ORDER FOR THE ALTERATION OF CORONERS' DISTRICTS.

Whereas by virtue of section 4 (1) of the Coroners (Amendment) Act, 1926, the right of the Right Honourable John Duncan Vaughan, Earl Cawdor, Lord of the several and respective Seigniories Liberties Royalties Honors Manors Lordships Freechase and Freewarren and Commotts of Kidwelly Carnwallon and Iskennen in the County of Carmarthen, to appoint a Coroner ceased on the vacancy in the Office of Coroner for such Liberties Honors Manors Lordships Freechase and Freewarren and Commotts which occurred in consequence of the death of the Franchise Coroner, Mr. John William Nicholas, of Brynteilo, Llandilo, on the 25th day of February, 1931, and for all purposes relating to Coroners the area in which the said Franchise Coroner had jurisdiction thereupon became merged in the County of Carmarthen:

Now therefore, I, the undersigned, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the power vested in me by section 12 of the Coroners (Amendment) Act, 1926, do hereby Order—

1. That the said County of Carmarthen shall henceforth include the following County Coroner's District, viz.:—

The Three Commotts District comprising the parishes of:—

Ammanford Urban, Bettws, Bury Port Urban, Cwmmamman Urban, Kidwelly, Llanarthney, Llanddarog, Llandebie,

Llandefeilog, Part of Llandilofawr called Llandilo Iscennen, Llanedy, Llanfihangel-Aberbythich, Part of Llangathen, Llangendeirne, Llangennech, Llangunnor, Llanelly Rural, Llanelly Urban, Llannon, Pembrey, Pontyberem, St. Ishmael.

The boundaries of the above district are as follows:—

On the South, the sea; on the West and North, the river Towy; on the North East, an irregular line from a point on the Towy a mile farther north than Llandilo Bridge to (say) half a mile east of Brynamman Railway Station; on the South East, the county boundary.

2. That this Order may be cited as the County of Carmarthen Coroners' Districts Order, 1931.
