FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACTS, 1901 to 1929.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, in pursuance of Section 80 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, that he has certified the manipulation of asbestos and the manufacture or repair of articles composed wholly or partly of asbestos and processes incidental thereto, to be dangerous, and that he proposes to make Regulations, under Section 79 of the Act, to apply to all factories and workshops or parts thereof in which certain specified processes are carried on in connection with the above.

ORDER DEFINING THE EMPLOYMENT WHICH IS TO BE TREATED AS OVERTIME EMPLOYMENT.

The Northamptonshire and Soke of Peterborough Agricultural Wages Committee, in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, and the Regulations made thereunder, do by this Order vary as from 9th September, 1931, their Order of 5th June, 1929, defining the employment which is to be treated as overtime employment for the purpose of the application of any differential rate of wages for overtime employment fixed by the

said Committee for the area comprising the administrative counties of Northampton and Soke of Peterborough, which for the purposes of the said Act shall be deemed to include the county borough of Northampton, so as to provide that such employment shall be as follows:—

(i) All employment in excess of $5\frac{1}{2}$ hours on a Saturday or on such other day (not being Sunday, Easter Monday, Whit Monday, Christmas Day, or in any year in which Christmas Day falls on a Sunday, Boxing Day, and not being any day given as a holiday in lieu of any such public holiday) in every week as may be agreed between an employer and a worker, provided that in any case overtime rates shall be paid in respect of all hours worked after 1 o'clock on such day.

(ii) All employment on a Sunday.

(iii) All employment on Easter Monday, Whit Monday, and Christmas Day, except in the case of a worker who, in lieu of a holiday on any of those days, is given equivalent time off on full pay on one other weekday in the week of employment in which that holiday falls.

(iv) In any year in which Christmas Day falls on a Sunday, all employment on Boxing Day, except in the case of a worker who, in lieu of a holiday on that day, is given equivalent time off on full pay on one other weekday in the same week of employment.

(v) All employment in excess of 41 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in the weeks in which Easter Monday and Whit Monday fall.

(vi) All employment in excess of 50 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in any other week in summer.

(vii) All employment in excess of $39\frac{1}{2}$ hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in the week in which Christmas Day falls.

(viii) All employment in excess of 48 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in any other week in winter.

For the purpose of this Order, employment in summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March and terminating on the last Sunday in October, and employment in winter shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the year.
