ABRASIVE CLOTH AND PAPER.

provisions of with the In accordance Section 2, Subsection (4) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade give notice that in pursuance of an application received by them for the making of an Order in Council to require imported abrasive cloth and paper in sheets, circles, bands, strips or any other form to bear an indication of origin, they have made a reference to the Standing Committee appointed by them under the Act in respect thereof.

Attention is called to the fact that, while under the provisions of the above Act the Committee must in every case referred to them consider whether the goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of sale or exposure for sale, they may also at their discretion consider and report upon the question whether such goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of importation.

# RAMSGATE HARBOUR.

HARBOURS DOCKS AND PIERS (TEMPORARY IN-CREASE OF CHARGES) ACTS 1920 TO 1922.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport will request the Rates Advisory Committee, set up under Section 21 of the Ministry of Transport Act, 1919, to consider and advise him whether, conditionally on the Harbours, Docks and Piers (Temporary Increase of Charges) Acts, 1920 to 1922, being extended by the Expiring Laws Continuance Bill proposed to be introduced into Parliament, the maximum charges authorised in respect of the Harbour undertaking of the port of Ramsgate should be modified after the 31st December, 1931, for a further period.

Information as to the permanent statutory maximum charges in respect of the undertaking and the modifications proposed may be obtained from the Harbour Master and Engineer, Ramsgate Harbour.
