"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorise the payment of an allowance of 9d. a day to the Naval rating employed as Draughtsman in the Fleet Flagship of the Atlantic Fleet.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

WHEREAS by Section 284 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (57-8 V. c. 60) (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act) it is enacted that, where the legislature of any British Possession provides for the survey of, and grant of certificates for, passenger steamers, and the Board of Trade report to His Majesty The King that they are satisfied that the certificates are to the like effect, and are granted after a like survey, and in such manner as to be equally efficient with the certificates granted for the same purpose in the United Kingdom under that Act, His Majesty in Council may—

(1) declare that the certificates granted in the said British possession shall be of the same force as if granted under that Act; and

(2) declare that all or any of the provisions of Part III of that Act which relate to passenger steamers' certificates shall, either without modification or with such modifications as to His Majesty may seem necessary, apply to the certificates granted in the said British possession; and

(3) impose such conditions and make such regulations with respect to the certificates, and to the use, delivery, and cancellation thereof, as to His Majesty may seem fit, and impose fines not exceeding fifty pounds for the breach of those conditions and regulations.

And whereas by the Indian Merchant Shipping Act, 1923, as amended by the Indian Mer-

chant Shipping (Amendment) Act, 1928 (hereinafter referred to as the Indian Merchant Shipping Acts), the Indian Legislature constituted by the Government of India Act provided for the survey of, and grant of certificates for, passenger steamers in British India:

And whereas the Board of Trade have reported to His Majesty that they are satisfied that the certificates for foreign-going passenger steamers granted under the Indian Merchant Shipping Acts are to the like effect, and are granted after a like survey, and in such manner as to be equally efficient with the certificates granted for the same purpose in the United Kingdom under the principal Act:

And whereas there are in force two Orders in Council relating to certificates for passenger steamers granted in British India, that is to say, the Order made on the 26th day of June, 1884, respecting certificates granted in Bombay, and the Order made on the 17th day of October, 1884, respecting certificates granted in Bengal, and by virtue of Section 745 of the principal Act those Orders continue in force as if they had been made under that Act:

And whereas by Section 738 of the principal Act, it is (amongst other things) provided that where His Majesty has power under that Act to make an Order in Council, His Majesty may from time to time by Order in Council revoke any Order so made:

And whereas it is expedient that the said recited Orders in Council should be revoked:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Him by the principal Act, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare as follows that is to say:—

1. Certificates of survey for foreign-going passenger steamers granted in British India under the Indian Merchant Shipping Acts by the proper authority shall be of the same force as if granted under the principal Act.

2. All the provisions of Part III of the principal Act which relate to passenger steamers' certificates shall, without modification, apply to such certificates as are referred to in Article 1 of this Order.

3. The Orders in Council relating to certificates for passenger steamers granted in Bombay and Bengal, dated respectively the 26th day of June, 1884, and the 17th day of October, 1884, are hereby revoked.

4. Nothing herein contained shall affect the force of any certificate for a passenger steamer granted in Bombay or in Bengal which remains unexpired at the date of this Order.

5. In this Order the expression the "proper authority" shall mean the authority for the time being empowered by the Indian legislature to grant certificates of survey under the Indian Merchant Shipping Acts.

6. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Indian Certificates for Passenger Steamers) Order, 1931.

And whereas by Section 91 of the said Acts, it is provided, *inter alia*, that where it is made to appear to His Majesty that the legislature of any British possession has made satisfactory provision for the protection of inventions, designs or trade marks, patented or registered in this country, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, to apply the provisions of the said Section to that Possession, with such variations or additions, if any, as may be stated in the Order:

And whereas the laws of New Zealand confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into New Zealand or the territorial waters thereof corresponding to those mentioned in Section 48 of the said Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928:

And whereas it is made to appear to His Majesty that the legislature of New Zealand has made satisfactory provision for the protection of inventions, designs and trade marks, patented or registered in the United Kingdom:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 8th day of February, 1890 (S.R. & O. Rev. 1904 IX Patents &c. p. 1.), Her late Majesty Queen Victoria was pleased to declare that the provisions of Section 103 of the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks Act, 1883, should apply to New Zealand, and it is expedient on the making of this Order that the said Order should be revoked:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him in manner hereinafter recited and of all other powers in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The provisions of Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928, shall apply to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of New Zealand in like manner as they would apply to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state with respect to which an Order in Council had been made under sub-section (2) of that Section.

2. The provisions of Section 91 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928, shall apply to New Zealand.

3. The Order in Council dated the 8th February, 1890, relating to New Zealand, is hereby revoked.

4. This Order may be cited as the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks (New Zealand) Order, 1931.

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 29th day of January, 1929, and known as the Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Supplemental Order in Council, 1929, the Schedule to the said Northern Rhodesia (Crown Lands and Native Reserves) Order in Council, 1928, was amended:

And whereas the said Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Supplemental Order in Council, 1929, has been amended in certain particulars:

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the Schedule to the said Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Supplemental Order in Council, 1929:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Amendment (No. 2) Order in Council, 1931.

2. The Schedule to the Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Supplemental Order in Council, 1929, is hereby amended by the deletion of the description of the Swahili Reserve set out in item II of the said Schedule and the substitution therefor of the following description:—

II.—SWAHILI RESERVE.

Boundaries:—

Starting from a point on the Rhodesia-Congo Border one mile east of where the railway crosses that border, the boundary

passes in a straight line due south until it reaches the eastern boundary of the railway area and then follows the said boundary to the north-west corner of Farm 747, thence east and south along the boundaries of Farms 747 and 746 to the south-east beacon of Farm 746, thence south by a straight line to the Mwatesi River to beacon V51, the north-west corner of Farm 730 Cleveland Park, thence up the Mwatesi River to beacon V55, thence along the northern boundary of Farm 730 to beacon V53, thence in a straight line to the north-west corner beacon of Farm 733, Ishiku Lake Reserve, thence along the northern and eastern boundaries of that farm to the south-east corner beacon, thence in a straight line to line beacon 53 on the northern boundary of Farm 731, thence southwards in a straight line to line beacon 21 on the southern boundary of Farm 731, thence eastwards along the southern boundary of Farm 731 to beacon C, thence along the eastern and southern boundaries of Farm 416a, Bwana Mkubwa East, to the railway area, thence following the railway area southwards to mile peg 1430, thence in a straight line eastwards to beacon 10 on the Rhodesia-Congo Border and then along the Congo Border, passing beacons 11, 12, 13, and 14, to the point of starting.

Included within the boundaries defined above but excluded from the Reserve:—

Farm No. 342a, Mwatesi, 1,000 acres in extent, situated on the Mwatesi River.

3. His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, in Council, may at any time revoke, alter, add to, or amend this Order.

4. This Order shall come into operation forthwith and shall be published in the *Northern Rhodesia Gazette* and the Governor or other Officer for the time being Administering the Government of the Territory of Northern Rhodesia shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places and in such manner and for such times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto.

And the Right Honourable James Henry Thomas, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of all the powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Sierra Leone (Legislative Council) Amendment Order in Council, 1931.

2. Articles 4 and 5 of the Sierra Leone (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1924, as amended by subsequent Orders, are hereby revoked without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder and the said Order shall be construed and take effect as if, instead of Articles 4 and 5 thereof amended as aforesaid, the following Articles had been inserted therein:—

“4. The Council shall consist of:—

The Governor as President;

Eleven Official Members;

Three Elected Unofficial Members; and not more than seven Nominated Unofficial Members, of whom three shall be Paramount Chiefs of the Protectorate.”

“5.—(1) The Official Members of the Council shall consist of the following persons:—

The four senior Members of the Executive Council holding office in Sierra Leone;

The Officers lawfully discharging the functions of the Commissioners of the Northern and Southern Provinces of the Protectorate;

The Officers lawfully discharging the functions of Comptroller of Customs, Director of Public Works, Director of Education, General Manager of Railways, and Director of Agriculture.

(2) Whenever the Attorney General for the time being is unable, although present

in Sierra Leone, to attend a meeting of the Council, the Solicitor General may attend in his place and with the same precedence.”

3. The Sierra Leone (Legislative Council) Amendment Order in Council, 1927, and the Sierra Leone (Legislative Council) Amendment Order in Council, 1928, are hereby revoked without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder.

4. This Order shall be published in the Sierra Leone Royal Gazette, and shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by the Governor by Proclamation in the said Gazette; and the Governor shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places and in such manner and for such time or times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto within Sierra Leone.

5. In this Order the term “the Governor” means the officer for the time being administering the government of Sierra Leone.

6. His Majesty may from time to time revoke, add to, alter, or amend this Order.
