Burnley and Sons Limited, Gomersal, near Leeds, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks; that suitable cloakroom and messroom accommodation shall be provided; that additional daily thermometer readings shall be taken and recorded if atmospheric humidity is artificially produced; and that the Secretary of State may at any time require the occupiers to make such special arrangements for the conveyance of workers living at a distance, or otherwise for the welfare of such workers, as may be necessary to prevent hardship.
