**BARMOUTH AND DISTRICT
ELECTRICITY.**

[SPECIAL ORDER.]

NOTICE is hereby given that Electricity Distribution of North Wales and District Limited (hereinafter called "the applicants") whose Registered Office is at Artillery House, Artillery Row, in the City of Westminster, are applying to the Electricity Commissioners for a Special Order (hereinafter called "the Order") under the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1928 for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

1. To authorise the applicants to supply and distribute electricity for all public and private purposes as defined by the Electric Lighting Acts within the Urban District of Barmouth and the Parishes of Llanaber, Llanddwywe-is-y-Graig Township and Llanenddwyn in the Rural District of Dolgelley all in the County of Merioneth (hereinafter referred to as "the area of supply").

2. To incorporate with the Order such of the provisions contained in the Schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 as are applicable to cases in which the undertakers are not the local authority and to apply such provisions to the undertaking to be authorised by the Order subject to such variations and exceptions as may be contained therein.

3. To provide for the laying down of electric lines in certain streets and parts of streets in the area of supply within a period to be specified in the Order.

4. To authorise the applicants to open and break up streets and parts of streets in the area of supply which are not repairable by the local authority and railways.

5. To prescribe and limit the prices to be charged for a supply of electrical energy.

6. To confer upon the applicants with or without variations all or some of the powers of the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1928 and enactments incorporated therewith and to alter vary or extinguish all rights and privi-

leges which would or might interfere with any of the objects of the Order and to confer all other rights and privileges necessary for carrying such objects into effect.

7. To vary and extend the provisions of Section 21 of the Schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 with respect to the period prescribed for the laying down of mains for the purposes of general supply in some or all of the districts forming the area of supply and to define the terms upon which and the times within which such supply is to be given.

And notice is hereby also given that the draft of the Order has been deposited at the office of the Electricity Commissioners and printed copies of the draft Order as applied for and of the Order when made may be obtained (at the price of two shillings for each copy) from Mr. William George, Council Offices, Barmouth, and at the offices of the undermentioned Parliamentary Agents.

Copies of the draft Order and of the maps showing the proposed area of supply and the streets within which it is proposed that electric lines shall be laid down within a specified time have been deposited for public inspection at the office of the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Merioneth at Dolgelley and at the offices of the respective Clerks to the Barmouth Urban District Council and Dolgelley Rural District Council at Barmouth and Dolgelley respectively.

And notice is hereby further given that every local or other public authority company or person desirous of bringing before the Electricity Commissioners any objection respecting the application must do so by registered letter addressed to the Secretary, Electricity Commission, Savoy Court, Strand, W.C. 2, posted on or before the 12th day of October, 1931 and a copy of such objections must also be forwarded to the undersigned Parliamentary Agents.
