PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Dockyard Ports Regulation Act, 1865, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council, from time to time, by Order in Council, to define the limits of a Dockyard Port for the purposes of that Act, and to make regulations in relation to any Dockyard Port for all or any of the purposes in the said Act particularly mentioned, and for such other purposes as from time to time seem necessary, with a view to the proper protection of His Majesty's vessels, dockyards or property, or to the requirements of His Majesty's Naval Service:

And whereas by the same Act it is also enacted that in relation to any Dockyard Port, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council, from time to time, by Order in Council, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade to make rules concerning the lights or signals to be carried or used, and the steps for avoiding collision to be taken by His Majesty's vessels and other vessels navigating the waters of the port, and of the approaches thereto:

And whereas in pursuance of the said Act certain Regulations and Rules were made by

Orders in Council dated the 16th day of June, 1915, the 4th day of September, 1918, and the 17th day of March, 1925, with reference to the two Dockyard Ports of Chatham and Sheerness:

And whereas it appears expedient to amend such Rules as hereinafter provided:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the said Act or otherwise in Him vested, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. This Order shall take effect from one calendar month from the date hereof.

2. The Second Schedule of the said Order in Council dated the 16th day of June, 1915, as amended by the said Orders in Council dated the 4th day of September, 1918, and the 17th day of March, 1925, is hereby repealed.

3. The following Rules shall have effect in relation to the two Dockyard Ports of Chatham and Sheerness and shall be read and construed as the Second Schedule of the said Order in Council dated the 16th day of June, 1915.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

RULES.

Observance of "Regulations for preventing Collisions at Sea."

1. All vessels within the limits of the Dockyard Ports, with the exception of merchant and other private vessels above Garrison Point, shall comply with the "Regulations for preventing Collisions at Sea" made from time to time under the Merchant Shipping Act, except in so far as those regulations are inconsistent with the rules hereinafter contained.

NOTE.—Above Garrison Point, merchant and other private vessels will comply with the Medway Conservancy Byelaws.

Vessels not to approach Vessels carrying Royal or other Standard at Masthead.

2. No vessel shall unnecessarily approach within two cables of any vessel carrying the Royal or any other Standard at the masthead, when under way in the waters of the Dockyard Ports outside Garrison Point.

Vessels to keep clear of His Majesty's Vessels.

3. When one of His Majesty's vessels or other vessel being in charge of His Majesty's Officers under way within the limits of the Dockyard Ports hoists the Red Ensign over "M" flag (International Code—Alphabetical) by day, or a red light by night, at the foremast head, all other of His Majesty's vessels present in the Port shall hoist the Pilot Jack by day, or show position lights (two white lights vertical, 8 feet apart, hoisted at the peak, or if no gaff, hoisted abreast of the maintop in the middle line of the ship or on the Ensign Staff) by night, as a general warning. The Pilot Jack shall also be hoisted by day, or position lights by night, for the same purpose at Chatham Dockyard and at the Signal Station at Garrison Point Fort, Sheerness, and all other vessels under way in the Dockyard Ports shall keep out of the way of the said vessel flying the Red Ensign over "M" flag, or showing the red light at the foremast head; provided always that the said vessel shall be navigated with due care and at a moderate speed.

4. In the Dockyard Port of Chatham, when and so long as the Pilot Jack is hoisted at the flagstaff at Locks, denoting that one of His Majesty's Vessels is intending to enter or leave the locks, or the Red Burgee is hoisted on a staff fixed to No. 3 building shed, denoting that one of His Majesty's vessels is intending to enter or leave No. 2, 3 or 4 Dock, all steam vessels under way in the Dockyard Port shall keep out of the way of the vessel which is being moved and also of the tugs which may be in attendance upon her.

5. In the Dockyard Port of Sheerness, when and so long as the Red Burgee is hoisted at the Harbour Sheers, denoting that one of His Majesty's Vessels is intending to enter or leave the basins, all steam vessels under way in the Dockyard Port shall keep out of the way of the vessel which is being moved and also of the tugs which may be in attendance upon her.

6. In the Dockyard Port of Sheerness, when and so long as the Red Burgee is hoisted at the entrance to North Camber, denoting that one of His Majesty's Vessels is about to be docked or undocked in the said Camber, all steam vessels under way in the Dockyard Port

shall keep out of the way of the vessel which is being moved and of the tugs which may be in attendance upon her.

Vessels to keep clear of Dredger Anchors.

7. All merchant and other private vessels shall keep clear of the anchors of dredgers within the limits of the Dockyard Ports. Such anchors will not necessarily be buoyed, and may lie as far as 200 fathoms from the dredger to which they belong. Should a dredger be removed altogether from her anchors, the position of the anchors and moorings will be indicated by cylindrical buoys painted white and with a broad red band around the middle of the drum.

Vessel turning round.

8. When a steam vessel under way (which includes a tug with a tow) is about to turn round by night or by day, she shall signify the same by four short blasts of the steam whistle in rapid succession, followed after a short interval, if turning with her head to starboard, by one short blast, and if with her head to port, by two short blasts, and whilst turning shall repeat such signal to any approaching vessel, which latter vessel shall take action to avoid collision.

Signal directing vessels and boats to keep out of the way.

9. When any seagoing steam vessel, steam vessel towing, steam dredger or steam hopper under way within the limits of the Dockyard Ports shall by reason of the crowded nature of the channel or anchorage, or from any other cause find it unsafe or impracticable to keep out of the way of other vessels or boats, she shall signify the same by four short blasts of the steam whistle or syren blown in rapid succession, and all vessels and boats shall keep out of the way of the vessel making this signal; provided always that the latter shall be navigated with due care and at a moderate speed.

Sound Signals in Fog, &c.

10. In fog, mist, falling snow, or heavy rain storms, whether by day or by night, the sound signals required by Rule 8 or Rule 9 shall be repeated at intervals of not more than two minutes.

Lights and Signals for Dredgers.

11. A dredger when at work or in a position for working shall carry the following Lights and Signals, viz. :—

Lights between Sunset and Sunrise :—

(a) *Forward.*—In the forward part of the dredger at a height of not less than 20 and not exceeding 40 feet above the hull, a white light in a lantern so constructed as to show a clear, uniform and unbroken light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least one mile.

(b) *Amidships.*—Three such white lights placed in a triangular form at least 8 feet apart, at right angles to the keel and with the apex uppermost, the base of the triangle to be at least 10 feet higher than the forward light and to be also higher than and clear of the framework, funnels, or other erections upon the dredger. If so moored or working as to make it necessary to prohibit the passage of vessels on one or both

sides, a red light or lights in a lantern so constructed as to show a clear, uniform and unbroken light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least one mile, is, or are, to be substituted for the lower light or lights of the triangle, on the side or sides on which passage is prohibited.

(c) *Aft*.—One such white light at or near the stern of the dredger and at such a height that it shall not be less than 15 feet lower than the forward light.

Signals between Sunrise and Sunset:—

Amidships.—Three black balls of not less than 2 feet in diameter placed in a triangular form at least 8 feet apart, at right angles to the keel with the apex uppermost, the base of the triangle to be higher than and clear of the framework, funnels, or any other erection upon the dredger. If so moored or working as to make it necessary to prohibit passage on one or both sides, a red flag or flags at least 5 feet in the hoist is, or are, to be substituted for the lower ball or balls of the triangle on the side or sides on which passage is prohibited.

Signal in Fog:—

In fog, mist, falling snow, or heavy rain storms a dredger at work or in a position for working shall at intervals of not more than one minute sound a gong rapidly for about 5 seconds.

Speed of Vessels Navigating Ports.

12. No merchant or other private steam vessel when navigating the water area between a line drawn from Garrison Point to Grain Martello Tower and a parallel line from the end of the Town Pier, Sheerness, or when navigating the water area above Whitewall Creek, shall exceed the speed of six knots over the ground.

Steam Vessels Navigating against the Tide.

13. Steam vessels navigating against the tide shall, before rounding any point of the River Medway, ease their engines and wait until any other vessels rounding the point with the tide have passed clear.

Marking of Wrecks.

14. Should a vessel sink or become a wreck in any part of the Dockyard Port so that an obstruction in a navigable fairway is caused, which in the opinion of the King's Harbour Master it is necessary to mark, such vessel or wreck will be indicated by the following marks:—

(a) *If within a line drawn 305 degrees from Garrison Point, Sheerness, to Dolly Bank,*

Either (i) by a vessel moored so as to lie on the channel side of the wreck or obstruction, from which vessel will be exhibited:

By Day.—A green flag and two green balls one from each end of a cross yard with a horizontal distance between the balls of not less than six feet and not more than twelve feet.

By Night.—Two green lights, one from each end of a cross yard with a horizontal distance between the lights of not less than six feet and not more than twelve feet.

The above signals may, if necessary, be shown from the wreck itself or from a fixed obstruction.

Fog Signal.—The vessel marking the wreck or obstruction will at intervals of not more than one minute ring a bell rapidly for about five seconds.

Or (ii) by a green cylindrical lighted or unlighted wreck buoy (exhibiting a green occulting light, if lighted) which may be placed near to or over a wreck, but will not indicate which side a vessel may pass.

(b) *If to seaward of a line drawn 305 degrees from Garrison Point, Sheerness, to Dolly Bank.*

By the Uniform System of Marking Wrecks in the Open Sea adopted for the Coasts of England, Wales, Scotland, Ireland and the Isle of Man.

Penalties.

NOTE.—The master of every merchant or other private vessel to which the rules in this Schedule relate must observe and cause to be observed the provisions of these rules as far as they relate to his vessel, and any such master by his wilful default infringing or causing any infringement of any of the provisions of these rules is guilty of a misdemeanour.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 30th day of July, 1931, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Prittlewell and partly out of the New Parish (sometime District) of All Saints, Prittlewell, both in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford:

“Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Prittlewell and the said New Parish of All Saints, Prittlewell, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is

insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Prittlewell, and of the said New Parish of All Saints, Prittlewell, which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas a plot of land situate within the said proposed separate District has been conveyed to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as the site for a permanent Church for such District and there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a sum of £1,500 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church:

"And whereas the said plot of land has been conveyed and the said sum of £1,500 has been contributed as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the contributors of the purchase money for the said plot of land and of the said sum of £1,500 have nominated to us the Bishop of Chelmsford for the time being as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish shall be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry, now Bishop of Chelmsford (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Prittlewell and of the said New Parish of All Saints, Prittlewell, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, become and be

constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Luke, Prittlewell'.

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of such New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and be exercised by the said Henry, Bishop of Chelmsford, and his successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Luke, Prittlewell, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Prittlewell and of the New Parish (sometime District) of All Saints, Prittlewell, both in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford, which, taken together, are bounded upon the east by the Parish of Southchurch, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north, upon the west, and upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Southchurch from the said Parish of Prittlewell at the junction of Hamstel Road with Eastern Avenue, and extending thence north westward along the middle of Eastern Avenue for a distance of 53 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Bournemouth Park Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Bournemouth Park Road for a distance of 18 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Royston Avenue, and extending thence first westward, then south westward and then again westward along the middle of Royston Avenue for a distance of 24½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Sutton Road, and extending thence first southward, then eastward and then again southward along the middle of Sutton Road (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said Parish of Prittlewell from the said New Parish of All Saints, Prittlewell) for a distance of 36 chains or thereabouts to its junction with North Avenue, and extending thence eastward along the middle of North Avenue for a distance of 64 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hamstel Road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of All Saints, Prittlewell, from the said Parish of Southchurch."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme

to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chelmsford.

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Coltishall with Hautbois Magna is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in the Very Reverend David Herbert Somerset Cranage, Litt. D., Dean of the Cathedral Church of Norwich:

"And whereas the said David Herbert Somerset Cranage is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Coltishall with Hautbois Magna now vested in him

as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Dean and Chapter of the said Cathedral Church of Norwich (hereinafter called 'the said Dean and Chapter of Norwich') and their successors:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Bertram, now Bishop of Norwich has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Coltishall with Hautbois Magna which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parishes or Districts in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parishes of Coltishall and Hautbois Magna:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said David Herbert Somerset Cranage (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), and with the consent of the said Dean and Chapter of Norwich (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Capitular Seal to be affixed to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Coltishall with Hautbois Magna now vested in him the said David Herbert Somerset Cranage as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Dean and Chapter of Norwich and their successors, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Dean and Chapter of Norwich and by their successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

"And whereas the Reverend John Talbot Skinner Law, Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Batley, is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Peter, Morley, now vested in him as aforesaid as such Vicar or Incumbent should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Wakefield for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend James Buchanan, now Bishop of Wakefield, is willing to accept such transfer and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said James Buchanan, Bishop of Wakefield, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Saint Peter, Morley, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that

is to say, in the New Parish of Saint Peter, Morley:

REGULATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF CHEMISTS
IN THE GOVERNMENT LABORATORY.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time. Competitions do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held as occasion arises on the occurrence of vacancies.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 23 and must not have attained the age of 28 on a date to be fixed in respect of the competition in which they are to take part. Candidates born on the governing date would be admitted on the day they attained the age of 23, but not on the day on which they attained the age of 28. A candidate who has served or is serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force may deduct from his actual age any time during which he has so served.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made—

(a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.

(c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject, but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called

upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. The candidates must possess a university degree with first or second class honours in chemistry or the Associateship of the Institute of Chemistry and must have had not less than one year's post-graduate experience in chemical work. They should have a working knowledge of technical French and German.

5. The Government Chemist will take such steps as he may think most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancy or vacancies which he desires to fill on any one occasion, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

6. Application shall be addressed in the first instance to the Government Chemist, and he will examine the candidates' credentials and will submit the names of such candidates as appear to have the requisite qualifications and to be best fitted for appointment to the Civil Service Commissioners, who, if dissatisfied with the number or quality of candidates for any vacancy, may require further search to be made for qualified candidates.

7. Candidates who are recommended by the Government Chemist and are accepted by the Civil Service Commissioners will be admitted to (a) an interview before a Selection Board, and (b) a written examination in English. A Selection Board shall be nominated by the Commissioners in consultation with the authorities of the Department, who shall be represented upon it, and, if practicable, one of the Commissioners shall be the Chairman. The Selection Board will take into consideration the candidates' record of experience and education, any recommendations that they may receive from persons named by the candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past, and the candidates' scientific knowledge and their personal qualities as shown at the interview; and on their estimation of all the above evidence the Board will frame their decisions, which will be final. The Selection Board will arrange the candidates in order of merit, and the vacancies will be filled by the appointment of the candidates in order from the list, subject to their passing the examination in English and satisfying the Commissioners that they are eligible in all respects.

8. The appointment of selected candidates will be subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of age, nationality, health and character, and will not be confirmed unless and until they have passed the prescribed period of probation to the satisfaction of the Government Chemist. Female candidates must be unmarried or widows, and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

9. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment.

The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at school, at the University, in the Forces, or otherwise.

10. Each candidate admitted to the qualifying examination shall pay a fee of £1; a candidate exempted from the qualifying examination shall pay a fee of £1 before admission to interview by the Selection Board. A candidate selected for appointment shall pay a fee of £8, towards which the fee paid on examination or interview shall count, before the issue of the certificate of qualification for appointment.
