A PROCLAMATION

IN ORDER TO THE ELECTING AND SUMMONING
THE SIXTEEN PEERS OF SCOTLAND.

WHEREAS We have in Our Council thought fit to declare Our pleasure for summoning and holding a Parliament of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, on Tuesday, the Third day of November next ensuing the date hereof: In order, therefore, to the electing and summoning the Sixteen Peers of Scotland who are to sit in the House of Peers in the said Parliament, We do, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, issue forth this Our Royal

Proclamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to assemble and meet at the Palace of Holyroodhouse, in Edinburgh, on Thursday, the Twenty-ninth day of October instant, at Twelve o'clock Noon, to nominate and choose the Sixteen Peers to sit and vote in the House of Peers in the said ensuing Parliament by open Election and Plurality of Voices of the Peers that shall be then present, and of the Proxies of such as shall be absent (such Proxies being Peers, and producing a Mandate in writing duly signed before Witnesses, and both the Constituent and Proxy being qualified according to Law); and the Lord Clerk Register and the Principal Clerk of the Session are hereby respectively required to attend such Meeting, and to take the Votes of the said Peers, and immediately after such Election made and duly examined to certify the Names of the Sixteen Peers so elected, and to sign and attest the same in the presence of the said Peers the Electors, and return such Certificate into Our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain: And We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly command and require the Lord Provost of Edinburgh, and all other the Magistrates of the said City, to take especial care to preserve the Peace thereof during the time of the said Election, and to prevent all manner of Riots, Tumults, Disorders, and Violence whatsoever: And We strictly charge and command that this Our Royal Proclamation be duly published at the Market Cross at Edinburgh, and in all the County Towns of Scotland, Ten Days at least before the Time hereby appointed for the Meeting of the said Peers to proceed to such Election.

WHEREAS by Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as amended by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1893, and extended by the Borough Councillors (Alteration of Number) Act, 1925, it is (amongst other things) enacted that if a majority of the whole Council of a Borough agree to petition and the Council thereupon petition The King for an alteration of the number of Councillors of a Borough, it shall be lawful for His Majesty from time to time by Order in Council to fix the number of Councillors to be allotted to such Borough:

And whereas by the Wallasey Corporation Act, 1927, the Borough of Wallasey was extended and a part of the area added to the Borough was formed into a new Ward named the Moreton Ward:

And whereas it was provided by the said Act that two Councillors should be assigned to the said Moreton Ward and that, subject to certain conditions thereby imposed, when the number of persons rated in the Ward or the aggregate rating of the Ward increased so as to justify an increase of the number of Councillors of the Ward it should be lawful for the Council of the said Borough to petition The King for an alteration of the number of the Councillors of the Ward and for the purposes of any such Petition and the proceedings thereon the provisions of Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as amended by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1893, and extended by

the Borough Councillors (Alteration of Number) Act, 1925, should apply with the necessary modifications as in the case of a Petition presented by the Council of a Borough not divided into Wards praying only for an alteration of the number of Councillors of the Borough:

And whereas a majority of the whole Council of the Borough of Wallasey on the 2nd day of July, 1931, agreed to petition, and the said Council thereupon petitioned His Majesty for an alteration of the number of Councillors of the Moreton Ward of the said Borough:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 23rd day of July, 1931, to refer the said Petition to a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council to consider the same on the 24th day of August, 1931, and report their opinion thereon to His Majesty in Council:

And whereas Notice of the said Petition and of the time when it pleased His Majesty to order that the same should be taken into consideration by His Privy Council was published in the London Gazette one month at least before the said Petition was so considered:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance and exercise of the powers in Him vested by the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882 and 1893, the Borough Councillors (Alteration of Number) Act, 1925, and by the Wallasey Corporation Act, 1927, and of every other power enabling Him in that behalf, doth, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, order and direct that:—

1. The number of Councillors of the said Moreton Ward shall be increased from two to three.

2.—(1) The additional Councillor of the said Ward shall be elected at the ordinary Election of Councillors on the first day of November, 1931.

(2) The additional Councillor so elected shall retire on the first day of November, 1932.

(3) The Councillor elected by the smaller number of votes at the ordinary election on the first day of November, 1931, shall be deemed to be the additional Councillor so to retire on the first day of November, 1932.

(4) If there is no poll at the ordinary election of Councillors in the year 1931, or for any reason it is doubtful which of the Councillors elected at the said election should retire on the first day of November, 1932, the matter shall be determined at the first or second meeting of the Council after the election by lot under the direction of the Mayor or other person presiding at the meeting.

visions of Section 1 of the said Act, subject to the necessary modifications, to any part of His Majesty's dominions other than a self-governing dominion (as therein defined) in like manner as they apply to India, and, in particular, such Order in Council may determine the Court by which the jurisdiction conferred by those provisions is to be exercised:

And whereas the Colony of the Straits Settlements is a part of His Majesty's dominions other than a self-governing dominion as aforesaid:

And whereas it is expedient to provide for applying the aforesaid provisions of the said Act to the Colony of the Straits Settlements:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in the exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Indian and Colonial Divorce Jurisdiction Act, 1926, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order in Council may be cited as the Straits Settlements Divorce Jurisdiction Order in Council, 1931.

2. On and after the first day of December, 1931, the provisions of the first section of the Indian and Colonial Divorce Jurisdiction Act, 1926, shall apply to the Colony of the Straits Settlements in like manner as they apply to India.

3. In the application of the said provisions to the said Colony—

(a) The Court which is to exercise the jurisdiction thereby conferred shall be the Supreme Court of the Colony of the Straits Settlements, and references in the said first section to a High Court in India shall be read as references to such Supreme Court;

(b) references in the said first section to India shall be read as references to the Colony of the Straits Settlements; and

(c) the reference to the Secretary of State in Council of India in the said section shall be read as referring to the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Holt and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Grimley, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Worcester and in the Diocese of Worcester:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the late Right Reverend Ernest, Bishop of Worcester, pursuant to the pro-

visions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Holt and Grimley duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Worcester and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Worcester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the approval of the said Bishop of Worcester embodying certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Holt and Grimley are now full the Reverend Alfred Cecil Fox being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Holt and the Reverend William Herald being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Grimley:

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said two Benefices of Holt and Grimley now belongs to one and the same Patron:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the Right Reverend Arthur, now Bishop of Worcester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Holt and the said Benefice of Grimley shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Grimley with Holt' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Holt only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Grimley and the then Incumbent of Holt shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Grimley only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Holt and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Holt if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Grimley shall have been instituted to Grimley subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Grimley before that date and shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice

of Grimley following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Holt and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Holt shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Grimley shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Holt and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"4. That at any time and from time to time after the Union has taken effect the Incumbent of the United Benefice shall employ such clerical or lay assistance in the performance of the duties of the United Benefice as the Bishop may require and towards the remuneration of clergy or lay workers so required to be employed the Incumbent of the United Benefice shall be liable to provide out of the income of the United Benefice such sum as may be necessary not exceeding the sum of £150 in any one year.

"5. That upon the union taking effect or upon the cessation of any pension which may become payable out of the income of the United Benefice of Grimley with Holt to the said Alfred Cecil Fox (whichever shall the later happen) all the tithe rentcharges glebe lands and all other the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice of Grimley with Holt or which may hereafter belong to the same United Benefice shall be charged and for ever after be chargeable in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the Benefice of Ombersley with Doverdale in the said Diocese of Worcester, with a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £65 the same annual sum or yearly rentcharge to be as from the date of the said union taking effect or as from the date of the cessation of any pension to the said Alfred Cecil Fox as aforesaid (as the case may be) due and payable to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ombersley with Doverdale and the said annual sum or yearly rentcharge to be apportionable between any outgoing Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ombersley with Doverdale or his representatives on the one hand and his successor in the same Incumbency on the other hand and to be receivable by the Incumbent in whose favour it is charged as aforesaid by equal half yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year and for the recovery of the said yearly rentcharge the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ombersley with Doverdale and his successors shall have and be entitled to all the powers and remedies provided by Sections 121 and 122 of the Law of Property Act, 1925, in respect of rentcharges to which those Sections apply. Provided always that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice of Grimley with Holt shall by any deed duly executed by him

under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any statute in that behalf enabling him, grant, convey and annex to the said Benefice of Ombersley with Doverdale any part or parts of the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice of Grimley with Holt which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Worcester for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for the said yearly rentcharge hereby proposed to be created as aforesaid then the said annual sum or yearly rentcharge shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and be no longer payable.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923 and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make certain alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Worcester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Worcester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Supplementary Scheme bearing date the 25th day of June, 1931, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Supplementary Scheme under the eleventh Section of that Measure with reference to the Benefices of Gloucester, Saint Aldate, Gloucester, Saint John the Baptist, Gloucester, Saint Mary de Crypt with All Saints and Saint Owen, and Gloucester, Saint Michael with Saint Mary de Grace, all situate in the City of Gloucester and in the Diocese of Gloucester (hereinafter referred to as the said four Benefices) and further under the nineteenth section of the said Measure with reference to the taking down of the Church of the Parish of the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Aldate:

“Whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council dated the 27th day of June, 1927, and published in the London Gazette on the 5th day of July, 1927 (hereinafter referred to as the original Order in Council), provision was made (inter alia) for the union of the said four Benefices and also for the union of the Parishes of the said Benefices of Gloucester, Saint Aldate, and Gloucester, Saint John the Baptist, upon the next avoidance of that one of such four Benefices which should last be avoided after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of the original Order in Council:

“And whereas the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Aldate, is now vacant and since the date of the publication of the original Order in Council as aforesaid the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint John the Baptist, has been avoided, and the Reverend Canon Herbert Morris Braithwaite who prior to the said date was the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Michael with Saint Mary de Grace, and is still the Incumbent of that Benefice has by virtue of the provisions of the original Order in Council become the Incumbent also of the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint John the Baptist:

“And whereas by the original Order in Council it was provided and directed that upon the union of the said four Benefices taking effect a portion amounting to £200 per annum of the annual stipend payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint John the Baptist, should be severed and diverted from that Benefice and that a part thereof namely a sum of £100 per annum should be applied for the endowment of a new District to be constituted within or near the City of Gloucester, and since the date of the original Order in Council the District of Saint

Aldate, Finlay Road, Gloucester, has been so constituted:

“And whereas it has been represented to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and it appears to us to be expedient that the taking effect of the union of the said four Benefices and the union of the Parishes of the said Benefices of Gloucester, Saint Aldate, and Gloucester, Saint John the Baptist, should be expedited as hereinafter recommended and proposed and also that the said sum of £100 per annum which, as aforesaid, is under the provisions of the original Order in Council to be applied for the endowment of a new District should forthwith be transferred to the said District of Saint Aldate, Finlay Road, Gloucester:

“And whereas the said Church of Gloucester, Saint Aldate, upon the taking effect of the union hereinafter recommended and proposed of the Parishes of the said Benefices of Gloucester, Saint Aldate, and Gloucester, Saint John the Baptist, will no longer be required for purposes of Divine Service:

“Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, with the consent of the Right Reverend Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent also of the said Herbert Morris Braithwaite (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“1. That the union of the said four Benefices shall take effect upon the first avoidance of the said Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Mary de Crypt with All Saints and Saint Owen, after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme (hereinafter referred to as the said date), and that thereupon the Parishes of the said Benefices of Gloucester, Saint Mary de Crypt with All Saints and Saint Owen, and Gloucester, Saint Michael with Saint Mary de Grace, shall also be united as directed by the original Order in Council, and pending the union of the said four Benefices as aforesaid the said three Benefices of Gloucester, Saint Michael with Saint Mary de Grace, Gloucester, Saint Aldate, and Gloucester, Saint John the Baptist, shall upon the said date be united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘The United Benefice of Gloucester, Saint Michael with Saint John the Baptist’ and thereupon the union of the Parishes of the said Benefices of Gloucester, Saint Aldate, and Gloucester, Saint John the Baptist which is directed by the original Order in Council shall immediately take effect.

“2. "And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Tynemouth Priory which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will render the same Benefice more eligible for augmentation out of funds under our control, and this circumstance will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the

Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the New Parish of Tynemouth Priory:

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Edward Frederick Lindley, Baron Irwin, and Lord Eustace Percy, being the persons whose consent is required by the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and of the Act of the 1st and 2nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 106 (in testimony of which consent they have signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Newcastle Diocesan Society (in testimony whereof the Society has caused their Corporate Seal to be affixed to this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Harold Ernest, Bishop of Newcastle (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the Law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Tynemouth Priory shall be transferred to the said Newcastle Diocesan Society and their successors and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Newcastle Diocesan Society and by their successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Newcastle.
