PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES
FOR FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 21st April, 1927, the Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares Trade Board (Great Britain) HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO VARY the Minimum Rates of Wages for female workers set out in the Notice Q (36) issued by the Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares Trade Board (Great Britain) and dated 12th May, 1931.

Full particulars of the Minimum Rates proposed may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Trade Board.

In accordance with Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board WILL CONSIDER ANY OBJECTIONS to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 13th October, 1931. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary, Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1. It is desirable that Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible with reasons what is objected to.
