PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**WHEREAS** by the National Economy Act, 1931, it is enacted that during the period of one month after the commencement of that Act (that is to say, the 30th day of September, 1931), His Majesty may, in respect of the remuneration (otherwise than by way of pension assessed before the commencement of that Act) of persons in His Majesty's Service, make such Orders in Council as appear to Him to be expedient for the purposes of effecting economies in the expenditure falling to be defrayed out of the Consolidated Fund or out of moneys provided by Parliament:

And whereas it is enacted by the said Act that such Orders may (among other things) make provision for the modification or termination of statutory rights, obligations and restrictions subsisting at the date when the provisions of the Order take effect:

And whereas the amount of the salary to be paid in respect of certain offices in the Service of His Majesty has been specified in the enactments relating thereto, and it is expedient for the purposes aforesaid that the provisions hereinafter contained should have effect:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the enactment hereinbefore recited and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) Where the amount of the salary to be paid in respect of any office in His Majesty's Service is specified in any enactment there shall, as from the date when this Order takes effect, be made from that amount—

(a) in the case of a salary of £5,000 a year or more, an abatement of twenty per cent.:

(b) in the case of the salary payable in respect of the office of Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, an abatement of fifteen per cent., and in the case of any other salary of £2,000 a year or more, but less than £5,000 a year, an abatement of ten per cent.:

(c) in the case of a salary of less than £2,000 a year (not being a salary in addition to which any bonus is paid) an abatement of such percentage, not more than ten, as the Treasury may determine:

Provided that, in the case of a salary of less than £5,000 a year, there shall be made such additional abatement, if any, as is necessary to reduce the salary to £4,000 a year.

(2) Whereas by reason of the foregoing provisions of this Article an abatement of twenty per cent., is, as from the date when this Order takes effect, to be made in the salary to be paid to the Governor of Northern Ireland out of moneys provided by the Parliament of the United Kingdom under subsection (3) of section thirty-seven of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, as modified by the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922 (Session 2): now, therefore, the deductions to be made under that subsection from the Northern Ireland residuary share of reserved taxes towards the payment of that salary shall be, in the year ending on the 31st day of March, 1932, a sum of eighteen hundred pounds, and in each subsequent year a sum of sixteen hundred pounds.

2.—(1) This Order may be cited as the National Economy (Statutory Salaries) Order, 1931, and shall take effect as from the 1st day of October, 1931.

(2) This Order shall apply to Northern Ireland in so far as it deals with any enactment relating to a subject with respect to which the Parliament of Northern Ireland has not power to make laws, but subject to this provision this Order shall not extend to Northern Ireland.

**W**HEREAS by the National Economy Act, 1931, it is enacted that during the period of one month after the commencement of that Act (that is to say, the 30th day of September, 1931) His Majesty may, in respect of certain services including education, make such Orders in Council as appear to Him to be expedient for the purpose (among other purposes) of effecting economies in the expenditure falling to be defrayed out of moneys provided by Parliament:

And whereas it is enacted by the said Act that any such Order may (among other things) make provision for the modification or termination of statutory or contractual rights, obligations and restrictions subsisting at the date when the provisions of the Order take effect:

And whereas it is expedient for the purposes aforesaid that the provisions hereinafter contained should have effect:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the enactment hereinbefore recited and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. Notwithstanding anything in subsection (2) of section one hundred and eighteen of the Education Act, 1921, the total sums paid to a local education authority out of moneys provided by Parliament in aid of elementary education may be less than one half of the net expenditure of the authority recognised by the Board of Education as expenditure in aid of

which parliamentary grants should be made to the authority, and accordingly subsections (2) and (3) of the said section shall cease to have effect as respects grants in aid of elementary education.

2.—(1) Any agreement made before the 1st day of October, 1931, making provision as to the remuneration to be paid to a teacher in respect of his employment in any place of education in receipt of a grant, or in respect of which a grant is made, out of moneys provided by Parliament may be modified by the authority or persons by whom the remuneration is payable so as to provide that the remuneration shall, as from the date aforesaid, be reduced by an amount not exceeding ten per cent. of the remuneration theretofore provided by the agreement.

(2) For the purposes of this Article, the local education authority by whom any public elementary school is maintained shall be deemed to be the authority or persons by whom the remuneration to be paid to teachers in respect of their employment in that school is payable.

3.—(1) This Order may be cited as the National Economy (Education) Order, 1931, and shall have effect as from the 1st day of October, 1931.

(2) This Order shall not extend to Scotland or to Northern Ireland.

And whereas it is enacted by the said Act that any such Order may (among other things) make provision for the modification or termination of statutory or contractual rights, obligations and restrictions subsisting at the date when the provisions of the Order take effect:

And whereas it is expedient for the purposes aforesaid that the provisions hereinafter contained should have effect:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the enactment hereinbefore recited and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1.—(1) Any revised scheme of scales of salaries for teachers or modification of an existing scheme prepared by an education authority under the Education (Scotland) Act, 1918, which shall be approved by the Scottish Education Department at any time prior to the fifteenth day of November, 1931, shall, notwithstanding the date of such approval, have effect as from the first day of October, 1931.

(2) Any agreement made before the first day of October, 1931, making provision as to the remuneration to be paid to a teacher in respect of his employment in any place of education in Scotland which is in receipt of a grant, or in respect of which a grant is made, from the Education (Scotland) Fund or the Vote for Reformatory and Industrial Schools (Scotland), may be modified by the authority or persons by whom the remuneration is payable so as to provide that the remuneration shall, as from the date aforesaid, be reduced,

(a) in the case of any teacher whose remuneration is governed by a scheme of scales of salaries prepared and approved under the Education (Scotland) Act, 1918, by such amount as may be necessary to give effect to any revised scheme or modification of an existing scheme to which the foregoing subsection applies:

(b) in the case of any other teacher, by such amount as the authority or persons by whom the remuneration is payable may determine.

2. For the purpose of effecting economies in the expenditure falling to be defrayed from the Education (Scotland) Fund or the Vote for Reformatory and Industrial Schools (Scotland), the Scottish Education Department may (a) require the modification of any estimate of expenditure submitted to them in respect of any place of education as aforesaid so far as such estimate is applicable to the period beginning the first day of October, 1931, notwithstanding the provisions of any minutes or regulations relating to the acceptance of such estimate for the purpose of grant, and (b) at any time within one month from the date of this Order by minute vary any rate of grant specified in existing minutes or regulations of the Department, and such minute shall take effect from the date specified therein notwithstanding anything contained in section sixty seven of the Education (Scotland) Act, 1872, or in subsection (1) of section sixteen of the Education (Scotland) Act, 1908, or in subsection (2) of section twenty one of the Education (Scotland) Act, 1918.

3. For the purposes of paragraph (ii) of subsection (1) of section twenty one of the Education (Scotland) Act, 1918, which provides that in each financial year there shall be paid into the Education (Scotland) Fund out of moneys provided by Parliament a sum calculated by reference to the amount of the sums estimated to be expended in that year from the Vote for education in England and Wales (except so far as such sums represent certain specified expenses), the amount of the sums estimated to be expended as aforesaid in the current financial year shall be taken to be reduced by such sum as the Treasury may determine after consultation with the Scottish Education Department.

4.—(1) This Order may be cited as the National Economy (Education) (Scotland) Order, 1931, and shall have effect as from the first day of October, 1931.

(2) This Order shall extend to Scotland only.

WHEREAS by the National Economy Act, 1931, it is enacted that during the period of one month after the commencement of that Act, that is to say, the 30th day of September, 1931, His Majesty may, in respect of certain services, including Unemployment Insurance, make such Orders in Council as appear to Him to be expedient for the purposes of effecting economies in the expenditure falling to be defrayed out of the Consolidated Fund, out of moneys provided by Parliament, or out of any fund established by the enactments relating to any of the said services, and of effecting improvements in the arrangements for meeting such expenditure:

And whereas it is enacted by the said Act that any such Order may, among other things, make provision for increasing the contributions to be made to the unemployment fund and for the modification of statutory rights subsisting at the date when the provisions of the Order take effect:

And whereas it is expedient for the purposes aforesaid that the provisions hereinafter contained shall have effect:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the enactments hereinbefore recited and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. As from and after the 5th day of October, 1931, until the expiration of the extended period the contributions payable under the Acts by employed persons and their employers shall be at the respective rates set out in the First Schedule to this Order, and accordingly in paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section four of the Act of 1925 a reference to that Schedule shall be substituted for the reference to the First Schedule to the Act of 1925, and the last-mentioned Schedule and section two of the Act of 1927 (except in so far as it relates to the meaning of the expression "young men and young women"), and the First Schedule to that Act shall be repealed.

2. The following provisions shall have effect as from and after the 8th day of October, 1931, with respect to the rates of benefit under the Acts—

(a) Subsection (1) of section four of the Act of 1927 shall have effect as if the Second Schedule to this Order was substituted for the Third Schedule to that Act, and the last-mentioned Schedule and subsection (1) of section two of the Act of 1930 and the First Schedule to that Act shall be repealed;

(b) In subsection (2) of section two of the Act of 1930, (which relates to the increase in the weekly rate of benefit in respect of dependants), for the words "nine shillings," wherever those words occur, there shall be substituted the words "eight shillings."

3.—(1) In this Order the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them—

"The Acts" means the Unemployment Insurance Acts, 1920 to 1931;

"The Act of 1925," "the Act of 1927" and "the Act of 1930" mean respectively the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1925, the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1927, and the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1930;

"Benefit" means unemployment benefit;

"Extended period" has the same meaning as in subsection (1) of section four of the Act of 1925;

"Young men" and "young women" have the same meanings as in the Act of 1927.

(2) This Order and the Acts shall be construed together, and any reference in any Act or other document to the Unemployment Insurance Acts, 1920 to 1931, or to the enactments relating to unemployment insurance, shall be deemed to include a reference to this Order.

4.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Unemployment Insurance (National Economy) (No. 1) Order, 1931.

(2) This Order shall not extend to Northern Ireland.

WHEREAS by the National Economy Act, 1931, it is enacted that during the period of one month after the commencement of that Act (that is to say, the 30th day of September, 1931), His Majesty may, in respect of certain services, including National Health Insurance, make such Orders in Council as appear to Him to be expedient for the purposes of effecting economies in the expenditure falling to be defrayed out of the Consolidated Fund, out of moneys provided by Parliament, or out of any fund established by the enactments relating to any of the said services, and of effecting improvements in the arrangements for meeting such expenditure:

And whereas it is enacted by the said Act that such Orders may (among other things) make provision—

for altering the respective proportions in which expenditure in respect of any such service is to be defrayed out of any fund so established as aforesaid and out of moneys provided by Parliament and for making transfers and adjustments between any such funds, or between any such fund and any other statutory fund; and

for the modification or termination of statutory or contractual rights, obligations and restrictions subsisting at the date when the provisions of the Order take effect:

And whereas it is expedient for the purposes aforesaid that the provisions hereinafter contained shall have effect:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the enactments hereinbefore recited and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1.—(1) The Minister shall from time to time, at such dates and in respect of such periods as the Treasury may direct, ascertain by what amount the sums which would otherwise have been required by insurance committees to meet expenditure properly incurred by them in connection with medical benefit under the Acts have been curtailed by measures taken to meet the present emergency and an amount equal to the amount so ascertained in respect of each such period shall be paid out of the funds out of which benefits are paid and shall be dealt with in accordance with the provisions of the next succeeding paragraph.

(2) Any amount so paid out of such funds as aforesaid shall be applied, in such manner as the Treasury may direct, as appropriations in aid of moneys provided by Parliament for the expenses incurred by Government Departments in the administration of the Acts and shall, for the purposes of section four of the Act of 1924, be treated as part of the expenses of the administration of benefits.

(3) The foregoing provisions of this Article shall apply in relation to expenditure properly incurred in connection with medical benefit by the Seamen's National Insurance Society as they apply in relation to expenditure so incurred by an insurance committee.

2. If and in so far as any measures which the Minister may, in view of the present emergency, deem it necessary to take with respect to the remuneration of insurance practitioners, or persons supplying drugs or appliances for the purposes of medical benefit, are inconsistent with the terms of any agreement subsisting at the date when the provisions of this Order take effect, that agreement shall be deemed to be modified so far as may be necessary to enable those measures to be put into operation forthwith.

3. The Minister shall, so soon as may be, in respect of the period from the 2nd day of January, 1928, to the 31st day of December, 1931, and thereafter in respect of each half-year, ascertain the number of contributions represented by the sums collected on account of contributions under paragraph (ii) of subsection (1) of section nine of the Act of 1925 (which relates to employed persons who have attained the age of sixty-five) and in respect of each such period a sum equivalent to fourpence halfpenny multiplied by the number so ascertained shall be transferred from the Pensions Account to the Central Fund.

4. So much of subsection (1) of section sixty-eight of the Act of 1924 as provides that in respect of each year there shall be paid to the Central Fund a contribution out of moneys provided by Parliament shall cease to have effect.

5.—(1) This Order may be cited as the National Economy (National Health Insurance) Order, 1931, and shall have effect as from the first day of October, nineteen hundred and thirty-one.

(2) In this Order—

“the Minister” means, as respects England, the Minister of Health and, as respects Scotland, the Department of Health for Scotland;

“the Acts” means the Acts relating to National Health Insurance;

“the Act of 1924” means the National Health Insurance Act, 1924;

“the Act of 1925” means the Widows', Orphans' and Old Age Contributory Pensions Act, 1925;

“the Central Fund” means the Central Fund established under section sixty-seven of the Act of 1924;

“the Pensions Account” means the Pensions Account established under section eleven of the Act of 1925.

(3) This Order and the Acts shall be construed together, and any reference in any Act or other document to the National Health Insurance Acts, 1924-1930, or to the enactments relating to national health insurance, shall be deemed to include a reference to this Order.

(4) This Order shall not extend to Northern Ireland.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the National Economy Act, 1931, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy

Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Sub-section (4) of section two of the Pensions and Yeomanry Pay Act, 1884 (which confers upon a soldier a statutory right to receive such pension as was fixed by any order applying to him and in force at the time of his enlistment and for the payment whereof money shall have been voted by Parliament) shall, save as respects pensions assessed before the 30th day of September, 1931, cease to have effect in relation to soldiers and airmen whether enlisted before or after the coming into operation of this Order.

2. This Order may be cited as the National Economy (Soldiers' and Airmen's Pensions) Order, 1931, and shall have effect as from the 1st day of October, 1931.

And whereas it is enacted by the said Act that such Orders may (among other things) make provision for the modification or termination of statutory rights, obligations and restrictions subsisting at the date when the provisions of the Order take effect:

And whereas it is expedient for the purposes aforesaid that the provisions hereinafter contained should have effect:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the enactment hereinbefore recited and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. Subject as hereinafter provided, any statutory or contractual obligation created before the coming into operation of this Order, whereby the Minister of Transport (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") is required to make payments out of the Road Fund to any authority or person, may be terminated by notice in writing given by the Minister to that authority or person:

Provided that—

(a) no such obligation as aforesaid shall, in so far as the Minister is thereby required to make payments towards estimated expenditure which has been approved by him, be terminated under the powers conferred by this Article if the Minister is satisfied that the authority or person to whom the payments are required to be made had, on the 1st day of October, 1931, paid or become liable to pay more than twenty-five per cent. of the estimated expenditure so approved:

(b) this Article shall not apply with respect to any payments out of the Road Fund required to be made by subsection (4) of section three of the Roads Act, 1920, by section fifteen of the London Traffic Act, 1924, by section eighty-seven of the Local Government Act, 1929, by section fifty-four of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1929, or by paragraph 14 of the Fourth Schedule to the Road Traffic Act, 1930.

2.—(1) Where the Minister withholds any contribution out of the Road Fund which, but for the exercise of the power hereinbefore conferred on him, he would have been required to make towards the expenditure of any authority or person in connection with the acquisition of land, any notice to treat served by that authority or person before the 1st day of October, 1931, for the purpose of the acquisition of that land may, with the written consent of the Minister, be withdrawn by notice in writing served by that authority or person, but in that event the authority or person shall be liable to pay to the person upon whom such a notice of withdrawal is served compensation equal to the amount of any expenses which he proves to have been reasonably incurred by him by reason or in consequence of the service of the notice to treat; and any dispute as to the right to any such compensation or as to the amount thereof shall be determined by an official arbitrator appointed under the Acquisition of Land (Assessment of Compensation) Act, 1919:

Provided that no notice to treat served for the purpose of the acquisition of any land shall be so withdrawn—

(a) if the authority or person by whom the notice was served has entered on that land; or

(b) if the compensation payable to the person on whom the notice to treat was served has been finally assessed.

(2) Where compensation is paid by any authority or person in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Article, a sum equal to such part, if any, of the amount of that compensation as may be determined by the Minister shall be paid to the authority or person out of the Road Fund.

3. Where by or under any enactment powers have been conferred on any authority or person for the execution of any work, or for the acquisition of any land, towards the expenses of which the Minister was required by reason of any statutory or contractual obligation created before the coming into operation of this Order to make a payment out of the Road Fund and the period within which those powers may be exercised was limited by or under that enactment, then, if the obligation is terminated by the Minister under the powers conferred by Article 1 of this Order, that period shall be deemed to have been extended by three years.

4.—(1) This Order may be cited as the National Economy (Road Services) Order, 1931, and shall come into operation and have effect as from the 1st day of October, 1931.

(2) This Order shall not extend to Northern Ireland.

My Lords read Section 8 of the Currency and Bank Notes Act, 1928.

The Chancellor of the Exchequer informs the Board that the Governor and Company of the Bank of England have represented to him that it is in their opinion expedient that the amount of the fiduciary note issue be maintained at 275 million pounds, to which it was increased under the authority of Treasury Minutes dated the 1st August, 1931, the 21st August, 1931, and the 11th September, 1931. He proposes accordingly to authorise the Bank to issue fiduciary bank notes to the total amount of 275 million pounds for a further period of four weeks.

My Lords approve and direct that the Bank of England be notified accordingly.

Let a copy of this Minute be laid before both Houses of Parliament under Section 8 subsection (3) of the Currency and Bank Notes Act 1928.

(c) prevent any person who is maintaining at the date hereof a regular service in accord-

ance with Section 6 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, upon the approved route numbered 293A from using on those days for the purpose of plying for hire upon that route in any of the streets or parts thereof declared to be "restricted streets" by any Order made by the Minister of Transport under Section 7 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, and forming part of that route in addition to the number of omnibuses which he may operate in those streets or parts thereof under the said Regulations, one additional omnibus thereon:

provided that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to affect or derogate from the powers of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis under the provisions of Section 52 of the Metropolitan Police Act, 1839, to give directions to constables for keeping order and for preventing any obstruction of the thoroughfares.
