire, LL.B., Barrister-at-Law, to be a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme for determining the boundaries of the Wards of the Borough of Wednesbury:

And whereas the said Commissioner has accordingly prepared the following Scheme, dated the 6th day of August, 1931:—

**"SCHEME FOR DETERMINING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE WARDS OF THE BOROUGH OF WEDNESBURY AND APPORTIONING THE COUNCILLORS AMONG THE SAID WARDS IN PURSUANCE OF ORDER IN COUNCIL DATED 29TH JUNE, 1931.**

**" I.—BOUNDARIES OF WARDS.**

" In the following descriptions:—

'The added part of West Bromwich' means the portion of the county borough of West Bromwich transferred to the borough of Wednesbury by the Wednesbury Corporation Act, 1930.

**" Market Ward.**

" The boundaries of the Ward shall be those at present existing save that there shall be added to the Ward the area of which the boundaries are the following, namely:—

A line commencing on the present boundary of Market Ward at a point in the centre of Ethelfleda Terrace at its junction with St. Mary's Road, thence eastward along the centre of St. Mary's Road and continuing along the centre of Vicarage Road to the junction of Vicarage Road with Vicar Street, thence south-eastward along the centre of Vicar Street to its junction with Walsall Street, thence north-eastward along the centre of Walsall Street to its junction with Foley Street, thence southward along the centre of Foley Street to its junction with Brunswick Park Road, thence south-westward along the centre of Brunswick Park Road to its junction with the passage leading to the railway track and Hydes Road, thence southward and south-westward along the centre of the said passage to its junction with Hydes Road at a point on the present boundary of Market Ward.

**" Wood Green Ward.**

" The boundaries of the Ward shall be those at present existing save that the boundary on the south-west shall follow the northern boundary of Market Ward as hereinbefore defined and there shall be included in the Ward so much of the added part of West Bromwich as lies to the east and north-east of a line along the centre of Rydding Lane and continuing along the centre of Allerton Lane, and there shall be excluded from the Ward so much of the added part of West Bromwich as lies to the west of a line along the centre of Rydding Lane and continuing along the centre of Allerton Lane.

**" Town Hall Ward.**

" The boundaries of the Ward shall be those at present existing save that there shall be included in the Ward so much of the added part of West Bromwich as lies to the west of a line along the centre of Rydding Lane and continuing along the centre of Allerton Lane, and there shall be excluded from the Ward so much of the added portion of West Bromwich as lies to the east and north-east of a line along the centre of Rydding Lane and continuing along the centre of Allerton Lane.

*"Kings Hill Ward."*

"The boundaries of the Ward shall be those at present existing.

*"Plan delineating Boundaries."*

"The boundaries of the Wards as above defined are delineated on the Plan annexed hereto which forms part of the Scheme.

"In case of any discrepancy between the Wards as delineated on the Plan and the textual description of the Wards as above set out, the textual description shall prevail.

*"II.—APPORTIONMENT OF COUNCILLORS."*

"The Councillors in office for each Ward as existing at the date of this Scheme shall be the Councillors for the Ward of the same name as altered by this Scheme."

And whereas the said Scheme has been submitted to His Majesty in Council for approval:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth hereby approve of the said Scheme of the said Commissioner, and doth order the same to be published in the London Gazette accordingly.

## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.
