PARLIAMENTARY ELECTIONS.
NORTHERN IRELAND.

RETURNING OFFICERS CHARGES.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, pursuant to Section 3 (3) of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that they have, under powers conferred upon them by Section 29 of the Representation of the People Act, 1918, made an Order (dated 5th October, 1931), prescribing Scale of maximum Charges of Returning Officers at Parliamentary Elections in Northern Ireland. The Rhone Spinning Company Limited, Sun Street, Keighley, Yorkshire, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the

afternoon shift in consecutive weeks and that suitable accommodation for clothing put off during working hours, messroom accommodation and washing facilities shall be provided; and that additional daily thermometer readings shall be taken and recorded if atmospheric humidity is artificially produced.
