PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 21st day of October, 1931 (C.W. 8828/31), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas under various Orders in Council regulations have been made from time to time governing the payment of Surveying Pay to Officers of Your Majesty's Surveying Service:

"And whereas under the said regulations Surveying Officers are eligible to receive Surveying Pay only while engaged on active surveying duties or on hydrographic duties:

"And whereas we are of the opinion that Surveying Pay should continue to be paid to Surveying Officers while undergoing courses of instruction in meteorology and gyro-compasses:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the continuous payment of Surveying Pay to Surveying Officers at the rates appropriate to their grades while undergoing the courses in question.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

NORTHERN IRELAND LAND ACT, 1925 (15 AND 16 GEO. V, CHAPTER 34).

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury give notice that pursuant to Section 2 of the Northern Ireland Land Act, 1925, They have authorised the further creation of £569,140 Guaranteed 4½ per cent. Bonds, including £60,000 such Bonds for issue to the National Debt Commissioners, and making with the amounts previously authorised a total of £5,885,340 such Bonds.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 13th November, 1931, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be assued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 16th November, 1931, to Saturday, the 21st November, 1931, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.
- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
