BORTH AND YNYSLAS ELECTRICITY.

NOTICE is hereby given that John Butterworth, of Brentwood, Borth, in the County of Cardigan, and Harmar Goodman, of The Haven, Borth aforesaid (hereinafter called "the Undertakers") have applied to the Electricity Commissioners under the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1928, for a Special Order (hereinafter called "the Order") for all or some of the following purposes—that is to say:—

To authorise the Undertakers to generate take transform supply sell and distribute Electrical Energy for all public and private purposes as defined by the said Acts within the following area (hereinafter called "the area of supply")—that is to say:—

So much of the Parishes of Cyfoeth-y-Brenin, Henllys and Cynnull-Mawr in the Rural District of Aberystwyth as lies to the north and west of an imaginary line commencing at a point at low water mark of ordinary spring tides 56 yards or thereabouts west of the premises known as Pen-y-graig thence proceeding for a distance of 652 yards or thereabouts in a south easterly direction to a point on the north-eastern side of the Great Western Railway 27 yards or thereabouts east of the Cyfoeth-y-Brenin parish boundary thence proceeding in a north easterly direction for a distance of 148 yards or thereabouts to the north eastern corner of the premises known as Bryn-Elmen, thence proceeding for a distance of 228 yards or thereabouts in a north westerly direction to the centre of the ford across the Afon Leri thence proceeding generally in a northerly direction following the centre line of the Afon Leri to a point where such line meets the Towyn Urban District Boundary in the centre of the River Dovey.
